

Reeth Parish Council January 2019

Speed Restrictions: PC James Smith attended the meeting to explain about the Community Speed Watch Scheme and how it could help in monitoring and raising awareness of problems with speeding in particular areas. The road outside the school was of particular concern and would be suitable for the scheme if a group of volunteers were willing to get involved. Coun Meffen offered to speak to the school and liaise with the police.

Christmas: Carols round the tree had been very successful and the collection had now been sent to Cancer Research. Couns Frankland and Longstaff were thanked for organising the tree which had attracted a lot of positive comments

Highways matters: No response had been received yet from the Highways Officer to the matters raised with him.

The clerk would contact Morrisons Construction regarding a JCB bucket which had been left on the roadside at Fremington.

Leyburn Town Council reported that investigations had now been completed into the flooding at the entrance to Washfold Farm and they were in the process of raising an order to deal with the problem.

Coun Longstaff raised problems which were being caused by stones rolling off the wall onto the road between Reeth and Healaugh.

Bus parking: Couns Cluderay and Frankland would inspect the market place to see if it was possible to mark off a designated area where the Little White Bus could park.

Street lights: One light on Back Lane had been fixed and the other was awaiting a new part. Repairs to the light outside the Post Office were pending.

Healaugh: Couns Longstaff and Frankland would erect the new noticeboard.

High Fremington: The clerk would contact the owner of a property which was still displaying a no parking notice on parish land.

Playground: The RDC inspection report was received.

District Council: Coun Scott reported that RDC had recently passed a motion to allow recycling bins to be placed on areens in tourist areas.

The Mews: The 'no parking' signs had not yet been put up and vehicles were still sometimes blocking access to the garages.







The Stang Road

When I last wrote we had received the news from Durham CC that their Corporate Management Team (CMI) meeting last August had decided, "after careful consideration" not to upgrade the C166 Stang Road to Priority one "as it was much like other Priority two roads in the county."

We have now instigated the promised Judicial Review and served the necessary papers on DCC. They have acknowledged receipt to ourselves and Leeds Court Centre and several letters have passed between us which I have asked the Court to add to the Judicial Review papers. They are too long to include in the Gazette but I've posted them on the Facebook page "The Stang Road Condition" should you wish to read them in full.

In our letter to DCC one of the things requested under the freedom of information act was the minutes to the aforementioned CMT meeting and after prompting they admitted through their solicitor, Neil Carter, that there were no such minutes. The following is an interesting paragraph from his letter to me:

You will see from our Summary Grounds that no contemporaneous written record of the decision to refuse your reclassification request for the Stang Road was made by the Council I therefore intend to produce Witness Statement from the Corporate Director of Regeneration and Local Services as evidence of the decision taken under delegated powers, following the CMT meeting on 8th August 2818. Equally, there were no minutes as such of that meeting but I

have enclosed the Action Log arising from that meeting. Furthermore, we intend to ask the Corporate Director to make a new delegated decision having regard to the points which you raise as part of the JR challenge. I will forward to you a copy of that new decision and the Witness Statement of the Corporate Director, as soon as they are to hand.

We are awaiting further developments.

In the meantime a fully loaded car transporter has slid on ice down the steep part of the Stang, couldn't negotiate the bend and came to a stop thirty yards off the road in the rhododendrons, fortunately although the top deck collapsed down onto the cab roof the driver was unhurt which wouldn't have been the case if someone had been in a car going up the bank when the wagon came down. Copart, the wagon owners, are investigating the possibility of a claim against DCC.

Our December meeting took place over a very sociable lunch at the Three Horseshoes in Wensley where we came along prepared to discuss how the 1918 Representation of the People Act had affected our ancestors. Several of us had 'brought along' an ancestor who would have been able to vote for the first time on 14th December 1918 when all men over 21 and some women over 30 were given the vote, following the lifting of the residential and property qualification.

The conversation covered a wide variety of social backgrounds and sources of information - some of us fascinating turned out to have grandparents or great grandparents! Amongst others we had ag labs, a butcher, an ardent trade unionist and a gamekeeper who was such a character landlord of the that the then Wenslevdale Heifer at West Witton was inspired to sit down in the evening after his funeral and write a truly stunning eulogy which summed up his life superbly. In many cases several generations of a family (plus their wives) voted for the first time on the same day.

We had a very entertaining time and covered a lot of ground, not all of it strictly to do with the 1918 election (there was a fascinating diversion into an 18th century murder story) but we did all pick up some useful knowledge as well, such as discovering that the very useful Absent Voters Lists for the period are available on Ancestry and Find My Past, listing soldiers away from



In The Two Dales

"PLUTO, magnanimous, whose realms profound, Are fix'd beneath the firm and solid ground, In the Tartarian plains remote from fight, And wrapt forever in the depths of night."

Orpheus

After leaving the sun, five and a half hours later, light rays bounce off a small group of objects. Pluto and its system of five moons orbit in the cold darkness of the outer solar system. Pluto is a strange object, originally classified as a planet, then demoted to a dwarf planet, and then the New Horizons probe arrived and detected an atmosphere of nitrogen, methane and carbon dioxide as well as signs of geological activity, caused by glaciers, tectonic plate and impact activity.

The temperature on the surface of Pluto is -240 centigrade which allows nitrogen to freeze and it is possible that there are rivers of liquid nitrogen on the surface as the planet's orbit brings it within the orbit of Neptune,

almost halving its distance from the sun. Crystallised liquid on the surface of the moon Charon suggest the presence of cryo-geysers, venting liquid methane compounds.

The Pluto system is small, half the distance from Earth to the moon in width, with Pluto and its largest moon, Charon dancing around one another in the centre.

This system of bodies is described as being the largest of a group of objects called the Kuiper belt, which orbit the sun at an extreme distance and are assumed to be the remnants left over from the creation of the solar system, more on that next month.

Well, sounds like a very interesting planet. There, I've said it. In fact if we apply the same criteria to Earth as we do to Pluto then Earth does not qualify as a planet either. So there.





Middleham And The Dales Local History Group

This month's talk, at 2.00pm on Tuesday, 19th March 2019 at the Middleham Key Centre, is Sister Dora presented by Suzanne Stirke.

Born in Hauxwell in 1832, Dorothy Pattison was one of 12 children. In her twenties she formed a relationship with James Tate, 2nd Master of Richmond School whilst continuing another liaison with local farmer Purchas Stirke. In 1864 she joined an Anglican religious community near Redcar and became known as Sister Dora. She would devote the rest of her life to nursing.

Moving to Walsall in 1865 she worked amongst the miners and steel workers as a nurse and developed an especially close bond with the local people. Her nursing skills, self-sacrifice and personal devotion to her patients became a legend. After her early death in 1878 her statue was unveiled in Walsall in 1886, reputedly the UK's first statue to a non-royal woman.

Because of her husband's family connections with the Pattisons, Suzanne Stirke has concentrated her research on Dora's life in Hauxwell. It is a dark tale of mental and physical abuse, the children and their mother, lived in constant fear of their father Rev. Mark Pattison.
