The Facebook Debacle

A number of people have asked me what I think about Facebook and other social media in light of recent scandals in the news about data collection by Cambridge Analytics. Also people have asked what social media is for

Social media allows you to connect with friends and follow content of personal interest to you from activities you are interested in to companies. It also allows you to share information, pictures, videos etc. with others.

In Twitter this is all publicly visible to anyone who has an account - though you can restrict who can follow you and see what you tweet.

In Facebook there are also games and personal messaging services so that you can chat face to face with friends by video or by typing messages. You are free to share as much or as little as you want totally publicly or semiprivately with friends and contacts. If you prefer you can just follow and respond to what others are posting. no obligation to share everything about your life or even allowed to use that information. The

personal contact details. You can even only interact with people you choose and block all other connection requests.

Dangers / the truth

Almost all free social media sites are run by for profit companies. There is an old saying - if you don't pay for a service YOU are the product. There is no such thing as a free lunch. Almost all media collect social marketing information about their users and use/ sell that data to marketing companies to target advertising. This is equally true of Google (so if you use Gmail the content of that email is analysed for marketing opportunities). Facebook has the ability to let third parties write applications that work with Facebook to eg. make fun quizzes or games - by accessing those types of things you give access to some of your information to the third party company who are bound by contracts how they are

Cambridge Analytics story arose because they attracted Facebook users to play their quizzes and used the data they accessed for political marketing and targeting purposes.

Safety

If you want to use Social Media you need to:

- 1) Decide what you are actually prepared to share publicly. A rule of thumb is if you walked into a room full of strangers would you be happy to tell them these things?
- 2) Check the security and privacy settings regularly in the Social Media you are using (particularly Facebook where the settings options are updated/changed often). You often find them in a menu called Settings, Options or Account Settings. Make sure they are set to only reveal what you share to the group of people you want to see it usually Publicly or with Friends (note if you share with their friends their friends will see anything you post to them)

Advantages

- 1) Keep in touch or reconnect with people you don't see often.
- 2) Quickly share information that you want others to know
- 3) Connect with new people and make new friends you have to be a bit careful here but for me this has been the biggest plus of Facebook. Without Facebook, Wensleydale Concert Series would not exist and I would not be having regular lessons with Tanya Anisimova a Russian cellist who lives in Washington DC so I have benefitted enormously and hopefully so has the concert scene locally.

Personally I don't see the need for the panic response of deleting accounts

arose and leaving social media but be aware of users what you share and take care only to e data connect with people you know or have a keting number of common friends.

Tour De Yorkshire Stage 3 Richmond To Scarborough Saturday 5 May 2018

On Saturday 5 May, Stage 3 of the Tour de Yorkshire runs from Richmond to Scarborough and passes through Leyburn, Bedale and Northallerton. Huge crowds are expected, as there were for the Tour de France when held in this region. A prime viewing place will be in Leyburn which, if the Tour de France day is anything to go by, will be extremely busy. The race will come through Leyburn at about 1.30pm.

For people coming from the Upper Dales - Hawes, Askrigg, Reeth, Sedbergh, etc - the Wensleydale Railway will be offering a FREE park and train ride from Redmire to Leyburn, with shuttle trains operating from 10.00am until 4.30pm (journey time about 15 minutes).

There is no need for passengers to book - just turn up on the day at

Redmire Station (a little way to the East of the village - for Sat Nav DL8 4ES) to catch one of the 10.00, 1045, 11.30 or 12.15 trains to Leyburn Station, which is right on the course of the race in an excellent viewing position. Or you can walk up into the town, where there will be plenty of action.

There is room for a few cycles on each train; if you want to be sure of a place for a cycle, you MUST pre-book by telephoning or emailing the Wensleydale Railway office and a special free ticket will be sent to you.

Swaledale's Newest Orchard

The old walled garden of the manse in Keld was neglected and became derelict. The land, together with a cluster of buildings in Keld, is owned by the United Reformed Church but administered by a charity, the Keld Resource Centre (KRC).

So what to do about it? In November 2016 the Church and the KRC decided that the best use of the land would be a community orchard. Homes from Ravenseat to Thwaite were leafleted to gauge the level of enthusiasm and an open meeting held on 10th January 2017. A lucky 13 people turned up and unanimously agreed the plan.

No time was wasted and clearance of the site began the very next day. The area was cleared of debris, an old cobbled path was excavated and battle commenced against creeping buttercup. More volunteers joined the group. Those with hard landscaping skills built a terrace accessible by wheelchair.

Although Keld is not renowned for its balmy climate the orchard is sheltered by its surrounding wall. The time quickly came to decide what varieties to plant. Useful advice was obtained from Gunnerside Estates. Yorkshire Dales National Park (YDNPA),knowledgeable Authority individuals and R V Rogers Nurseries in Pickering who subsequently provided the plant stock.

Eight freestanding trees comprise dessert apples, a cooking apple, a damson, plums and crab apples. Pears

and more apples are being trained as espaliers and cordons along the south facing wall. Blackcurrants, gooseberries and rhubarb complete the list of fruits. A few flowering bushes and many Spring bulbs have been planted to add colour. Pots of herbs stand at either end of the orchard. The whole area was seeded with a locally sourced mixed grass seed.

Costs were minimised by doing all the work ourselves. Individuals made donations and we received grants from KRC and YDNPA. A major source of funds came from sponsorship of trees, bushes, herb pots and benches. We're not too keen on meetings and we managed to do all this with just four.

A wasteland has been transformed into a productive, colourful and peaceful orchard. Come and see for yourself.



The March speaker was Tony Wood, a guide at Rokeby near Barnard Castle, who had researched the story of Sir Thomas Robinson, 1702 - 1777, a 'gentleman of fashion' who built the existing house to his own design.

Sir Thomas was very much a larger than life character, quite literally in some respects, being known as 'Long due to his height. corresponded widely with many of the best known names in 18th century society but is little known himself. possibly due to the fact that one of his brothers, a bishop of destroyed his correspondence after his death

During his lifetime Thomas was a noted collector and self-taught architect. Inspired by a Grand Tour he decided to rebuild the existing mansion at Rokeby but didn't like the design of the first architect - so he drew up his own plans and created the first Palladian style house outside London, only the second in the whole country. Later he designed more houses, as well as the church at Rokeby and more modest buildings around the Teesdale area

He married a member of the Howard family and combined his honeymoon in France with a spying trip which may well have contributed to his promotion to the baronetcy. Sadly his new wife was addicted to drinking and gambling and died young, with no children

Thomas joined some of the foremost thinkers of the day in the Royal Society, obtained a seat in the

House of Commons and bought shares in Ranelagh pleasure gardens. He entertained and built extravagantly and inevitably ran into serious debt.

A lifeline appeared in the form of the governorship of Barbados but even there he couldn't curb his passion for building - running into difficulties by unauthorised improvements to his own residence amongst others and getting further into debt. While there he married a wealthy widow but she limited his access to her fortune by a prenuptial agreement and declined to join him when he was recalled to England. interesting alimpse into character was provided by the final address which he wrote on leaving Barbados. asking for compassionate treatment of the slaves there, which did actually have a lasting effect.

Back in England Thomas continued to collect art and a books as well as designing a number of significant buildings in all parts of the country including the Gatehouse at Bishop Auckland Castle, the Tea House at Rokeby, the Rievaulx Temples and the Rotunda at Duncombe Park near Helmsley. He was a great influencer of taste and fashion, knew Chippendale and Capability Brown, and designed one wing of Castle Howard where his work proves how well he understood the engineering required to support his architectural ideas.

In 1754 Thomas, unable to remarry due to his estranged wife in Barbados, fathered an illegitimate daughter who eventually became his sole heir when he died in 1777. His title passed sideways to one of his brothers but Rokeby had already been lost to the family when he was forced to sell it in 1765 to settle some of his debts. The estate is still owned by the Morritt family who made it a notable centre for the arts, while its original owner, in spite of a memorial in Westminster Abbey, is largely unknown.

Astronomy In The Two Dales


Time for some humour, so let's get Mercurial.

Mercury is the closest planet to the sun and zips around its orbit in 87.97 days and remains so close to the sun requires special optical equipment to view it.



Mercury is small, one third the size of the earth, and being so close to the sun suffers extremes of temperature, ranging from -173 centigrade up to +427 centigrade.

The temperature at the poles remains a cool -93 centigrade as these are never in direct sunlight, and water ice has been detected in the shadows of the deep craters at the north pole of the planet.



We have sent 2 probes to this small ball of metal: Mariner 10 1974-1975 and Messenger 2004-2015, with a third planned to be launched this year that will reach Mercury in 2025. This mission will consist of two probes, one for mapping and the other for magnetosphere detection.

Funny, sending probes to a dead ball of rock. Well, Mercury has a magnetic field, it appears to be geologically active and it has an atmosphere of particles, blasted off the planet's surface by the sun's energy which forms a tail. This has given rise to the theory that Mercury may have been a comet captured by the sun.



We can only imagine what our sun looks like from that close a distance. This picture shows the small metallic ball against the back drop of the sun's surface, known as a transit of Mercury. Perhaps one day we will have an observation station on the surface of Mercury which can give us up to date warning of the sun's activity and any dangers that may be a threat to Earth. 

The chairman thanked the councillors for their work in distributing and discussing the housing needs survey with parishioners. The forms received to date are still being analysed but it would appear that a positive response has been received, showing a need for affordable housing in the dale.

Road repairs: Apart from the clearing of the flooded road near Reeth, none of the reported problems on our roads had yet been attended to. The chairman said that he had offered to show a highway engineer around the problem areas but no one had contacted him as yet.

Thanks were expressed to Jack Stones and the council who had kept the roads open during the recent heavy snowfalls and icy conditions. The clerk reported dangerous conditions on the Booze road due to heavy snow. She had contacted the council but was told that any snow clearing service to Booze had been discontinued. She was advised to put the issue on the agenda for the next meeting when it was hoped that county councillor Blackie could be asked for his help on the issue.

Proposed increase in council tax on second homes: Although the motion had now been defeated, we had been asked beforehand to state our council's position on the matter and so a vote was taken where the majority of councillors were against the increase.

Financial: Three cheques were issued, one to pay for the hire of the school room, one to Mrs. Hutchinson for expenses on materials to clean and maintain the war memorial, and one to

the clerk to cover annual salary and expenses.

Planning: Application R/01/30L was received to correct a mistake made by the architect in applying for permission for eight ground-mounted solar panels, when the quantity should have been sixteen. The permission for eight had been granted. The chairman declared an interest and the remaining councillors agreed to ask the clerk to send a letter to explain the error and re-apply for the correct quantity.

Local matters: Mrs. Moses, owner of the dilapidated seat on High Green is in the process of purchasing a new replacement. Councillors agreed that the new seat should be delivered to the chairman's house and they would help to replace the old one.

Next meeting: 14th May, which is the AGM

Reeth Parish Council March 2018

Annual Parish Meeting

The council was in a healthy position financially. The memorial hall accounts were in a good position to carry on a rolling programme of improvements. The chair, Coun Cluderay, thanked all members for their hard work during the past year, also Gary Woodward for his work on the green and Colin Garner for managing the market. There were no major problems outstanding and the council's sound financial standing had enabled the provision of a defibrillator for Healaugh.

Memorial Tree: The tree in memory of the late Coun Richard Beal had been planted in the community orchard.

Northallerton Court House: Councillors were encouraged to write in with their concerns regarding the future of the court facilities.

Best Kept Village: No feedback had been received after the 2017 competition to help with future improvements. This would be considered at the next meeting.

Speed Signs: The possibility of a moveable radar speed sign was discussed. This could be moved around the area as required.

Water Cycle Challenge: The organisers of the Water Cycle Challenge charity event asked for permission to set up a feeding station on the green again on July 14.

Street Lights: Lights in Back Lane and Quaker Close would be reported. The light opposite the old police house had been repaired and the one at Fremington would be done soon.

Planning Application: Prior to the

formal meeting the owners of the Fremington Bike Centre attended to answer questions about the proposed extension raised by councillors and in correspondence from local residents. Suggestions raised at a public meeting in January and by the National Park had already been incorporated into the revised plans which were about to be submitted. Following discussion the council voted by a majority to support the expansion, feeling that it would attract more custom into the area without detracting from existing businesses.

Highways: The road near Swale Farm between Grinton and Richmond was in very bad condition, even after patching had been carried out. Concerns would be forwarded to Coun Blackie.

Website: Agendas and draft minutes of the meetings would be available online at http://www.reethparish.uk/which was currently under development. District Council: The last meeting had voted against the proposed tax rise on second homes. It was hoped that this might have stirred interest in looking at other ways of tackling problems concerning lack of housing and jobs in the area.

Dog Waste: A dog waste bag dispenser would be positioned near the post office.

Drains: A drain near Skellgate Lane was totally blocked and had blown out tarmac on the footpath. A number of potholes around the village and broken curb stones on the green needed to be dealt with.


