First Thoughts . . .

I feel a rant coming on.

"What's the point of taking things round to the recycling bins?" someone asked me the other day. Before I could start discussing the environmental benefits of re-cycling, he went on to say: "Because people take all sorts of rubbish there and just dump it in or around the bins, without any regard to what should be put in them."

I must say he has got a point and we had a discussion about the selfish attitude of some people who think rules don't apply to them; but also about the need perhaps for people to be educated about what can go in the bins.

The powers that be must have been listening to our conversation, because the very next day new posters appeared at the Recycling Centre. One poster makes it clear that it is **not a refuse site** and that illegal dumping of rubbish is fly tipping. For that, you could be fined up to £50,000 or receive a custodial sentence. (Sent to prison, in other words.)

Another poster implores us to *Recycle Responsibly* by putting our recycling in the correct bin. Not doing this means the council then has to sort through the bins. This costs money - which means we are paying for it through our council tax bill.

That poster also says that if the bins are full, we should take our recycling home - or risk being prosecuted for fly tipping. (Just dumping the recycling on the floor, in other words.)

In addition to the posters, each bin now has a large sticker on it stating quite clearly what can and cannot go in

the bin. For example, NOT: takeaway pizza boxes, polystyrene, black plastics, oil cans, paint tins and bubble wrap - all of which are often dumped there.

Personally, I think the council do an excellent job in trying to keep the Recycling Centre tidy and have now made it clear what can be left there. Sadly, there are some amongst us who just couldn't give a ****.

Police Report

Once again we have a few incidents of note in the two dales of Swaledale and Arkengarthdale and general neighbouring areas. Anyone with information about possible suspect persons or vehicles should continue to pass this on to our Control Room staff by dialling 101.

Several thefts took place around 3rd October where 3 males one of whom was in a wheelchair, appeared to remove several bottles of alcohol from a shop in Leyburn and a possible suspect white vehicle was also seen at the time. A similar vehicle was seen at Bellerby where chainsaws, power tools and circular saw were taken from a container.

Sometime around 27th September a Lambert pressure washer was taken from a farm in Aiskew which would have needed to be removed by a machine as it is a very heavy piece of equipment. On 26th September a copper cylinder and lead were stolen from a building on the Business park at Leyburn.

Between 18.00hrs on 26th September and 06.45 hrs on 27th September sheep were stolen: 20 ewes, 19 gimmer lambs and a Bluefaced

Leicester tup from a farm near Newton Le Willows. Sometime from 25th August to 3rd September out of Leyburn on the Wensley road, 2 shipping containers were broken in to and locks damaged.

A dog escaped from a property and as a result death of livestock occurred and a vet had to be called out. The consequences of sheep worrying can result in a conviction or the offending dog being shot if caught in the act. A reminder was sent out only last month to keep dogs under close control.

Anyone with any information regarding these incidents is strongly encouraged to come forward and report it. All information received will be treated in the strictest of confidence.

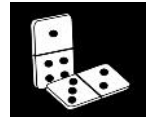

One of the frustrating things about Windows Update in Windows 10 is that Microsoft no longer give you any choice in the matter - they won't even let you permanently disable it any more. (It automatically turns itself back on again after a few days if you try). To make matters worse they now release a large update in spring and autumn with new features (and often delete features they think you don't need any more). These are time consuming and error prone - the one last March I mentioned in a previous article caused quite a few people problems locally. Going forward I don't really see a solution to this problem.

One of the less obvious features of these large scale updates is that Microsoft reset some power settings during the upgrade. One in particular has caused quite a few problems and I recommend turning it off. The feature is designed to make your computer switch on quickly - it does this by saving a record of your computer's system state before turning off and reloading it when you turn on again. This has the knock on effect that if you have an issue that causes your computer to crash and restart there is a good chance it will go into a loop of restarting or not starting properly. You can turn it off by going to Settings and type Power, then on Power and Sleep. On the right is a link to Additional

Power Settings which opens a new window. Click on "choose what the power buttons do" and then "Change settings that are currently unavailable". You can now untick "Turn on Fast Startup (recommended)". While you are there .I recommend changing the "Power Button" setting to Shutdown (which allows you to use the power button to switch on and off). Then click OK.

The Fast Startup setting needs to be changed after every large feature update from Microsoft as they turn it back on again. This setting ensures that every time you turn on your computer that it starts from scratch and does not load problems from your last session.

Sadly this will be my last "Carol's Computer Corner". I have been writing these articles almost every month now for over 10 years and feel it is time to stop. Dales Computer Services will continue with web design and hosting. Scam Advice From North Yorkshire Community Messaging

The latest figures from Action Fraud indicate that the telephone is still the most common method for scammers to contact their victims.

The most common types of scam being reported is where people are called from someone claiming to be from the HMRC, stating the person has an outstanding debt and instructing the person to pay that debt by I-tunes vouchers.

Similar scams include the caller claiming to be from Microsoft/BT/Talk Talk etc and claiming they have identified a problem with the person's computer. They then ask the victim to download a piece of software which

allows the scammers access to the victim's computer and invariably their bank details. Remember, you can eliminate cold calling by purchasing a call blocking device or a new phone that has call blocking features.

The next highest category is frauds and scams involving auction sites. (eBay, Gumtree etc). Be suspicious of any potential seller asking you to send money via direct bank transfer and not through PayPal. You have no protection if it goes wrong. Also, be suspicious of emails purporting to be from PayPal advising advance payment is needed.

PCSOs and Cyber volunteers are giving numerous presentations throughout the county on frauds and scams which are well worth attending and may just give you that bit of knowledge to prevent you becoming a victim. 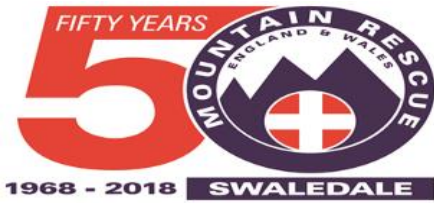

Silver Hill: Cllr Don Mackenzie had responded to concerns regarding the proposed reduction in gritting of Silver Hill by the Highways Subcontractor. He stated that there would be no change to the current levels of gritting.

Grass Cutting Muker: There had been no response from Highways regarding the request to cut the green at the top of the Car Way. The Clerks had spoken with the contractor cutting the main green and they had confirmed that they were contracted by Highways.

Part Night Lighting: There had been one response by a resident regarding street lighting in Muker. The meeting felt that there should be no reduction in street lighting levels.

Highways: The Clerk of Melbecks Council had contacted the Clerks to say that a resident had raised the issue of missing reflective strips on the Buttertubs Pass. There are a number of areas where the strips are missing. Cllr Metcalfe also raised the issue of missing cats' eyes. Clerks to contact Highways to request replacements for the missing strips and cats eyes.

A recent accident with a motorbike on the Buttertubs was also discussed. Cllr Reynoldson stated that there was still debris piled up at the side of the road. Clerks to contact Highways.

Cllr Metcalfe raised a potential problem about tractors with trailers being able to turn properly around the corner by the Institute. He stated that whilst the area had been much improved it may cause problems. Clerks to arrange a meeting with the relevant parties to discuss the issue. Cllr

Metcalfe also pointed out that there was a large pothole outside the Institute in Muker which needed repairing. Clerks to contact Highways.

Cattle grids: Cllr Metcalfe raised the issue of the cattle grids at Ivelet that still requiring cleaning. Highways had stated that they were to be done. Clerks to raise again with Highways. Cllr Reynoldson stated that the fence on the cattle grid on the Buttertubs required repairing.

Grass cutting of roadside verges was also raised as a problem; Cllr Metcalfe said that they were cutting the grass but missing bushes and trees, all the way along the B6270. Clerks to contact Highways.

Richmondshire DC: Cllr Blows had forwarded a press release from RDC regarding an upgrade of 14 Public Toilets. They have allocated £100,000 towards the upgrades and the work is expected to be complete by March 2019. Both Muker and Keld toilets are included in the upgrade. Cllr Blows has requested that 'sensible lighting' should form part of the upgrade at Muker.

YDNPA Planning: A planning application had been received for a loft conversion at Kisdon in Muker: The Council had no objections. Kisdon View, Angram - The Planning Application has been approved conditionally.

Astronomy In The Two Dales

Saturn, known as Cronus to the Greeks, castrated his father with a stone sickle and ate his own children. Thank goodness Saturn is one billion miles away from us.

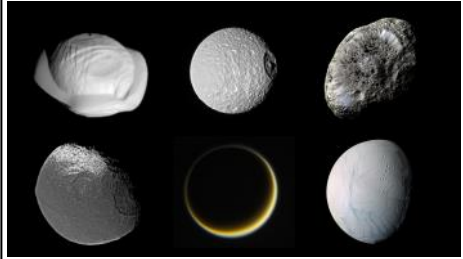


Ninety five times the mass of Earth, Saturn is a gas giant planet composed mainly of hydrogen and helium, the internal pressure being so great that the gases become metallic in nature. Famous for the ring system that is visible from Earth with a telescope, this planet is the furthest that we can see in the solar system with the naked eye.

This is a hostile place, average temperature of -185 centigrade with a wind speed of 1100mph, there are storms at both poles many times larger than Earth.

There are also 62 moons not including the small moonlets which are part of the ring system. Many of these have bizarre shapes and do not look like natural objects, however the gravitational pull of Saturn is enough to distort rock, which may account for the weird look of many of its moons. The ring system extends 75000 miles out from Saturn and is composed of dust

and ice, with some larger chunks which sweep the rings into separate tracks, it has been suggested that the rings may only be 250,000 years old and are composed of the remains of moons destroyed by collision.



Many missions have been past Saturn with the Cassini probe being the only one to dedicate its mission to the Saturn system alone. There may be more explorations as Saturn is still considered to be a viable (affordable) option for NASA as part of their ongoing New Frontiers programme of missions. NASA previously requested plans to be put forward for a mission to Saturn that included an atmospheric entry probe and possible investigations into the possible discovery of life on Saturn's moons Titan and Enceladus as well as establishing a manned presence on one of the Saturn system's moons.

**Marvels In Silver:
Georg Jensen Jewellery**

The Danish silversmith, Georg Jensen (1866-1935), is considered to be one of the most influential designers of the 20th century. Dr. Sally Hoban, author of Miller's Collecting Modern Design, and a frequent TV broadcaster, examines his life and work for The Arts Society Wensleydale on **Tuesday 13th November at 2.00pm in the Middleham Key Centre.**

Born into poverty, Jensen was largely uneducated and, failing to make a living as a sculptor, turned to silversmithing in 1904. He adopted the Art Nouveau style where beauty, quality and utility were merged in his handcrafted work as a stark contrast to mass produced Edwardian uniformity.

Jensen's innovative silver jewellery, with its non-precious stones was designed as art for the middle classes, evolving into a modernist style in the 1920s, when he achieved world-wide fame. Working collaboratively with his designers, he inspired them to explore their own creativity and ensured they were always fully credited for their work. This principle continues to the

present day in the prestigious Georg Jensen brand.

Grinton & Ellerton Parish Council September 2018

Council membership: Mark Jones was welcomed to the council following the retirement of Harold Brown.

Police matters: Inspector Mark Gee attended the meeting to answer questions from councillors and residents. Problems had continued with callers trying to get through to the control room due to the high volume of calls. He said that investment was ongoing and asked people not to be put off calling the non-emergency number which now had a facility for callers to leave a number for the police to ring them back.

Road safety in the village was a major concern with speeding traffic and large vehicles, such as coaches accessing the narrow road to the Youth Hostel, combined with increased traffic in general and greater numbers of cyclists, particularly families accessing the Swale Way, felt to be contributing to the dangerous situation. Inspector Gee said that every community had similar concerns and were all competing for the same limited resources to deal with them. Many of the points raised were Highways matters rather than for the police to deal with. Matrix boards were an option but their usefulness varied and was felt to diminish if they were left in the same place for more than a few months. Cyclists who were breaking the law by speeding or riding three abreast could be reported to the police but there were obvious problems with identification after the event.

Coun Blackie offered to arrange a site meeting with the local police and

Highways once a new manager was in place to look at the problems on the ground.

The police had received mixed feedback from the community following an incident involving hunt saboteurs in Reeth.

Asked what he felt were some of the biggest problems in the area at the moment Inspector Gee mentioned child sex exploitation, with even rural communities opened up to worldwide influences, modern slavery, drug dealing which was spreading out from urban areas and cyber criminals using the internet to steal substantial sums, particularly from the elderly.

Youth Hostel: The clerk had written to the YHA head office with members' concerns about fireworks and litter but had not yet received a response from them.

Arkengarthdale Parish Council, September 2018

Planning Applications: The conditional approval of an application at Fairhaven, Booze was noted and two new planning applications were fully supported: one at Fairview, Booze, that made good use of existing facilities without impacting on the view; and the other for Affordable Housing which would encourage young families to live in the dale.

Interpretation Board: A new wooden stand for the interpretation board to be placed on High Green would be locally sourced by the Parish Council and made from green oak. The interpretation board was being sourced through the National Park.

Bench: A request from Hayley Birks for a bench to be placed in Arkengarthdale in memory of Richard Birks was fully supported and a preference was expressed for it to be sited on the grass opposite the CB Inn. It was suggested that, pending further information from the Birks family, the bench should face down the dale.

Bus Service: Both the Little White Bus and the Yellow Bus companies had been approached but neither was able to incorporate a new service between Arkengarthdale and Reeth.

Rats in Langthwaite: Yorkshire Water had been contacted following a complaint from a resident about the number of rats in Langthwaite. The water treatment works and drains in the area had been inspected. There had been no sign of nests or rodent damage on Yorkshire Water's property, and a follow-up inspection would be made with cameras by the end of October.

Car parking: All relevant parties had been advised about dangerous parking on the roadside/pavement next to The Rigg. Messages had also been left for the tenants in the rental properties at The Rigg. The current signage outside Waterfall View cottage at the entrance to Storthwaite Lane in Langthwaite was considered to be adequate, as it was felt that changing existing parking arrangements would simply move the parking problem elsewhere, rather than resolve it. The owner of the Waterfall View would be asked to leave a message for guests to park considerately.

Winter road maintenance: The dale would receive two new bespoke snow ploughs in October, which would be suitable for clearing the dale roads.

Highways: Several potholes in Arkletown and the 30 mph speed restriction sign, which had been knocked over outside The Rigg, would be reported to the Highways department for repair.

Affordable Housing Business Plan: Information from utility companies was being collated for the business plan: A quote had been received from Northern Power Grid to bring in new electricity supplies to four properties. BT would bring in a telephone cable to four properties at no charge on account of a rural allowance per property which was not going to be exceeded. A quote from Yorkshire Water for new supplies and for relocating the water main was still pending.

Financial matters: The audited Year End accounts (2017/18) were approved. It was agreed that, as in previous years, a donation of £50 would be made to The 2 Dales Junior Football Club.
