

Inheritance Tax overview

Inheritance tax is often called a voluntary tax in that, with planning, the payment of inheritance can be avoided. It is a tax levied on a person's estate when they die and on certain gifts made during an individual's lifetime. We can provide taxation advice to help you minimise the potential charge to inheritance tax.

Inheritance tax (IHT) is levied on a person's estate when they die, and certain gifts made during an individual's lifetime.

Gifts between UK-domiciled spouses during their lifetime or on death are exempt from IHT. Most gifts made more than seven years before death will escape tax. Therefore, if you plan in advance, gifts can be made tax-free and result in a substantial tax saving.

Scope of the tax

The rate of tax on death is 40% and 20% on lifetime transfers where chargeable. For 2018/19 the first £325,000 chargeable to IHT is at 0% and this is known as the nil rate band.

Residence nil rate band

An additional nil rate band is introduced for deaths on or after 6 April 2017 where an interest in a qualifying residence passes to direct descendants. The amount of relief is being phased in over four years: starting at £100,000 in the first year; £125,000 for 2018/19; and rising to £175,000 for 2020/21. For many married couples and registered civil partnerships the relief is effectively doubled as each individual has a main nil

rate band and each will also potentially benefit from the residence nil rate band

The residence nil rate band can only be used in respect of one residential property which does not have to be the main family home but must at some point have been a residence of the deceased. Restrictions apply where estates (before reliefs) are in excess of £2 million.

Painter of Sunlight: Joaquin Sorolla

During his lifetime, Joaquin Sorolla popular. (1863-1923) was a internationally-acclaimed artist outside Spain and the USA he is largely a forgotten figure today. Gail Turner, an expert in Iberian art who holds the equivalent of a CBE for promoting Spanish Culture, will explore his work for The Arts Society Wensleydale. This first lecture of the 2018-2019 season is on Tuesday 9th October at 2pm in the Middleham Key Centre.

Sorolla's eclectic approach encompasses impressionistic figures and high-key colours in an expressive style. His lucrative society portraits employ a more sombre palette but with bravura the same brushwork. reminiscent of John Singer Sergeant. Sorolla's best landscapes are suffused with Valencian sunlight, about which he declared: "Every effect is so transient, it must be rapidly painted."

Given the enduring popularity of Impressionism, it is surprising that his accessible work is not better known. This is a rare opportunity for us to learn more about him.

New members will receive a very warm welcome. Visitors pay £8.00 a lecture, which will be refunded if they join.

Tax on Holiday Cottages

I am concerned that much has been published in the press and by "Financial Advisors" suggesting that let holiday cottages qualify for 100% Business Property Relief for Inheritance Tax particularly after a recent tax case.

I am no longer in public practice but remain a member of the Institute of Chartered Accountants Tax Faculty and try and follow some matters. HMRC are increasingly challenging such claims and, although one case was decided in the taxpayer's favour, the facts were exceptional and the First Tier Tribunal, which heard the case commented that only exceptional cases will qualify. The majority will not.

Interestingly another case suggests that if the holiday let is part of a wider qualifying business, eg a farm, it may qualify but that is a very complicated area.

I am also aware the Government is considering whether holiday cottages should be treated as businesses for rating purposes. As such, presently, being of low rateable value, they fall within the Business Rates exemption and so pay neither business rates nor Council Tax. I believe it is our own Rishi Sunak's department which is considering this and councils in the south west are pressing for a change. Other cash strapped councils may be expected to do so.

The present allowance may, therefore, be tightened up but even the present allowance is dependent on the degree of letting including days available for let and those actually let. Even if you claim it comes within the "Available for Letting" rules but is not

actually let so much even if it is for more than the minimum, I understand increased scrutiny may be expected including evidence that a very real attempt is being made for regular lettings.

Owners of holiday cottages may wish consult their tax advisors on these matters.

Astronomy In The Two Dales

"That Zeus is king in heaven is a saying common to all men."

Jupiter is the fifth planet from the sun and by far the largest, having a mass equal to two and a half times all the other planets combined even so it still has a mass one thousandth that of the sun.


Jupiter has 69 moons, four of which are visible from Earth with a pair of binoculars, there is also a faint ring system, like Saturn's, but not visible from Earth. The largest moon, Ganymede is larger than the planet the distance involved (45 minutes at



Mercury and Europa has an ice covered liquid ocean which future space probes will be sent to explore.

Jupiter is composed mainly of hydrogen and helium, and can be considered as a failed star or even as a brown dwarf star, that did not have enough mass to ignite, even so Jupiter radiates more heat than it absorbs from the sun. The core is dense and may even be solid, composed of gas compressed until it has solidified, possibly even into a diamond between 12 to 45 times the mass of Earth.

Jupiter is the real place in the solar system to send manned missions, with

the speed of light) this is a major undertaking from Earth, less so if we had a base on or in orbit around Mars. Manned bases on the moons of Jupiter would allow exploration of yet more of the outer solar system, however, present day technology requires crews to be confined in their craft for years as they crawl through vast expanses of darkness until they reach their final destination





Healthy Ageing Advice: Don't Neglect Your Strength & Balance.

Walking is just not enough, according to a new review of the evidence from Public Health England. Their review concluded that while aerobic exercise, such as walking or gardening, is good for the heart and improves the circulation, PHE found that muscle, bone strengthening and balance activities, which are equally vital for health, are being neglected.

"People's understanding of walking more and doing aerobic activity, keeping up the heart rate, has grown, but the need for us all to do two sessions of strength and balance exercise a week has been the Cinderella of public health advice," said Louise Ansari from the Centre for Ageing Better.

In older adults poor muscle strength increased the risk of a fall by 76%, PHE said. Those who have already had a fall are three times more likely to fall again. Strengthening and balance activities not only help prevent falls, but also help improve mood, sleeping patterns, increase energy levels and reduce the risk of an early death.

Toilet Lights Muker: Cllr Blows has spoken with Gary Hudson of RDC. A timer had been fitted and Gary Hudson was under the impression that the bulbs were 5 watt LEDS and therefore felt that the matter had been resolved However Cllr Blows had informed him that the issue was not the times at which the lights were on but the intensity of the lights and that they could not be only 5 watts. An engineer has been requested to check the wattage of the bulbs. Gary Hudson had also responded regarding the Toilet charges being waived for Muker Show day, he was going to run this past Colin Dales There was also regarding the opening times of the toilets as members of the meeting felt that 8.00pm was too early to close the toilets particularly in the Summer months

Cattle grid Ravenseat: Highways have repaired the fence.

Cattle grid Ivelet: Highways have raised an order to clear out the grid.

Grass Cutting Muker: The Clerks had requested that the areas in the village be added to the schedule for grass cutting however there is some confusion as to who is carrying out the grass cutting of the verge, neither Highways or RDC say they do it.

Street Light: Part Night Lighting: there hasn't been any feedback from members of the Parish regarding this issue. Members of the Parish are reminded that if they have a view on whether certain street lights should be turned off to reduce energy consumption between the hours of

midnight and 5.00am they are requested to contact the Parish Clerks or their local councillor.

Highways Silver Hill: Cllr Blackie informed the meeting of his concerns regarding a NYCC Contractor who has informed NYCC that they wish to stop gritting the section of road between Silver Hill and West Stonesdale as it is unsafe for the grit wagon. Cllr Blackie and those present at the meeting felt that this was totally unacceptable. Highways have suggested that the work to improve the bend on Silver Hill is larger and more complicated than first thought and will be carried out next year. Clerks to write to NYCC Highways expressing the Parish Councils concerns regarding gritting.

Northern Power Grid works Keld: Cllr Blackie explained the issues surrounding the works to be carried out in Keld. The works have now been moved to October and instead of a 5 week closure, the road into the village will be closed for 3 weeks, with traffic lights by the memorial with occasional waits of no longer than 10 minutes.

Greenlands Premises Licence: An application for a premises licence in respect of a B&B had been received by RDC. The Parish Council had no objections to the application.

Commons Act: Application Thwaite Common: A notice to amend the register to record an historic event for a new right of entry to exercise 36 sheep gaits over Thwaite Common. Commons Act Application Ivelet Pasture: A notice of an application to correct the register: to change the name and address of the right holder: Notices have been displayed on the notice board for information.

Planning Application High Frith: A planning application had been received for the re-occupation of a former House: No objections from PC.

Planning Application Crowtrees and Crook Seal: The applications have been approved conditionally

Planning Application Kisdon View: A new application for Kisdon View Angram had been received. The Parish Council were in support of the new application and felt that it would meet the neighbour's objections whilst giving the applicant the building they need.

Planning Application Foal Ings, Muker: For the erection of a single storey extension: No objections from PC.

Tree Works: The Council have been notified that YDNP had given consent to fell one Leylandii located at Greenacres Angram.

Middleham and the Dales Local History Group

Session 2 (of a 3 session course on Vernacular Buildings and Maps for Local History Studies) Recording and interpreting vernacular buildings in the Dales, will be presented by Alison Armstrong at Middleham Key Centre, on Tuesday 2nd October at 2.00pm


