New Chairman for Friends of Swaledale Festival

Swaledale Festival has appointed a new chairman for the Friends of Swaledale Festival following the death of its long-standing chairman, John Borland in July.

Taking his place is Elizabeth Bedford who has been active within the Festival for several years both as a member of the Friends and more recently as a Board member. Elizabeth has excellent credentials for this new office as a true 'Yorkshire lass' despite having spent most of her working life in the south of England working in human resources and head-hunting.

Since returning to Yorkshire and settling in Swaledale - "with a sigh of relief" she says - she has become involved in a long list of community activities both in the dale and in York where she spends some of her time as a volunteer guide in the minster.

In Swaledale when not on Festival business, she may be found involved in other musical activities such as the Swale Singers and as an aspiring organist, or at Hudson House in Reeth as one of the volunteers who help to keep this busy community facility running. She is also both a keen walker and volunteer bus driver for Reeth and District community transport. Finally she admits to being "a proud new grandmother".

The Friends of Swaledale Festival operates as a quasi-autonomous organisation within the Festival structure and was originally established simply as a means of raising

additional funding for the major twoweek annual event. It developed under Mr Borland's chairmanship into a valuable means of enabling supporters to feel a strong social identity with the Festival.

Elizabeth says that her aims as chairman are "to keep the Friends happy and to increase the number of Friends." With her involvement in other areas of the Swaledale Festival organisation, she also has plans to streamline some of the financial and administrative side of the Friends and look for new ways in which they can support the Festival.

'Flu Clinics

'flu The vaccination season is now well

underway. For those of you who missed the clinic, there are catch up sessions available (although sadly all the cake has now been eaten). If you are over 65, are a carer or have a long term medical condition such as asthma. COPD, heart disease or diabetes you are entitled to a vaccination on the NHS. Please contact the practice to arrange protection from 'flu.

We are also vaccinating children against the 'flu. Any child aged 2, 3 or 4 as of 31st August 2016 is eligible for the vaccine. Last year there was quite a low turn-out for vaccinations in this group. There are no sharp needles involved, just a spray into your child's nose. Flu infections can have serious consequences for young children and often outbreaks can be difficult to contain as they are at the age where lots of things are likely to be shared. If parents have any questions or concerns about the vaccine, we are happy to help - please call or email us.

Muker Parish Council August 2016

Muker Sign: The sign has still not been replaced. It was noted that the sign can only be erected by NYCC on the grounds of Health and Safety reasons. Parking Restrictions Muker: Highways are sending a contractor to replace the Mon-Fri restriction signs with 8.00-6.00pm signs. It was noted that the

6.00pm signs. It was noted that the yellow lines from the Institute up into the top of the village had not been repainted and that parking restriction signs had been placed on common land on the beckside. Clerk to contact Highways.

Thwaite Notice Board: Cllr Reynoldson had looked at the Notice Board and reported that the back of it was rotten and needed replacing. Cllr Reynoldson to obtain a quote for a replacement.

Dog Fouling Keld: A sign had been placed on the bin and the weeds had been cut back. Parish Council to monitor the situation.

Post Box Keld: The post box had been replaced albeit in a different position.

Polling Stations: Cllr Whitehead read out an e-mail from the Returning Officer regarding there being no Polling Station in Muker Parish for the recent European Referendum. The Returning Officer confirmed that Muker Public Hall would be used in the future if it was available. Clerk to reply to the Returning Officer

Trees Gunnerside Bridge: a response had not yet been received from Gunnerside Estate.

Highways: Capital Highways Scheme: Cllr Whitehead read out an e-mail

outlining NYCC Capital Highways Scheme 2016/2017. The only work included in the plan in Muker Parish was surface dressing at Satronside.

NYCC: The condition of Thwaite Bridge and Hoggarths Bridge was discussed. Clerk to contact the new NYCC Highways Manager Richard Marr. Cllr Reynoldson raised the issue of a deep rut on the side of the Buttertubs Pass where a lorry had gouged out the side of the road. Clerk to contact Highways.

Yorkshire Water: Keld Sliplining Works: An e-mail had been received from Yorkshire Water regarding the final section of the project, which would be completed in September. Cllr Blackie commented on how well the overall upgrading project had gone. Cllrs agreed that there had been very little disturbance throughout project. Clerk to write to Yorkshire Water commending them installation.

Central Dales Practice: Medication Home Delivery Service: Correspondence had been received from Hawes Medical Centre regarding their new prescription home delivery service. Deliveries in Upper Swaledale will be made on Friday afternoons. Anyone wanting a home delivery must ensure that they are at home to take delivery and a medication delivery slip must first be completed.

Emergency Services Darlington Memorial Hospital: Cllr Blackie informed the meeting of the NHS: Better Health Programme and the proposal to reduce the number of A&E Services such as 24/7 A&E Emergency Services and 24/7 Consultant-led

Maternity and Paediatrics Services in the area. There are currently four in the area: North Tees / Stockton, Darlington, Durham and James Cook. The proposal is to reduce this number to two, with a possibility of three. The remaining services will not attract any additional resources. A consultation will take place during November.

NHS: Transforming our Communities Consultation: Cllr Whitehead read out correspondence from the NHS regarding a consultation regarding the Rutson Ward at the Friarage Hospital in Northallerton. The PC would support the presence of wards such as the Rutson Ward.

Gas Bottles Thwaite: Cllr Reynoldson raised an issue regarding the siting of gas bottles at a private residence in Thwaite and the positioning within a public right of way. Clerk to write to the residents in question. Alison Stringer



Astronomy in the Two Dales

Greetings fellow people of Earth; Starman reporting, from the frontiers of known space and as you demand accuracy I will tell you my location. I am currently approaching the star system known as EAFOTS BF-J B9-0, 9561 light years from Earth, on the return journey of a four month exploration mission to the outer spiral arm of the Milky Way galaxy.

So what do you have to look forward to where you are? Well your moon will be in its "new "phase on the 1st, which is good news for those of you who like watching meteors, as there will be the Draconid meteor shower on the 7th Best seen in the early evening with the meteors radiating from directly above, near the bright star Vega.

The full moon on the 16th, will be a supermoon, appearing larger than normal as it is at its closest approach to your planet and is a sign to go

hunting as it is known as the Hunters' Moon, however this is going to block out all but the brightest meteors from the Orionid meteor shower on the 20th and 21st. Viewing time is 2.00am, looking southward for the distinctive belt of 3 stars.

You will then enjoy another new moon on the 30th, so another good time for observation of far away and faint objects. As many of you will have seen, heard or read, a planet has been detected orbiting your nearest star neighbour, Proxima Centauri. The initial observations took place in 2013, but it was only with the recent establishment of a specific observing campaign that confirmation of the discovery was made.

This new found world is a bizarre place, orbiting its star in 11 days, yet it could possibly have water on its surface. Now this planet is only 4.2 light years away, so it would only take 4 years at the speed of light to get there, if only you had the technology to do that.

Winter may be coming but help with your energy bills is also on its way
