#### First Thoughts . . .

I was going to start off this month with the first line of a medieval English round from the mid-13th century: Sumer is icumen in - because summer is almost here. But then I found out that its meaning is not as it sounds (Summer is coming in) but, Summer has arrived. So that's no good.

Unless of course you are a meteorologist (which sounds like you should study a meteor, right?) in which case summer has indeed begun for you, seeing as how under meteorological definitions, all seasons are arbitrarily set to start at the beginning of a calendar month - 1st June for Summer.

Unless of course you are visiting from Ireland where according to the Irish Calendar, summer begins on 1st May and ends on 1st August, rather than the meteorological definition of 1st June.

For the astronomers amongst you, you'll have to wait until 21st June for the summer solstice. Except that reckoning by hours of daylight alone, the summer solstice marks the midpoint, not the beginning, of the season therefore this date is also known as *midsummer*. In which case, summer must have started sometime early in May.

Unless of course you are following the Christian calendar which designated 24th June, the feast day of the early Christian martyr St John the Baptist, as Midsummer's Day.

Traditionally though, Summer is associated with hot or warm weather; in which case, Summer was on Thursday 11th May. What did you do last summer?

#### **Wildlife Reports**

As many of you will know - I hope - I am your local National Park Ranger and I'm based in Reeth in Hudson House. My door is always open and is frequently used by a lot of you. I am very lucky to be based in Reeth rather than one of our two main offices as it means people are more inclined to call in with concerns, comments and general enquiries or just a chat sometimes.

I am writing this as I want to encourage you; the public of the Two Dales, to tell me about any interesting wildlife you may have seen that you think is unusual or needs noting. By this I mean any unusual flowers or plants, any rarer mammals; particularly any Red Squirrels or Otters, interesting butterflies such as Green Hairstreaks or birds; especially Birds of Prey.

I often hear about sightings second or third hand which can be frustrating. For instance someone has told me they

had heard someone had photographed a Red Squirrel in Reeth. It would be great to confirm this; I am currently monitoring a site near Keld for this species but if I knew they were as far down the dale as Reeth we could target our monitoring more effectively perhaps.

If you see anything that you think is of note then please contact me with as much detail as you have such as the date and location of your sighting. A good photograph would be a bonus. If necessary I can then pass it on to my Wildlife colleagues or just keep an eye and an ear out for further reports.

#### Astronomy In The Two Dales

How can you do astronomy in Swaledale in mid-summer? It's not easy. You can stay up really late and do some observing in the wee small hours. Or you can buy a very expensive solar telescope to study the sun safely during the day (you must NEVER look at the sun through a normal telescope). But if neither of these options seem attractive there are a couple of alternatives.

The first is to use a stick and a wall. At our latitude the difference in the sun's height in the sky between summer and winter is very large. So it is interesting to mark the top of the shadow the stick casts when the sun is at its zenith on the summer solstice, and then mark the equivalent position three months later at the Autumn Equinox and six months later at the winter solstice.

Place the stick in the ground so it casts its shadow on the wall at about 1.00 pm on the 21st of June (Not 12.00 noon - because our clocks are currently one hour forward). Ideally you should measure the height of the stick above the ground as well as its exact position (so you can make sure you do the experiment the same in the winter). You also need to make sure the stick is vertical. The mark needs to be semipermanent - a good strong chalk mark on a wall will do provided you refresh it from time to time.

The other thing you can do at this time of year is to look out for the strange "noctilucent" clouds which sometimes appear in the night sky

around mid-summer. They are usually white or electric blue, lit up by the sun which at this point is well below the horizon. Scientists know very little about them for certain, other than that they form incredibly high (about 50 miles up) and are made up of very tiny ice crystals. They were first recorded after the explosion of Krakatoa, and seem to have become more frequent in modern times, possibly because of human activity.

Noctilucent clouds are visible about 90 minutes after sunset or before sunrise. (Clouds lit up by the sun much closer to sunset or sunrise may well be ordinary cirrus clouds). I have included a picture on the next page of a particularly bright display of Noctilucent clouds over Uppsala in Sweden, taken by a photographer known as Goforbit. They are usually more subtle than this - but do look out for them, as they can be outstandingly beautiful.

Anyway, this is Starboy's last outing - Starman is back next month after three months improving his starship. And if he gets tied up again, whether by DIY or a super-villain, we have Galaxian waiting in the wings.

### Computer Corner

With Carol Haynes of Dales Computer Services

#### The Full Circle

This article is a bit of a detour from usual topics and may be a little too geeky for some people, but please bear with me.

One of my personal frustrations in recent years has been the move towards very expensive, but essentially disposable, devices which have (to my mind anyway) fairly limited functionality. Of course I am talking about smart phones and tablets (all varieties including Apple, Microsoft, Samsung and many others). They are fine for quick replies to emails, checking your Facebook and Twitter and watching the odd video or listening to music, but are frustrating and slow if you want to do anything serious or work that involves lots of typing.

With the rise of the phone/tablet came the decline of CD sales and paper book sales as people moved to MP3 music and Kindle books; and as a result desktop and laptop sales dropped off.

In recent months things have started to change and come full circle—the sales of CDs increased again and outstripped digital downloads and electronic books started to see falling sales as physical book sales improved again.

Laptop and desktop computer sales seem to be on the rise again too (though the desktops seem to be more of the 'all in one' type rather than the traditional tower).

There has also been a huge

resurgence in 'hobby' computers with the birth of things called 'single board computers'.

It is becoming obvious too that people are getting frustrated with the stranglehold of businesses such as Apple and Microsoft on computers—and in particular I had quite a bit of feedback on my article on the death of Windows Vista and the upcoming end to Windows 7 in 2020. There is a fair amount of resentment that laptops, in particular, that work fine have to be chucked out and replaced as Windows Vista is now officially unsupported.

Well, you could consider keeping that aging laptop going by dumping Windows altogether. The open source operating system Linux has been around for many years and is a development from Unix which predates Apple and Microsoft - indeed Apple's MacOS is based on BSD (really a variant on Linux).

The reason many people don't want to swap to Linux is familiarity and the perceived 'geekiness' of Linux. However, things have moved on and some versions of Linux not only come ready to install easily but also packed with all the free software most people would ever need. The biggest seller of Linux is that it is completely free.

The biggest difficulty of Linux is choosing which version will suit you best - there are literally hundreds. Linux Mint is specifically written to be a relatively easy transition from Windows and Mac (it should work on an old Mac laptop so long as it is new enough to have an Intel chip).

The best part about most of these Linux solutions is that you can try them out and make sure they work before

you commit yourself to the idea without affecting your current computer setup.

You can find out more about Linux Mint here: www.linuxmint.com. You can order a CD from the downloads page or download an ISO file and make your own CD (instructions for that are on the download page in the User Guide). Once you have the CD pop it in the drive on your laptop or desktop and your computer. restart If your computer is configured to start from a CD or DVD it should start straight into Linux Mint\* and you end up on a desktop that you can explore and play with without affecting your files or programmes. Because it is running from CD it will be quite slow - but testable.

If you decide you like it, make sure you back up all of your important files before you use the install icon, as installation will wipe out Windows and all your files.

\*If not read the Linux Mint guide for an explanation on what you need to do to start from a CD - this varies from computer to computer.

Next month I will write a little about other alternatives - tiny cheap single board computers for adventurous souls or keen DIYers.

TAKE HOME A PIECE OF THE DALES



# Reeth Orchard Garden Maintenance with Phoenix House

On a beautiful spring morning, punctual at 10.00am, Roger (Team Leader) arrived with seven 'blokes' from Phoenix House in Catterick Garrison ready to help with our heavy garden work. After the introductions the men were divided into work groups.

Firstly the compost area needed attention. Divided into three bays reflecting the various stages of decomposition, the contents were redistributed to leave Bay 3 full of beautiful, crumbly, dark compost and Bay 1 empty to allow for the start of a new compost cycle.

A second group helped with the splitting of perennial herbaceous plants. These large plants were split into four pieces, one piece returned to the bed and the remaining three potted up. After six weeks and established root growth, these plants will be ready for sale at the Garden gate.

Using scarifying equipment to remove moss in the lawn was another onerous task. Moss may look light and fluffy but a three quarter full dumpy bag is a considerable weight. No problem, of course, for the 'blokes' All lawns were edged, wild branches cut back, cherry tree suckers were dealt with, as was the dead ivy on the walls.



#### Crime in the Two Dales

With the fields full of ewes and lambs, we have received several

reports of dogs attacking sheep. It goes without saying that this is not only very distressing to both the farmer and his sheep but also a crime and yet it could be easily avoided simply by putting a dog on a lead.

Under the Dogs (Protection of Livestock) Act 1953 the owner and anyone else under whose control the dog is at the time, will be guilty of an offence if it worries livestock on agricultural land. If you allow a dog to worry livestock you can be prosecuted and fined and ordered to pay compensation. A landowner is permitted to shoot your dog if it can be proved that the action was necessary to protect livestock and that it was reported to the police within 48 hours.

Last month we have also received several reports of various thefts. Overnight 8-10 coping (top) stones were removed from a drystone wall in Downholme and a nearby neighbour also had a similar theft. Whilst in Hurst, 15-17kg gas bottle and 3 tractor batteries were stolen.

On a different note, we are aware that people are still being targeted via their telephone, emails or texts by Scammers/Fraudsters. Two to note are those claiming that they are from BT or HM Revenue and Customs. (HMRC)

One other report was that of the caller saying that they were from Durham Constabulary working with school children and then asking for

money.

If you receive a text message from HMRC, which does happen occasionally, they will never request personal or banking information in exchange for a 'tax refund'. Do not open any links contained within the message. Don't give out private information (such as bank details or password), reply to text messages, download attachments or click on any links in emails if you are not sure they're genuine.

According to Action Fraud, the national fraud and cyber-crime reporting centre, people have also been asked to pay bogus debts and taxes using online music store i-Tunes' gift cards.

If you receive a telephone call and you think you have been called by a fraudster the best course of action is to simply hang up. You can report a misleading website, email or phone number to Action Fraud (www.actionfraud.police.uk/

report\_fraud) and search on GOV.UK (www.gov.uk/search) to find official government services and phone numbers - for example if you want to apply for a driving licence etc.



## Farmer And Ranger Create Shelter On Swaledale Moor

An isolated garage on Whitaside Moorwhich symbolises the coming of the motor car to the Dales - has been converted into a shelter for walkers and mountain bikers.

The garage was built in the 1940s by the Sunter family of Robson House Farm for Joseph Sunter's first car, a Standard 12. It had to be put by the roadside, as there was then no track down the fell to his farm. The Sunter family would complete the last leg of their journey home in a tractor, once the car was safely locked away.

When a farm track was laid, the garage became redundant and fell into disrepair. It was then that Norman Sunter, Joseph's grandson, had a chance conversation with his Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority (YDNPA) area ranger, Michael Briggs.

Mr Sunter said: "Over the years we've seen hundreds of people sheltering behind the garage. Instead of standing behind it, I thought they might as well shelter in it. I was wondering whether to just take the garage doors off and leave it open, but Michael said he would like to do it up. And they've done a very good job."

Showing the resourcefulness typical of the YDNPA's ranger service, Michael Briggs assembled a group of volunteers to carry out the renovations and raised funds for the work.

Three businesses chipped in: the Dales Bike Centre at Grinton; the Dales Trail Series, a running event across Swaledale and Wensleydale; and 'Ard

Rock Enduro, a mountain bike festival held each August in Swaledale. In total, the materials for the project cost less than £900.

Rangers and Dales Volunteers cleared the garage of rubbish and accumulated soil; removed the old doors; rebuilt some sections of the walls; added a new roof and lintel; installed some benches and laid a stone aggregate floor. Mr Sunter helped by disposing of a lot of the rubbish and debris.

Michael Briggs said the shelter could not be in a better place: "It is right at the end of a bridleway that connects Swaledale to Wensleydale at Castle Bolton, via Apedale. It also links well to other bridleways spreading in all directions to Low Row and Gunnerside.

"What is so satisfying is that this was an idea from a farmer, who was making a generous offer. It was great to be able to take it up and bring the project to fruition. It cost the Authority nothing but time and it was something a bit novel for our Dales Volunteers to get involved with."

## Upper Dales Family History Group

The April speaker was Mary Randles from Garstang in Lancashire who spoke about her research into her own family in 'Albert's story'. Albert was the eldest child of Mary's grandmother, and had been born illegitimately in 1926 while his mother was in service. The family knew nothing of his parentage so Mary beaan research to grandmother's life, believing she was Lancashire born and bred, only to discover that she had originated in Houghton-le-Spring in County Durham.

Mary had used a number of sources to follow up Albert's tragically short life, beginning with his National Service records which had confirmed his date of birth and named his mother and step father as next of kin. Following up a family story that she had gone into service at Newmillerdam Wakefield and from there had gone to St Michael's on Wyre in Lancashire Mary had used electoral records to trace her grandmother and the families she had worked for. In St Michael's on Wyre she had taken a job as a housekeeper for a widower, but had then married him. He treated Albert as his own son and together they had four more children

Albert had been called up for National Service and joined the Corps of Police, serving in Palestine, where he was killed in 1947. Mary had obtained details of his death from his casualty card and used the services of the War Graves Photographic Project to get a photograph of the grave. She had also arranged for her mother to receive the Elizabeth Cross, an award for the next

of kin of those who died in conflict after the second world war.

However, Mary did not give up find details of trying to grandmother at the time of Albert's birth. She eventually got a certificate which was for an Albert Bayles with the correct date of birth and correct mother's name, and a father named as John Bayles who was found to be a shepherd in a remote cottage at Dallowgill. Investigating further, she found a baptism entry at St Peter's Dallowgill for Albert as being the son of John Bayles, but she never found any entry to suggest that he was ever married to her grandmother.

Mary still had many unanswered questions about her grandmother's life but the way in which she had tackled the search was a fascinating and useful lesson in researching someone who had lived in the twentieth century, which is often more challenging than looking further back.

Our next meeting is on Wednesday, June 28, at 7.30pm in Fremington Sunday School when Anthony Atkinson will be speaking on 'Mary Eleanor Bowes - The Greatest Heiress of the North.' Heiress of Gibside and the Queen's great, great, great grandmother, it is a tale of love, pathos, debauchery, abuse, greed, kidnapping and adultery; ultimately her tale is one of triumph in the face of overwhelming betrayal.

## **SWAAG Hagg Dig**

The Swaledale and Arkengarthdale Archaeology Group (SWAAG) wish to invite volunteers from Reeth and surrounding areas to help explore a site at Hagg Farm, Fremington, and to further understanding of a Romano-British site that may have links to the Roman centre at Catterick.

SWAAG have been awarded a grant from the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority's Sustainable Development Fund to undertake a large dig this July. The dig will focus on opening up a large area across the site, as well as offering an opportunity to explore below the layer at which the site was abandoned to investigate the origins and development of the site.

manager Philip Project Bastow explained: "Thanks to David Clarke and his family who own the Hagg, SWAAG has explored different areas and evidence revealed of possible roundhouses, enclosures and walls. The finds suggest that the site was Romano -British and abandoned towards the end of the 4th century AD. However, we have no evidence as to when the site was established or how it was developed and indeed we are not even sure what it was for. I am confident that this is a major site and of great significance for Swaledale."

He added: "This is very much a community project and we would like as much support as possible from local volunteers with an interest in archaeology. We can provide all the training, we just want their enthusiasm."

The dig will be held from Wednesday 5th July to Wednesday

19th July. Anyone interested in taking part should contact SWAAG at info@SWAAG.org, There are no charges for participation and all equipment and training will be provided.

There will be an opportunity to learn more about the site, the opportunities for participation in the dig and to talk to members of SWAAG, on Saturday 24th June between 2.00pm and 4.00pm in the Reeth Memorial Hall.

If you do not wish to dig but would like to visit the site please join our guided walk. It will leave from the Reeth bus shelter at 10.00am on Sat 15th July and is a round trip of some 4miles. For details, please contact:
