This month's recipient is **The Swaledale and Arkengarthdale Luncheon Clubs Association**. Here's what they have to say:

The facts that our local population is becoming increasingly elderly, that there are increasingly fewer local services, and that some residents risk becoming socially isolated are nothing new. These issues were all identified back in 1993 when 645 local residents (about half the population) completed a questionnaire on how they saw the future of the Two Dales. This concluded that the community needed to find more ways to help reduce rural isolation, particularly in winter.

The Survey led directly to the establishment of the first monthly Lunch Club in Langthwaite in 1994. This proved an immediate success, and further Clubs were started in Muker, Low Row and Reeth. The Luncheon Clubs Association was formed to coordinate the catering and financial accounting, hall bookings, transport and grant applications.

Now, twenty years later, all four Clubs are still holding their monthly lunches. They excellent are opportunities for a social get-together, and go a long way to reducing the feelings of isolation that many less mobile older folk experience. regular use of the four village halls helps to keep them open as community facilities, and the use of the community minibus helps raise awareness of the Ring to Ride transport system. The Clubs also help our small local caterer's your organisation.

Membership is free and open to all residents living in the Two Dales. New members (of any age) are always welcome, and several members attend more than just their nearest club.

Astronomy in the Two Dales

As a great man once sung, "Summer is here and the time is right for dancing in the street." Although do be sure to get the council's permission to close the road first.

The 3rd of June is a good time to view Saturn, as it is at its closest approach to the sun and with the new moon occurring on the 5th, the skies will be dark, giving us a good chance to see the ringed planet.

This month we have Saturn Mars and Jupiter all in the southern sky around midnight so not too late. Jupiter's moons will be visible through a pair of binoculars, but a telescope will be required to see Saturn's rings. (See picture on p11.)

On the 20th of June the summer solstice occurs at 22.34pm, the same day as the full moon, however as the night is the shortest of the year we will not see much of our nearest neighbour.

The summer is also the best time to admire our galaxy the Milky Way as it becomes more visible to us because of our planet's position on its yearly orbit. Look for the cloudy band overhead

stretching from north to south.

While we are on the subject of neighbours, what do we know about the relationship between our planet Earth and the cosmos? Well, picture the following: our planet is 8000 miles in diameter and it spins at 1000mph. It orbits our sun every 365.25 days. At the same time our sun is spinning at 4000 mph. The sun takes 27 days to spin once and while it spins it is orbiting around the centre of our galaxy the Milky Way.

Our sun and the entire solar system is moving at 514,000mph through interstellar space on an orbit that takes 250,000,000 years to complete. This is known as a galactic year as it is the time taken by our sun to complete one orbit of our galaxy.

The estimated age of our solar system is 5,000,000,000 years which means that our sun is making its twentieth trip around the galaxy and at present estimates will do so another twenty times before deciding to retire, claim its pension and enter the great retirement home in the sky.



How A Spring Clean Could Save Your Life

It may be the last month of spring, but there's still time to squeeze in a final spring clean. North Yorkshire Fire & Rescue are suggesting people clear clutter that may be blocking escape routes and to make sure their family, guests and loved ones know how to get out, stay out, and call 999 in the event of a fire.

Working smoke alarms are regularly the heroes in a fire, giving people the warning they need to get out of their home in a fire. But blocked exits, locked doors or unfamiliar surroundings can shave vital seconds from their escape time.

We all know we need to take time to test our smoke alarms, but this week

make time for your home and take some simple steps to help keep your loved ones safe:

- Think about how you'd all get out in case of a fire. Making an escape plan and practising it will help ensure that everyone can get out, stay out and call 999
- 2. Fit at least one smoke alarm on every level of your home so smoke can reach the alarms quicker giving you more warning time.
- Test your smoke alarms monthly. Smoke alarms can save your life, but only if they work.
- Clear your escape routes. Make sure you're able to escape without tripping over to ensure a speedy exit
- 5. Keep your door and window keys in a known and accessible place. Make sure everyone knows where the door and window keys are kept so they can reach them easily and get out quicker in case of a fire.

Many of us care for others, children and loved ones. If this is you then consider the following:

- How will they get out? Plan an escape route that works for them and think of any difficulties they may have or help they may need getting out. Would they benefit from a torch to light their way or a stair rail?
- Where is the best place to go if the worst happens and they can't escape? This is especially important if they have trouble moving around or can't get downstairs on their own.
- Who's your 'Escape champ'? Nominate someone in your home (perhaps a child) to be the 'Escape champ'. Role-playing escape routes regularly and giving children the responsibility to keep escape routes clear makes fire safety more fun and engaging.

Just two to three breaths of toxic smoke could leave you unconscious, so every second counts when escaping a fire. Having working smoke alarms and knowing the escape plan in an emergency could make all the difference.

If you have dependants or someone less able to care for, it could take more time to get out, stay out and call 999. Make sure you're always prepared, your exits are clear and everyone knows what to do if the worst should happen.

The Swaledale Big Dig

The Big Dig has now finished after just over two years in which we dug 50 test pits across Fremington, Grinton and Reeth. We have learnt a lot about the development of our villages much of which you can find in the free booklet which we have distributed to all the households in the three villages. If for some reason you did not get one then these are available in shops, the museum, local pubs, cafés, Hudson House etc; if you would like further copies then please contact me at alan@swaag.org.

Our 50 test pits yielded over 4,000 pieces of pot. These and the other finds belong the landowner to concerned. Nothing we found was of any value, no hoards of coins for example; but if you would like to keep some or all of the finds from your pit then please let me know. Ideally we would like to keep those bits of pot which tell us most about how the villages developed, with the most interesting pieces being put on display in the museum

Readers of previous editions of the Gazette may remember that the final piece of work of the Big Dig was to investigate the dating of the enigmatic Grinton-Fremington Dykes. Our first excavation produced pieces of charcoal which were radio-carbon dated to the Bronze Age. Our most recent radiocarbon date from the work we did in March is from the 5th century BC - an Iron Age date. This date does not mean the dykes were constructed in the Iron Age but does show they are not Bronze Age but were built around that time or later, possibly much later, as charcoal remains in the soil for a long time. The work continues.

Although the Big Dig is now over, there is a lot of information about it on the SWAAG website www.swaag.org including several videos of our events and the work we have done. The work of the archaeology group and the local history group continues of course; all are welcome to join in. For further details see the website or contact info@swaag.org.

Finally, a big thank you to all those who joined in, in whatever way, with particular thanks all those who allowed us to dig in their land and to the Heritage Lottery Fund for their support.



What To Look For In A New Computer

Since Microsoft released Windows 10 I have had quite a number of people ask me what to look for in a new computer, so here are some thoughts:

Firstly it depends on what you plan to use it for. If you just want to use the internet, email and write the odd letter don't spend a fortune. If you want to play high powered graphical games you need to spend quite a lot to avoid frustration - and possibly consider building a computer or getting a custom computer built for you.

Desktop or laptop?

There is no doubt that the market has definitely moved towards the laptop. They are generally cheaper than desktop computers these days and there is a lot more choice.

If you plan to do a lot of work in one place - and especially if you are going to do a lot of typing the desktop computer is probably still the best choice as they support a larger screen

The new all-in-one desktop computers can be a good compromise - they do away with a lot of the clutter of the traditional tower computer (and the messy wires - even more so if you have a wireless mouse and keyboard). They also generally support wireless connections.

For most people a laptop is more than adequate and is often just as powerful, and has similar specs, to desktops.

The geeky stuff to look for:

There are 4 basic things I look for in a new computer: the processor (CPU), the amount of memory (RAM), hard disk size and whether it has a CD/DVD drive.

CPU: There are two main brands, Intel and AMD. Both brands are fine but they make a range of processors at different performance and price points. With Intel it is worth looking at their Core series of processors (Core i3, i5 or i7). Generally the higher the number, the faster/more powerful the processor and also the higher the price.

Common AMD processors are labelled A6, A8, A10 etc. and again the higher the number the higher the performance and price. AMD processors also often have good quality graphics built into the same chip. (Intel there is usually a separate chip.)

RAM: As a general rule, more memory is needed in computers as time goes on as new programmes make bigger demands. There are computers around now with 4Gb, 8Gb, 12Gb, 16Gb and even 32Gb of RAM. For most users 8Gb is adequate and is probably no more expensive than machines with 4Gb. If

you want to do things like use video editors and demanding photo editing programmes you should probably have as much memory as you can afford.

Hard disk: 1000Gb or 1Tb is very common now and more than adequate for most needs. Again if you want to use demanding things that use large files it may be worth considering more. It is pretty easy to upgrade your hard disk if you run out of space. For desktop users it is usually easy to add an extra hard disk if needed later.

CD/DVD: Increasinaly laptops coming without optical drives. If this is important to you check it has one before buying.





Upper Dales Family History Group

April's speaker was Jenny Stacey who came to talk about the Foundling Hospitals in which she had a particular interest as one of her ancestors arrived in Yorkshire as a foundling sent up from London to the hospital at Ackworth near Pontefract.

Foundling hospitals had existed on the continent for some time but it was not until the middle of the 18th century that the first was opened in the UK. Thomas Coram had spent much of his life in business in America. On returning to England he was shocked by the plight of children in London and devoted himself to tackling the problem.

He obtained a Royal Charter and involved a large number of patrons, including several well known personalities of the day, drawn from walks of life. to proceedings and offer different types of support to the children. These babies were not abandoned on the doorstep but brought to the home by mothers who could not give them a good enough start in life. The babies were fostered out to wet nurses and then returned to the Hospital around the age of five where they received a basic education and training for future employment. Their health care was also

better than average for the time as the patrons also included a number of medical practitioners.

The final part of Jenny's story involved her own ancestor who was born to a servant airl Elizabeth Rowley in 1760. She eventually gave him up to the Hospital and Foundling he eventually sent to Ackworth. Here he was apprenticed to a farmer in Haxby where he did very well and eventually had a farm of his own. astonishingly, and completely unknown to the speaker, one of our own members sitting on the front row was descendant of the another foundling.

This month's meeting is in Wensley Village Hall at 7.30pm on Wednesday June 22 when the speaker will be Dr Jenny Stephenson on 'Taking the Medicine, 145 years of a Family Doctors' House'. Dr Stephenson, a Sheffield GP, will be speaking about the history of her practice which commenced in 1870. It describes how the team adapted and survived through many challenges over the years, which included cholera. influenza (twice) smallpox, two World Wars, the new NHS, industrial unrest, a flood and a disaster, to name but a few.

In the back border: white Camissia, Viola Cornuta Alba, white Thrift, bright blue Anchusa 'Loddon Royalist' and Geum 'Flames of Passion'.

Wild flower meadow: Ox-eye daisy, common Vetch, Meadow Cranesbill, Yellow Rattle and Lady's Smock.




