#### What is a Luncheon Club?

Who can go to the Luncheon clubs? Anyone who lives in the Two Dales, or who is a former resident of the Two Dales

#### How old do you have to be?

There are no age restrictions. Our current membership ranges from the early fifties to the mid nineties. Everyone is welcome.

#### Where are they held?

In Low Row Institute, Reeth Memorial Hall and Muker Public Hall. Another lunch is also organised for the Langthwaite community.

#### When?

Each of the four clubs meet once every month. Langthwaite on Mondays, Reeth on Wednesdays and Low Row and Muker on Thursdays. Members can attend their nearest club or any combination of the clubs. Several members go to more than one club.

#### What's on the menu?

A three course meal with tea or coffee. Each club offers different menu choices every month with a choice of 3 starters, 3 main courses and 3 puddings. Vegetarian options are also available on request.

#### Who cooks the food?

Rachel Newborn (from Satron) is our main caterer. She has support from Gladys Atkinson at holiday times, and several volunteers help with the food preparation and washing up.

How much does it cost?

Each lunch currently costs £8.

# Do I need to book in advance or can I just turn up on the day?

You do need to book your menu choices a week before each lunch so that we have time to collate all the orders and buy the food to be sure that there are enough portions of every option available on the day.

#### Where can I get the menus from?

Each Lunch Club has a volunteer coordinator who issues the menus and collates everybody's choices. The main ones are: Janet Bethune for Langthwaite, Mike Beckwith for Muker and Alan Thorogood for both Low Row and Reeth. Reeth menus can also be

picked up from and returned to the Post Office or the Gift Shop. We can also email the menu choices to you if you like, please call Alan on 886524 for any assistance with the menus.

# I live in Reeth. Can I go to the Luncheon Club in Low Row?

Yes you can. Several members go to more than one club.

# I don't have any transport. How can I get to a Luncheon Club?

For Muker and Low Row we use the Community Bus to provide a subsidised transport service to get people to the lunches. For Langthwaite and Reeth we use volunteer drivers (because the Community Bus is doing its regular shopping trips on Mondays and Wednesdays). volunteer coordinators will always do their best to organise transport for anyone who needs it.

- You have a really good lunch and don't have to worry about doing any cooking or washing up. And you won't need to eat much else for the rest of the day.

# Arkengarthdale Parish Council, July 2018

Robert Stones and Susan Dray were welcomed as newly appointed councillor and clerk to the Parish Council respectively. A card from Katie Willcomm was read out, thanking the Parish Council for their kindness and efficiency during her time in post as Parish Clerk, and at her retirement, and wishing the Council well in the future. The councillors expressed their thanks to Katie for all her efforts and time over the past 29 years.

Affordable housing: Information and plans by Native Architects for affordable housing near Langthwaite had been put on display at a public meeting held at the CB Inn on 8 July 2018, and had been largely well-received by the public. Funding had been received from Richmondshire District Council for these plans, and further funding opportunities were considered and identified. Potential funders would be approached once a business plan had been produced.

Interpretation Board: The text and image for the interpretation board to be placed next to the ore cart on High Green had been approved with the Yorkshire Dales National Authority (YDNPA), and would consist of a brief overview of the local history of lead mining and an artist's impression of an ore cart in use. The cost of the stand for the interpretation board sourced by the YDNPA had seemed expensive so they would be asked to consider mounting the board on an alternative stand provided by the Parish Council.

Road repairs: The road to Booze had been resurfaced. Highways were monitoring the drainage. It would probably need a more adhesive surface come Autumn when the leaves were likely to make it difficult for two-wheel drive vehicles on the steep part leaving the village.

The Eskeleth road had also been resurfaced and all the damaged areas had been dealt with and a proper drain had been installed near the chapel.

The poor road surfaces between Seal Houses and High Faggergill and outside St. Mary's Church had been raised with the Highways Department, whose legal department were looking into who was responsible for these road surfaces.

The Highways Department was aware of the state of the road between Whaw chapel and the bridge, where it was falling away into the river and was monitoring the situation.

The Highways Department had reported that the water that runs off the land and collects on the Dale road at Danby road-end/Moor Intake was the responsibility of the land-owner.

The Highways Department had been made aware of the permanently standing water (even when there has been no rain) on the Dale road at the turning by the bridge into Langthwaite, and of the standing water on the Arkengarthdale Road, near Town End, that turns to ice in the winter.

Bus Service: A request had been made for a bus service between Reeth and Arkengarthdale. If it could be established that there was a significant need for a frequent bus, enquiries would be made to find out if a service could be provided by the

House in Reeth, and if not, then the Little White Bus would be approached. Rats in Langthwaite: A complaint had received bv Richmondshire District Council from a resident in Langthwaite about the number of rats. Yorkshire Water would be contacted to request that they deal with any rats at the sewerage works on Storthwaite Lane in order to work in a timely way with the rat control being undertaken by Richmondshire District Council at the barn on Storthwaite Lane close to the village. As with all cases of pest control, this was being paid for by the landowner.

Parking: A complaint had been received about cars obstructing the entrance to Storthwaite Lane when parking at the side of Waterfall View cottage in

Community (Yellow) Bus at Hudson Langthwaite. A diagram would be drawn up to identify where cars could be safely parked and the owner of Waterfall View would be contacted and asked to inform all guests of the recommended parking arrangements at the cottage. Several complaints had been received about cars parking on the road and/or the pavement outside The Rigg and dangerously obstructing pedestrians and cars. The owner of The Rigg would be contacted.

# TIGHR Rag Rug Exhibition, October 2018

More than a hundred professional and semi-professional hookers and prodders from around the world will descend on Reeth this October. The international group of rug makers are meeting for a four-day celebration of the ancient craft, as part of the conference held every three-years by The International Guild of Handhooking Rugmakers. (TIGHR)

Previously held in places as far Island afield Vancouver and Australia, 2018 marks the UK's turn to host the rug making elite. Visitors from Japan and the USA are among the many who will travel thousands of miles to attend the event. #### **Upper Dales Family History Group**

June's speaker was Gill Parkes, an archivist at Durham County Record Office, who had scoured their archive to bring us a vast array of wedding photographs, dating from the 1860s to the 1940s, illustrating all levels of society. As some of the photographs were accompanied by newspaper reports of the ceremonies, it was possible to imagine the colours and fabrics of the clothes and zooming in on the scanned pictures showed trimmings and jewellery in great detail.

Some of the earliest examples were of Quaker weddings, some from wellfamilies. known showing their distinctive style of dress and in at least one case accompanied by a later picture of the couple with their children.

Durham Liaht The Infantry collection had produced a number of photographs of military weddings, many from the times of the two world wars. and many with fascinating, often poignant, stories to go with them.

forward Movina through decades and with cameras becoming more widely available, as well as grand society weddings, we began to see

ordinary workina class families. pictured outside terraced cottages or in back yards, dressed in their best for their big day. The photographs traced the changing fashions for wedding dresses, some of which were grand enough to now be in the Bowes Museum. as well as the bouquets, and the clothes and hats of the guests.

Gill ended her presentation with advice on what to do with our own collections of photographs, stressing the importance of clearly labelling everything with date, place and subject if known (but absolutely not writing on the pictures themselves.) and adding clear instructions as to what should be done with them.

15/07/2018 14.00hrs: (30) Team called by the Ambulance Service to assist with the evacuation of a casualty near Round Howe. Stood down as first team members arrived.

**12/07/2018 2350hrs** (29) Team called

by the Ambulance Service to rescue a person who had become stranded in the dark on one of the currently dry rock islands above Richmond Waterfalls. Water rescue Techs made their way to the casualty & then recovered them to safety.

07/07/2018 12.30hrs: (28) Team called to rescue an injured young mountain biker above West Burton. Treated on scene be ambulance crews & evacuated by the team.




# Astronomy In The Two Dales

The asteroid belt is a ring of dust, gas and rock which circles the Sun between the orbits of Mars and Jupiter.





At the moment we know of 7000 asteroids, some are quite large: Ceres is classed as a dwarf planet, 590 miles across, and is one of 16 asteroids that are large enough to land on. The total mass of the entire asteroid belt is enough to make a body 1500 miles

that the chance of hitting one is one in a million. This makes mining asteroids impractical, even with robotic devices, as only 10% of asteroids contain metal.

So, where did all this rocky junk come from? Once again two possibilities arise: left over "stuff"

So, where did all this rocky junk come from? Once again two possibilities arise: left over "stuff" from the formation of the solar system which has been pulled out toward Jupiter; and option two, that a large asteroid/planetoid hit Mars, removing most of its atmosphere and leaving it as the dead planet we see today.



An object 1500 miles across impacting Mars, which is 4000 miles across, would devastate any ecosystem that existed, probably removing some of Mar's surface as well, all of which has, over time, formed the ring of debris that we see today and left the vast scars that we see on Mars.



# Muker Parish Council June 2018

Defibrillator Tan Hill: The defibrillator has now been installed and a sum of £570 has been received from Tan Hill Pub. The Clerk has registered the defibrillator with the Yorkshire Ambulance Service. Clerk to contact Tan Hill's new owners and check whether the battery has been installed. Clerk to contact Mike Peace to thank him for his contribution.

Toilet Lights Muker: An e-mail had been received from Cllr Blows. Residents are still having problems regarding the lights shining into their properties; a timer is not thought to be the best solution. Clerk to contact Cllr Blows.

General Data Protection Regulations: Information had been received from YLCA stating that Parish Councils are now exempt from appointing a Data Protection Officer. Consent Forms were completed by the Councillors present. Clerk to send forms to remaining Councillors along with Privacy Notice. A Record Management Policy had been drawn up and was agreed by the meeting to be adopted. An audit had been carried out by the Clerk, whilst there is not a lockable cabinet information is kept within a lockable room.

Finance: an order to pay Michael Guy £174.00 for the installation of the defibrillator at Tan Hill was raised.

Highways: Cllr Calvert raised the issue of the cattle grid at Ravenseat where the wooden railings are rotting away. Clerk to contact Highways. Cllr Metcalfe also asked that the cattle grid between Ivelet and Gunnerside be

reported as it needs weeding.

Grass cutting, Muker: A request to be made of the grass cutting crew who are responsible for the Green at Muker to also cut the green at the top of the Village and the area around Hylands. Car Park Pothole: Cllr Whitehead raised the issue of a large pothole in the Car Park at Muker. Clerk to contact Highways.

Street Lighting - Part Night Lighting: A letter had been received from RDC regarding street lighting within the village. RDC have requested that some lighting within the villages of the Parish be turned off between the hours of midnight and 5.00am in a bid to reduce energy usage. The Parish Council felt that many of the lights within the villages were needed. However they would like to seek the views of members of the Parish. If anyone has a view on whether certain lights could be turned off between these hours they are asked to contact the Parish Clerks or their Local Councillors. Clerks to respond to RDC.

NYCC - Constituency Committee: An e-mail had been received informing the council of the end of the seven local Area Partnerships, which were to be replaced by 6 Area Constituency Committees.

YDNPA: The Planning Application for Ravenseat Farm for a single storey extension had been withdrawn.

Planning Applications for telecoms masts at Crow Trees and Crook Seal Birkdale, had been referred to a Planning Committee on 12 June.

Planning Applications for Scarr House and Mill Bridge Barn Oxnop had both been approved.

A Planning Application had been received for Aygill Farm for the

conversion of a stone built barn to be converted into a one bedroom local occupancy / holiday rental property. The Parish Council were in support of the application.

Friarage Stakeholder Update: briefing had been received regarding the sustainability plan for the Friarage. A draft business case is to be put forward to NYCC Scrutiny of Health Committee in the Autumn, prior to any potential public consultation. Whilst this process is ongoing the Trust committed maintaining remains to services as they are now at the Friarage including its 24/7 A&E department.

Competition: A company, Clicktrans had been in touch asking the Parish Council to publicise a cycling competition they are holding. People can take part by sending information regarding their agreement.

conversion of a stone built barn to be favourite cycling route. Clerk to place converted into a one bedroom local on Notice Boards.

Monies: Golden Jubilee Fund. The Chairman raised the issue of a sum of money which had been left over from fundraising for the Queens Golden Jubilee and which was still left over following the Diamond Jubilee. This money had been held in a Barclays Account, and then transferred to a Swaledale Fundraisers Account However the Bank intends to start charging £6 per month for the money to remain in the account. 



# Summer Term In Arkengarthdale

As newcomers in Arkengarthdale, we are writing to thank the staff and families who made us so welcome when we enrolled our 6-year-old for the summer term at Arkengarthdale CofE School.

What were we expecting, bringing our daughter here from part of Birmingham prized for the quality of its state schools? From an infant school with 60 pupils per year, a swimming pool, wooded parks nearby, theatres, museums... We imagined her education in Arkengarthdale might be more limited, but offset by fresh air and country living.

It has been utterly beyond expectations. Across the curriculum, the school has given her a wonderfully rich experience. Her reading level jumped three stages within weeks; at the end of term she was immersed in the well-stocked library of chapter books.

Within days of arrival she started cornet tuition with the school's outstanding brass teacher. Her excitement at seeing the Reeth Brass Band play in Langthwaite was only dampened by our expression when she suggested taking up the euphonium as well. We blame the quality of their soloist...

She was amazed by the singing in school music lessons, saying it felt 'like being in a real choir'. At their May Celebration, the expressions on the children's faces as Alistair Griffin sat with them to perform 'The Road' were priceless - and they sang it beautifully too. The children made clippy-rugs to

their own designs, to be included in the Rag Rug Exhibition in Grinton in October. The visit to the Swaledale museum was followed by a morning with the team excavating Roman artefacts at Hagg Farm.

Walking to school through this beautiful dale, sometimes running the final stretch to beat the school bus, gave our girl half a chance at sports day given how quick and strong the local children are. It made a great start to the working day for us too. We used wrap-around care at the school (including forest school, and the film, craft, and sports clubs), and with our work dependent on the Reeth Rural network, the service outperformed our experience of broadband in the city.

Our daughter thrived in the mixedage class. The size of the school ensured supportive learnina environment where she concentrate on a task at her own level. while quietly absorbing what the older children were doing. She came home talking about lessons that the whole school had enjoyed, and observing Year 6 calmly take their SATS in an adjacent classroom demystified the process.

The quality learning of the environment in the Arkengarthdale school. and the taken care understand the needs and motivations of individuals, is how we imagine the best private schooling to be, but it is all here in this fabulous state school on our doorstep. We offer our unreserved thanks to all who have made this summer one to remember Jo & Nick
