

PRICELESS

First Thoughts . . .

As primary school teachers know, each class has a variety of personalities: for example, the quiet ones who either just get on with things or who keep a low profile in the hope that they can get away with doing nothing; those who let you know they are there; those who find learning easy and so can fly; those who find learning a struggle, but nevertheless kept plugging away until things fell into place. Then there is the disruptive element - maybe just one or two - who make life difficult for everyone in the class. They seem to take up more of your time and energy than the rest of the class put together - to the detriment of their class mates' learning, but they are oblivious to this.

The saying "Give me a child until he is seven and I will show you the man" (Commonly attributed to the Jesuits, but actually it came from the Greek philosopher Aristotle.) suggests that we can more or less predict what someone will be like as an adult as much of their character and habits are formed by that age. You can argue about the age, but most would agree that this is fundamentally true.

So, imagine a primary school class

of children, all grown up and living in a village community and you will still have the same mix of characters: some of them quietly doing things within the community simple because they think it is a good thing to do; others who let you know exactly what they have done, but at least they have done something - unlike the auiet ones who have done nothing at all to help the community. As for the disruptive element, they are, for example, the dog walkers who think the rules about picking up their dog's mess do not apply to them; the litter louts: the drivers who think they can drive and park wherever and however they like. They are only a small minority but they have a disproportionate effect on the rest of us.

Back to the children: How do you want yours to grow up? I doubt any parent would want their children to be anything less than responsible members of the community. So what are we, as a community, doing to encourage this? What examples are we setting them? And what are we actually doing for them to make them feel included? After all, as George Benson (originally) sang: 'I believe the children are our future. Teach them well and let them lead the way."

Post Office News

We have previously updated you on the letters sent out by the Department of Work and Pensions to Post Office Card Account (POCA) holders encouraging them to have their benefits paid into a bank account. The DWP has now informed the Post Office that they are writing to POCA customers in the pension age group aged up to 79 years although we know for a fact that they have been doing this for some time.

Some of you may be concerned or confused by these letters and think that you have no option but to agree to this. This is not the case. If you do not have a bank account or are unable to open one - or if you simply prefer to continue using your POCA - then you can continue to do so. It is entirely up to you if you choose to have your payments made into a bank or not.

HMRC are also adept at causing confusion as they are still sending out tax bills which state on them that payment can be made at the Post Office. This is no longer the case as HMRC (and not the Post Office) made the decision last year that this was no longer an option. Yet they are still using stationery that says it is.

The Museum is open every day from 10.00am to 5.00pm. If you want to come earlier or later in the day, try contacting us. If you don't have time for the Museum, you can always visit our shop. Come and see some of Ann Hewitt's new season woven scarves, inspired by the patterns and colours of our local lichens. They are as much works of art as fashion items, so they have been displayed in our Upper Gallery.

Last month brought some surprising new acquisitions. We have been given the remains of a World War II British Army 2 inch mortar bomb. Not to panic, just the fins and completely safe. It was found by the donor whilst swimming in the Swale between Healaugh and the Swing Bridge on 6th May. It has the date 1942 on one of the fins. The donor wonders if it is a legacy from the RECCE corps when they trained in Swaledale and Arkengarthdale.

Our second donation is a very fine fountain pen that once belonged to Dr Speirs, which was brought in by a collector, who would like to return it to its 'home' in Reeth. We wonder how many prescriptions were signed using it by this famous doctor of the Dale?

North Yorkshire Police: 10 Phone Frauds

(It's long - but worth reading.)

Fraudsters are becoming increasingly sophisticated in the way that they deceive people - especially over the phone. They will often call you claiming they're from the police, your bank or some other trusted organisation saying that you have been a victim of fraud or that you owe, or are owed, money. It is easy for them to convince you too, since they can both fake the telephone number on the screen and do their research to find out some of your basic bank and personal details. Here we cover some of the most recent types of frauds carried out by criminals over the phone, both nationwide and right here in North Yorkshire, to help you to recognise them.

1. Fake police scam

This is a call from someone claiming to be from the police or your bank telling you there's a problem with your card or bank account. They may ask for your account and card details, including your PIN number. They may ask you to withdraw money to assist a police investigation and even offer to send a courier to collect your card or money from you so they can resolve the problem. They may also advise transferring your money to a 'safe account' to protect it. The caller will often sound professional and try to convince you that your card has been cloned or that your money is at risk. This is a common scam and the police or your bank would never ask you to withdraw money or move it to a safe account.

2. Computer repair scams

A fraudster may call you claiming to be

from a well-known company, such as Microsoft, Apple or your broadband provider. They'll tell you that your computer has a problem and they can help you to solve it. They may instruct you to download what is known as a 'Remote Access Tool'. This gives the criminal access to everything on your computer including your online banking. Remember, genuine computer service companies don't contact customers this way and you should never let anyone remotely access your computer.

3. Investment fraud

Investing in stocks and shares or any other commodity can be a successful way of making money. However, it can also lead to people losing their entire life savings. Fraudsters will call you and persuade you to invest in all kinds of products, offering high rates or return, particularly over long periods of time, which often do not exist. Remember, genuine investment companies will not cold call you.

4. Premium rate 'Insolvency Service' phone scam

This telephone scam asks you to make unscheduled and unnecessary calls to the Insolvency Service - a Government agency that supports people in financial distress, tackling financial wrongdoing and maximising returns to creditors. Victims are asked to dial a telephone number that, although it does connect to the Insolvency Service, is not one of their official numbers and is premiumrate that costs a lot of money.

5. Bogus bailiffs

Victims receive a cold call by someone claiming to be a bailiff working on behalf of a court, attempting to recover funds for a non-existent debt. Fraudsters request payment by bank trans-

fer and if refused they threaten to cold calls and text messages. visit the people's homes or place of work in order to recover the debt that is owed. The fraudsters often use the names of certified Bailiff Enforcement Agents such as "Scott Davis", "Stephen King" and "Mark Taylor". Remember to always make vigorous checks if you ever get a cold call associated with a bailiff, always request details of the debt in writing to confirm its legitimacy and never feel rushed or intimidated to make a decision based on a phone call a legitimate company will be prepared to wait whilst you verify information.

6. PPI fraud

Fraudsters pose as officials often from the Financial Conduct Authority (FCA) and cold call people stating that they are eligible for a Payment Protection Insurance (PPI) claim. The fraudsters tell you how much PPI you can claim back but emphasise that an advance fee payment is required in order to make the claim successful. You should never take up offers of PPI claims on the spot from cold calls and text messages.

7. Tax rebate fraud

Victims receive a cold call from fraudsters posing as local council officials or professionals stating that they are eligible for a general tax or council tax rebate. They also use a range of other techniques, such as sending text messages, to convince the intended victims that their tax rebate is legitimate. when in fact this may not be the case. The fraudsters will tell you how much tax you can claim back but emphasise that an advance fee payment is reguired in order to make the tax claim successful, Remember, never take up offers of tax rebates on the spot from

8. HMRC fraud

Fraudsters cold call victims and convince them that they owe unpaid tax to HMRC. They also leave victims automated voicemails saying that they owe HMRC unpaid taxes. When victims call back on the number provided, they are told that there is a warrant out in their name and if they don't pay, the police will arrest them. They may also use text messages that ask victims to urgently call back on the number provided. When victims call back, they are told that there is a case being built against them for an outstanding debt and they must pay immediately. It's important to know that the HMRC will never use texts to tell you about a tax rebate or penalty or ever ask for payment in this way.

9. Compensation calls

This telephone scam involves fraudsters cold calling their victims and claiming to be from the Financial Ombudsman Service, telling them they have a cheque for a large amount of money from a compensation claim. The victim is then often told to buy an iTunes (or similar voucher) roughly to the value of £300 to 'release' the compensation. They then claim that a courier will collect it from their home address and that a cheque will be sent to them in the post. Never buy iTunes or gift vouchers if instructed to by someone claiming to be from a government body or official and never hand over any payment to anyone claiming to work at the ombudsman - their service is free to all consumers and they would never ask you for money over the phone.

10. Identity fraud

Identity fraud involves the misuse of an individual's personal details to commit crime. Your details are valuable to criminals and can be misused by them, or sold to others. If your data is obtained by criminals it may be used to obtain credit cards or bank accounts in vour name, as well as numerous other financial products. You should always be extremely wary of unsolicited phone calls claiming to be from your bank or phone provider. Particularly if they are requesting personal information such as dates of birth or passwords. Remember, your personal information is valuable, protect it.

If you believe you have been a victim of fraud:

Call North Yorkshire Police on 101 or report it to Action Fraud by visiting actionfraud.police.uk or by calling 0300 123 2040. In an emergency or if a crime is in action dial 999.



Upper Dales Family History Group

In April we had two speakers, Janet Ratcliffe and Sue Thorne, who are involved with a project chronicling the history of the village of Sessay near Thirsk.

In the course of their research they had stumbled across a collection of handwritten and illustrated magazines, 33 issues in all, produced by a group of former schoolfriends in their late teens and early 20s and circulated around the whole group. Each girl in turn added a section and the whole magazine was then edited by Fanny Booth, a farmer's daughter from Warlaby. Other contributors included some of the daughters of Rev George Dupois from Sessay and friends who had met at a school in Grantham.

Janet and Sue had begun bv researching the Rev Dupois explained the circumstances behind his appointment to the very comfortable living at Sessay where he lived the life of a country gentleman and was credited with resuscitating the local cricket team in between bringing up a large family. A late 19th century census shows the rector and his wife at home with several of their seven daughters (the sons were away at school) looked after by two footmen and several maids.

Three of the daughters, Julia, Laura and Netta, were amongst the writers of the magazine which they filled with serious poems and humorous limericks, romantic stories in serial form, recipes and a wide variety of articles. As well as the insights from the magazines themselves which begin in 1890, Janet

The Stang Road

I mentioned in last month's report that I'd written to Durham *CC* advising them in a 'letter before action' that we were intending to apply for a Judicial Review. This has now produced a response from their head of technical services, John Reed. Although it is mostly non-committal civil servant speak, it does confirm that they will consider our request for the *C*l66 to be upgraded to Priority 1 in their upcoming annual review.

I replied to John Reed and included copies of six articles the Teesdale Mercury have printed through the winter months that are dedicated to the Stang and the problems associated with it; also I directed him and his fellow decision-makers to 'The Stang Road Condition' Facebook page, which has scores of posts, pictures and videos highlighting the dangers of travelling over the Stang in winter. So, they should all be aware of the particular and exceptional conditions of this road.

I understand DCC's annual review should be held in May so by the time you read this we may know the outcome of their deliberations. Let's hope it's favourable for us. Should this not be so, we will at least have further evidence to support our case when applying for a Judicial Review but with luck that may not be necessary.

Venus's surface has only been glimpsed by probes that have survived the horrific conditions, before being "dissolved" by the heat, 465 centigrade, and pressure, 90 times the atmospheric pressure of Earth; not to mention the clouds of sulphuric acid. Life as we know it is impossible on Venus. That said the conditions are not too dissimilar to that of the volcanic vents found on the sea floor of oceans on Earth.

The main geological feature is that of the volcano and there are thousands of them, some still active today, these have formed the smooth lava flow



surface detected by RADAR from space probes. There are six mountain ranges on Venus some 7 miles high, a climber's dream. Combined with the length of the Venusian day, 116.75 Earth days, light is not a problem for the explorer - just the fact that you would be compressed flat and fried before you knew it; and you could marvel at the Sun travelling from west to east as you were.

The first probe to land on the surface of any other planet, Venera 9 a Russian probe, landed on Venus on October 22nd 1975 and lasted 53 minutes on the surface before it succumbed. This was also the first time images of the surface of Venus had been taken. (See next page)

When Venus is observed from the Earth it is seen to rise in the morning; it then overtakes us and is seen to set in the west. Hence the morning and evening star definitions. Venus orbits the sun 13 times, in the same time Earth orbits the sun 8 times and if you plot all the paths that Venus takes you end up with a pattern that is known as the pentagram of Venus, a pretty



pattern but unlikely to protect you from rude punk songs.





Middleham and the Dales Local History Group

On Tuesday 19 June 2018 at 2.00pm in the Middleham Key Centre, Dr Helen Bainbridge will give a talk entitled The Discovery of Swaledale in the early 20th century through the novels of May Sinclair.

Ancient History ... Computer Style

Well that was a weird trip down memory lane: In a dark damp trunk (with rusty hinges that had to be forced) hidden in our outhouse I found things that really defined a major part of my life in the early 80s and 90s and led me to working with computers.

They were numerous card folders each containing a computer cassette with old computer programs dating back to the BBC Micro Model B that I bought in early 1982. From these cassettes you can tell what I was into back then - computer programming. This was before the days when floppy disk drives were affordable for home users - and before hard disks were even affordable for small businesses. so you plugged your computer into your TV and a cassette player, then after a long period of screeching from the cassette player the computer was ready to use.

Three of the things I found were cassettes of the computer languages Lisp, Forth and Pascal, all of which I went on to teach in college (along with quite a few others) and ultimately I ended up running the computer department. This was in the days when people wrote computer programs for fun and it was quite addictive.

I also found a tape of "Turtle Graphics" which was a forerunner of the educational computer language 'Logo', which I have used over the years to teach young children early programming

ideas and which was still used in schools to the end of the 20th century.

The other odd item I found was a book entitled 'Archimedes Utilities'. This was designed for the replacement to the BBC Micro and was again made by Acorn Computers. It was called Acorn Archimedes and was adopted by the BBC as the new BBC computer (though it was a short lived arrangement with the BBC). It didn't use Windows or MacOS, it used a system called Arthur. This was a rush job, because the computers were barely ready by the launch date and the programs were not finished and I have to say Arthur was pretty pointless though it did use a mouse to start programs, but after that you lost the mouse completely. Before too long they developed a new system called RiscOS for its time was revolutionary and a lot better than Windows or MacOS at that time (both of which were in their infancy).

The electronics technology inside the Archimedes was an early version of the chip called Acorn Risc Machine (ARM for short).

Acorn Computers as a computer maker/brand sadly disappeared many years ago. They just could not compete on the global stage with massive US corporations (Windows or Mac at the time both 'acquiring' ideas from Acorn that subsequently appeared in Windows and MacOS without any credit to Acorn's innovations). The RiscOS computer actually re-emerged under license and continued to develop with a niche fan base for years.

So what is the point of this ramble? Well Acorn Computers still exists today and are highly successful, having

morphed into the company called ARM (originally the A stood for Acorn but now stands for Advanced). They have become a global brand in the chip market like Intel and AMD but they have in recent years focussed on the mobile device market. ARM chips are now widely used in a vast range of mobile devices and tiny computers like the Raspberry Pi I wrote about a few months ago. So with hindsight it was sad when Acorn Computers apparently disappeared. but they transformed into one of the most important global tech brands - and the device you are reading now may well have an ARM chip in it.



The Jousting Scholar Lectures On Richard III

World-wide interest has been rekindled in Richard III since the 2012 discovery of his grave beneath a Leicester carpark and as Middleham was his boyhood home, he is the fitting subject of The Arts Society's 50th Jubilee lecture delivered by Dr Tobias Capwell, a world authority on medieval armour.
