Brass Band Contest £3000 Raised

The weekend of Sat 7th & Sun 8th September was indeed a very busy time for Leyburn Band.

Following the dreadful flooding that affected Arkengarthdale, Swaledale, Bellerby and the Leyburn area of Wensleydale, a disaster fund was set up under the guidance of the Two Ridings Community Foundation, On Saturday 7th a joint brass band concert took place in St. Andrew's Church, Grinton. The combined talents of Leyburn Band, Muker Silver Band and Reeth Band gave the capacity audience some excellent music and the event raised over £3.000 for the charity. One of the highlights of the evening was the piece "Pater Noster", written by Rebecca (our conductor) for her sister Emma, who is our Soprano/ Principal cornet player. The piece is inspired by the closing words from The Lord's Prayer.

After this excellent evening, Sunday 8th saw Leyburn playing in the Hardraw Brass Band Festival. Competing against eight other bands from 1st section down to ungraded, it was indeed a daunting task. Each programme was to last 20 minutes and had to include a hymn, march and solo. Leyburn's programme opened with the stirring piece by John Williams, "Olympic Spirit". This was felt to epitomize the spirit of the Dales which is truly Olympian. Then followed the hymn tune "Slane". Arranged specially for Leyburn by our conductor Rebecca. "Slane" is in the country's list of top ten favourite hymns. The words "Lord of all Hopefulness" reflect the feeling

of hope we all feel at this time. Then came the "Pater Noster" piece (that was played on Saturday) again played by Emma Soprano/Principal cornet player. The march Leyburn chose to play was "Marching Onwards", written by Ivor Bosanko, a Salvation Army musician. This stirring Concert March is based on two hymns, "Onward Christian Soldiers" and "I Will Go in The Strength of The Lord".

Finally, Leyburn played an arrangement of a beautiful song from the musical Annie. This song, another arrangement by Rebecca, brings us back to hope, reminding us that "the sun will come out tomorrow and will clear away all sorrow".

When the results came, Leyburn was awarded the prize for the Best March by an Ungraded band, Emma our Principal Cornet won the prize for Best Solo and the band won the D Mark Thomson Trophy for Best Band overall. Rebecca won the tankard for the conductor of the band with the highest marks.

It was a great ending to a busy and successful weekend. The prize money won by Leyburn has been donated to the Two Ridings charity in aid of the flood appeal.

Astronomy In The Two Dales

"It was 4 pm, 30th of July 2019 when I found myself in a somewhat strange situation"

There we were, five of us standing on Reeth bridge. To our right, bales of feed were swept away across the show field. To our left, oil tanks, logs and a paddling pool ploughed their way towards the Swale, while a greenhouse was remodelled into a cubist sculpture. I was feeling the impact of trees and rocks the size of car engines against the bridge. I watched water cascade over Jabz cave and a thought appeared in my mind, I am witnessing the effects of a Solar Minimum*.

A Solar Minimum is when the Sun is at its weakest in its 11-year cycle and our magnetosphere weakens letting through more cosmic rays. These react with particles, dust and soot, in the atmosphere to create clouds. The more these interactions occur the larger the clouds are and the greater water content they contain. The weaker the Sun, the more frequent these events and the more destructive the results.

See the graph on the opposite page where I have marked all the floods (red arrow highlighted), that have affected Swaledale and Arkengarthdale against the solar cycle record that we have. You can see that the most destructive floods were in 1701, 1771, 1864, 1883, 1888, 1890, 1892, 1896, 1899, 1914, 1925, 1936, 1950, 1986, 2000 and 2019.

Of these events only 1771, 1936, 1950 and 2000 occurred when sunspot numbers were above 150. All the other events occurred during solar minimum or during weak solar cycles with 150 or less sunspots. NASA have already warned that the next solar cycle will be the weakest for 200 years so we should expect more such events. When we compare what is happening now with what occurred between 1880 and 1885, there is the potential for several storms and floods in a short period of time. Thankfully we have HINCO on the job who will be clearing the rivers and becks, so if this does happen again the effects will be mitigated.

Meanwhile, back on Reeth bridge, I tried to lighten the mood and said to one of my fellows "Two hundred yards that way, there is alcohol" or; "Do not remind me" was the terse reply.



North Yorkshire is a huge rural county, and people in communities such as Reeth can face challenges in accessing health and social care. The Arts Society Wensleydale moves to Tennants

From 8th October 2019, Tennants of Leyburn becomes the regular lecture for The Arts Society Wensleydale (TASW). Jackie Pope of TASW said: "Membership of the Society has increased by 11% in the last year and we have welcomed 151 quests. The move gives both members and visitors the chance to experience exciting new programme Tennants modern and accessible settina."

Topics will cover a diverse range including: the Art of Ancient Afahanistan: Street Art: Architect Zaha Hadid; and Artists Illness and Creativity. In May 2020, Lee Miller's son, Antony Penrose, will lecture on his mother's photographs: "Witnessing Women at War". This will coincide with the release of a Hollywood biopic starring Kate Winslet as Lee Miller.

In the first lecture of The Arts Society Wensleydale's new season, at Tennants Garden Rooms, Leyburn on 8th Oct from 2-3pm, Architectural Historian Caroline Knight will explore the work and life of the famous wood carver Grinling Gibbons (1648 -1721)

Gibbons virtuoso style of limewood carving was well suited to the Baroque interiors of the time. His skill in intricate decorative carving has never been surpassed and embellishes Windsor Castle, Hampton Court, and Kensington Palace, as well as churches and other public buildings. There are local connections. The "King David

Panel", his earliest-known surviving work, is now in Fairfax House York, returning to the city where it was made. Following the disastrous 1986 fire at Hampton Court retired woodcarver Trevor Ellis, formerly of Coverdale, played a major role in the restoration of Gibbons' carvings. His late wife, Ellie, colour blended the new and restored carvings. Their work is discussed in Michael Fishlock's book "The Great Fire at Hampton Court".

Caroline is an expert on 16th to 18th century British architecture, and is a lecturer at the V&A. Her publications include London's Country Houses (2009) and a history of Kensington Palace. Tickets are £10 (refunded if you join TASW).



Reeth Brass Band

August

A hectic month started on Sunday 4th when the band performed a concert on Reeth Green Bandstand. This was five days after the horrendous flooding and road closures that took place earlier in the week. The proceeds of a collection on the day amounted to over £120 which was donated to the Flood Relief Fund.

West Burton Chapel Anniversary was on Sunday 11^{th} when the service was driven indoors by threatening inclement weather. This is a favourite event for the band, as after the service we are treated to a buffet supper with tables groaning with food and copious cups of tea.

It is believed that the first Scorton Feast dates back to 1257. thought that the band has attended every year, on the first day, for over 30 years. What could be more quintessentially English than a cricket match on the village green with a brass band playing in the corner beside the village hall. Following our concert at 3.30pm a delicious tea was provided before a service at 6.30pm, which attracted a hall packed with people. The service was conducted by the Revd. Les Nevin whose humour has no bounds, his jokes about musicians, especially trombone players are legendary.

Songs of Praise on Reeth Green took place on Sunday 25th at 3pm. The proceeds of the collection on the day go towards the Firework Fund. A big crowd assembled on a very hot day when twelve hymns were sung with great gusto to band accompaniment.

Over £280 was collected on the day. A donation of £100 has since been made to the Flood Relief Fund by the organisers.

The 107th Annual Reeth Agricultural Show took place the following day. With the band leading the Show Officials they marched from the village at 9.30am over Reeth Bridge to the Show Field at Fremington. This road was the scene of devastation less than a month ago with stone walls broken down, large trees and hay bales washed down the river and debris all over the roads It is a tribute to all those who helped to clear up the mess that the event took place at all. Thanks to all that hard work, the day was saved and the sun shone on crowds of people to make the day. The show organisers should be proud of their bravery in continuing the arrangements which proved to be vindicated extremely successful outcome. During the day the band played a variety of music to entertain those present rounding off with the two Swaledale melodies "I'll sing of a place to my very dear' and "Beautiful Swaledale land of rest'

September

Sixty musicians and a choir of thirty staged a musical extravaganza on Saturday the 7th September in St. Andrew's Church, Grinton. The three bands of Leyburn, Muker and Reeth, were joined by the Marske Choir to raise more money towards the Flood Relief Fund. The concert performed to a church packed to overflowing with enthusiastic supporters. The following day the bands last concert of the year, on Reeth Green Bandstand, took place.

With cars covering the village green a good crowd gathered to hear the band play from 2pm to 3.45pm.

Only one other engagement was planned for September. Eggleston Show will be on Saturday 21st. This will be reported in the November edition of the Gazette.



Sustainable Swaledale Update

Hello to the people we chatted to at Reeth and Muker Shows, and we've enjoyed welcoming new people to our meetings. Don't forget to join our Facebook 'Sustainable Swaledale' Group to find out what we're planning and join in. We welcome businesses and other local groups too.

Low Carbon Transport

These days, lots of us are trying to reduce our carbon emissions. However. low-carbon travel can be very tricky, due to our remote location and few public transport options. Cycling is a great low-carbon option but doesn't suit everyone, so it is easy to end up on single-occupancy car journeys, which are about the least sustainable option available (apart from flying, obviously!) However, there are other good options. You probably already know about the Little White Bus (aka Swaledale Shuttle - see www.littlewhitebus.co.uk) which does twice-daily runs through Swaledale and onward to Richmond & Catterick. There are also seasonal bus services like the DalesBus 830 which runs along Swaledale every Sunday and Bank Holiday until 20th October. Full details available at www.dalesbus.org.

Ridesharing is another great option - if two people share, your carbon emissions are halved. Several web-

based schemes exist, including www.blablacar.co.uk and www.liftshare.com/uk. It's pretty simple - you submit details of where you want to travel from & to, and then other users of the website can offer you a ride and a price (it may be free!). Alternatively, you could offer lifts to others. The more people that use these services in our area, the better they will be - so if it doesn't fit your needs now, try again in a few months.

Often, it's simpler to talk to friends and neighbours and organise rideshares locally. Why not arrange a communal weekly shopping trip to Richmond or Leyburn and save yourself some fuel costs? It's quicker than cycling - though of course cycling is a very low-carbon (and cheap!) option.

Climate Emergency

We've been liaising with Richmondshire Council, asking them to join over 100 other UK councils in declaring a climate emergency and then developing policies to actively support carbon reduction. We're delighted that on 23 July, the council voted unanimously to declare a 'Climate Emergency' requiring urgent action; with a range of objectives including "making the Council's own activities net-zero carbon by 2030".



As this goes to press the two joint teams with Hawes lost their respective opening matches but they had not had the opportunity to play together and hardly train together. They have plenty of potential for two good teams.

with residents Compared in Arkengarthdale, Freminaton and Grinton in particular, we escaped lightly in the devastating floods. Tributes to all those who helped support the community would fill several issues of the Gazette but we would like to thank the Reeth Young Farmers for the huge help they have given the community. I would mention our own Ian Rowland-Hill and his colleagues in Upper Swaledale for what they are continuing to do raising money for flood victims and for arranging food parcels to Arkengarthdale and other communities in the immediate aftermath. Also, the fire crews from around the area did tremendous work on the day to rescue people and this, miraculously, avoided any loss of life.

Our MUGA is seriously affected but the field avoided the mud and silt and is back to normal and many thanks are due to Paul Longden and others for all their work.





Joe Rafferty from Ard Rock said: "Swaledale and Arkengarthdale have been the host of Ard Rock for 7 years now, and the valleys and beautiful scenery have given us all so many good times and special memories. On behalf of all the Ard Rock participants and the mountain bike community, we are delighted that the funds we raised will help the local community recover. We would also like to thank the Two Ridings Community Foundation for managing our donation and their hard work so far, we have full confidence that they will ensure that it is used in the best possible way.

Jan Garrill, Chief Executive of Two Ridings Community Foundation said: "The donation from Ard Rock reflects the special place this community has for all the people involved in the Ard Rock event. We will ensure that the Fund's donation is used to help people in the affected area get back on their feet again. But in the meantime, the Dales are open for business as usual, so do continue to visit and support our amazing community".
