500% Tax Increase

On 19th December a report entitled Attracting Families To The Yorkshire Dales National Park was presented to the Members of the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority (YDNPA). This report recommended raising Council Tax on second homes within the National Park by 500%. The purpose of this increase is to force the sale of second homes to release them back to the market and thereby to reduce the price of these properties by market forces. This, in turn, is expected to bring families back to the Park. The report was agreed by 12 votes to 9 and has now gone to the relevant District and County Councils for further discussion.

Although agreeing that we need balanced, vibrant communities in the Dales, a recently formed group, **Dales Home Owners Action Group** (DHOAG), believes that the problem of "hollowed out communities" is not solved by the blunt instrument of taxing one group of Dales stakeholders. It is a much more complex issue requiring all parts of the community to work together. In particular, there is a need for careers, not simply jobs, to keep our young people here or to encourage them, and others, to return after university or college.

Importantly, the report has no economic impact statement to explore the effect of such a shock to the local housing market where the policy would be likely to cause a reduction in all property values, not just a typical 2 bed cottage. In addition, there is no assessment of the possible effects on spending patterns in the Dales and the



Thomlinson Trust To Expand Its Coverage

The Thomlinson Trust was set up in 1994 in memory of Dr Hugh Thomlinson. Until now, grants were made only to those living in the Gunnerside area however, From March 2018 applications will be accepted from residents anywhere in Melbecks and Muker parishes, and in those parts of Grinton parish to the west of Summer Lodge beck. Should there insufficient funds to meet all requests. only then will priority be given to applicants from the Gunnerside area.

The Trust makes grants to groups and individuals, of any age, towards the cost of educational and leisure activities. Grants are usually for amounts between £50 and £500. Since

1994, the Trust has made over 270 awards for a wide variety of activities.

More than 25 students have been helped with the cost of University and college courses, while others have received fundina for music swimming lessons, to buy computer equipment or for going on school trips. The Trust has supported the local nursery and primary schools, and youth groups. It has helped adults to learn new skills, contributed to tea parties for senior citizens, supported the local choir and repaired the chapel boiler and organ.

The Trustees meet twice a year (usually in March and October) to consider applications for funding. The next meeting is scheduled for the 8th of March. Application forms may be obtained from the Secretary by e-mail at davidcrapper@yahoo.co.uk.



The Stang Road

Winter is upon us and, as frequently happens, the road out Arkengarthdale into County Durham. which climbs to some 1700 feet above sea level has claimed some scalps and caused difficulties for many due to snow and ice These difficulties are often exacerbated because boundary between North Yorkshire and County Durham is at the summit and so the responsibility for treating the two ascents different lies with organisations.

In recent years, whereas the Yorkshire side has been looked after well, the Durham side has not, resulting in many cases of drivers from the Reeth side reaching the summit on clean tarmac only to be confronted with a dangerous and frightening descent on snow and ice through the Stang forest.

This year we have mounted a campaign, with the help of the Teesdale Mercury in Barnard Castle, to try and persuade Durham County Council to upgrade this, the C166 road in question, to priority one for winter treatment.

However, a good proportion of those who volunteer have no First Aid experience whatsoever, and acquire all the skills they need on the training course provided through the NHS by YAS (Yorkshire Ambulance Service).

Now I am not a creature of habit, so knowing I could 'log on' to the service when I pleased appealed to me greatly. There are no 'fixed hours' a person has to do, no 'set' days of the week you have to be on duty. I pick the hours I like and provided they don't overlap with other CFR's I am then on duty.

As CFR's we respond to medical emergencies such as Heart Attacks, Strokes and life threatening situations. The kit we carry caters for the majority of incidents we are likely to respond to, and we are thoroughly trained in the use of it. As many of you are aware, you can wait a long time for an ambulance or medical assistance here in the Dales, and that first hour can mean the difference between life and death. It is as stark as that.

A CFR on duty can only be contacted and despatched by the YAS control desk and no other means. We are given the details of the emergency and where it is so we have time to plan any 'strategy' en route. We can be at a location in just a few minutes, potentially greatly enhancing the survival prospects of someone with a medical crisis.

If YOU have a few hours to spare every week or month and would like to come and join a band of great people give our coordinator Simon a call on 01748 886453. (You'll probably know some of us.) Volunteers like you could save the life of someone you know or love. The skills you learn will help not only enhance the safety of people throughout the Dales but are useful to know should you ever (and fingers crossed you don't) have a family emergency, and need to give CPR (Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation) for example, to an adult or child within your own home.

As I said, all training and equipment is supplied - the Community Chest donation will enable us to purchase some vital equipment - and we are fully supported by the YAS. If you are thinking about volunteering for anything that helps you give something back to your local community, then becoming a CFR is a superb way of doing it.

The Cost Of Not Writing A Will

When a close one suddenly passes away, it can be a shock for the whole family. My Mum was diagnosed with terminal cancer in June this year and passed away in August. Even now, it is hard to believe that she has gone. However, I am grateful that Mum had a Will. It has made things a lot easier to deal with.

This was nearly not the case when a family friend passed away earlier this year. For the purpose of this article, I will refer to him as Tom. Tom first asked me to write his Will in 2016 as he knew he had terminal cancer. Despite this, Tom kept putting it off and eventually signed his Will one week before he passed away. Tom's Estate was bequeathed to a close friend.

Had Tom's Will not been signed, he would have died intestate and his whole estate would have gone to the Crown, as Tom had no surviving family.

Only with a valid Will can you be certain that your estate will go to the right people:

- you can specify how long funds must be held in trust for children, to any age you deem appropriate.
- You may wish friends or charities to

benefit.

- You may also want to outline personal wishes, such as funeral arrangements or who should inherit particular property or items of worth.
- You may also exclude family members who you don't want to benefit from your estate in a will.

Even if you have made a will, you need to ensure it is updated.

If you do not draw up a proper Will:

- the rules of intestacy award none of the estate to stepchildren and livein partners, regardless of the longevity of the relationship.
- Unless you have a joint mortgage, the house that you share with your live-in partner could potentially be passed onto your children, parents, siblings or the state, leaving your partner homeless.
- In the event that both you and your spouse die, you would have no say in who becomes your children's guardian. If your child or children are under the age of 18 it is important you have a Will for this reason.
- You may not want parents or siblings to benefit to the detriment of your spouse.

Astronomy In The Two Dales

As highlighted last month, the deep winter night sky is dominated by the constellation of Orion - the Hunter. The chart on the opposite page shows the sky to the south at about 8.00pm on February 15th. This is also the date of the new moon and the sky will be nice and dark for a few days before and after.

Orion can be used as an aid to locating other constellations and stars. By extending the line of the Belt south -eastward, Sirius the brightest visible star and part of Canis Major (Greater Dog) can be found; extending the line north-westward leads to Aldebaran the 'red giant' eye of Taurus (the Bull). A line eastward across the shoulders points in the direction of Procyon, part of Canis Minor (Lesser Dog). 





Fleece Craft Shop: Designing A Cosy Niche For Fellow Artists

As a creative one of the biggest challenges can be finding the perfect platform for your work. But five textile artists from across the North-east have crafted their own solution to that problem. The pals have come together to launch an artist cooperative. Fleece is a gallery shop in Reeth that not only provides the ideal place to showcase their work but also brings opportunities to likeminded artists.

Vicky Petrie, who founded the cooperative with Louise Curnin, Thelma Russell, Margaret Chalmers and Janet Phillips, said: "We wanted to create a place where artists could not only sell their work directly to customers but also show the real quality of the products being made."

After many years of designing, making and indeed selling their work, the group, who all met through their shared love of textiles, felt ready to take the next step. "For us it was about being able to create and sell handmade items in an environment that reflects the hours, days or even weeks of intricate work that has gone into each piece," said Vicky, who designs and makes felt from her home in Yarm.

Plus they are doing their bit to help support the region's creative economy, for as a not for profit cooperative the money made from every sale goes directly to the artists. Already filled to the brim with the work of up to 17 creatives from the Yorkshire Dales and just beyond, the friends are clearly filling a niche. The shop brings together

textiles, glassware, woodturning, handmade books, hand-dyed wools, watercolours, silver jewellery, ceramics and everything in between.

Textile artist Janet Phillips, who is owner of The Threshing Barn and a fellow founder of the cooperative said: "The shop has a good mixture of different crafts and everyone respects what each other are doing. I get such a thrill out of running a creative business and situated in the heart of Swaledale this is such an awe-inspiring landscape for creative people to work." Having enjoyed a lengthy career working around the world, the grandmother-of-three from Wensleydale added: "It is very rewarding to be able to put something back into the community."

With the shop officially opened by president of the International Feltmakers Association, Sheila Smith, the textile artist and author from Thirsk, who is also selling handmade books in the store, said: "Because the staffed by the shop is themselves it is a very inspirational place. People can talk to the artists about their work and who knows it might even encourage them to have a go themselves. "There is certainly a lot of creative talent in the area and this is a fantastic opportunity for artists to display and sell their work."
