However, I am becoming increasingly concerned about the ways in which technology is taking over our lives and how we are becoming dependant on it. Because, when the technology fails, what do we do?

Just recently, because of a glitch, card machines across Europe were unable to accept payments, causing much wringing of hands amongst those who no longer carry cash. In April, a new system failure meant that nearly two million TSB customers could not access their online banking. And last year the NHS, together with many other organisations, was crippled by a worldwide ransomware attack meaning doctors could not see their patients; prescriptions couldn't be processed; and treatments had to be postponed.

Just three examples: The Fire Sale - an all-out cyberwarfare attack that performs a systematic attack on a nation's computer infrastructure - which formed the premise of Die Hard 4, does not seem so fanciful now.

Unfortunately, we are getting less and less choice as more things are put online. You don't need paper bills anymore - you can view them all online. Not much help though when you need a utilities bill as proof of address and only original bills are accepted. And if you are not computer-savvy - good luck to you.

So what will happen when the whole IT infrastructure comes crashing down? BT's answering service sums it

up. I rang to complain that my broadband connection was not working; I got a recorded message advising me to go online to look for possible solutions.

I'll let you have a rant about people becoming addicted to social media or to computer games where the aim is to shoot everybody on your island; or about the perils of the internet. **MAC**

They include araceful goosewings and slender spindles; some are carved, some are plain; a few bear the initials of the owners: all have a beautiful patina of use. They are all little pieces of social history belonging to a single local collector. What is more, they are for sale. Why not pop in to the Museum and purchase a bit of the past, for yourself or as a special present.

Windows Upgrade woes: April update rolling out

I have had a number of people contact me with problems caused by this.

The free Windows 10 update that Microsoft announced on April 10th (known as the 2018 Spring Creators Update) started rolling out worldwide and will take some time. It is an enormous download and can take hours to install and unfortunately there is no simple way to stop it being installed.

This is very much the new model for Microsoft - a couple of times a year they effectively 'offer' a new version of Windows 10 to users. This isn't the usual update it is pretty much a whole new version of Windows with new features and some older features removed. Much of the emphasis is on the newer app interface. I put the word 'offer' quotes because Microsoft effectively force installation on all Windows 10 users. There are ways to temporarily delay the installation but they are not easy to access, especially in Windows 10 Home versions.

You can see if you already have the latest version installed by clicking on Start and going to the Settings cog icon. In the settings window open System and then scroll down and click on About. The newest version is build 1803

There have been lots of niggly problems that people have had to deal with and many of them are conveniently listed with solutions on this page:

https://tinyurl.com/scu2018

There have unfortunately also been a few major issues resulting in people ending up with unusable computers. It is sometimes difficult to know the exact cause of these issues – even when they are well documented online.

Here is my best advice (and this applies generally) to using computers but especially before you attempt major upgrades: MAKE SURE YOU HAVE A BACKUP OF ALL IMPORTANT DATA. Ideally also make sure you have a full system backup so that you can roll back if your system no longer works.

Lenovo computers seem to have a specific issues (albeit intermittent). There is a feature in older Lenovo computers (especially those originally supplied with Windows 7, 8 and 8.1) called "Lenovo Service Engine". This is part of the computer BIOS and has a number of issues – including known security problems but also issues with Windows updates. Lenovo no longer

support it and you should disable it.

If you have a Lonovo computer turn it off - then turn it on and start tapping F2 before the LENOVO screen appears - keep tapping until the BIOS screen appears. You will need to use the arrow keys to find Lenovo Service Engine - set it to disabled and then go to Fxit and use Save and Fxit

There is also some related software installed in windows. You need to go to remove that too but it is model specific - go to the Lenovo website and search for your computer in support and there should be a tool you can download to uninstall LSE from windows. In early 2015 Low Row purchased a defibrillator for the village using grant monies. This was part of a national initiative to give remote & rural communities the chance to deliver immediate lifesaving care responders community first ambulance crews arrived. Mounted on the wall of the Village Institute it stood 'quietly overlooking' community until January this year.

On one of the frequent snowy days of this winter, a medical emergency at the Punch Bowl Inn required the De-Fib to be brought into action. A 999 call to the Ambulance service was made & the code to open the De-Fib box was given, however due to the snow the Ambulance service were struggling to access the Dales villages and, as is often the case, Swaledale Mountain Rescue Team were called out to assist.

Following the use of the De-Fib, the simple task of replacing the used items started. This proved to be challenging to say the least: the Ambulance Service couldn't help as it wasn't their equipment; the Community First Responders couldn't help for the same reason; the local council had no budget to help; and the village institute couldn't help, but do generously provide free the electricity needed to keep it working.

The problem was that 'Low Row organ village' owned the Def-Fib, but the wider 'village' isn't an entity and as such does contrinot have a pot of money for such dales.

things. So, a plan B was needed. Not only did the De-fib need replacement parts, the very expensive battery was coming to its replacement date. Just over £350 was needed to keep it running.

An online Crowd Funding page was set up and Low Row businesses and locals generously donated; the Punch Bowl also hosted a charity evening. After 3 months we had raised enough money to meet the immediate requirement and happily the De-Fib is now fully operational again.

The Community chest money will be used to buy an extra spare set of pads to keep it running for the next 3 years, or until it is needed operationally again.

Thanks again to all the Low Row businesses, villagers & The Reeth Gazette for their help to keep this life saving equipment running.



Look After Your Aorta

Abdominal aortic aneurysm (AAA) screening is a way of checking if there's a bulge or swelling in the aorta, the main blood vessel that runs from your heart down through your tummy.

This bulge or swelling is called an abdominal aortic aneurysm, or AAA. It can be serious if it's not spotted early on because it could get bigger and eventually burst (rupture). In England, screening for AAA is offered to men during the year they turn 65. Men aged 65 or over are most at risk of AAAs. Screening can help spot a swelling in the aorta early on when it can be treated.

You will get a screening invitation in the post when you're 64 or soon after your 65th birthday. You can then arrange an appointment that suits you. If you're a man over 65 and you haven't been screened before, you can ask for a test by contacting 0191 445 2554. If you're a woman or man under 65 and you think you might have a higher risk of AAA - for example, because a close family member has had one please call in to see me or Dr Smart.

An AAA will often cause few or no obvious symptoms, but if it's left to get bigger it could burst and cause lifethreatening bleeding inside your tummy. About 8 in every 10 people who have a burst AAA die before they get to hospital or don't survive emergency surgery to repair it. This is the UK average and I suspect that in the Dales, the chances of survival will be almost 0% given the distance we are from James Cook Hospital.

Screening can pick up an AAA before it bursts. It involves a short ultrasound scan at Richmond. If an AAA is found, you can then choose to have regular scans to monitor it or surgery to stop it bursting. The screening test is very quick, painless and reliable. Research suggests it can halve the risk of dying from an AAA. At the moment only just over half our eligible patients take up the offer of screening, which is the lowest take up in the area. Given the poor survival rate from a ruptured AAA in our area, I would encourage those who receive an invitation attend. 

Matters Arising

Reeth Parish Council May 2018 AGM

Election of officers: Chair - Martin Cluderay; Vice chair - Jennifer Kendall; Green wardens - Graham Frankland and Colin Longstaff; Market representative - Martin Bearpark; Data Protection Officer - Alan Meffen; Clerk - Ian Scott.

Accounts: The accounts for the year were approved.

Dog waste: The dog waste bag dispenser had been installed on a post near the Ice Cream Parlour.

Langhorne Drive: The overgrown hedge in Langhorne Drive had been dealt with. Calor Rural Community Fund: The chair had looked into this source of funding but felt it was not suitable for any local scheme as the allocation of grants depended on a public vote.

Dales Bike Centre: The meeting noted that the plans for the extension of the facilities had been approved.

Richmondshire Area Partnership Fund: The clerk would apply for funding towards the Healaugh defibrillator.

Speeding concerns: The council had been copied into correspondence between a resident and local MP Rishi Sunak regarding speeding near the school. He had forwarded these concerns to the police who were considering ways of monitoring traffic speed on the whole length of the road.

Charity car wash: Permission was granted for the fire brigade to hold a charity car wash on the green on Sunday, May 27.

Highways: Stones needed to be replaced in the retaining wall alongside the footpath on School Hill. A number of pot holes around the green would be

inspected; it was understood that the road was due to be resurfaced this year.

Street lights: The outstanding lights had been fixed and the pedestal lights in Quaker Close were due for repair.

Best Kept Village: Suggestions for providing hanging baskets and pots around the village would not be taken any further due to expense and practical difficulties.

District Council Report: It was noted that Coun Blackie had been successful in lobbying for the new pole at Seal Houses to be a lattice rather than monopole design. Hopefully this would improve mobile phone coverage in the area by allowing other companies to use it if they wished.

Youth activities: Councillors had looked at various options suggested by the PCSO to provide a suitable meeting place for local young people. The suggestion of a 'hub' type shelter was felt to be a good idea in principal but not the most suitable for local needs. Coun Cluderay stressed that it was important for the council to give more consideration to what could be done for young people in the parish.

Rubbish bins: There was an ongoing problem with some bins on the green not being emptied.


this planet we must conclude some form of life has existed or is existing and has achieved a technological level for space flight..."

"Sir, sir . . . "


"Can you remove him, please, as his constant interjections are beyond . . . Thank you."



"The topography of this world is varied over 12 kilometres from the bottom of the deepest liquid ocean to the top of the highest peak which lends belief that this planet has a molten core of rock and metal with a crust made up of rock platelets that interact to form the larger peaks. One can only imagine the terror of existing on a world where the very surface may move and reform beneath your limbs. This



Grinton and Ellerton Parish Council May 2016

Parish meeting: Since last year's meeting there had been no further problems with cyclists on footpaths and the parking alongside the moor road had improved. The defibrillator had been purchased and installed.

Coun Coates proposed that a cleaning and maintenance day should be arranged in the near future as the parish hall had no cleaner.

Election of officers: Chair - Coun Geraldine Coates; Vice chair - Coun Stephen Porter; Memorial Hall rep -Coun Coates.

Commons Registration: Attempts to correct the registration of land at Crackpot had been rejected again due to further objections by Open Spaces who refused to accept that the original registration had been a mistake in spite of written evidence made at the time by the then clerk, Elsie Pedley.

River bank: The trees damaging the river bank had now been removed.

Street Lights: One of the lights in the village was still off and was understood to be due for replacement. Coun Blows would follow this up.

Parish Forum: Coun Coates reported on the last parish forum which had discussed Operation Owl, encouraging the public to report suspicious activity on the moors to the police, and ways of attracting young families to the area.

Ward boundaries: The final recommendations on the boundary review were received. The suggestion of adding Upper Swaledale to the name of the new ward had been accepted.

Finances: The accounts were approved.

Highways: Serious concerns expressed about the state of the road at Ellerton. Coun Blows had been in Highways touch with on occasions and had been assured that the work was in the programme but had been unable to get a firm date for the start. In the light of the lengthy disruption when the work was first done and the amount of money spent on the project Coun Barker said that it was important to know not only when the repairs would be carried out but why the problems had not been properly addressed in the first place.

Coun Fletcher-Lee asked for consideration to be given again to speed limits on the approaches to the village.

Overhanging bushes opposite the end of Stainton Lane would be reported as they were blocking the view of oncoming traffic to vehicles waiting to turn into the lane.

Public toilets: Coun Blows would look into the closing times of the public toilets which locked automatically. This could cause problems particularly during the Swaledale Festival when they were used by audiences attending events at St Andrew's.

Broadband: Coun Fletcher-Lee reported that Grinton would be included in the next service upgrade but the number of properties involved seemed very vague.

Commons Rights: Notice had been received regarding the surrender of commons rights of two houses in the village which had recently been sold. The clerk would ask for clarification on the legal basis for this.

Upper Dales Family History Group

Our May speaker was Peter Higginbotham, who talked about his new line of research into children's homes. His research can be read on the website at:

http://www.childrenshomes.org.uk/

Peter began by outlining some of the early homes set up from the 18th century onwards by a wide variety of organisations, such as religious or occupational groups, and by individual philanthropists such as Thomas Coram who set up the famous Foundling Hospital in London.

Admission policies varied widely between the institutions. Corams would take in foundlings left at the gates but others had quite restrictive rules about who could qualify and children were admitted by a ballot of the subscribers. Many institutions began in London or other big cities but then moved out into the countryside as their organisation changed (and they realised how much their original sites were worth.)

Other famous names were Thomas Barnado who began a work in the east end of London, Thomas Bowman Stephenson who started the National Children's Homes (now called NCH Action for Children) and Edward Rudolf who began the Waifs and Strays Society, now called The Children's Society.

There were many occupational homes that took in children whose fathers had followed a particular line of work,. Sailors was an obvious one, with an example from Hull, but there were also homes for children of clergymen, actors, railway workers,

commercial travellers, and policemen, funded by donations from members of that trade. Other homes were run by religious denominations particularly for children from those churches and there were also 'emigration homes' training those going abroad in essential agricultural and domestic skills. Some were run by the Poor Law system, and later by local authorities, as part of the Workhouse system.

In the later 19th century many of the big organisations adopted the 'cottage homes' housina system, children on smaller self contained village style sites. From 1930 onward local authorities took over and the focus changed from large institutions to keeping the children at home if possible, or fostering or adoption. The very last option was to place a child in a home, and they were usually ordinary houses with small numbers of children on ordinary housing estates.

Peter then moved on to talk about record keeping; some charities have good records, others none at all. Some charities have changed their names, or disappeared entirely. Several have survived but no longer run children's homes and have changed their focus to giving grants or supporting children in other ways. If the charity has ceased altogether there may be information with the Charity Commissioners.

Meetings recommence on September 26 at 2.00pm in Harmby Village Hall when David Turner will be speaking on 'Quakers, radicals and mill owners' his research into the Baynes family of Sedbergh, Middleham and Skipton. For more information contact 07432677783 or email:

Landlords And Property Investors: 2018/19 Is An Important Year For You To Get Your Sums Right

By 2020-21, property investors will only be able to claim basic-rate tax relief on their finance costs for residential properties, which include mortgage interest, interest on loans to buy furnishings, and fees incurred when taking out and repaying mortgages and loans.

The proportion of costs that receive full relief will reduce by 25% a year over four years. This will affect landlords who pay higher-rate tax and could move many landlords into a higher-rate tax bracket.

The biggest problem with the change is that most landlords are completely unaware of it. While investors with a large portfolio might be planning ahead, many with small portfolios alongside a full-time job have no idea what is about to happen. You need to be able to crunch some numbers.

What can be done to minimise the impact of the changes? Whatever you do, there'll be a cost involved in changing things.

Is it worth forming a Limited Company? The capital gains tax on that move ends up being very prohibitive if you have owned the property for some time. A self-employed property investor can claim incorporation relief,

but they must pay stamp duty as a sole owner selling a property to a limited company.

All of the changes in the property sector, including the 3% stamp duty surcharge on buy-to-let purchases and the abolition of the wear and tear allowance means there is more to consider when owning, or considering purchasing a buy-to-let property.

Air BnB Rentals

A simplification measure aimed at those renting out a property through Airbnb is a property allowance for individual landlords whose total property receipts for the tax year (the income that they would bring into account in calculating their property profits) do not exceed £1,000.

This income is not chargeable to income tax. Where total property income exceeds £1,000, landlords may elect for partial relief, whereby they are simply taxed on their income above £1,000 but with no allowance for expenses, instead of calculating their taxable profits in the usual manner.

Rent a Room Relief

Income from renting out a room to a lodger may qualify for 'rent-a-room' relief, if:

- Your gross rent-a-room income does not exceed £7,500 for the tax year (before the deduction of any expenses);
- The source of the income relates to letting a room in your only or main residence: and

of furnished accommodation in a 'residence' in the UK, or from associated goods and services (for example providing meals, cleaning or laundry services to a lodger)

If all the above conditions are met, the income is exempt from tax. You do not need to do anything for the exemption to apply; it will apply automatically unless you 'opt out'.

New Energy Efficiency Standards

New legislation that came in on 1 April 2018 means it will be illegal to let out a property if its Energy Performance Certificate (EPC) band is F or G. The rules are quite complicated so it's worth seeking professional advice to check whether and when you need to comply.

Arkengarthdale Parish Council May 2018

Affordable homes: The result of the housing need survey was discussed. There was a 43% response to the survey and a definite need for nine homes identified. At a meeting of the Upper Dales Community Land Trust Native Architects had impressed with their exciting proposal for the design and layout of the houses and the next step is a meeting with the architects and the National Park planners at the park HQ on 15th May.

Real progress in a very short space of time has been made on these homes, thanks to the splendid efforts of the UDCLT led by County Councillor John Blackie. The houses will be for rent in perpetuity, meaning that they can never be sold for holiday homes. There is still some way to go and funding is now being actively sought.

Highway issues: There are concerns reported by the clerk over snow clearing on the Booze road. Apparently she was told by Highways the service for Booze had been withdrawn. What this means in effect is that Robert Stones used to be called on to clear the road with his Bobcat, the only suitable vehicle capable of negotiating the road up to Booze, and apparently it is this service that Highways will no longer provide. Councillors promised to look into this and have further discussions at the next meeting.

The chairman advised that the offer of a highways official to go round the dale with him to look at all the required repairs had not materialised, and he had real concerns about the state of the Eskeleth road. Some

potholes had been filled but others had not and the edges of the road were in a bad way as well. Councillor Watkins is to attend one of the Highways workshops on 21st May and will raise the matter there.

Boundary Commission: The review of Richmondshire District Council has been finalised, the commission having accepted councillor Blackie's pattern of new wards in the upper dales in its entirety, so Arkengarthdale will become part of an enlarged Lower Swaledale and Arkengarthdale RDC ward from May 2019

Mrs. Applegarth sent details of deregistration of land at Whaw Chapel which had been incorrectly registered. Planning: R/01/143A, this application for a barn conversion at Bouldershaw Lane has been granted. Application R/01/30L at 2 Plantation cottages has been granted. Application R/01/147A for the conversion of the old butchers shop to a dwelling has been received. They acknowledge the letter of support from the parish council.

Local matters: Councillor Lundberg advised of the offer of a seat that the donor wanted to place on Mr. Tildesley's land at Storthwaite. This initially needs further investigation as to whether this is in Reeth parish.

Following the suggestion from the chairman at a previous meeting, Councillor Watkins confirmed that a grant offer of £900 has now been received from the Sustainable Development Fund for an interpretation Board to be placed with the ore cart on High Green. Match funding has been provided from Councillor Blackie's Upper Dales locality budget grant. The board will outline the history of lead

mining in the dale and nearby, and Councillor Watkins is working closely with the National Park Interpretation Officer Karen Griffiths on this project. Retirement: Councillor Clark Stones and Clerk Katie Willkomm both announced their retirements from the parish council. Councillor Stones, has served over 50 years on the council, the majority of that time as Chairman, and all expressed their sadness at his retirement and wished him well for the future. The Chairman thanked him for his exceptional contribution to the dale.

Katie Willkomm served as Clerk for over 29 years and has done a splendid job. She also went with the Chairman and Councillor's very best wishes, and she in turn thanked everyone for their kindness and wished the council well for the future
