Post Office News

A few things to bear in mind when packing Christmas gifts to post. Some restrictions apply to many common including perfume. aerosols. alcoholic beverages and items with lithium batteries. We will ask you about the contents of your parcel so we can put on appropriate stickers to comply with national and international regulations governing the carriage of mail and so you get the correct Royal Mail service for your parcel. If you cannot tell us what is in the parcel, then we are not allowed to accept it for posting.

A small parcel valued up to £20 weighing up to 2kg sent inland on the standard 2nd class still only costs £2.85.

Small parcels sent overseas with Royal Mail should weigh no more than 2kg. For larger heavier items Parcel Force offer a premium guaranteed service. All leaflets on prices, sizes and prohibited and restricted items, also customs declarations, are available from the post office before you pack your parcels.

Please do pop into Reeth Post Office for any advice on how best to send your parcels. We are here to help you get the service you need.

Don't forget also that we offer business and personal banking services for all high street banks. No need to make a special journey to Richmond for example, for banking transactions. Cash withdrawals are available from business and personal bank cards too.

You can carry out most banking transactions at the post office but each bank has its own quirks on how

they want certain transactions to be conducted. If in doubt, just call in and we will help you.

The 2016 Christmas stamps are now on sale. Over the last 5 decades, Christmas stamps have been designed by some of the world's best artists and designers, such as Quentin Blake and Raymond Briggs. The 2016 stamps are no exception having being visualised using paper cut-outs by artist Helen Musselwhite, and then photographed by Jonathan Beer. They celebrate the great traditions of a British Christmas including the robin redbreast, whose appearance on Christmas cards was inspired by the red coats of Victorian postmen.

Finally, thank you for using your local post office at Christmas and all year round.

Cloud Computing

Many people have asked me over the last year "What is cloud computing?" and "Do I need it?"

At its simplest 'the cloud' is just another name for the internet. Cloud computing means that you can store your files (documents and photos) on internet based services instead of, or as well as, on the disk dive in computer. In some cases it also means you can produce and edit documents and photos directly on the internet. Let me give you some examples.

In the past if you wanted to write a document in a word processor you would have to sit in front of a computer, type and save the document and then either print it or send it by email to someone else. If you need to change the document then you would have to go back to the same computer and open it in your word processor to make the changes.

Now you can still do the same thing (and many do) but you can also store your document in the cloud. That means you can easily share it with other people and you can access and even edit it from any computer, phone, tablet etc. that is connected to the internet.

One example of an integrated system that allows you to so this is Microsoft Office 365. This is a subscription based service from Microsoft. Once registered you get a full copy of the most recent edition (and all updates) of Microsoft Office

(which includes Word. Excel, PowerPoint, Publisher, Outlook and Access) which can be installed on your normal computer. The subscription allows a number of family install and use the members to programme. You also get a fixed amount of cloud based storage for your document and mobile apps for phones and tablets. You also get access to internet based versions of Office programmes that you can anywhere, and on any device just by logging in with your account details.

Similar subscription services exist for other kinds of programmes such as photo editing (Adobe have a similar system to Microsoft for the full version of Photoshop and their professional Creative Suite.)

As well as storing your files in cloud storage by Microsoft or Adobe there are many companies trying to attract you to use their services. One of the most well-known is Dropbox which allows you to store files in a special folder on your computer or device and by the magic of the internet the files will automatically be copied to all your other devices where you have Dropbox installed. It is a great way to share files or folders of files with friends or work colleagues and they provide a free subscription with a limited amount of space.

One way people also use these cloud services is to copy all their important files to the cloud as a backup - then not only are they available everywhere you also have a backup in case your computer dies. Also phones etc. can use cloud services such as Dropbox to automatically send photos and videos, contact details etc. to a secure storage

you don't lose all your important files.

So who needs cloud computing? It is certainly useful for work related storage so that you can share and update files easily with co-workers. It is also useful for families that want to share photos etc. with other family member wherever they might be. It is also useful for anyone with multiple devices who wants to be able to access or store their files and have access in one place to everything.

So what are the down sides? Firstly, cost: In the past you bought the programmes you need for your computer and used them until you decided you needed to buy a new version. Many companies are moving to subscription models which can get very expensive. To be fair if

location so that if you lose your phone you are the sort of person who always upgraded to the latest versions of things then most of the subscriptions work out considerably cheaper but for most people the cost has increased.

> Secondly, companies are charging for cloud storage which is a lot more expensive than buying an extra hard disk and has to be renewed every year.

Thirdly, security: Whilst all the services say they are secure and your files are safe, in reality popular services are going to inevitably be a target for cyber attack and data theft - all the big names in the business have had to deal with this at some point.

Grinton and Ellerton Abbey Parish Council November 2016

Commons Registration: The application to correct the wrongly registered piece of land at Rosegarth had been successful and the similar application at Crackpot was still in the system pending more documentary evidence.

conditions: The clerk written to Highways regarding the slippage on the main road and Coun Blows had followed this up by email. Coun Barker said that the response, that the situation was being regularly monitored, was very disappointing in view of the amount of money which had spent on repairs in recent years. The council stressed the importance of the B6270 as the essential main supply route into the dale for businesses and residents. Coun Blows would follow this up with Highways.

Footbridge: The footbridge over the beck had been removed for the time being as walkers were still using it in spite of the closure notices and it had become very unsafe. There had been no progress in identifying the owner of the land at either end.

Emergency services: Couns Coates and Blows updated members on the ongoing discussions regarding accident and emergency provision for the area at one or more of the Teesside hospitals.

Public phones: Details had been received of a number of phone boxes which BT proposed to remove in the area. The call box in Grinton village was not included but there were no objections to the removal of the one at Crackpot Lane from which no calls had been made in the last year.

Mobile phone coverage: Nothing further had been heard regarding a pre-planning application for an additional mobile phone mast at the youth hostel which would give a wider choice of network providers. Coun Blows would follow this up.

Tree preservation orders: Three applications to remove or trim trees in the parish had been approved by the National Park.

National Park: On behalf of all the council Coun Coates thanked Coun Harold Brown for his sterling work over 20 years as parish council representative on the YDNP before standing down due to ill health.

Village green: The clerk would look into records of legal transactions regarding the village green arising from a query regarding easement for electricity cables near Mill House.

Safety barrier: Coun Blows was asked to look into progress with a safety barrier for Grinton Bank which had been raised with Highways some time previously.

Bus shelter: A builder would be asked to refix the loose coping stones on the roof of the shelter.

Grass verge: The clerk was asked to look into a means of protecting the newly repaired verge from further damage from cars.

Next meeting: The next meeting is at 7.15pm on Monday, January 9.



Now Then

This year's Now Then also includes an interview with Harold Brown of Grinton entitled "Hill farming since the 1940s" along with some fascinating photos taken by Lucie Hinson in the 1950s.

Tony Harrison's detailed article about caves in Wensleydale and Swaledale includes the Devis Hole Mine south of *G*rinton.

Tofu

Apparently, it was first made in Han dynasty China some 2,000 years ago. Chinese legend ascribes its invention to prince Liu An who accidentally curdled some soya milk.

Tofu is a good source of protein and contains all eight essential amino acids. It is also an excellent source of iron and calcium and the minerals manganese, selenium and phosphorous. In addition, tofu is a good source of magnesium, copper, zinc and vitamin B1.





Astronomy in the Two Dales


Hurrah! It is the festival of Saturnalia, running from the 17th to the 23rd of December, a time when everything is reversed, slaves could insult their masters, gambling was legal, gifts were given and social conformity ignored. More about the Dark Sun later.

This month we have two meteor showers, as all of you know by now, unless you have not been reading this article, then I will tell you that there are two meteor showers this month. The first, the Geminids, occurs on the 13th and 14th with up to 120 meteors an hour, however, we have a full moon, another supermoon when the moon is at its closest approach to the earth, on the 14th which will illuminate the night sky and block out this display. For those who wish to brave the cold, look south after midnight.

Our second display of fiery rocks is on the 21st and 22nd of the month, coinciding with the winter solstice, which occurs at 10.44 am on the 21st. The Ursids only produce 10 meteors an hour, however with a diminishing moon they will be easier to see, radiating from a northerly direction.

Venus and Mars can be seen in the south western sky. They will set between 6.30 and 8.30 pm and as the nights are long this is a perfect time for observation, even with a pair of binoculars

So, back to Saturn, the second largest of the planets in the solar system, orbiting 10 times further from the sun than the earth, taking 29 years



for one orbit of the sun. Saturn is famous for its rings of ice, it also has 62 moons. Recent discoveries have shown that the winds of Saturn create a hexagonal pattern at both of the planets poles. This has also been seen to change colour from a blueish colour to a golden hue though what causes this is unknown.

The Cassini probe in orbit around Saturn has also found geological activity on several of the moons in orbit around Saturn, with geysers of gas and vapour and seas of hydro carbons. Saturn can be described as a failed star with its own planetary system, a distant counter point to our own star, and worth celebrating.


