A VOLUNTEER ROLE WITH A DIFFERENCE!

The Alzheimer's Society Befriending Scheme, relies on trained volunteers providing activity and support to enable people in the early stages of dementia to continue enjoying their hobbies and interests for as long as possible something that they are no longer able to do safely by themselves.

A wide range of activities can be undertaken, depending on the wishes of the person with dementia. These may include watching or playing sport, walking (with or without animals), visiting galleries, museums, gardens and garden centres, visiting shops, listening to music, painting or craft work, baking, photography looking at photographs and many more. Visits almost always include a cup of tea or coffee and possibly a scone and both people involved have a good time!

Being a Befriender entails sparing 2-3 hours on a regular basis (weekly or fortnightly). This isn't 'written in stone' as we quite understand that volunteers have other things in their lives - holidays, appointments and all the other myriad of things that make up normal life. We point out that the people with dementia also have such things so the scheme is flexible depending on the needs of both the person with dementia and the volunteer.

We don't expect the volunteers to do any personal care and no qualifications are needed. All our volunteers are checked through the Disclosure and Barring Service and training and ongoing support is provided by the Befriending Manager and our volunteers are able to reclaim agreed

travelling expenses.

Anne Brown, who has managed the service since it's inception in 2009 says "we're looking for volunteers who are interested in helping people. I believe it's one of the most satisfying ways of volunteering and it's a scheme where everyone involved benefits; the person with dementia doesn't feel so isolated, the carer is able to have a few hours respite and the volunteer can often benefit too".

REPAIRS COMPLETED ON WELL-USED PATH

Walkers heading to Whitfield Gill in Wensleydale will find the route is a lot easier to navigate thanks to work by volunteers and the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority (YDNPA). Sixteen volunteers from the Ragged Robin conservation group teamed up with Dales Rural Trainee Scheme apprentice Suzannah Barningham and Authority Access Rangers Paul Sheehan and Rob Wilson to repair the path running up Mill Gill from Askrigg.

"It's an extremely popular route which winds its way through woodland past Mill Gill and Whitfield Gill waterfalls from the village," Paul said. "Due to the high level of use and the fact it is old, it needed a wide range of work to improve accessibility for users including replacing and resurfacing 35 wooden steps, laying 40m of flags, widening gateways and clearing vegetation. "We also improved the signage and we have had a lot of positive feedback from local users and visitors alike." The YDNPA staff, together with the Authority's Dales Volunteers, the Ragged Robin group and other volunteers, look after 1,454 kms of public footpaths that cover the 1,088 sq kms of the National Park. As well as celebrating the 60th birthday of the creation of the National Park, this year also marks the 50th anniversary of volunteering here. And in the past 12 months alone, volunteers have done an amazing 6,129 days of work, of which 4,495 days were carried out by the Dales Volunteers Nick Cotton, the Authority's Member Champion for Recreation Management, said: "The public paths in the National Park need constant attention to keep them up to scratch and we wouldn't be able to do it without the help of an army of volunteers. "The Mill Gill one is just one example of how we all work together to make sure visitors and locals alike can enjoy this special place."

recommended posting dates have been announced. For inland second class the date is Thursday 18th December; and for first class it's Saturday 20th December. If you are posting overseas, there are various dates depending on where it is going to. For example the last date for New Zealand is 4th December; for Canada it's 9th December: for USA 12 December: and for Western Europe it is 13th December. Call in for a leaflet if you want the full details. Finally, some trivia for you. Taking payment for mail became regulated in 1583 with 'letter-receiving house' springing up across the country. When mail coaches were introduced in 1784, these houses became known as Post Offices and postmasters became official. They were licensed to rent post horses for riding

post-to-post when carrying mail. As demand increased in the 19^{th} Century, subpost offices were opened across the country and sub-postmasters became integral parts of their community. As of course they remain today.

THE SWALEDALE BIG DIG.

We have now nearly finished our 2014 season of the Swaledale Big Dig and can reflect on a very successful year. Since reporting in the October edition of the Gazette we have dug another two test pits, bringing the total to 27, and have spent 4 days in Grinton doing a geophysical survey of what we believe to be part of the once larger medieval settlement there. Our end of year event "The 2014 Season: What have we learnt?" will take place on Friday 28th November, 7pm to 9.00pm and Saturday 29th November, 10am to 4pm in the Reeth Memorial Hall. On the evening of the 28th we will talk about what the Big Dig has achieved and the results from the 27 test pits that have been dug in and around Reeth We. lliw offer archaeological interpretation of what the finds might suggest in respect of the history and development of our community. We will also describe our ideas for 2015 activities when our focus will switch more to Grinton and Fremington. The events are open to everyone and are free.

The exhibition on Saturday 29th November will feature displays of the activities. We will bring along the finds, so please come and see what you and others found in their pits and, more importantly, what the finds are and what they tell us.

Swaledale & Arkengarthdale Archaeology Group (SWAAG) will be on hand to answer your questions and to encourage you to sign up for our future courses and activities.

The Swaledale Big Dig is managed by SWAAG and funded by a generous grant from the Heritage Lottery Fund.

NEWS FROM THE BELLERBY STUDY GROUP

History teacher, Reubin Frankau, combines his knowledge of Swaledale's past and his fascination with omnibuses in his talk **Percival's Buses** at Bellerby Study Group on Wednesday 5 November. He has a vast collection of model buses and local memorabilia.

On Wednesday 12 November the Chief Executive of the Yorkshire Dales National Park, David Butterworth, celebrates its 60th anniversary in Happy Birthday: 60 years of the YDNP.

The National Park was designated in 1954 because of its extraordinary natural beauty, the diversity of its wildlife habitats and its rich cultural heritage. It covers 680 square miles and straddles the central Pennines in North Yorkshire and Cumbria and is the living, working environment and home to 20,000 people. Originally from Barnsley, David now lives in Bellerby. After 30 years in journalism, Caroline Brannigan set up her own business writing people's memoirs. She produced over 50 books which are fascinating for her clients, their families and friends, and have captured intriguing social histories

She will tell us all about it in Memoir Writing in Yorkshire on Wednesday 19 November.

In Human Bones Do Tell Tales, Professor Charlotte Roberts of Durham University describes how the human remains of our ancestors are central α archaeological study. They represent the people who built monuments like Stonehenge; domesticated plants and animals; manufactured the landscape and made the artefacts found in archaeological sites. Middleham and Dales Local History Group

Tuesday 18th November 2 pm Middleham Key Centre New light on the later medieval castle: recent work at Hornby Castle, North Yorkshire

Erik Matthews

In this talk Erik Matthews will focus on discoveries made at a site recently excavated in the grounds of Hornby Castle near Bedale. Evidence has been revealed of a building known as a "pleasaunce" - a detached moated structure comprising a hall and tower. It was built by one of the early 14th century owners, Sir John Neville, and was used for the entertainment of important quests before being destroyed during some kind of military action shortly before the end of the 15th century. Erik will talk about the range of artefacts recovered at the site and the appearance of the building before explaining what this tells us about life in the Medieval elite residence. He will also discuss tantalising evidence that has been uncovered of an earlier hunting lodge from the Anglo Norman period used by the Dukes of Brittany, along with even earlier occupation by the Vikings. Erik Matthews is the Field Officer of the Architectural and Archaeological Society of Durham and Northumberland, Since 2010 he has been engaged in an on-going programme of archaeological fieldwork involving excavation, documentary research, field walking and building recording at Hornby Castle. Annual membership of the group is £10 (due in January each year) and visitors are welcome to attend individual meetings for a fee of £3. GRINTON CONSERVATION PROJECT

A great turn out of all ages to 'Across in the Wood', on Sunday 5th October. We saw plenty of creativity in making labyrinths with lego, chalk, leaves and sweet chestnuts. The fire pit had its first outing and before we could have a hot drink, we collected fire wood to stoke up the 'Kelly Kettles'. Bees We've added roof insulation to the beehive, to help the bees maintain their cluster at $35^{\circ}C$ over winter. The bees 'take turns' to be on the outside of the cluster. We put a 'mouseguard' at the hive entrance, as mice find hives make a good winter nest - and do lots of damage as well as raiding the bees' honey stores.

Wildflowers We've chosen 2 areas where we'll create good conditions for wildflowers - one for Spring flowers, another for early Summer species. We'll keep adjacent paths clear of brambles, and mow and clear at the right time of year to encourage flowers, not grasses. We'll include info on the areas and the maintenance jobs in the porch. If you are passing with secateurs you can see what to clear and what to leave!

A few people attended Scything and Peening courses with Steve Tomlin, funded by YDNPA (thanks to Mark Hewitt, our local Wildlife Officer). "...experience the joy of mowing with a scythe. No more ear defenders, visor, strimmer fumes or noise; just the sound of the birds and the swish of your blade." Scything is apparently very relaxing and even therapeutic!

Mower - we've now sold the mower, so

scything becomes more important!

The activities will commence on Monday 10th when the KS2 children will be creating an air raid shelter as part of their Forest School work. On Tuesday 11th the school will host an open afternoon when the children will provide entertainment and afternoon tea will be served. There will be an opportunity to see the children's work on the topic, and listen to poetry readings as well as the choir, who will perform a varied program, including songs from World War 1 such as well-known favourites 'Pack up your troubles' and 'It's a long way to Tipperary'. CRIME IN THE TWO DALES

In the last two months in several areas in and around Marske and Hudswell suspect males with dogs have been seen. We have also had several incidents where a group of young adults about 3 in number have ordered food in various establishments across the Dales and then left without payment. In Arkengarthdale a forced entry to a church occurred and loose

entry to a church occurred and loose change taken. Possibly a series of similar offences have also happened elsewhere so please ensure charity/honesty boxes etc. are kept secure and regularly emptied. Once again we received reports of damage to a local residents garden. This type of unacceptable and behaviour is upsetting to those concerned. At a local school an attempt was made to break into the premises of which the lock was damaged but thankfully nothing taken. In Muker two males were disturbed whilst trying to break into a shed where a petrol strimmer and Stihl were stolen. In Thwaite two outbuildings were also broken into and a red Quad and Honda generator were stolen. In Marske we had a report of a sheep that had been shot in the throat and another had been bitten by a dog in two places. If anyone has any information regarding any of these incidents please don't hesitate to get in touch by calling 101 and our Control Room staff will be more than happy to assist you.

For those of you who are unaware about this free service due to a change in law from April 6th 2016 it will become compulsory in England for all dogs to be microchipped.

HOUSING NEEDS UNDER REVIEW

A review of the way affordable housing is

supplied in the Yorkshire Dales National Park will be carried out in the next few months. Members of the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority agreed today (Tues) to work with housing authorities to look at practical ways of improving the supply of homes being built for local people. And they also agreed to make the service that deals with applications higher priority. Authority's Housing Development Plan (HDP) was adopted in 2012 and aims to get more affordable housing built to stem the tide of families moving away from the communities where they were born. It also aims to retain new houses in local occupancy to prevent them being snapped up as second homes or retirement properties. Authority chairman Peter Charlesworth said: "We and our district council partners set a target of delivering an average of at least 30 affordable houses a year in the National Park. The number of planning applications approved has risen in the last two years but the actual number of homes being built is still struggling to reach that level. "There are a number of economic reasons this. Most are out of our control but we still need to see if there's anything more we, as a National Park Authority, can do to help improve delivery. "The review will look again at some of the practical aspects of providing affordable houses for local occupancy - rather than as second homes or holiday homes. In particular, it will look at whether some additional flexibility is needed to make it viable to develop some of the allocated housing sites. Members also agreed to make the development

Immunosuppression (suppressed immune system due to disease or drugs)

HMRC CRACKING DOWN ON LANDLORD TAX!

If you're one of the thousands who have invested in a rental property, there are some important tax issues you need to consider when paying tax on rental income.

HMRC are clamping down on landlord tax that has been undeclared and if you have letting income you may be receiving a letter from them soon regarding their 'Let Property Campaign'!

Property owners who have unwittingly made errors but come forward in an 'amnesty' of sorts will face penalties of 20% plus tax and interest. Those who don't come forward may receive penalties of 100% and may face prosecution. All rental income must be declared to HMRC.

Allowable expenses

You only have to pay tax on any profit you make from rental income after deductions for allowable expenses. These include things you need to spend money on in the day-to-day running of the property.

Rent a room scheme

The Rent a Room Scheme lets you earn up to a threshold of £4,250 per year tax-free from letting out furnished accommodation in your home. This is halved if you share the income with your partner or someone else.

Capital improvements to your rental property

At some point, it's likely that you'll want to make your rental property more profitable by adding space or making it more liveable. These are called 'capital improvements', because they add value to the property. Although you can't claim these costs as

expenses, you can offset the cost of the work against the taxable profit when you sell the property.

Keep track of your expenditure

It's important to keep a record of certain documents and correspondences to use as proof when claiming tax relief.

Selling your rental property

You usually don't have to pay capital gains tax on your own home, but you may have to on any profits you make from selling a rental property. You can, however, get some relief.

Lettings relief is available to those who have let out all or part of a home. It's calculated as the lower of the following three options:

- £40,000
- The amount of Private Residence relief due

The amount of gain you've made on the let part of the property

After these deductions, your profit will be taxed 18% for standard income tax band (20%), or 28% for higher band taxpayers, minus that year's annual exemption, which is £11,000 in the 2014/15 tax year.



VOLUNTEERS GET BUZZY

The Yorkshire Dales Millennium Trust (YDMT) has embarked on a new initiative to build up a picture of bumblebee populations within hay meadows in the Dales. As part of YDMTs Buzz in the Meadows, project officer Tanya St. Pierre trained a small team of volunteers in the science of bumblebee identification. During June and July these volunteers conducted weekly or fortnightly bumblebee surveys in some of the few remaining traditional wildflower hav meadows in the Dales at Askrigg Bottoms, Grassington, Lower Winskill, Myker and Colt Park at the foot of Ingleborough. It is the first time this type of survey work has been carried out in the Yorkshire Dales. Their findings will now be added to the national records maintained by the Bumblebee Conservation Trust and disseminated widely within the farming community and conservation professionals, with a view to influencing policy and managing hay meadows as a habitat for bumblebees into the future. The feeding habits of 614 bumblebees, comprising ten different individual species, were recorded during the survey period1. The bumblebees were recorded visiting 21 different wildflower species across the five survey sites. The bright pink/purple blooms of Red Clover were found to be the most popular by far, and regular visits to Yellow Rattle, Meadow Buttercup, White Clover, Eyebright and Selfheal were also recorded by the volunteers as the bumblebees foraged during the summer months. Many other lesscommon flower native species also proved to be valuable sources of nectar and pollen for the bumblebees, including Wood Crane's-bill, Bistort, Devil's-bit Scabious and Melancholy Thistle, confirming that the unique botanical diversity of wildflower hay meadows are very

special and valuable natural resources. Tanya said: "Spotting the very rare Mountain bumblebee (Bombus monticola), also known as the Bilberry bumblebee, was the highlight for me. It was recorded on eight occasions from mid-June to late July at Colt Park, where it was seen feeding largely on Yellow Rattle, together with Red Clover, White Clover and Bird's Foot Trefoil. I really hope that we will be able to repeat the survey next year - it will be fascinating to compare the results year-on-year. This project wouldn't have been possible without the help of our team of volunteers, so I'd like to say a big thank you for all their hard work this summer." In recent decades two species of Britain's bumblebees have become extinct, whilst the remaining 24 species have shown a dramatic decline, some by as much as 80%. These worrying statistics are largely due to habitat loss: since the 1930s, 97% of the UK's wildflower hay meadows - an area the size of Wales - have been lost. Only 1,000ha of upland hay meadow now survive in the UK, of which about 50% are found in the upland dales of North Yorkshire, Cumbria and County Durham. Since 2006 YDMT has worked with farmers to help to restore the botanical diversity of almost 400 hectares of upland hay meadows to their former glory. By autumn that figure will stand at well over 450 hectares. It is hoped that the data gathered by the volunteers will help to ascertain the importance of these habitats for bumblebees and other pollinators.
