Little White Bus

After an absence of over 12 years, we have made a return to this lovely and unique part of the country. Almost the first thing we noticed when travelling the road to our holiday cottage in Gunnerside, was the presence of The Little White Bus.

Whilst not knowing of its existence or purpose, we supposed it was a facility to aid visitors to the dales, having seen similar and locally named buses in such places as Pembrokeshire and North Devon.

We collected our copy of the October edition of the Gazette from the garage in Reeth and read with interest the letters on the LWB. The introduction of the service deserves to succeed and as a visitor, may I offer the following observations:

Where is the service advertised? Surely one of the main places would be in holiday accommodation. If every cottage, B&B, hotel and pub had a leaflet available, it would automatically reach the intended users of the service without them searching it out. We obtained the leaflet from the

Reeth Visitor Centre, but it was not on display. The lady was very helpful in producing it from a tray under the counter, but the point is that whilst we knew to ask, others will be unaware.

Where to park? Well, using the service in a way similar to town park & ride schemes may help by having a landscaped field designated at each end / intermediate locations of the route. It stops unnecessary car travel along the dales and provides the driver with the comfort and knowledge for legal and controlled parking, removing the need for cars to be abandoned along road side verges etc.

Another benefit may be obtained by providing a 3/5/7 day ticket, a walkabout ticket if you will, which would allow the holder to access the service anywhere along its route.

I do not wish to deride the efforts already taken for this service, but perhaps my thoughts may prompt some discussion even if considered impractical or inappropriate.

Sadly we have returned to our West Country but very much look forward to returning in the near future and using the LBW to aid our walking in the dales




Twenty Years Ago Extracts from the November 1995 Gazette



Post Office News

It's that time of year when you need to be thinking about latest recommended posting dates for Christmas - unless you were hoping to send a parcel via surface mail, in which case you are too late for most places outside Western Europe.

Royal Mail have produced a guide to their Christmas parcel and letter services, which is available in the post office, but as a quick guide, airmail (now known as International Standard) to the Far East and Eastern Europe needs to be sent by 7th December; Australia and New Zealand by 10th December; Canada and USA by 15th December; and most places in Europe by 16th December.

One point to bear in mind is that for overseas parcel, you need to make sure the weight is under 2kgs.

As far as the UK is concerned, you have loads of time.

Please remember if sending any parcels that legally we are not allowed to accept any parcels for posting if we do not know what is inside. So if anyone has asked you to take a parcel to the post office, please make sure you know

what is inside. Remember also that many everyday items including perfumes, nail varnish and aerosols are classed as 'dangerous goods' under transport regulations and are subject to certain restrictions. If in doubt, check with us at the post office.

Christmas stamps are nearly here too. Royal Mail has issued Christmas stamps since 1966 and from 2005 it introduced a policy of alternating religious with non-religious designs each year. This year, it's a religious theme. The stamps tell the 'traditional Nativity story in an impressionistic style, from the Annunciation to the Nativity and the journey of the Magi.' They will be on sale from November 3rd.

Finally, another reminder: Many people are still unaware of the range of banking activities that you can do through the post office, regardless of who you bank with. There is no fee for withdrawing cash using a debit card issued by a UK bank; and most UK banks will allow you to pay cash and cheques into your account. They each have their own little quirks with regard to the procedure to follow, so again, if in doubt, call in and ask us.

More 'Flu Jabs!

Thank you to all who turned out for the flu clinic. I am sure that this has now become firmly embedded in the Dales social calendar, although perhaps more as a social gathering / bake off with the vaccinations as supporting act. Over 270 of you managed to have your vaccinations, and I always enjoy seeing so many people when they are well.

Those who are in the eligible or 'at risk' groups who missed out on the clinic are able to book into one of our catch up clinics. Please call the practice for further information. Just to clarify, eligibility is defined by those people over the age of 65; those who are registered as a carer, and those who suffer from the following conditions:

- Chronic Respiratory Disease (COPD, asthma, etc)
- Chronic Heart Disease (e.g. heart failure)
- Chronic Kidney Disease
- Chronic Liver Disease
- Chronic Neurological Disease (e.g. Parkinson's Disease)
- Diabetes
- Immunosuppression (suppressed immune system due to disease or drugs)

Those of you who have had 'flu will know it is a miserable experience. For some, it can even be life-threatening. I can't recommend the 'flu vaccine enough to you, and wholeheartedly recommend it to those of you who are eligible.

Community Transport Project

The 'flu clinic was also the maiden voyage of our new patient transport project, working in partnership with Reeth and District Community Transport, Hambleton Richmondshire and Whitby Clinical Commissioning Group and South Tees Hospital Trust.

For some time, we have been aware that people who are unable to come to the practice are often disadvantaged as it is very difficult to bring all aspects of the practice to them at home. We have secured funding for a project to use the RDC transport team to provide transport to patients who would otherwise have required a home visit from a nurse. This could be used, for example, to provide an annual heart disease check at the practice or a routine monitoring blood test.

The aim of the project is to reduce social isolation, improve the standard of routine care to this disadvantaged group and also support a local service to ensure its continued viability. It is important to note that this project does not replace home visits for unwell patients provided by the doctors or home visits for people who are terminally ill.

Some of you may remember that the Museum received some charming watercolours by a local amateur artist called Dorothy Riley - which featured in our AGM quiz. Billie Riley would like to know more about her, so we publish her enquiry below and do hope that you can help us, to help her:

My mother's name was Sheila Riley. During the Second World War she was sent from London to live in Reeth with her great aunt Dorothy Riley. So, I estimate that she was here from 1940-1944 during which time she attended Fremington School. Dorothy Riley, who never married, lived in Tyneholme on the Green in Reeth and was known locally as a painter of landscapes.

She was a short woman and a redhead. Other than that, and a photograph of her with Wilfred Pickles (kindly given to me by Margaret Rutter) I know little about Dorothy and would be very grateful if anyone has any information about her life, or

Swaledale Mountain and Cave Rescue Team

There were 6 incidents in total for the team last month:

19/09/2015 (43) 07.25hrs: Penrith MRT called for us to assist with the continuation of the missing person search alongside 10 rescue teams. During the search the body of the missing person was located.

18/09/2015 (42) 14.25hrs: Penrith MRT called for us to assist with a missing person search alongside another 8 rescue teams.

16/09/2015 (41) 03.25hrs: Cleveland MRT called for our search dog and handler to assist with a missing person search. Person was located and evacuated.

13/09/2015 (40) A walker slipped about 25 feet down a steep wooded banking below Fremington Edge. The party called for help at the nearest farm, who in turn contacted the team.

As part of the team were undertaking medical training 1 vehicle responded immediately with other team members direct. The team treated and evacuated to the farm for hand over to the Yorkshire Ambulance Service vehicle. Many thanks to the local residents for their help and the welcome cups of tea at the end.

12/09/2015 (39) 17.30hrs: The team were called by the Ambulance Service to rescue a walker who had fallen some 35ft through rocks at Round Howe, A joint effort by MRT and Ambulance crew, treated and evacuated from the crag to the Air Ambulance.

09/09/2015 (38) 10.30hrs: A small group from the team undertook the rescue of a sheep trapped in a steep gully near Gunnerside Bridge, successfully rescued without the need for mutton for the rest of the year.

At the end of Sept we ran a training session in Ravenseat for the teams that cover the Northern Pennines. Teesdale, Penrith, Cave Rescue and Kirkby Stephen MRT. During the full day we had a visit from the Coastguard helicopter as part of our training. Thanks to all who attended and the land owners for access.

Several issues come up time and time again at most Parish Council meetings throughout our area and I am sure they occur around the country.

The matter of dog mess on our footpaths and greens is one. Please make every effort to clear up after your dog and make sure you have a supply of poo bags with you. The vast majority of people act responsibly; it's the few who spoil it for the rest of us.

Parking is another. As winter approaches there are fewer visitor cars in our villages but do try to be considerate when parking your vehicle. Remember the space outside your boundary wall probably doesn't belong to you but is part of the Parish. Your Parish Councillors are aware of the problems and regularly discuss what can be done.

NYCC did an assessment on grit bins recently and intended to remove several in Reeth. Fortunately this decision was overturned - particularly as they were in the Quaker Close area which would affect people walking to and from the Doctor's surgery. Please don't use the grit bins for rubbish -

either use the bins provided or better still. take it home.

As commented on in last month's Gazette, the recycling bins can be an eyesore. RDC assure me that the bins are emptied weekly. For various reasons it is not possible to make the space larger to accommodate more containers. It would be helpful if we could all make sure that any large packaging is flattened before being put in the containers.

Several people have contacted me over the refugee situation asking what our Council was doing by way of help. I have raised the issue but as yet have not received any information. Richmondshire D. C. is joining with the other District Councils and NYCC to plan a way forward. If I get any information I will pass it on.

With the nights drawing in, loneliness can be an issue particularly for older people in more remote locations. A good neighbour scheme has been suggested but that seems to me to be too formal. We should all be aware of who our neighbours are and what their needs may be.



Condemned prisoners were executed on the Knavesmire but there were also gallows on the Hull Road, on Clifton Road, at St Mary's Abbey and behind the castle walls in the city centre.

Karen had selected a number of criminals and types of offence ranging from medieval examples to the 19th century Luddites to illustrate both

Early examples were the Earl of Northumberland, tried for high treason after the Rising of the North in 1572 and Robert Aske from Marske for his part in leading the 1537 Pilgrimage of Grace; both were beheaded in the city centre. Less exalted criminals were sent to the gallows, including poisoners, murderers, coiners and smugglers from across the area. The most well-known was probably highwayman Dick Turpin, but equally infamous at the time, now almost entirely forgotten, was school teacher Eugene Aram of Knaresborough who murdered Daniel Clarke in 1744.

A number of cases had a dales connection including the Wensleydale rioters executed in 1758 for the offence of high treason in breach of the Militia Act, and George Berry who robbed Anthony Batty on his way home from Hawes market.

Astronomy in the Two Dales

Fizz, bang, crackle, what celestial fireworks do we have for the month of November? Well, how about two meteor showers: the Taurids and the Leonids.

The Taurids are a long running meteor shower that peaks this year on November 5th; however the moon's light will block all but the brightest meteors and I surmise the rockets and flares will do for the rest. However for those of us who may be up and about at 2.00am on the 6th, the constellation Taurus will be in the southern sky with the meteors radiating from that point.




As part of the constellation of Taurus we have The Seven Sisters or Pleiades, an open cluster of stars and the red giant star Aldebaran which is only 65 light years from Earth and there are scientific reports that Aldebaran has a planet orbiting it. For those of you with dreams of immortality, Pioneer 10, a probe launched back in the seventies, will reach this area of space in two million

years time; so stay tuned for the news on that one.

Our second light show occurs on the 17th to the 18th of the month and as the new moon occurs on the 11th the skies will be dark for the Leonid meteor shower. Radiating from the constellation Leo, this meteor shower has a cycle that peaks every 33 years. The next one is in 2034 when hundreds of meteors can be seen every hour. Another date for your diary.

If you have ever wondered what a meteor shower looks like from an astronauts point of view, here is a picture taken in 1997 of the Leonid meteor shower.



The full moon occurs on the 25th, and the only time for planetary observation is in the early morning as Venus, Mars and Jupiter dance with each other in the eastern sky after 2.00am and before the sun rises. So load up on parkin, wrap up warmly and enjoy the show.

Computer Corner

With Carol Haynes of Dales Computer Services

Windows 10 snooping and internet sharing

One of the more worrying things recently being discussed is the amount of data harvesting going on by Microsoft with the new Windows 10 and also sharing your internet connection with other users.

Firstly, I don't think Microsoft are the worst company out there for doing what they are doing - they are just more open about it. All the time you are connected to the internet companies are collecting anonymous information about you. But it is a little worrying the way the data collection process crept in with little fanfare and the new privacy policy is pretty wide ranging.

The other thing they are doing is using your computer and your internet connection to share windows updates with other users. Anyone who has used torrent downloads will know how this works and it is nothing sinister but it does mean that if you have a fixed amount of data each month from your

internet provider some of it is being used by Microsoft to save them money.

Basically what is happening is if you download an update for windows (in most cases this is automatic and doesn't require you to do anything) it may no longer be coming from Microsoft's servers - parts of the updates are coming from other users computers and once you have the update you too will be sending out packages of data for other users to download. This passes the load from Microsoft's servers to users computers - thus saving them a lot of money.

If you are on unlimited superfast broadband you are unlikely to notice anything but if you have slow broadband or a monthly limit on usage you may well notice things slowing down and your monthly limit disappearing faster.

All of this stuff can be turned off so that you don't share data or your

guaranteed that they have nothing to do with Microsoft.

If you get one of these calls ask for their phone number (they are unlikely to give it) and report it to the police.

Let me spell this out clearly: NO REPUTABLE COMPANY WILL CALL YOU AND OFFER TO FIX YOUR COMPUTER - certainly not Microsoft. It is almost impossible to talk to them if you offer to pay!

News from Arkengarthdale C of E School

Arkengarthdale School has always had a strong link with Outdoor Learning, but recent developments have strengthened this link further. The school has been fortunate to receive a grant from the Ernest Cook Trust which will an enable us to develop our outdoor areas further and to build on our Forest School learning. The Ernest Cook Trust was founded in 1952 and it supports learning in the outdoors in schools and other organisations. You can learn more about this trust at www.ernestcooktrust.org.uk

Next door to the school is our third classroom - an area of woodland lent to the school by our neighbours. Every week, the children use this area as a base for learning about - and in - the outdoors. The children are already very familiar with this area and its flora and fauna. They can name the tree species within the woodland and are familiar with the animal species that share the environment with them. So far they have seen owls, deer, a wide range of invertebrates and lots of other different bird species. A small beck runs through the copse and it is hoped to develop this area of wetland so that we have pond study facilities on the site.

Both of them lead activities in the woodland, with the support of our other staff.

One of the purchases with our Ernest Cook Foundation grant is a large tepee, which is being installed soon. This will enable the children to use the woodland in even the wettest conditions. A feature of our grant from the trust is that we share our developments with the community, so we are hoping to share our area with everyone who is interested. We will be holding a Tepee Play afternoon soon when the children at Arkengarthdale School will be hosting an introduction to their area for anyone who is interested. Watch out for further details about this.

Although much of our Outdoor Learning is done in our immediate environment, we explore other areas also. Our Year 6 children have just returned from a week's residential visit with their friends from Richmond Methodist School at a residential centre near Whitby. On the visit, they studied the seashore, watched seals, canoed down the river to Whitby harbour, built shelters, beck-scrambled in the River Esk, orienteered on the moors, hunted for fossils, bodyboarded in the North Sea and made lots of new friends to boot.

Credit Unions have a mission to provide easily accessible savings and affordable loans, and to offer financial education to both its members and the general public at large.

in the UK are Credit Unions regulated in the same way as banks and building societies PRA. the by (Prudential Regulation Authority) and the FCA (Financial Conduct Authority) and all members' investments are protected by the FSCS (Financial Services Compensation Scheme) to the value of £75,000. As Credit Unions do not have to make a profit, all of their excess revenue is used to benefit the members, by a dividend return on their investment or a reduction in loan rates and by adopting a policy of no fees.

Darlington Credit Union was formed in 2009, following the merger of four small credit unions within Darlington. At the time of the merger there were 600 members with savings of around. £120,000 and a loan book value of £60,000. Today DCU has over 5,000 members, savings of around £1.5m and a loan book value of approximately £900,000. Anyone within the DL, YO and HG postcodes can become a member and this includes corporate accounts. Many small local traders have opened accounts attracted by the fee free offering.

In September 2015, DCU will move from its current premises in Church Row, Darlington to an exciting new premises at 41 Tubwell Row. The new office will provide a fully functional will offer banking hall that members α safe and environment to transact their business. It will also look impressive. In the first quarter of 2016, DCU will also be switching its operating system to a new banking platform, as part of the

Expansion Project".

This new banking platform will allow DCU to offer its members, and prospective members, a much wider product range, from current accounts to cash ISAs and with the possibility of offering mortgages in the future. Full banking facilities online will available.

None of these advances will detract from our stated aim of offering a face to face service to as many people as possible. As part of that aim we are working closely with several organisations to extend our services into the rural communities. At a time when banks are closing their last few rural branches, such as Bedale, DCU is seeking to fill that void with financial services and support in the heart of those communities.

In North Yorkshire we are working with North Yorkshire County Council, to provide our services and products through their libraries in places such as Leyburn, Thirsk, Bedale, Catterick, Richmond, Stokesley and Northallerton.

We hope to establish the same in Reeth for the benefit of the people of The Two Dales. Emma Wilson will not only transact financial business on

Reeth Parish Council September 2015

Village pound: The pound had been advertised in the local press and three applications had been received of which two had subsequently been withdrawn. Councillors agreed to rent the pound to the sole remaining applicants.

Street lights: Coun Frankland had a list of lights around the parish which were in need of repair. A request had been made that a light at the bottom of Mill Hill should be changed to LED and this would be passed on.

Playground: An application had been made to deregister the playground group with the Charity Commission as this was no longer relevant to its running.

Parking: There lengthy was discussion regarding complaints about parking on and around the green and the clerk would contact some of the residents who had been putting out unauthorised parking cones. There were particular issues near the Burgoyne hotel where permission had been given for cones to be put out on the appropriate day to allow the refuse lorry room to reverse up the slip road. A number of complaints had also been received about a vehicle believed to belong to a visitor which was blocking the pavement on Silver Street. The clerk would also follow this up.

Remembrance Sunday: Arrangements had been made for the parade to leave Reeth at 2pm for a 2.30pm service at Grinton. There would be no return parade due to the number of police required but participants would walk back informally or use the coach. The

tea would be held in the Buck Hotel this year as the Memorial Hall had another advance booking. The clerk would approach local clergy regarding the 11am service at the war memorial on November 11.

Defibrillator: The clerk would follow up options for the provision of a defibrillator in the village.

War Memorial: Coun Frankland was asked to take some photographs of the memorial to assist the monumental mason and save a site visit.

Air crash memorial: Members agreed that the proposed plaque to those who died in the wartime plane crash on Fremington Edge should be placed outside the Burgoyne Hotel where it would be seen by more people, rather than at the crash site.

Footpaths and green: A number of footpaths in the parish were noted as being in a poor state of repair and overgrown, including the path up School Hill where the drains were also blocked, Back Lane and the path to the surgery in Quaker Close. Loose setts around the green had been reset. There had been reports of garden waste dumped on parish ground along the Arkengarthdale Road.

Recycling centre: There had been a number of complaints about the state of the recycling bins and frequency of emptying. Coun Beal had passed these on to RDC but some of the problems were caused by the way the facility was used with bags and boxes left on the ground beside the bins.

Dog fouling:

There had been a complaint about dog fouling on the green in spite of the number of new dog waste bins provided.

Muker Parish Council September 2015

Matters Arising: Cllr Blows stated that Sally Dixon of RDC was to attend Muker to look at where the Dog Bin should be positioned.

The sign directing people to the toilets could be located on the existing post by the Bridge.

Cllr Blackie had received a quote from NYCC to replace and erect the Muker Sign of £250.

The gutter on the Public Toilets had been cleaned.

The light on the Literary Institute was still not working. Cllr Reynoldson stated that there was a light in Thwaite which was continuously on. Clerk to contact RDC.

Highways: Cllr Blackie felt that the Consultation Process concerning the Grit Bin Review was extremely poor. He also reported that NYCC accepted that had there been communication problems. Cllr Blackie reported that following further discussions a number of grit bins had been saved, these are Bainbridge near the Ambulance Station, Reeth, Turfy Top and Silver Hill. There are two bins in Muker and two bins in Thwaite which are earmarked for removal. The Parish Council can decide whether they want to pay for the filling and maintenance of these bins. These

payments can be deferred until next year.

Cllr Whitehead raised concerns regarding the ash trees obstructing motorists' views of the road on the right hand side of the road just before Angram. Clerk to contact Highways to request their removal.

YDNP: Regarding approval for the Thwaite H Pole for the pumping station, the council noted that Yorkshire Water had knocked on doors in Thwaite and that noise from the pumping station was the main concern. Cllr Reynoldson questioned the need for the H Pole when there is already a pole adjacent; he also stated that this additional pole would ruin the view onto Kisdon Hill. Cllr. Blackie asked whether the transformer could be erected on the existing pole. It was agreed that the Clerk would write to Kerry White and Richard Graham, enquiring as to whether this could be done. The Parish Council felt that this whole process had been rather rushed through.

A planning application had been received for the relocation of an LPG Tank at Kearton Guest House Thwaite - No objections

Cllr Metcalfe questioned Cllr Blackie concerning the National Parks' policy on Barn Conversions near the roadside. Cllr Blackie explained the new policy and the difference between a barn to be converted for sale on the open market
