

As a brief round up of the year we responded to 61 incidents in 2015, a mixture of walkers, climbers, runners & users general outdoor The finished with the challenging task of dealing with the floods in Cumbria & North Yorkshire adding a different twist to our Mountain & Cave Rescue role. The 61 incidents equate to around 6,000 rescue person hours, all given free to help those in need. On top of this we trained for another 4000 rescue person hours. Thanks for your ongoing support.

Scarborough MRT with flash flooding in Whitby.

28/12/2015 (61) 17.00hrs: The team were redeployed to Selby as the flooding there was causing a threat to life & a bridge had collapsed making access difficult.

27/12/2015 (60) 00.00hrs: Continuation of flood evacuation from York

26/12/2015 (59) 22.00hrs: As part of the National flood rescue response we were called to assist with the evacuation of people from the flooding in York. Over 200 Mountain Rescue technicians from all over the UK attended.

25/12/2015 (58) 13.30hrs: Just after Xmas dinner, The team were requested to standby by to assist with any flood incidents during the poor weather both in area & in Cumbria.

12/12/2015 (57) 18.00hrs: Team leader contacted directly by a local resident reporting 2 persons stuck while trying to access their remote property in the snow. 2 team members walked up to investigate while other leaders placed on stand by. Located safe & well very quickly & walked back to safety.

Astronomy in the Two Dales

The best time to be out and about with your telescope this month is when the moon is new and small and dull, so that all those bright and sparkling stars leap out of the inky blackness of the night sky. That will be the 8th of the month then, the full moon not being due until the 22nd.

If it is planets you want to observe, then, with the exception of Jupiter, which is rising in the east after sunset, all the other planets that can be observed are lined up in the early morning sky, just as they have been for the last couple of months. It is as if they have gone on strike and refused to move, picketing the dawn sky in objection to the government's policy appalling response to the floods? Who can say?


Whilst we are on the subject of planets, what exactly is a planet? Well, according to the International Astronomical Union, a planet is defined as "a celestial body in orbit around the sun demonstrating hydrostatic equilibrium and having cleared its orbit of debris." I am sure you all know that hydrostatic equilibrium means to be

spherical in shape. According to this definition we only have three planets in the solar system. Yes that's right, three, as only Mercury, Saturn and Neptune meet the definition, leaving all the other planets classified as Dwarf planets, which only meet the first two criteria of orbiting the sun and being spherical.

The problem is that there are many other objects classified as Dwarf planets. and if they were added to the list of celestial bodies we would have 500 planets in the solar system, the smallest being 302 kilometres across up to Jupiter which is 70,000 kilometres across.

Then we have another problem: astronomers have found an object beyond the orbit of Neptune, beyond the orbit of any known planet, ten times further from the sun than Pluto and it is bigger than the Earth. Is this a planet or a massive lump left over from the destruction of another object? Will this object change our perception of the solar system? Will UKIP accuse it of being a migrant from Alpha Centauri? All this and more next month.

I do hope that everyone who attended enjoyed the Carol Service. Thank you for holding this event for Christian Aid's Christmas appeal.

Your gift will support our work around the world, including Nigeria where malaria is the leading cause of death. Approximately, 250,000 children die each year. It is particularly dangerous for pregnant women to get malaria, as it accounts for around 11% of maternal deaths. What is shocking about this situation is that it is preventable, but many people do not know how to protect themselves.

At seven months pregnant, Geneka caught malaria. Her local health centre didn't have suitable medicine for pregnant women, so she had to walk to the next village to get the help she needed. Sadly, Geneka's baby was stillborn at birth. Christian partner AD-CHUS are working hard with Geneka's community and others to teach them how to protect themselves against malaria.

Dorothy, a nurse, has received training in prevention so that she can deal effectively with malaria cases and share her knowledge with her patients. On the day we spoke to her, she had

helped to deliver Onuchukwu iust Okoye's baby boy, Israel. Onuchukwu had attended antenatal sessions with Dorothy so she knew how to avoid getting malaria. Without this help, Onuchukwu's story could have had a very different ending.


