Will they be astounded by the ineptitude of the politicians? And will they wonder what 'Brexit means Brexit' actually means?

As Bon Jovi sang: The more things change, the more they stay the same.

Computer Corner

Windows 10 Updates Woes

A number of people have complained that their computers are constantly updating and are generally running slowly.

In February, Microsoft issued an update for Windows 10 that seems to be causing a few problems. The issue seems to be that it gets stuck in a loop and continually downloads and tries to install itself over and over. The update is a large file so it tends to suck up your internet usage and is quite frustrating. It is happening one of my computers so I sympathise.

MS seem to be aware of the problem but have yet to figure out and issue a fix.

To see if you are affected, click Start > Settings (the little cog wheel) and then scroll down the page and click on Updates & Security. If you see "2018-02 Cumulative update for Windows 10 Version 1709" and it says "restart required" then you are probably affected.

Sadly there is no way to tell Windows 10 to ignore an update but a TEMPORARY solution to the download and fail cycle is to tell Windows you are on a metred connection. This is to prevent people accidentally using up all their allowance on a limited connection. To turn on metred connection click on Start > Settings (little cog) and then on "Network and Internet". You will see a link that says: "Change Connection Properties" Click on it and scroll down

until you see "Metered Connection" and turn it on.

From now on you will get warnings you are on a metred connection - you can ignore them.

Note this is a stop gap only. You should not leave this setting switched on all the time or you will receive no more updates which is a bad idea but at least it stops the same faulty update trying to install repeatedly. You can turn it off and see if updates are working again every few days and once things are working properly leave metred connection switched off again.

'EXTEND Exercise' is a chair based exercise class that enables people whose mobility is not as good as they'd like it to be, to still enjoy the benefits of exercise.

The class helps to improve flexibility, co-ordination and strength through exercises that focus on different parts of the body and all choreographed to an upbeat and varied selection of music.

The teacher, Gayle Pearson trained as an EXTEND exercise tutor while working for AGE UK as a 'Falls Prevention and Mobility Advisor'. She has a wealth of experience in helping people to improve their mobility, and since qualifying as an EXTEND exercise teacher she has been providing a class in Richmond for the last year.

Gayle says "We have a wide range of people coming to the Richmond class, some who are already active and want to keep fit, others who may be recovering from a fall or injury to those who have health conditions or a



disability that deters them from doing exercise. The beauty of EXTEND exercise is that it gives all those people an opportunity to exercise at a pace that suits them."

Are You A Carer?

It is estimated that up to 10% of the population may be acting as carers for a family member or friend. Across the country only a small percentage of carers are formally recognised and recorded. We know that 4.1% of our patients are carers but suspect that there are many more of you out there. We would really like to hear from you if you are a carer. This helps us improve and develop our services to support you. Often carers have higher rates of such mental health problems depression and anxiety as well as the physical health burden of caring for someone else. We are now offering carers proactive health checks and they are also entitled to a free NHS 'flu vaccination

We have a collection of resources from local charities and services to support carers, such as a sitting service, where a volunteer sits in the house for a few hours, allowing the carer time to go out, reassured in the knowledge that someone is keeping an eye on things while they are away.

There is now a brand new online directory just for North Yorkshire which has been launched by North Yorkshire County Council. It's called 'North Yorkshire Connect' and you can take a look here:

Theme Park For Dogs

Changes are afoot (or should that be apaw?) at Croft Farm Boarding Kennels in Grinton where planning permission has been granted for what will be the country's first Dog Theme Park.

The idea is the brainchild of Janet Sunter, owner of the kennels, who explains: "A number of dog owners have commented that there isn't really anywhere around here where they can let their dogs run free because of the sheep in the fields, so I thought 'Why not use our field to set up an area for dogs? Really, I'm just trying to provide a safe, clean, dog-friendly area in the Dale where dogs could socialize with other friendly dogs and be able to run until their heart's content."

Dog theme parks - which are theme parks specifically for dogs as opposed to theme parks where they are quite happy for owners to take in their dogs - are big in Japan and the USA; and are a growing commodity in China where pet dogs are more and more popular. But this will be the first such park to be established in the UK.

So what attractions can we expect to see at the park? "Well, my plan is to divide the field into five different areas," says Janet. "A jungle park with two large pools for swimming or just cooling off; big boulders for the dogs to climb around on; and plenty of trees if they just want to laze in the shade. A miniature city with its own community centre where the dogs can hang around. A play area with plenty of features to keep the dogs entertained such as a caterpillar tunnel, a hide and seek structure, a cosy cottage and plenty of

picnic tables. A tiny tot park for the puppies who may not be ready for socialising with older dogs. And finally, an agility area with several obstacles that can be used as training and stimulation aids such as giant tunnels, climbing platforms, weaving poles, and tyre jumps."

A spokesperson for the planning department commented: "This is a really innovative idea and if successful will put Grinton at the heart of the dog community. We are keen to support projects of this nature which create new employment opportunities in the area as well as bringing new income into the dales."

It is hoped that work will commence on the dog park this month and that it will be open for its first visitors from the beginning of July.






Astronomy In The Two Dales

Betelgeuse our nearest giant star neighbour about 1500 times the size of our Sun and about 600 light years away from us. Our boffins describe Betelgeuse as a Red supergiant star approximately 8 million years old and nearing the end of its life when it will explode and change our view of the night sky for ever more.

The present theory on stars and their evolution states that stars are similar to nuclear reactors and as they burn through the available fuel, turning hydrogen into helium in a process known as nuclear fusion, they expand and eventually explode scattering dust, gas and rare elements such as gold and platinum through space, leaving a nebula which eventually condenses to form new stars or planets.

However a recent picture of Betelgeuse has shown a strange white patch on the surface of this star as well as a distortion in the shape and the question arises is Betelgeuse about to


change into a different type of star instead of exploding?







Can I Protect My Home From Care Costs?

Protecting our homes from care costs is at the forefront of many people's minds.

It is important to be aware that there are many unregulated providers in the market offering asset protection to protect your home from care fees. Some of the arrangements are successful but it is a lottery.

If North Yorkshire County Council (NYCC) believe that your home or your money have been given away deliberately to avoid paying care fees, then they have the power to recover any money that they are owed. This may mean that if the property has been put into a trust, NYCC may ask for the care fees to be paid by the trustees.

However, you are entitled to a free

A needs assessment is a discussion between you (or the person you look after if you are a carer) and a trained person, either from NYCC or another organisation that they work with. You will talk about the care and support needs you have and how these affect wellbeing. This will identifying any physical needs, such as whether you need help to wash or dress, get in and out of bed or keep your home safe to live in. The assessment will also look at your mental and emotional needs and ask what is important to you in how you live your life, such as being able to carry on working or volunteering, or being able to meet your friends.

A needs assessment won't ask about your finances.

Paying for Care

Different ways to pay for care and support are available, so people should not have to sell their home in their lifetime to pay for care.

A Deferred Payment Agreement is an arrangement with NYCC that will enable people to use the value of their

If you are eligible, NYCC will help to pay your care home bills on your behalf. You can delay repaying them until you choose to sell your home, or until after your death.

You might choose to rent out your home and use the income to reduce the amount you asked to defer.

Your home and your money still belong to you if you have a Deferred Payment Agreement, so you can make gifts to your children. But a Deferred Payment Agreement for care costs will always need to be repaid - either by the sale of your home after your death, by someone else, or by something like the pay-out from a life assurance policy.

Carers and families can help people to make decisions about their care and how to pay for it. If NYCC are concerned that the person applying for

homes to help pay for care home costs. | the Deferred Payment Agreement does not have the capacity to understand, or won't have capacity to understand in the near future, then another person may need to represent them. Only a person that is properly authorised, like someone with legal power of attorney, can represent someone in applying for a Deferred Payment Agreement.

Melbecks Parish Council February 2018

Highways: Highways Officer has met councillors to discuss the drainage problems at Peat Gate, West End Cottage, Gunnerside, and having 'Children Playing' signs in Gunnerside.

It was confirmed that the gully at West End Cottage will have a jet sent through it to clear the blockage. Children playing signs - the highways officer advised that it would not be possible to put up such signs in the village, due to the road layout, as cars were unlikely to be exceeding 20 mph in the village itself. The clerk will ask for this to be confirmed in writing and to see if there is anything else that can be done.

Councillors also commented that



recent gritting had only been carried out on hills and that this was not acceptable. Clerk to report this, as well as street lights out at Bridge Corner, Gunnerside and Toledo, Low Row.

Planning: Planning application: Dial House Gunnerside – no comments or objections raised. Planning decisions for Rowleth Gardens, Strands, Wardell Hall, Low Row and Spensley House, Gunnerside – all approved conditionally. YDNPA: Spring 2018 Parish Forum will take place at West Burton Village Hall on Monday 23rd April 2018.

Council tax on second homes: The discussion regarding increasing council tax on second homes will be considered by Richmondshire District Council at the end of February. RDC Cllr Blows and RDC Cllr Yvonne Peacock have met with second home owners and residents from DHOAG (Dales Home Owners Action Group) to address their concerns. Councillors aareed unanimously that they are opposed to the proposal of increasing council tax on second homes and asked for these views to be taken forward to the meeting.

Defibrillator: A request to fund replacement parts linked to the defibrillator at Low Row Institute was received, however it appears that there may be funding available from the Yorkshire Ambulance Service (YAS) to replace these. The council advised to contact YAS initially to see what may be available and to consider other funding options - to be reviewed at the next meeting.

Next meeting: Annual Parish Meeting followed by the Parish Council meeting at Low Row Institute on Thursday March 29th at 7.30pm. Nikki Adams

Reeth Parish Council February 2018

Second Home Council Tax Proposals: Paul Stokes, representing the Dales Homeowners Action Group attended meeting to present figures obtained through Freedom Information Requests regarding the number of properties which would be involved in any increase on council tax on second homes in the national park and to express concerns about the possible effects of this on home and business owners in the area. Councillors unanimously to oppose the proposal, which was to be debated at the next district council meeting, on the grounds that they felt opportunities and facilities were more important in attracting younger people to remain in the dales and that a large increase in council tax would be more likely to create more holiday lets than family homes.

Highways: The district council had replied that they were not able to deal with the overgrown hedge outside an unoccupied house on Langhorne Drive and suggested that Highways should be asked to cut it back. A resident had expressed concerns that parking near the top of Hill Close was obstructing the view of motorists turning onto the main road. An extension to the drain would be installed at Raw Bank to help prevent flooding and icing on the road.

Street Lights: Lights at High Fremington, opposite the old police house and on Langhorne Drive and Quaker Close were off and would be reported.

Planning: A planning application for Ivy Cottage, Healaugh, was circulated.

Memorial Seat: The group organising a memorial seat and tree in memory of the late Coun Richard Beal had asked the council to reconsider their decision on this. It was still felt however that although there were no objections to the bench, the green was not the best place for the proposed crab apple tree with a circular bench around it, for a number of reasons includina eventual spread of the roots which could damage the plinth and problems with fallen fruit, as well as the dangers of setting a precedent. It was noted that the council did not actually own the green but were agents and custodians of it. The group would be asked to look for alternative sites around the village.

Northallerton Court House: The clerk reported proposals to close the court house in Northallerton with the consequent loss of local services.

Village Green: It was noted that damage to the grass and to curb stones had been caused by large vehicles which had not been able to drive on the road round the green due to parked cars. In addition, one of the posts in Anvil Square had been knocked down.

Website: The chairman reported that the parish council website http://www.reethparish.uk/ was now being developed.

District Council: Coun Scott reported that at a recent meeting the district council had voted to put up council tax by 2.9% to avoid drawing on their reserves in the coming year.

Fund Raiser: Permission was granted for a fund raising event on Saturday, August 18, on the village green for Guide Dogs for the Blind.

the said road and still received no response.

I then emailed George Richardson, the councillor for Barnard Castle East and he passed on an email from me asking them to respond. Still no reply. So much for the respect in which our civil servants hold their publicly elected masters.

I have now written again to Brian Kitching informing him in a 'letter before action' that it is our intention to call for a judicial review into their classification of the Cl66 road on the grounds of irrationality. I will let you know in next month's Gazette how we're getting on.


