Look After All Our Visitors

It's not just our human visitors who deserve a warm welcome to the Yorkshire Dales. We have many migratory birds who make long and hazardous journeys to spend their summer here to raise young. Unfortunately they don't always receive a warm Yorkshire welcome.

Many of us are familiar with these harbingers of spring and anticipate their return eagerly. So it was with great sadness that I received a letter from a human visitor informing me of the deliberate destruction of a House Martin's nest. Whilst here, he had watched the birds build their mud nest in a window recess only to see it knocked away and be replaced by flapping plastic bags to deter further building.

To me, and many others, this shows a shocking and ignorant disregard for these amazing birds which have travelled from Sub Saharan Africa to breed here. However, what is most important is that this is a criminal offence under Section 1 of the Wildlife and Countryside Having Act 1981. spoken to NYP PC Julian Sutcliffe our local Wildlife Crime officer "to either intentionally recklessly destroy or cause damage to a breeding wild bird's nest is an offence which could attract a fine

and criminal record". As it happens he is currently investigating damage caused to Sand Martin nests in Swaledale.

This report was not specific in naming a location but suggested someone made people aware that if home owners feel they must deter these birds they should do so before they start building their nests, which is perfectly legal - if a little mean.

As the complainant said in his letter: "Surely one of the joys of living in such a beautiful area is to share it with the natural world and its amazing wildlife." I can't agree more and really don't understand why people can't share their houses with a charismatic and well travelled visitor for a few summer months.

Grinton Conservation

Bats: July's bat watch was cancelled, because of the spectacular thunderstorms (including big hailstones in Marske). Hopefully normal 'bat scanning' will resume in August - see below for details about the monthly bat watch events with North Yorkshire Bat Group.

Bees: The bees are doing well, and we have a small colony ready to move into one of our hives. They are producing plenty of honey - look out for them in your gardens and around *Grinton*. They are much smaller than bumblebees, and looking more like a wasp.

Bee fact: Why do bees collect pollen? Pollen is mixed with water and to form a type of bread that is fed to the growing larvae. It provides a rich source of proteins and fat whilst honey provides energy (carbohydrate). Bees collect about 20kg of pollen every year; that's 1 million pollen loads at 20mg a go (source: British Bee Keepers Association).

Upper Dales Family History Group

June's speaker was Dr George Redmonds on links between surnames and place names, particularly with a Yorkshire connection.

He began with an overview of pitfalls to avoid and stressed the importance of knowing the meanings of words at the time when surnames began to be fixed in the 12th to 14th centuries, rather than what the word may have come to mean in the present day. One example of this was the name Baxter, the equivalent of Baker; in the medieval period this could either be the person who actually made the bread, or the one who tended the communal oven where bread was baked. Also a surname may look as though it is

connected to a particular place but might pre-date it and derive instead from a smaller settlement which no longer exists. It was also important to understand when a surname became fixed, passing down generations. This happened mostly between about 1250 to 1450 but the situation in the north of England was more fluid and names continued to change over time.

Some names seem to have one original holder from whom all later generations are descended, Metcalfs of Wensleydale were given as one example, while others could be traced back to several individuals adopting the name of their place of origin around the same period. As late as the 19th century many names were regional. Metcalfe distinctly Alderson for example. Some names were significant in a particular region but never spread and from the time of the Black Death until the present day, some have died out completely.

Dr Redmonds gave numerous examples of how names changed through dialect until they sometimes very different original place name and gave details of a number of local names such as Harker. Punchard. Caygill Pickersgill, answering questions from the floor and generally amazing the audience by the breadth of knowledge of his subject.



Swaledale Mountain & Cave Rescue Team

There were 9 incidents in total for the team last month:

09/07/2015 (28) 18.00hrs: The team's search dog & handler were called to assist Cleveland MRT in a missing person search. Stood down while responding.

05/07/2015 (27) 18.00hrs: The team were called by Teesdale MRT to assist with the search of the River Wear for a missing child. A number of children were rescued from the water prior to our arrival. One however was unaccounted for. After an intensive water & river bank search Police divers recovered a child's body. A tragic end to a summer's swim.

28/06/2015 (26) 17.00hrs: The team were called by the Ambulance service to rescue a walker with a medical condition on the Pennine Way above The Green Dragon, Hardraw. Paramedics & Air Ambulance also attended. The casualty was transported by the land ambulance to hospital.

The incident was in Upper Wharfedale's area so we passed it them. While UWFRA were en route Swaledale MRT updated the Police logs to assist while they travelled to scene.

13/06/2015 (24) 19.25hrs: Contacted by the Ambulance service to rescue a collapsed walker near Gunnerside Gill, the team treated the casualty with the ambulance crew & transferred to air ambulance for onward transport.

13/06/2015 (21, 22, 23) 10.00hrs: While providing safety cover for the Swaledale Marathon the team dealt with 3 casualties who needed treatment & evacuation.

09/06/2015 (20) 11.25hrs: The team were called by the Ambulance service to rescue an injured walker near the banks of the river at Middleham. Our 3rd visit to this location.

Defibs in the Dales:

Reeth and Grinton Community First Responders cover most of Swaledale, all of Arkengarthdale and points in between. They are volunteers, trained and supported by the Ambulance Service to provide basic life support in the event of emergency calls.

As a fall back position the villages have established a network of Defib stations along Swaledale. Currently Low Row, Gunnerside, Muker, Thwaite & Keld have Defibs located in the villages. If you suspect someone is having a heart attack call 999/112 & ask for the Ambulance. They will send a rapid response vehicle & give you the code to access the locked defib box. Each village has trained a number of local people so don't be shy: call for help AFTER you've made the 999 call.

How we are called out:

As with everything today technology is at the heart of Mountain Rescue. All teams in England & Wales are called by & work under the authority of the Police. The Ambulance, Fire & Coastguard Services are also able to request the assistance of the teams either directly or via the Police.

When the Police receive a 999 call for Mountain Rescue (especially from a mobile phone) the call could be routed to any 999 call centre in the UK and the operator might not have any idea where Swaledale is. Once the call gets to North Yorkshire Police they use a system called SARCALL to page the team & from that point the team deploy to the rescue.

This whole process usually takes less than 5 minutes. In the unlikely event that the Police via a 999 call can't call us then either re dial 999 & try again or ask for any Mountain Rescue Team in North Yorkshire; all the teams are able to alert each other.

The team can only be mobilised via the Police / Ambulance Service through the 999 system.

Don't forget our August talk which is combined with a special walk this month. On Wednesday 12th August Ann Henderson will give a lecture on 'The Campaign for Women's Votes and Swaledale. The May Sinclair Connection' at 7.30 pm in the Museum (pre-booking advised). Helen Bainbridge & Ann Henderson will lead a special 'Walk Round Reeth in the Footsteps of May Sinclair' at 3 pm, meet at the Museum (£4 for Friends £6 for visitors) c.60-90 minutes.

Joined Up Local Government

I have been asked to expand on my brief comments last month on the subject of better joined up local government.

When the Arkengarthdale Chapel sadly closed, the Parish Council sought to look for affordable housing for the building and the District Council sent a questionnaire to all households. This was all very creditable but, with respect, the wrong organisation was asking the wrong question. The District Council is not the Planning Authority and the question was limited to the housing needs only of current residents.

The Planning Authority is the Yorkshire Dales National Park, a well meaning but unelected quango whose policy seems solely to protect our lovely environment. Their job, surprise, surprise, is to plan. Yes, we must protect the environment but not to create a fossilised dinosaur.

Their attitude was perhaps best exemplified when we were applying for planning permission for a new sports facility at Reeth and an Officer objected on the grounds that "visitors would hear children playing". That obscene remark was speedily withdrawn but is indicative of the Authority's underlying philosophy and indeed

accords with their local plan. The interests of existing or potential residents are regarded as subservient to those of visitors.

We need more younger people, not just pensioners, in the community, both retaining those already living here and encouraging those wanting to come and work and make their lives here. This requires a cohesive local plan providing for the economic and social sustainability of the community. This we do not have and yet it is by no means incompatible with the vital need to protect the environment.

By the way, we still urgently need people to help run our stunning sports facility - preferably those who do not object to hearing children playing.


Astronomy in the Two Dales

This month we have a change in format: The table of times has been banished and

replaced with a star chart, showing the brightest stars and their constellations. The smokey stripe across the chart is the Milky Way, which is our galaxy which we are part of. The Milky Way appears as a stripe as we are on the outer fringes and we are looking back toward it, edge on.

This month we have the best meteor shower for the northern hemisphere, the Perseids, not to be confused with golf ball size hail. It is visible from late July, peaking on the 12-13th of August; and this year the new moon is on the 14th of the month, so, with clear skies a good show could be had with as many as 100 meteors an hour being visible. Look to the north eastern sky, after dark, preferably after midnight.

The moon is full on the 29th and is a super moon, meaning that it is at its closest point to the earth and may appear larger than normal, a great opportunity for moon observation. A good tip from the great man, Sir Patrick Moore, is to use a pair of 30 denier tights as a primitive moon filter by stretching them over the telescope



aperture or binocular lenses being used. This prevents the brightness of the full moon from hurting your eyes. WARNING: Being caught rummaging through your wife's dressing table drawers for tights may result in more than sore eyes.

The planets are hiding from us this month, with Saturn setting in the south west before 11pm and Mars only just rising before dawn in the north east, yet we are armed with our star chart and can find the W shaped constellation of Cassiopeia. Cassiopeia constellation is named after Cassiopeia, the vain and boastful gueen in Greek mythology. She boasted she was more beautiful than the sea nymphs, daughters of Poseidon and he sent a sea monster to prey upon Cassiopeia's people. The only way to placate the sea monster was to sacrifice her daughter, Andromeda, and it was the travelling hero, Perseus who saved her



Windows 10 Again

If you have a computer with Windows 7, 8 or 8.1 chances are you have seen a new little icon appear at the bottom right hand corner of the screen. It is black and white and looks like a picture of a window in 4 panes - a bit like the key on most keyboards to the left of the space bar. If you hover your mouse over it a message pops up saying Get Windows 10.

As far as I can tell Windows 10 will become available at the end of July and for most Windows 7 and later users is likely to be a free upgrade during the first year.

A few quick questions and answers:

- 1) Should you upgrade now? No! There are bound to be teething problems in Windows 10 and in particular there are likely to be some issues with the upgrade process in the early days. Hold fire for a few months and let them get rid of the gremlins before you take the plunge.
- 2) Should you uparade later? Probably yes before the free upgrade period expires. Almost certainly Windows 8 will be 'replaced' Microsoft's way since they are offering it as a free upgrade. For windows 8 users think of it as the next step there shouldn't be too much to learn that's new. Windows 7 users will have a bit more to get used to but they are making the effort to make the transition easier.

- 3) What about Windows XP and Vista users? If you are still using Windows XP you should be seriously thinking of upgrading at some point soon because XP is becoming more and more insecure but your existing hardware might not be good enough for Windows 10. Windows Vista is still a current operating system and receiving support so there is no need for immediate panic.
- 4) What should I do before upgrading? This is very important before even contemplating upgrading do a full backup of your computer. There are facilities in Windows 7 and Windows 8 to do a System Image Backup of the whole computer onto an external hard disk you should do this before even thinking about doing the upgrade. That way, if there is a problem you can restore your computer



Muker Parish Council June 2015

Matters Arising: Cllr Blackie and Cllr Whitehead had attended a meeting on Monday 22nd June at Ivelet Bridge and Usha Gap Bridge. At Ivelet Bridge, after a slow start, new walls are been built and have been approved by the National Park. The work should be finished in approx four weeks. At Usha Gap Bridge 'Listed Building Consent' will be required to repair the Bridge. This would normally take several weeks but it will be dealt with as an 'emergency repair'. The work is planned to take place after Ivelet Bridge is finished. The repairs are been proposed to take place overnight to lower impact on road users.

Yorkshire Water Pipeline: Plans were in place for several road closures to take place during the works, but after several discussions plans are now in place for no road closures to take effect.

Finance: Barclays Bank required some further information on the Bank Signatories, Cllr Whitehead to attend with item.

Highways: Clerk to write to Highways on the issue of Grass Cutting. The Councillors felt the latest cutting of the verges was very poor. The main problem was the lack of trimming on certain 'High risk' places leaving concern for Public Safety.

Richmondshire D.C.: Councillor Blackie reported that Local GP Practice Inspections had taken place at Dr Brookes' Reeth Surgery and results had found the Practice highly rated.

NYCC: Cllr Blackie reported on how

well the Little White Bus service is going, running from Richmond to Keld. Take up of the service has been good.

YDNPA: A Planning Application had been received from Richmond Motor Club. The Parish had no objections.

A Planning Application had been received to erect a double garage to replace existing tin sheeted building at Oxnop Ghyll. The Parish Council had objections to this application on the grounds that it was out of character for the area and seemed to look more urban than rural, it also has the look of an extension rather than a garage and finally the footprint size was of concern.

Planning Permission has been granted on Ivelet Bridge, Muker Literary Institute, Kearton Country Hotel and Valerie Hack Restoration Ecology (construction of vehicle park Moorland Site, Birkdale Common).

AOB: Cllr Blackie made a proposal on the possibility of offering a weekly mobile Post Office service in Muker Village. This would be run from the Hawes branch, which has currently successfully been running several in Wensleydale. He would like to hear any comments from the public on this suggestion. Comments can be left with Cllr Blackie or any local Parish Councillor.

The lack of a light on the Muker village Defibrillator was being looked into.


