I have just picked up the Gazette from the Post Office and seen your request Ordinary, cheap vinegar works a treat on annual weeds.

You can also get a much larger quantity (from Amazon, unfortunately) of a highly concentrated vinegar which you can then dilute.

The friend who recommended this wrote: "I use it 1 part of concentrate to 8 or 9 parts water and apply it with a cheap sprayer from Wilko."

For perennial weeds such as bindweed, we are currently trying it out (in Stroud) with several successive applications at a higher concentration. It certainly weakens it seriously on the surface and we hope it will severely reduce its ability to grow fast and furiously! Worth a try?

I noticed that you were asking for any gardening magazine. tips in the I have tried this for the first time this summer, due to Covid we couldn't get the weed killer. usual We were told many years ago that salt or rock salt would keep the weeds from your cobbles so after 7 years of treating our cobbles 3 times a year with weed killer I weeded the cobbles by hand in April then sprinkled rock salt and then luckily it rained Quite hard and washed it all in. We have only had the odd weed since and

will be treating again with rock salt come October. We were told that if you do this a few times the soil In between the cobbles becomes sterile and weeds are unable to grow. It might be early days but I think it has worked. Kind.

Another Irritating Article That Is Not Local News

Occasionally I have lazy too-easythrow-away-social-media comments directed at me. Readers asking me why I publish such items as Book and TV recommendations, when the Gazette should be local news only?

Well, for those dissenters you can stop this problem yourself, it's in your control. It's a case of 'Put Up or Shut Up'. That's what Managers have taught me in my life. When I expressed my frustration with projects, they made me lead them. Incidentally I never failed. I am not meaning to be rude. Its just a useful term. Submit what you would like to see published. Then your problem is fixed. Of course it is not possible for there to be a lot of local news every month. Therefore I will always have page white spaces to populate. I decided to describe what I have to solve for every Gazette.

Printing Restrictions

Every Gazette has restrictions around the number of pages. Imposed by the printing presses we use. Examine the Gazette in your hand. It consists of A4 sheets, printed both sides, stapled down the middle and folded. Four x A5 pages per sheet. Each Gazette's total number of pages has to be exactly divisible by 4 and there is a printing maximum of 60 pages per Gazette.

It's a big puzzle to solve.

Let us take a look at the August Gazette puzzle. See the screenshot on page 9 opposite. This is that edition right at the start. All the adverts are surrounding the publication's front page. First task is to work through all of the regular submissions. These

consisting of many articles supplied in different fonts and file formats. Including different size photos. Photos I have to manipulate, often reducing in size, improving focus etc.. Then the task is to find white space that each article/photo can be placed. Then the adverts have to be placed in suitable positions. All different shapes and sizes of course. Surprisingly 3 days hard work minimum.


Aesthetics

Now there is the look and flow. Basic standards I try to keep:

(1) No opposing two A5 pages full with adverts (2) Avoid any white space, wasting funds (3) Avoid adverts of similar business type next to each other (4) Colours suitable for print (5) standard fonts and line spacing (6) Accessibility considerations e.g. easier to read for readers with eye conditions.

Today I had run through all your submissions and placed all the adverts and articles. At that point I had a total of 62 pages. Not divisible by 4. I had to either delete $2 \times A5$ page or add $2 \times A5$ A5 pages. Those 62 pages had three and a quarter A5 pages of white space. Deleting or adding pages is more complicated that it sounds as many articles are longer than one page. Resulting in the white spaces of many different sizes in different areas of the Gazette. This is where I have to be inventive and add the items that are not local news. Although the fun of the Gazette for me is to be inventive, be different, share ideas and recommendations. Hopefully it works for you, most of the time. If not well you better gripe on social media.

Incidents - Aug 9th to Sept 9th

On average we respond to between 50 to 60 calls each year.

4 Incidents this edition

The teams focus during the Covid-19 outbreak has been to maintain an operational Mountain & Cave Rescue Service, we've held meetings on-line & limited equipment checks to reduced members of the team. Fortunately we are well stocked with the essential PPE to protect the team when deployed.

08/09/2020: Incident 30: While re stocking the vehicles from the 3 day search we were called by the Ambulance Service to rescue an injured walker in the Arkengarthdale area, as we arrived the walker had made it to the ambulance for treatment.

6,7 & 8 /09/2020: Incident 27, 28, 29: A 3 day search of the vast area between Tan Hill & Gunnerside looking for a missing walker. 100 rescue team members, search dogs & Police from 6 teams covered 100's of miles of moorland. The missing walker was located safe & well after 3 days of searching having survived 3 nights out. A special thanks to Gunnerside Estate for the use of their off road vehicles & to Tan Hill for keeping us fed & watered.

The map opposite shows the vast

search area covered during the 3 day search. The coloured lines are the GPS tracks of team members' radios, the shaded areas are the search areas.





Swaledale Night Sky

'What is the bright star that I can see in the evening/morning..?'

This must be the most frequent question I get asked when people find out I've an interest in astronomy. Over the next 3 months these are the visible **planets** that are often mistaken for 'bright stars'.

Venus is easily visible early in the mornings from 5 a.m. onwards through October and November. Very bright to the east. A phase e.g. crescent shape may be

visible through binoculars.

Mercury, a very elusive faint planet, joins Venus during the second week in November. Positioned down at 7 o'clock from Venus it can be seen from about 6 a.m. onwards.

Mars is visible through most of the night over the next 3 months. High in the South East, South and South West around 10 p.m. – 11 p.m. Orangey red in colour. A small telescope may show dark markings and polar ice caps.

Jupiter, visible through October just after dark, low down to the south. Very bright and setting early in the evening to the south west. A pair of steadily held binoculars may show up to four Galilean moons lined up either side. A dark cloud band can often be seen across the planet.

Saturn is also visible low down to the south after dark. Near Jupiter, it is the fainter bright star a little to the east at 10 o'clock position. Saturn is a wonderful sight through a decent telescope. Any questions?

Two Ridings Community Foundation announced 10th September 2020, the launch of financial support for individual households in Swaledale, Wensleydale & Arkengarthdale that were flooded in July 2019 who want to improve their home's resilience to future flooding. In July 2019 flash flooding caused major devastation across parts of Swaledale, Arkengarthdale and Wensleydale.

In response and thanks to generous donations from across the UK, Two Ridings Community Foundation opened the Swaledale & Wensleydale Recovery Fund to provide assistance to people affected by this flooding. Over £250,000 was raised.

Newly discovered mass extinction event triggered the dawn of the dinosaurs

Huge volcanic eruptions 233 million years ago pumped carbon dioxide, methane and water vapour into the atmosphere. This series of violent explosions, on what we now know as the west coast of Canada, led to massive global warming. Our new research has revealed that this was a planet-changing mass extinction event that killed off many of the dominant tetrapods and heralded the dawn of the dinosaurs.

The best known mass extinction happened at the end of the Cretaceous period, 66 million years ago. This is when dinosaurs, pterosaurs, marine reptiles and ammonites all died out. This event was caused primarily by the impact of a giant asteroid that blacked out the light of the sun and caused darkness and freezing, followed by other massive perturbations of the oceans and atmosphere.

Message from the Museum in Reeth

As I write this message we are not sure whether we will be open in October or not, so keep an eye out for our blue 'A' boards on the Green, give us a ring or e-mail, or check our website for the latest information. We are now busy drawing together a spectacular programme of talks for next season, which we hope will make up for the disappointment of having to cancel all this year's events.

Further to our continuing investigation of fluorite and barytes recovery in the Dale, Alan Peart has been in touch in response to our article on the subject in the Gazette. He and his father Telford Peart worked the old spoil heaps for fluorspar on the top of Arkengarthdale (directly over the top from the Charles Bathurst property and the CB Hotel, off the Langthwaite to Low Row minor road) between 1968 and 1971, during the spring and summer months. They were sending out between 20 and 30 ton of fluorspar a week to the Redcar and Sheffield steel works from Arkengarthdale. Alan says that they 'had a tractor and trailer and Bristol tracked loading shovel working there along with a log washer, dammed water for supplying the washer, settling pool, standing engine and cabin. Until a few years ago the old metal log washer, the remains of the hut and the railway sleepers that held the washer axle along with the dam and settling pool could be clearly seen'. Mr. Peart and Mr. Houston are meeting up in the Museum to exchange memories and add to our knowledge of the subject.

Now for last month's mystery photograph. A few months ago Tracy Little asked the Upper Dales Family History Group about the picture and she was contacted by Bob Ellis the expert in traditional dance tunes of the Yorkshire Dales, whose book 'There Was None of this Lazy Dancing', was published in April this year. Bob initially wondered if this might have been a mislabelled photograph of Leyburn Quadrille Band who were known to have been active in the area but subsequent research by both Bob and Tracy has uncovered the story of the Reeth Quadrille Band, identified all the players and found the great great grandson of the band leader. The first probable mention of the band to have been found dates to 1858, when some of the members were reported playing at a ball in the Black Bull in West Witton. As the football report is very short, I thought I would submit a report for the league in which we play. This is the Hambleton & Richmond-

shire Junior Football League and was the first league in the county to be awarded Charter Standard status and that status has recently been renewed.

Covid-19 has led to an initial significant reduction in participation in football and other activities and we are not immune.

A great deal of work and dedication of volunteers, however, has resulted in an increase in the number of teams by about a third over this time last year.

We have expressed in the strongest terms, our frustration at the lack of support by the FA and this they have not disputed!

The County FA have most of their staff on furlough following funding cuts by the FA but those at work have been doing their very best. Unfortunately, the Directors at North Riding County FA decided in January that all leagues must use the FA discredited WGS system for player registration and this must be backed up by registering a parent in each case. I told them in April that WGS would not be able to cope and, with furlough, their staff would find it difficult to support. The Directors and particularly, the Chairman now accept I was right.



The following incident of note occurred in this area this month -

On 6th September an 80 year old male hiker was reported missing in the Gunnerside area. Although he was well equipped, his disappearance caused great concern, and police and Swaledale Mountain Rescue were mobilised in a search. They were to be joined by other rescue groups including one from the RAF. The police helicopter was mobilised and local gamekeepers and farmers joined the search. Two days later the hiker was located near Keld, having fallen and become disorientated on the moors. He was checked over and found to be ok to go home. A huge thank you to all the volunteers who dropped everything to join the search. Thanks also to the Tan Hill pub for their generous provision of food, drink and facilities

The North Yorkshire Local Resilience Forum update on Covid-19:

A united effort is needed across North Yorkshire with everyone pulling together to steer the county away from the escalating number of Covid-19 cases, if we are to avoid the sort of lock downs we are seeing elsewhere. Residents are being warned that the evidence is clear, following weekends the county is seeing big and worrying rises in positive tests. Only by sticking consistently to the simple, straightforward measures of social distancing, good hand hygiene, and wearing face coverings will we avoid further increases in the number of positive tests. The warning comes as the Government announces it's 'rule of

six' which limits outdoor meetings in England to a maximum of six people, observing social distancing guidance. For the sake of our parents, grandparents, the many vulnerable people trying to resume some level of freedom in this new norm, for the sake of our economy and businesses, please stick to the guidance and follow the simple precautions that we know work the best. Most recent cases in the county appear to be among younger people, those under 30. If you have a young person living at home with you, talk to them about the risks, not just to themselves but to others.

The HANDS, FACE, SPACE guidance includes -

- -Wash your hands regularly for 20 seconds
- -Keep a safe 2 metre distance, meet outside where possible, avoid crowded places, do not meet up with anyone outside your home if you have Covid-19 symptoms
- -You must wear a face covering on public transport, in shops and indoor public spaces
- -If you have Covid-19 symptoms, book a test immediately and self isolate at home : visit www.northyorks.gov.uk/ testandtrace or call 119














Help for Swifts

Every summer here in the Dales we are lucky to see swifts darting across the skies and through villages, with their distinctive shrieking call. But the nature lovers and birders among you will already be aware that the swift population has declined by 50% over the past twenty years and action is needed if this trend is to be reversed.



Anybody considering offering a helping hand to these wonderful birds should take a look at the swift bricks recently installed at the gable end of Stubbs Farmhouse in Langthwaite.

Barely noticeable as they blend into the wall, they provide the perfect nesting habitat: easy access and a cool, protected space in which to lay eggs and rear chicks.

So, if you're having any work done to the outside of your house, you might want to have a think about installing one of these bricks.

The main requirements are that it should be at least 5 metres high and have direct flight access. After that, it's fingers crossed for some exciting residents next year.




