Post Office News

Don't panic. Not just yet anyway -you've still got time to dispose of your old pound coins. You have until Sunday 15th October: after that date the old round pound will no longer be legal tender and businesses will not be obliged to accept them. However, the old coins can still be deposited at Post Offices and most high street banks. Note though that they will have to be paid into an account - you won't be able to just exchange old coins for new ones. And, this will only be a temporary measure, so it would be best to get rid of them beforehand.

Don't you just love the new polymer £5 notes? Well the new £10 notes come out on the 14th of this month so it will be joy unconfined. After the numerous complaints about the material used to make the fivers, the new tenners will be made out of exactly the same materials - animal fats included. But the new f.10 note is 'cleaner, safer and stronger than the old one and contains sophisticated security features which make it very difficult counterfeit.' They are also more environmentally friendly than the paper ones due to their durability. The Carbon Trust has certified that over their full life cycle, the carbon footprint of a £5 polymer banknote is 16% lower than the £5 paper banknote, while the carbon footprint of a £10 polymer banknote is 8% lower than the £10 paper banknote.

As for the old notes, their legal tender status will be withdrawn in Spring 2018 with the exact date being announced at least three months in advance.

Sadly, you will have to wait until 2020 for the new £20 notes.

Finally, just a reminder that you can save yourself having to travel miles by carrying out most of your day to day banking activities at the Post Office. The Post Office has an arrangement with most high street banks to enable personal and business account holders to carry out transactions at the post office. Businesses wanting to get their change from a post office will need to get a change giving card from their bank. It makes sense to support the local post office: Where would we be if Post Office Ltd followed the lead of the banks in deciding that rural branches were no longer viable?

Swaledale Mountain and Cave Rescue Team

A busy few weeks with 12 incidents. 08/08/2017: (49) 15.30hrs: Team called by the ambulance service to assist fire, helimed, ambulance, HART & Police with the rescue of a farmer. The casualty had rolled a tractor & slurry trailer down a steep wet banking & then been thrown clear of the vehicle another 80ft. A joint stretcher carry to the helimed for transport to hospital.

07/08/2017: (48) 13.30hrs: The team requested to search for a missing 13 year old, lost between stages for over 4 hours, on the Ard Rock event. A quick search located the child & they were returned by team vehicle to waiting parents.

04-06/08/2017: (45,46,47) 07.00hrs: The team attended the Ard Rock mountain bike event providing rescue cover for over 2,000 riders. 12 rescues completed & plenty of scuffs & grazed knees.

24/07/2017: (44) 16.30hrs: Team called by Yorkshire Ambulance to rescue an injured walker near Aysgill Force, Hawes. Ambulance crew had assessed & the team carried back to the road. The call initially went to Cave Rescue who quickly passed it on to us.

22/07/2017: (43) 13.30hrs: Team called by Yorkshire Ambulance service to rescue an injured motor cross rider 4 miles from the road in a steep gully. Helimed also attended & the casualty was less injured than first thought &

was walked to the aircraft for transfer to the road ambulance.

20/07/2017: (42) 16.00hrs: Team search dog & handler called to assist Teesdale MRT with a missing person search.

17/07/2017: (41) 20.00hrs: Team called to Gunnerside Gill to rescue an injured mountain biker; treated on scene by the team & evacuated to the road for transport to hospital.

15/07/2017: (40) 08.30hrs: Team provided safety cover for the DT 30km race. 1 person evacuated from the hill & a few bumps & scrapes dealt with.

11/07/2017: (39) 11.30hrs: Team called by Yorkshire Ambulance to a walker with a medical condition on the fells above Grinton. While en route the casualty recovered enough to be assisted to the ambulance by the crew & passing walkers.

08/07/2017: (38) 08.30hrs: Team provided safety cover for the Nut Cracker Mountain bike event. A number of casualties dealt with during the day.

Reeth Parish Council July 2017

Verge cutting: The National Park ranger had confirmed that cutting the roadside verge on the road to the White House was the responsibility of Highways, not the YDNPA.

Playground: The district council inspection had pointed out a number of items needing attention and these had been passed on to Mr Whitehead to be dealt with. The new parts had been ordered from Playdale and the clerk had submitted a grant application to help cover some of the costs. A RoSPA inspection would be carried out in September.

Visitor Survey: Notice was received that the YDNPA would be carrying out a 5-yearly visitor survey in Reeth on a few days during the summer. They asked to be informed of any days which would be unsuitable due to particular events.

Remembrance Day and Poppy Appeal: In answer to a request from the police councillors confirmed that the parade would be held on Sunday, November 12, and that this year they wished to march back from the service as well as to it. A letter had been received from Martin Sunderland, the new Poppy Appeal co-ordinator, who had also taken on responsibility for flying the union flag on Remembrance Day and for the funerals of local veterans. Coun Kendall agreed to pass on details of these on behalf of the council.

Public toilets: RDC planned to start charging for the use of toilets, including the ones in Reeth, and would be installing pay locks on doors..

District council: Coun Scott reported

on a self-build housing seminar he had attended and on news from a recent RDC meeting that central government funding for district councils would be withdrawn in the near future.

Village clock: The council agreed to take out an agreement with Smiths of Derby to ensure regular maintenance of the clock in future.

Healaugh defibrillator: An electrician had now examined the proposed site and advised on the practicalities.

Village green: The clerk had written to the businesses which had either not returned green agreements or were not complying with them, but had so far had no response. He was asked to write again to inform business owners that signs left out overnight would be liable to be impounded if no action was taken.

It had been suggested that an additional honesty box was required at the north side of the green but councillors felt that the existing ones were already visible enough; some motorists simply ignored them.

A litter bin was requested for the side of the green near the post office where some visitors were using private and business bins for their rubbish.

Drains: Coun Frankland reported that water was still overflowing across the Arkengarthdale Road and into a garden on the lower side of the road, even though the problem had supposedly been investigated. A blocked drain on the cobbles near the Black Bull was also spilling water onto the road, running down towards the Copper Kettle. The clerk would report both of these problems to Highways.

Next meeting: Monday, September 25, at 7.00m in the Memorial Hall.



Sewing Machines

You may remember an earlier appeal for sewing machines to send to Malawi, and this is to thank, and update, the families who are giving so generously.

In June-July a team of self-funded volunteers went to Malamulo in Southern Malawi and trained 38 ladies with all sorts of backgrounds how to make washable sanitary pads. Our volunteers were taken aback that some have never used scissors before, something we just take for granted. The pictures below show the workshop, and ladies learning to cut from templates.

Everyone made enthusiastic and, at times, outstanding progress. Our "graduates" will be acting as teams of trainers, showing local mothers and grandmothers how to make them. Pads will be given free to girls, helping to keep them in school longer to enhance their prospects, and those of their







families. There is also spin off through increasing sewing skills to mend and make. They will be supported by the Malamulo College of Health Sciences and the National Police Aid Convoy UK charity.

Donations from the Dales were collected by Andrew Stones from Arkle Town, shown in the picture above with Heather Roberts from NPAC, and we know that there are already even more offers. Andrew is happy to hear from anyone willing to drop off donations and will store them for collection by us.

We also regularly collect gardening and other tools, sheets and blankets (not duvets or pillows), school text books and baby and children's clothes and shoes (not adult): pretty much anything else that can be used. Ask if you are not sure.

Another container will be going out in December with further supplies. The more hand and electric sewing machines and other items that we have, the more we and our partners in Malawi can do to spread the project to other villages, and to help those communities. Please email heather@npac.org.uk

Many of you will be familiar with my Computer Corner articles. I have been writing those now for over 8 years (time flies) and for a change I thought I would start alternating them with a column about my first love - music. This is just a short article to gauge the level of interest - so if you are interested do let me know (email address below).

About 4 years ago I started to learn the cello at the age of 55. Most people say that learning musical instruments is for young people but I can honestly say it is never too late. I will write more about taking up a musical instrument later in life in a future article.

A couple of weeks ago I spent a week near Oxford at Oxford Cello School on a 'performance' course and played a cello sonata in a recital - the first time I had played unaccompanied cello in front of a fairly large audience. I spent quite a few months preparing for the concert and this brings me on to the topic of this article: Sir Granville Bantock, the composer of the sonata I played.

Sir Granville Bantock - who is he? He was a British Composer of the late 19th century and the first half of the 20th century. Sadly his music is not

played often but I was introduced to his cello sonata, fell in love with it and had to play it. His sonata made me curious about the man and his music and why has he been almost forgotten?

I can't really answer that question but he was a great composer, featured at the BBC Proms a few years ago where he was described as the "most unjustly neglected composer of the 20th century." He was a highly prolific composer and educator and received a lot of support and admiration from other, often better known, composers.

Sir Edward Elgar was a friend and admirer of his work and Bantock took over teaching composition at Birmingham University from Elgar. He remained in Birmingham teaching a composing for 30 years.

Another admirer and friend was the great Finnish Composer Jean Sibelius - they dedicated symphonies to each other.

Being a bit obsessive about music and musicians I sought out further information about Bantock and ended up in a lengthy correspondence with his grandson. Now I plan a new website about Bantock's music.

In order to make this article real for you I would like to share some music with you so you listen and let me know what you think. You can also read more about his life and music by going here: http://tinyurl.com/bantock-bio (If you aren't sure what to do with this just open a web page on your computer and type the address in the bar at the very top of the window that opens and

Do let me know what you think of this music and let me know if there are any music topics or composers you would like me to write about. One of my particular interests is finding music that is rarely heard but I am open to any suggestions from the 'classical' repertoire.

Astronomy In The Two Dales

'Winter is coming!' said Galaxian.

On 22nd September the sun is above/below the horizon for approximately equal time: 12 hours, the Autumnal Equinox. Daylight hours are shortening at the maximum rate, about 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ minutes each day. Whilst readers may despair, stargazers welcome the encroaching darkness.

The night sky changes with the seasons as we orbit the sun and the dark side of the earth faces out to different parts of our universe. A useful coincidence is that the shortening of the days and the seasonal changing of the night sky 'cancel' each other out. So, when it is fully dark about 2 hours after sunset, the night sky looks pretty much the same from August through to the end of the year.

On a clear evening this autumn, wrap up warm, grab a comfy chair, find a dark location away from lights with a good view to the south, sit back and explore the grandeur of our galaxy - the Milky Way.

Give your eyes time to adapt to the dark (at least 15 mins), use a dim red light for illumination and wear any distance/driving glasses.

The chart opposite shows the night sky to the south at 21:00 on 22nd September.

The Milky Way can be seen as a hazy band of light arcing up over the sky from south-west to north-east. This becomes more west to east as night and months progress.

The haze is made up of 200 billion (and counting*) stars including 500

million 'habitable' planets (current estimate*). The solar system embedded part way out from the centre of the frisbee shaped Milky Way and the hazy band is where we are looking along the body of the disc. There is a bulge of stars near the super-massive black hole in the centre of our galaxy and this is just visible low down on the horizon where the band widens. A dark rift and mottled lighter and darker patches may be visible. This is due, mainly to inter-stellar dust hiding background stars.

The triangle of 3 bright stars is known as the Summer Triangle. Sometimes that is all that is visible from light polluted suburbia.

Back in 1610, Galileo first used a telescope to resolve the haze of light into individual stars. Readers with binoculars or spotting telescopes can have their own Galileo moment: use the lowest magnification, try to find a way to steady yourself and slowly scan across and along the 'via lactea'. See how the view ebbs and flows, filling with stars and darkness. Awesome





Climate Action

Firstly, I'm sorry about the misleading temperatures in August's article - I didn't check that it would be OK to use a symbol for degrees Celsius, resulting in some very misleading figures. So the last sentence in paragraph 3 should read 'Earth's temperatures are over 30 dearees C more than they would be without our atmosphere: around 17 degrees C instead of -18 degrees C. The correct final paragraph is: 'The Paris Agreement [...], committed to hold the increase in temperature caused by human activity to well below 2 degrees C compared to pre-industrial levels (we are already more than 1 degrees C above that), and pursue efforts to limit it to 1.5 degrees C.

In August, we reviewed the scientific consensus that the increased global temperatures since the 1750s are human-caused; and the 'bathtub' effect: meaning that to reduce the level of Greenhouse Gas (GHG) emissions in the atmosphere (water in the bath), we need to reduce emissions sources (the taps) and increase sinks (the plughole).

Fossil fuels have enabled fantastic progress since the first Industrial Revolution, but limiting global warming

sharpr1966@gmail.com 07943 715003 or 01748 884584 to 2 degrees C or less above those preindustrial levels means moving away from fossil fuels over the next few decades, while delivering more energy to ensure prosperity for everyone. We have to 'turn the curve' on GHG emissions, stabilising at 420ppm and then reducing rapidly: scientists say that if we exceed 450ppm, the dangers are profound.

The Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change has calculated a carbon (globalcarbonproject.org), helping us understand for how long we can continue burning fossil fuels. To have a 'likely chance' (2/3 probability) of not exceeding the 2 degrees C limit, scientists calculate that we could burn another 816 billion tonnes of carbon after 2016. However, 816 tonnes isn't going to help us stay 'well below' 2 degrees C, and there is a 1/3 chance we would still exceed 2 degrees C. At current rates, we are burning around 36 billion tonnes each year, meaning we would burn through that budget in around 20 years - and the rate of emissions is still going up each year. The carbon budget is almost spent - we cannot carry on for even one more generation at this level, and so we have to reduce rapidly emissions from fossil fuels, deforestation and land sources. Today, fossil fuels provide around 80% of primary energy; by 2030, we need to be using 80% from renewables or zero carbon sources. Continuing to burn all the known reserves of fossil fuels will blow the carbon budget, so we have to strand these assets - in other words. 'leave it in the ground'.

The Paris Agreement signatories committed to implement Nationally

Determined Contributions (NDCs) to turn emissions down sharply, with targets for 2030 and 2050. NDCs plan the transition to 'clean and green' energy: non-carbon energy, or carbon energy combined with carbon capture, together with restoring ecosystems and stopping emissions from deforestation and land degradation.

The 16 countries with the highest emissions have collaborated on the 'Deep Decarbonisation Pathways Project': research to develop practical national blueprints for limiting global warming to 2 degrees C or less, focussed on long-term transformational approaches. They show many similarities, with three common pillars:

- Ambitious energy efficiency gains
- Low carbon electricity, from renewables and possibly nuclear
- 'Fuel switching' to reduce emissions

from buildings, transport and industry: through electrification, bioenergy and synthetic fuels.

The costs are surprisingly low, typically around 1% of Gross Domestic Product. These common factors provide opportunities to share expertise and collaborate on technology developments. The results give grounds for optimism - ambitious reduction is achievable, through multiple feasible technical routes. We don't need a miracle, just a sustained transition starting now. And why would we not prefer safe, clean and secure sources of energy, instead of relying on cartels and imports, and polluting our air, atmosphere, land and water?

Middleham & The Dales Local History Group

Arkengarthdale Parish Council July 2017

Councillor Stones was welcomed back after his recent major heart operation. chairman welcomed District Councillor Ian Scott to the meeting. Matters arising: The possibility of building houses on the car park land was discussed in some detail. The Watkins Councillor chairman and attending the recent UDAP meeting at Carperby, where affordable housing was on the agenda. County Councillor Blackie was given confirmation of a arant towards funding of a Project Worker who would work solely on developing community-led housing projects. RDC will undertake a survey on the land and advise on its suitability for building.

Roads: Councillor Scott said he was aware that some roads in the dale had been inspected with a view to doing repairs. The main road from Reeth has now been resurfaced. Following the resurfacing of the road to Whaw bridge, a complaint was received by County Councillor Blackie from resident that the surface was too smooth and could present problems during icy weather. Nothing has been done about outstanding road repairs on Stang Lane, the roads to Booze and from Eskeleth to Seal houses. Councillor Watkins will chase all these up with Highways.

In addition there is still the issue of who is responsible for the much needed repairs to the church road. The clerk had found an entry from the minutes of the meeting of 15th September 1986 which reads "Repairs to the church road have been made. Clerk to

acknowledge thanks to the Highways department." The parish council is also aware that Mr. Arnold Singer, who was parish councillor from 1987 to 1992, used a bye law during that time to prove that it was the responsibility of the County Council and further repairs carried were out by Unfortunately we now have a situation North Yorkshire Hiahway department is denying responsibility for the road and as a consequence, it is now in a bad state of repair. Councillor Watkins will take the matter up with the Highway department.


Councillor Watkins advised the meeting of the setting up by Area1 Richmond, of the online Parish Portal where road repairs can be reported and then followed through to conclusion. He will circulate the details to the other councillors by email.

Finance: A cheque was issued for £15 to pay for the hire of the school room for the meeting, and one for £50 in favour of two dales football club to give to Mr. David Williams for his help with the accounts.

Local Matters: Councillor Lundberg said the wall at Arkle Town will be rebuilt during the second week in August.

Councillor Watkins reported that he had been contacted by the police following a residents complaint of speeding motorists through the dale. They advised that a survey had been carried out and is being analysed to determine the best course of action.

Councillor Stones thanked the Chairman and Councillor Watkins for their help during the planning meeting when the conversion of his barn was discussed and approved.
