Astronomy In The Two Dales

I am back from out of space. I had a beard but a vacuum sucked it off my face. Thanks to Starboy for manning the controls whilst I investigated the latest developments in space vegetables. However, upon my return I discovered that the USA had pulled out of the Paris climate change agreement and people were losing their minds. So, I thought I would address the issue of astronomical causes of climate changes here on Farth.


As the chart below shows, our planet goes through a cycle of warming and cooling, each cycle lasting approximatively 125,000 years. The main driving force behind this is our star, the Sun.


The chart below that on the left demonstrates the relationship between solar activity and average Earth Temperatures; the image on the right is an illustration of the path our solar system takes as it orbits our galaxy, the Milky Way.

Our solar system passes through the dense clouds of dust and radiation in the plane of our galaxy, which influence not only our Sun but all the planets in our solar system.

On top of this NASA released a report detailing the influence of Supernova, exploding stars, on our Earth. The ice core records show layers of carbon 14 and beryllium and an increase in nitrates in the Antarctic ice sheet caused by a massive increase of Gamma radiation. This raised the average temperature of the Earth between 3 and 4 degrees centigrade.









These events have occurred on average every 12,500 years with the last event being 22,000 years ago, and with the predicted supernova in the constellation Cygnus occurring in 2022, this may be the next one.

So, why are we told that carbon dioxide causes a rise in temperature? Beside the political and financial arguments, it is a matter of psychology. No one likes to think they are not in charge of their own destiny; to realise that we are not in control is unacceptable to most, so we must be told that we can change what is going on.

Fraud Alert

Fraudsters are sending out a high volume of phishing emails to personal business email addresses. pretending to come from various email addresses. which have compromised. The subject line contains the recipient's name, and the main body of text is as below: "Hi, [name] I am disturbing you for a very serious reason. Although we are not familiar, I have a significant amount of individual info concerning you. The thing is that, most likely mistakenly, the data of your account has been emailed to me. For instance, your address is: [real home address]. I am a law-abiding citizen, so I decided your personal data may have been hacked. I attach the file -[surname.dot] that I received, that you could explore what info has become obtainable for scammers. File password is - 2811 Rest Wishes"

The emails include an attachment - a '.dot' file usually titled with the recipient's name. This attachment is thought to contain the Banking Trojan Ursniff/Gozi, hidden within an image in the document. The Ursniff Banking Trojan attempts to obtain sensitive data from victims, such as banking credentials and passwords. The data is subsequently used by criminals for monetary gain.

Protection / Prevention Advice

Having up-to-date virus protection is essential; however it will not always prevent your device(s) from becoming infected. Please consider the following actions:

 Don't click on links or open any attachments you receive in unsolicited emails or SMS messages: Remember that fraudsters can 'spoof' an email address to make it look like one used by someone you trust. If you are unsure, check the email header to identify the true source of communication (You can find out how by searching the internet for relevant advice for your email provider).

- Do not enable macros in downloads. Enabling macros will allow Trojan/ malware to be installed onto your device.
- Always install software updates as soon as they become available. Whether you are updating the operating system or an application, the update will often include fixes for critical security vulnerabilities.
- Create regular backups of your important files to an external hard drive, memory stick or online storage provider. It is important that the device you back up to is not connected to your computer as any malware infection could spread to that as well.
- If you think your bank details have been compromised, you should contact your bank immediately.

Message From The Swaledale Museum In Reeth

We are delighted to report that Anne Hewitt's selling exhibition Land Thread is doing so well that it is now completely different from the one that opened in May, as many works have been sold. Come and see what is new, as fresh pieces are made and the combination of wonderful colours. textures and patterns shift. Thanks to Scenicview we have very smart new for our workshop window exhibition on local lichens created by Les and Sue Knight. The Knights will be hosting two lichen 'drop ins' Wednesday 5th July and Saturday 5th August between 2.00pm to 4.00pm in the Museum. You will be able see and handle specimens, look at them under a microscope and chat about their habitats

On Monday 24th July we are launching John Place's new book on his grandfather The Life of Mr Reginald Place of Reeth which incorporates a history of Reeth over the last 100 years. He will give a short talk, followed by Barbara Buckingham who will remember her uncle and John will sign copies of the book. The usual event charges apply, and booking ahead would be helpful.

Our reaular talks programme continues on Wednesday 12th July with Ruth Rising who will talk on her project 'Grounds for Appeal: The North Riding Military Tribunal Papers 1916 -1918' with special reference to local cases. The North Yorkshire County Record

Heritage Lottery Fund to make the North Riding Military Tribunal Papers 1916 - 1918 widely available. Currently 38 volunteers are listing, conserving and digitizing some 6000 appeal cases of men who wished to defer their military service or who conscientiously objected to it. In 1921 the Board of Health issued instructions that all tribunal records be destroyed. By an oversight the North Riding Tribunal papers have survived. The case papers tell stories of serious hardship and loss of family members as well as glimpses into the state of health of individuals in the North Riding of Yorkshire during the First World War. The War Office issued brochures showing that women could substitute for agricultural workers on farms as well as jobs in other businesses and industries. However some of the appellants in the case papers are certain that women could not possibly substitute for their employee. Such concerns were generally dismissed by the tribunals.

Richard Lamb is leading a tour of the 'Smelt Mills at Marrick' on 22nd July, as a follow up to his June talk. The Marrick mills are important for a number of reasons. The Low Mill is reputedly on the site of Yorkshire's first smelting mill from 1574 and of course both have survived remarkably well. This tour is a rare opportunity to examine, interpret and appreciate the remaining structures and their function within the landscape including the three dams, the two peat houses, the various ancillary buildings, the flue and the two mills with their complete furnace arches. 

The Train That Never Came

From around 1840 until 1920 about a

different schemes proposed for bringing rail to Swaledale. Some of these were hare-brained, idle speculation but three plans can be singled out as serious, with substantial local support and heavyweight political backing resulting in an Act Parliament beina passed to development.

So explained Keith Sweetmore at a meticulously researched and highly engaging talk to a packed audience at Swaledale Museum on Wednesday 7th June. For these eighty years (a time of huge change in the dale with the waning of lead mining and resulting depopulation) rail provided an everpresent promise of delivery from economic decline.

Rail reached Richmond in 1846 and Leyburn ten years later. By 1878 the Wensleydale railway connected Leyburn to Hawes Junction (Garsdale) and continued to place Swaledalers within walking distance of the national rail network until the 1960s. However, the movement of goods (and especially lead, chert, coal, milk and wood (yes, wood.) by rail would require Swaledale to have its own track.

The first serious project was proposed in 1869 to connect Reeth to Richmond with a line terminating near Reeth Bridge. It was backed by Sir George Denys and other local lead mine owners. To minimise costs, the plan proposed diverting the Swale to avoid

the tedium of building two bridges. The project (though not the part involving river diversion) received parliamentary approval but the funding (between £35K and £55K) never materialised.

The next serious plan surfaced in 1882. Far more ambitious in scope, it connection proposed α Richmond and Hawes Junction via Reeth and Hawes, supported by a financial justification so obvious it hardly needed explaining. To avoid overwhelming his audience with maps, Keith had created a photo montage of the intended route so that audience could visualise its traverse. From Reeth the track kept north of the Swale as it passed up dale (Is that kitchen it's going through?), crossing to the south bank near Scabba Wath, then gradually gaining altitude beyond Satron as it rose to a system of short tunnels at Buttertubs before descending to Hawes. Keith's photos did a wonderful job of bringing the plans to life (although where Jenny was Agutter, Keith?), did the as documentation supporting the project.

In order to raise funds, shares were sold door-to-door at over five hundred households in the dale. We know this because Keith has the record of each household's response. No mere set of this record details the accounts. reasons given those 1880s by householders for buying (or more often not buying) shares in the project. I'm sure one of them said 'OK - but don't tell the wife' but I'd have to check. This priceless social record hopefully be available at the museum before long. The financial justification may have been obvious, but not obvious enough to raise what must have been an

astronomical sum for such an ambitious | worth'. project. Like its predecessor, it never got beyond plans.

Alas, the same is true for the third project Keith described. The Swaledale Light Railway (1912) was intended to follow much the same route as the 1869 project with terminal Fremington rather than Reeth, just outside the Dales Bike Centre. Keith brought the beautiful and detailed large scale maps for this venture to the meeting for all to see. Backed by chert miner James William Close, this project held the promise of government funding. However, when what was thought to be a government grant turned out to be a loan, the local council smelt a rat. They may not have been alone as one nameless Whitehall civil servant recorded that 'this line is pretty obviously more trouble than it's

Which is probably the destiny of all plans to bring a railway to the dale with the fastest rising spate river England. The Swaledale Light Railway project was briefly resurrected after WW1, but by then peak rail was already history.

And so too ends my summary of Keith's brilliant talk. I have not been able to do justice to the amazing insight into Swaledale history that Keith's research has exposed. I should add too, that any errors in the above account are of the author's making blame my notetaking.





Reeth Brass Band

The recent Band Annual General Meeting appointed Brian Hicks as their new President.

On completion he was awarded the Silver Medal by the Worshipful Company of Musicians, London as the top student.

Brian served as Bandmaster of the Royal Fusiliers (City of London Regiment), completing tours of the UK, Germany and Sharja in the Persian Gulf. Further appointments followed as Brigade Bandmaster of the Parachute Regiment, then Director of Music for The Parachute Regiment and Airborne Forces. His next posting was to the Artillery Mounted Germany, culminating finally with the prestigious appointment as Director of Music of The Scots Guards Band in London, taking part in all aspects of Royal duties.

After leaving the service he travelled to Oman to help form the new School of Music for the Sultan's Royal Oman Police. He finally retired to his native Cornwall continuing in music, conducting choirs for many years as well as playing principal horn in the

Plymouth Symphony Orchestra. On his move to Richmond, to be near family, he has played horn with the Richmondshire Symphony Orchestra before joining Reeth Brass Band as a baritone player then Musical Director.

Brian is a Licentiate of the Royal Academy of Music, an associate of the Royal College of Music and an Honours Fellow of the Victoria College of Music in London. The band is fortunate to have such an accomplished musician in our midst and we wish him many happy years as our new President.

Defibrillator Tan Hill: Tan Hill have placed a collection box in the pub. Cllr Blows had sent an e-mail regarding the grant, which could possibly be obtained for purchasing the defibrillator. The grant will not be available until at least the end of May.

Water on Road, Muker: Highways online reporting system states that the request had been fulfilled.

Pot Holes, Ivelet: Highways have been contacted and the service request is still open.

Finance: The Chairman read the Annual Governance Statement; the Clerk presented the Financial Report for the year ending March 2017; the Chairman read the Financial Risk Assessment. All were in favour.

Highways: Silver Hill - Cllr Whitehead raised the issue of caravans, motor homes etc not being able to get up Silver Hill and having to be towed out. The tight bend has been causing problems for a long time, with four mobile homes needing assistance in April alone. The Grit bins are often being knocked as vehicles reverse to try and get around the corner and in turn the grit bins have knocked the wall down. Missing Sign - Cllr Porter raised the issue of a missing sign for Crackpot and Summerbridge at the top of Gunnerside Bridge. Clerk to contact Highways.

YDNPA: Planning Application R/06/245A for the conversion of a barn into a two bedroom holiday let -

Millbridge Farm - Low Oxnop; and Planning Application R/06/219A for the erection of a detached garage at Brystone - West Stonesdale, had both been received. The Council had no objections to either.

CTC Path: Cllr Whitehead read out an e-mail from Michael Briggs Park Ranger regarding repair and reinstatement works to areas of the CTC path which have been eroded east of Swinner Gill. The Parish Council supported the work.

YLCA: Better Broadband Subsidy Scheme - the Chairman read out an email which had been received regarding the Government Scheme. If someone can't get a broadband speed of at least 2Mb per second they could qualify for a subsidised connection worth up to £350. People should contact basicbroadbandchecker.culture.gov.uk to see if they are eligible.

Bench Muker - Cllr Metcalfe raised the issue of a bench in Muker Village adjacent to the Highway, Clerk to contact Highways.

Streetlight Keld - A letter had been received from a resident in Keld with the support of a number of other residents regarding the street lights in Keld. The issue of the lights in the public toilets being on all night was also raised, which the residents feel leads to light pollution but also cannot be cost effective regarding energy saving. Update On Wild Flower Meadow In The Orchard

The meadow looked a picture in the middle of May: vetch was still there but in smaller quantities; the yellow rattle was coming through; wood cranesbill and oxeye daisies in bud; the dandelions (loved by the bees) were probably the more dominant at this stage but I pulled the clocks off to avoid them spreading too much.

The middle of May saw a visit from Tanya St Pierre, the Hay Meadow Project Officer for the Millennium Trust For The Yorkshire Dales. She was very encouraged when she saw the large quantities of yellow rattle, clover, wood cranesbill (what beautiful colour) and buttercups all flowering. The vetch was flowering but mainly near the trees (where in years gone by fertiliser has been used around them, but not anymore). Tanya suggested we take the flower heads off the vetch as much as possible before it seeded, allowing the other flowers to continue to flourish.

Eyebright along with Yellow Rattle is another semi parasitic plant that we planted last year, but will not come through until June time. Both will have contributed to the Vetch being less vigorous.

The plan is to cut the meadow when the Yellow Rattle has seeded ie when the loose dry seeds inside the plant begin to rattle. Weather allowing this should be well into July.

The Orchard is a beautiful, peaceful place to visit, especially at this time of the year - you may even find some plants for sale for your own garden.

Upper Dales Family History Group

May's speaker was Dr Joan Heggie of Teesside University who came to talk about the project she is working on called Women and Property in the North Riding of Yorkshire in the 18th and 19th centuries. The aim is to build up a picture of women's involvement in property and land, investigate what property they owned, comparing a period in the 18th century with a period in the 19th century after the Married Women's Property Act. Using the deeds as a starting point the project's aim is to then go on and reconstruct the lives of the women represented.

Using the Register of Deeds at the North Yorkshire County Records Office in Northallerton Joan had been able to analyse the deeds in great depth and extract data to show the representation of women and their status - spinsters, wives, daughters, widows etc.

In the early part of the study over half the women were married and about a third were widowed. But in later transactions widows were the largest portion and married women's involvement dropped. Some of the deeds also named women and their relationships which is of great use to family historians.

One case involved Jane Severs, a widow. The deed gave her whole family history, including details of her brother, parents, and grandparents. Men were not required to give this level of information when registering a property, but women were, in order to

prove that they had legitimately inherited the property and had the right to pass it on. Some deeds also give the former names of the parties where an heir had changed their surname in order to inherit a property.

Sadly later deeds at the end of the 19th century no longer always listed family relationships as civil registration had made it easier to prove identity, but did often still contain useful extra information such as occupations. The deeds transcribed so far are on a searchable database at http://www.registerofdeeds.org.uk/about

Reeth Parish Council and Annual General Meeting May 2017

Appointments: Coun Cluderay was elected as chair for the coming year, with Coun Kendal as vice chair; Couns Frankland and Longstaff as green wardens; Coun Cluderay as Memorial Hall representative; and Coun Bearpark as market representative. Ian Scott was re-appointed as clerk.

The vacant posts had been advertised but no-one had requested an election or put themselves forward for nomination. It was therefore agreed that the clerk should approach those who had previously expressed an interest with a view to co-opting them onto the council.

Accounts: The accounts and annual return were circulated and accepted.

County Council: Notice was received of an NYCC scheme which would require utility companies to obtain a permit from the county council before carrying out work which involved digging up roads.

Cycle events: The Ard Rock event would be based at the Bike Centre at Fremington from August 4 to 6.

National Park: Notice was received of the YDNP's proposed Management Plan along with an invitation to be part of the forum to discuss it.

Tree removal: Approval had been given for the removal of a sycamore tree at High Fremington.

Street lights: The light at Fremington had now been mended.

Market report: Although the number of market stalls was very low at the present time, this was a reflection of

what was happening elsewhere, not just in Reeth.

Playground: A quote had been received from Playdale for repairs. The biggest single item was the zip wire which required frequent attention due to misuse of the equipment. Councillors agreed to pay for the repair this time but to consider other options in the future.

District Council: Richmondshire District Council had approved the proposed reduction in the number of councillors and would be applying to the boundary commission to have this put into practice.

Highways: Coun Frankland reported that the flags near the bottom of the village and on Silver Street had still not been repaired.

Security Marking: The clerk had contacted the local police with regard to holding a security marking session in Reeth but had heard nothing back. He would follow this up.



Election of Chair: Cllr Alderson was elected unanimously as Chair with Cllr Crapper elected unanimously as Vice-Chair.

Trees Gunnerside Ghyll: in Cllr McCartney has been in touch with a contractor, who carried out some work in the past and it was agreed for him to arrange to have a look and give a quotation for some work Cllr McCartney will contact YDNPA to confirm which trees can be removed or cut back.

Dog waste bin: The Clerk has contacted RDC regarding the dog waste bin which was ordered last year and which has not yet been installed. Cllr Blows will contact RDC regarding this issue.

Financial Risk Assessment: The financial risk assessment was approved. Audit- Annual governance statement: This was approved unanimously by councillors.

Accounting statement: this was approved unanimously by councillors.

Highways: the clerk was asked to report the following issues to

Highways: drain at West End cottage; Gunnerside, street light at Peat Gate; street light outside Corner Cottage, Gunnerside; drain at the top of Peat Gate. It was confirmed that the replacement of the pole at Toledo has not yet been completed.

Councillor Stubbs was again voted in as Chairman, with Councillor Lundberg remaining as Vice Chairman

County Councillor Blackie brought the council up to date on progress with the plan to build four affordable homes in the dale. The intention is to form an Upper Dales Community Land Trust, under the auspices of the Upper Wensleydale Community Partnership (UWCP), whose objective would be to develop sites in the upper dales to provide affordable houses for rent in perpetuity, and beyond the reach of the recent right to buy legislation. Councillor Blackie has approached Richmondshire District Council for a arant towards the funding of a part time worker at the UWCP, whose role would be to undertake the tasks necessary to form the Upper Dales Community Land Trust, whilst also bringing forward the architectural plans for the development, drafting the planning applications to the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority, and seeking the funding from various available sources to actually build the houses. The initial projects would be the one at Langthwaite and another at Hawes.

Councillor Blackie made clear that any affordable housing for rent scheme in Arkengarthdale that came forward via the Upper Dales CLT would be delivered as a full working partnership between the Trust and the Parish Council, this including deciding who would be offered the tenancy of the houses initially and as they become available for re-allocation. However the

Parish Council would not be required to provide any funding towards the scheme

The Councillors voted unanimously to support in principle the proposals as put to it by Councillor Blackie.

There are several road repairs pending in the dale and Councillor Blackie is to take a Highway Engineer round to highlight them. Councillors pointed out problems with the roads to Booze and Whaw, the road from Whaw to Faggergill and the deep holes at the edges of Stang Lane.

Speeding motorists through the dale are causing concern and the police will be contacted to determine the best course of action

Planning applications have been approved for a low-level extension at Town End, Whaw; a barn conversion at Bouldershaw Lane; and new windows at Plantation and Watson's Cottage, Stang Lane.

Mr. Robert Baker had informed the council of his retirement from the grass cutting. He has served us extremely well over the years and the councillors thank him for his work and wish him well in his retirement. Local resident and Scar House gardener Mr. Steve Colman is to take on the role for a trial period.
