Wensleydale Concert Series

As we start our fifth season of concerts on 18th April we have some exciting news and special offers for you. The concert series started almost accidentally when Ι invited professional concert cellist friend to give a concert in May 2015 - so impressed were the audience that I was repeatedly asked when the next concert was going to be and the series was born. Since then we have had seven or eight concerts each year in upper Wensleydale. In 2017 we became a registered charity and began to provide additional events for young people in schools, elderly people in care homes and occasionally in private homes.

Co-op Community Fund

This year we are proud and pleased to have been chosen to receive funding from the Co-op Community Fund. If you shop in the Co-op and have a Co-op card please visit our community page (at www.tinyurl.com/wcs-coop) and select to support our work every time you go shopping. Co-op then makes a donation to our cause for every Co-op product and service purchased during the coming year.

One of the problems locally is that many people do not find evening driving easy and there is virtually no public transport. We plan to use some of the money to provide transport to concerts (by buses and local taxis) from Leyburn and Hawes (and possibly other locations if there is sufficient demand). Please get in contact with us as soon as possible if you would like to register your interest.

The second activity we wish to fund this year is a free daytime mid-week educational event and performance in the summer term for young people. Then another for the general public. Particularly housebound elderly people and those in residential care, inviting professional musicians to perform for them. More information will be on our website later in the year, so please sign up for our email newsletter to keep up to date.

Programme and tickets for 2020

All of our programmed concert tickets are £15 for adults (£1 for children and students) but until the end of March we have a special Early Bird Season Ticket for £60 for all seven of this year's concerts. These can be ordered by printing the form available for download on our website. During April the Season Ticket price increases to £70. If you have bought a ticket to the first concert and would like to upgrade to a season ticket on the night you can do so by paying the difference (£55).

This year we have also introduced a £20 discount for purchases of six or more tickets in one order (again by post). This applies throughout the year. Individual tickets can be purchased by post, online or by the booking line phone number on our website.

We are really pleased to welcome a variety of musicians - a piano duo from Spain (flying over in April especially to play for us); two more piano recitals; a cello and piano recital; a cello recital from Tanya Anisimova from Washington DC (who gave an astonishing performance in 2018) and a wonderful guitar recital. There will also be a special chamber concert in July bringing together 4 musicians to perform Messiaen's Quartet 'For the End of Time' in a concert to remember the life of Grete Buck, who was a close friend and ardent supporter of our series.

The team is made up of highly trained volunteers available 24/7 in any weather, any time. On average we respond to 50 to 60 calls each year. There were four incidents this month.

Incidents Jan 1st to Feb 10th

09/02/2020: Incident 08: Team called by the Police to assist Upper Wharfedale MRT with flooding in Patley Bridge area. We remained on standby at our base but fortunately water levels dropped & we stood down.

08/02/2020: Incident 07: Team called to assist Cleveland MRT with a search for a missing child, stood down en-route when the child was located safe & well.

01/02/2020: Incident 06: Called to rescue 2 walkers reported to be suffering from hypothermia on the Harkerside fells. 'What 3 words' location app was a good way out, so fortunately we had sent another group of team members in to another likely location. This proved correct so the casualties' ambulance, Heli med and team headed off to dry out.

15/01/2020: Incident 05: The teams 2 search dogs were called out tonight to support a neighbouring team with a search. Stood down en-route as the search was concluded.

13,14,15/01/2020: Incident02,03 & 04: Team called by North Yorkshire Police to search & rescue an injured driver below Buttertubs Pass. We attended on a further 2 days, to support the Police with the on-going investigation due to the steepness of terrain.

13/01/2020: Incident 01: Called to assist Cave Rescue Organisation following reports of an overdue caving party. High water levels prevented initial access in to the cave. Once water levels had dropped a joint team found & escorted the cold casualties to the surface.

Each month we'll highlight an item of our rescue equipment; this is how we spend your generous donations. This month we thought you might like to see some of our water rescue equipment.

We are a Type C Team, this means that we are available for national flood incidents as part of the DEFRA multi agency response. When we deploy out of area we always have a team left in the dale for local rescues. We have a number of special rescue boats & water sledges designed for evacuating people from flooded buildings (these were used in the floods in the summer). We have around 15 specially trained water who technicians are also operational mountain rescuers They train as a small unit & also alongside the whole team. It's always cold & wet for them!!

BBC Radio 4 Podcast The Life Scientific Susannah Maidment on stegosaurs



Susie was dinosaur-mad as a child. But unlike most children, she never grew out of her obsession. She tells Jim about an exciting new stegosaur find in the Atlas Mountains in Morocco and describes the time she spent dinosaur hunting (with a toddler in tow) in the Morrison Formation in the American Mid-West: a place where there are thought to be enough dinosaur remains to keep a thousand palaeontologists happy for a thousand years. She is at her happiest out in the field, with a hammer and a notebook, studying rocks and looking for dinosaur remains. We tend to lump dinosaurs together as though they all roamed the earth at the same time which is silly - given that they had the run of the place for nearly two hundred million years. Susie wants to sort out exactly which dinosaurs lived when. Although she warns, the fossil record is woefully incomplete. We will probably only ever know about 1% of what there is to know about all the dinosaurs that ever lived, Producer: Anna Buckley.







A Harkerside farmers' feud

In the mid-1800s, the 19 farmers who battled to earn a living from the limited resources of Harkerside started to realise that the land wasn't big enough for all of them. At least not while grazing sheep on the moor was a free-for-all without rule or regulation.

Daylight and night-time attacks on each other's sheep and aggressive stand-offs between rival gangs of farmers led to a long series of expensive and inconclusive criminal and civil courts hearings, which were reported in the Yorkshire newspapers as the 'notorious Swaledale Farmers' Dispute'.

An illustrated talk on the whole story will be given by Will Swales at the Key Centre, Middleham, on Tuesday 17 March at 2pm; one in a series of public

2 Dales Lunch Clubs

Margaret Jamieson Memorial Lunches Members of the Low Row and Muker Lunch Clubs held special lunches in February to remember Margaret Jamieson who was a long standing member of both clubs until she died last year.

Margaret appreciated the friendship of the other Lunch Club members so much that she left a significant bequest to the Luncheon Clubs Association in her will. This has enabled us to disprove the old maxim that "there is no such thing as a free lunch" as her bequest more than covered all the costs [including transport and hire of the village halls] for the two February lunches.

The Luncheon Clubs Association is a not-for-profit volunteer run organisation for the local Two Dales community, and it runs 4 lunch clubs every month. The lunches are held in Low Row, Reeth and Muker with the fourth lunch being for residents of Langthwaite and Arkengarthdale. excellent three course home cooked lunch is provided for £8, with at least three different menu choices available for each course including a vegetarian option. Transport to the lunches can usually be provided either on the Community Bus or via other members offering lifts. The aim is to provide opportunities for a social get-together, and reduce the feelings of isolation that many less mobile older folk experience in our deeply rural Upper Dales.

We currently have four spare seats available on the Community Bus that brings members from Grinton, Freming-

ton, Reeth and Healaugh up to the Low Row lunches, usually on the first Thursday of every month. So if you'd like to join us and give the lunch clubs a try then please do get in touch. For further details please either ask Susan at the Post Office, or call Julia on 886 524.


For many of us, technology plays a big part in our lives, whether it's a phone, watch, fitness tracker or the sat-nav in our cars. Lots of us own internet-connected devices too: webcams, games consoles, smart TVs, fitness and sleep trackers. And (horrifyingly) 'smart speakers' that listen to all your private conversations, silently learning about how you live, what and who you like - and don't like!

Tech companies spend millions on highly sophisticated marketing, based on the latest research (including psychology, sociology, and behavioural economics), so they can keep us on the technology hamster-wheel. To satisfy their shareholders, they need to keep selling us more.

That means designing new models with new features (many of which are software improvements) and then persuade us that we **need** to buy that latest product.

So how can we keep our older models in good working order? • <u>iFixit.com</u> is a global online community dedicated to helping people repair all sorts of stuff. Its contributors are on a mission to share their 'how to' guides, drawings, videos and parts lists, to help us keep our stuff in good working order. There are free step-by-step guides for over 20,000 products, including clothing, appliances, technology, and vehicles.

The Restart Project is a UK-based social enterprise helping people learn



how to repair their broken electronics and to rethink whether they need to buy them in the first place. It runs regular 'Restart' parties, with people helping each other to repair their slow or broken tech devices. The website (therestartproject.org) has a Repair Resources section, including Top Fixing Tips and a Restarters Wiki covering computers, phones, gadgets, household and kitchen items.

iFixit tells us that companies don't want you to get their products fixed: 'It took a lawsuit to force Apple to offer a battery replacement program. Many companies, including Apple, refuse to sell replacement parts to independent shops.' iFixit says that just isn't right, and believes we should have a right to repair. You can read more about tech sustainability and repairing on our website.

Incredible Swaledale aims to grow fresh fruit and veg for all, using public or otherwise unused spaces. Our Reeth project is starting to take shape, with plans for raised beds and a herb garden. We need some compost or decent soil! If you can help, please email us.



The following incidents of note have occurred in the Dales area -

On 14th Jan, a serious road traffic collision occurred involving a single car between Carperby and Redmire. We would like to thank those members of the public who were first on the scene and called the emergency services/gave first aid at what was an extremely traumatic incident.

On 24th Jan, two fake £20 Scottish notes were used to pay for goods in a business in Aysgarth. Around this time

a fake £20 Scottish note was used in a shop in Hawes.

Between 25th - 27th Jan, three vehicles on Woodburn Drive in Leyburn have been found with damaged tyres. It is not confirmed whether the damage has been deliberately caused and the incidents linked but please be vigilant and do come forward if you have any info relating to this.

On 4th Feb, between 08:00am - 3:30pm, a property in Newton Le Willows, near to Aysgarth Prep School was broken into and items to the value of approx. £4,500 were taken. Investigations are continuing and we ask anyone who may have witnessed anything suspicious to contact us on '101'.

In the last four weeks we have had 10 telephone scam incidences reported to us; five of the victims gave personal/banking details before realising they were being scammed and out of those 10 victims, money paid out has totalled approx. £10,000. Never give out your banking/personal details to callers you cannot verify. Also, never let anyone access your computer remotely unless you have instructed THFM to do so!

MUKER PARISH COUNCIL MEETING 9 January 2020

Village Sign - West Stonesdale - Cllr Peacock stated that the paperwork has been completed and there is £300 available from NYCC. Clerk to contact Highways to arrange a site visit to determine the position of the sign.

Water on Road - Crowtrees - Cllr Peacock commented that Highways were of the understanding that the water was coming off a Landowner's field and have had difficulty contacting the Landowner in question. Cllr Calvert said that he thought the water was due to the gullies not being cleared properly. Cllr Peacock to discuss again with Highways and arrange a site visit. Cllr Peacock also stated that she had reported the lack of grit heaps to Highways at the beginning of December and they still hadn't been done. Crowtrees road. Cllr Peacock stated that there is to be a review of grit heaps later in the year but mainly where there are too many in close proximity to one another.

Highways Issues - Cllr Peacock stated that Highways again think the water at Shivery Gill is coming from a Landowner's field. Cllr Calvert said that all the surrounding land is common land. Cllr Whitehead said that the majority of common land in that area had been allocated to Gunnerside Estate for upkeep. Cllr Calvert said surely it is in Highways interest to deal with such issues to prevent worse repairs being required in the future. Cllr Peacock asked whether the road was gritted. Cllr Calvert said that it was gritted to the border and that it was priority 2. He also stated that a large number of people travel to Cum-

bria for work so are reliant on the road. Cllr Whitehead said that whilst he understands not all roads can be Priority 1 and that Highways cannot possibly grit everything, he would ask that they appreciate the conditions in the area due to the bleakness and altitude. Cllr Peacock also stated that Highways are planning a review of gullies and their maintenance.

Usha gap Bridge - Highways are looking into repairing it.

Buttertubs Pass - Cllr Peacock stated that she would look into the missing cat's eyes and reflective strips.

Streetlight Thwaite - Clerk reported to RDC.

Stained Glass Window Muker - The Chairman read out an e-mail from YDNP Enforcement Officer who is dealing with the issue. The residents of the Chapel have sent the stained glass for repair which is being done offsite and once repaired is to be reinstated into a new window frame.

ARKENGARTHDALE PARISH COUNCIL, January 2020

Report on the prevention of future floodina: David Jeffels. Joint Chairman of York and North Yorkshire Flood Risk Partnership, attended the meeting to explain the requirements of a Section 19 report being produced for DEFRA/Environment Agency on the summer floods. The draft report would be circulated in early February and residents from all the affected parishes would be invited to feedback on the accuracy of the report and the feasibility of the recommendations for prevention of future similar events.

School building Notification had been received by post from RDC during the Christmas period of the intended sale of the building and the subsequent invitation to register an interest to bid before 29 January 2020. community had been informed at a public meeting facilitated by the Parish Council on 9 January 2020 that the Parish Council was not considering registering an interest itself, but would support an emerging community group by registering interest on their behalf, on the condition that the group's proposal for the use of the school building was plausible. A community group was forming and an open meeting to discuss the use of the building would take place on 16 January at The CB Inn at 7pm. Some of the councillors would attend.

Affordable housing: There would be a meeting of the Upper Dales Community Land Trust on 15 January 2020 and Cllrs Stubbs and Watkins would attend. Flooding matters: Thank you letters

had been sent to an anonymous donor, to Mr G Jackson and to Ms S Harding for their generous and kind donations. An offer of a donation from Richmond Motor Club had also been accepted. A quotation had been received and accepted from L&D Construction to repair the flood damaged roadway outside St Mary's Church. The flood damaged road on High Green had now been completed. The three YDNPA footbridges across Arkle Beck which had been destroyed in the flood had yet to be reinstated. These were well used by residents and tourists and YDNPA would be contacted for a work schedule for the replacement of these bridges.

BT consultation on telephone kiosks: BT had cancelled the Parish Council's application to adopt the red telephone kiosk in Langthwaite. The notification letter from BT gave the reason for this as RDC's objection to the removal of the telephone. BT's letter had been poorly worded, but it was inferred from the letter that a working BT telephone would remain in the kiosk.

NYCC Highways: Following a site meeting in November 2020 and an incident on Bouldershaw Lane, Highways had recently started work on Bouldershaw Lane and were due to begin work on the Stang road. The work on the edges of the road between Reeth and Arkle Town had been finished.

Street lights: A broken street light on the bridge at Langthwaite had been reported and fixed by RDC before Christmas, despite confusion over the lack of a ref number on the light. The number, which had been painted over, would be reinstated if possible to make future reporting easier. (continued next page)

Planning matters: planning application - R/01/41B at The Corn Mill, Arkengarthdale, for full planning permission for demolition of the existing dwelling and erection of a newbuild, two-storey dwelling. There were no objections.

Christmas lights on High Green: There had been a lot of positive feedback on the new Christmas lights, including the illuminated reindeer Thanks expressed to the residents on High Green who had supplied the electricity. Local matters: The following matters requiring attention were identified and would be followed up with Highways: potholes on Arkle Town lane: the sides of the road at Beck Crooks; the dangerous drop off into the beck along the riverside road at Whaw. Next March. meetina: Arkengarthdale Parish Council.



Dales Accessible to Electric Cars

The first public electric vehicle charging points have opened in the Yorkshire Dales National Park.

Pod Point units capable of charging two vehicles simultaneously have come into service at National Park Authority car parks at Aysgarth Falls, Grassington and Hawes.

The 'fast'-rated 7kw machines are expected to be used by people looking to top-up their car batteries. An hour of charge at the new points will add around 30 miles of range for a typical full-battery small electric car.

Electricity has been led to the Pod Points from the National Park Centres which are located next to the car parks. All centres are currently supplied with electricity generated from a mix of conventional and renewable energy sources, but contracts are currently being reviewed with a view to switching to a 100% 'green' tariff.

There are six other electric vehicle charging points in the Yorkshire Dales National Park listed on Zap Map: at a business near Sedbergh; at Stone House Hotel near Hawes; at two holiday cottages in Bishopdale; at the Devonshire Fell Hotel in Burnsall and at the Devonshire Arms Hotel near Skipton. These pioneering installations, however, are intended for use by customers rather than the general public.

Flood remedial work

The chair, Coun Kendall, summarised correspondence regarding the ongoing clearance work in Arkle Beck, covering some problems which had arisen with the extent of the work, who had authorised it and who was responsible for paying for some elements of it. The contractor also attended the meeting to explain some of problems arising from conflictina instructions and advice from different parties involved.

Coun Good would approach the Two Ridings Foundation for additional funding and would also investigate other sources.

The NYCC flood management team had also requested a meeting in the near future to discuss their draft report.

Village green

No replies had been received as yet regarding quotes for repairs to the tarmac near The Copper Kettle; the clerk would re-send the emails. Coun Good would remind Yorkshire Water about the query regarding the drain in the same location. There were no objections to the installation of a log store at The White House. It was confirmed that an external light on the building belonged to the owner and was not part of the street lighting circuit.

Playground

Prices and quotes were required for repair work to the playground. An application for funding would be made to the RDC Community Investment Fund

Phone boxes

The phone at Healaugh was no longer listed for removal so the council's application to adopt the box had been cancelled.

Christmas tree

Thanks would be sent to all those who had helped with the erection of the Christmas Tree on the green.

Flagstones

Repairs were authorised to the loose flagstones in the Mews.

Parish precept

RDC had requested confirmation that no parish precept would be requested for the coming year.

Grass cutting

Arrangements with NYCC for cutting the grass verges would remain unchanged.

Parking in Fremington

The owner of Frog House had obtained proof that the land in question was definitely part of the property and would be reinstating the parking sign.

Scattering of ashes

A visitor wished to scatter ashes on the green. Current legislation no longer allowed this and they would be advised of alternatives.

Swaledale Festival

Permission was given for the Festival to erect a gazebo on the green on Friday, May 1, and their offer of help for any events connected with the Tour de Yorkshire event was noted.


