# Boost to the Swaledale and Wensleydale Flood Recovery Fund

In May 2020, the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government announced that up to £250,000 in match funding would be made available for communities in Swaledale Arkengarthdale Wensleydale and affected by flooding in July 2019 and February 2020. This is a significant concession from the government and means that all the local fundraising done will be doubled

This boost to the Swaledale & Wensleydale Recovery Fund managed by Two Ridings Community Foundation means more can be done to help local residents recover from the damaging effects of the flooding. We aim to help ensure that homes, businesses and communities are better prepared and able to recover more quickly in the event of any future flooding, as well as provide additional assistance with recovery and reinstatement in cases of hardship.

Many people have not yet been able to return home, and in some cases additional, perhaps unexpected expenses, have been incurred. These funds will be able to help with these on going recovery needs.

In addition, Two Ridings Community Foundation will be looking to work alongside local organisations, Parish and Town Councils and groups of local residents to develop and implement plans to help protect communities from the risk of future flooding. The types of activities which can be funded are variable - from upland and Beckside

planting, to well-designed improvements to watercourses, to projects that will reduce surface water run-off in the villages. Work is underway to identify sources of support and expertise to help local communities design and implement effective projects.

Some funding will also be available to help individual local residents provide flood resilience measures for their homes, such as flood barriers or doors, drainage improvements etc. It is unlikely that for larger schemes of work in particular, the full cost of these works could be covered.

The current situation with regard to Covid-19, and the restrictions imposed on how we all do business and conduct our lives, will have an impact on how Two Ridings Community Foundation is able to carry out this task. This means it is taking a little longer than might have been expected to get the process for applications up and running and to get the right people in place to work effectively with local communities.



# Mountain & Cave Rescue Team

Incidents

May 30th to June 15th

On average we respond to between 50 to 60 calls each year.

#### 3 Incidents this edition

The teams focus during the Covid-19 outbreak has been to maintain an operational Mountain & Cave Rescue Service, we've held meetings on-line & limited equipment checks to single members of the team. Fortunately are well stocked with the essential PPE to protect the team if deployed.

14 & 15/06/2020: Incident 21: Called by the Police to search for a missing person, the team searched for 2 days with help from RAF Leeming Mountain Rescue Tea. Sadly a body was located.

14/06/2020: Incident 20: Called to assist the Ambulance service with the evaluation of a casualty at Aysgarth Falls again (again, the 3<sup>rd</sup> time in a few weeks!)

**30/06/2020: Incident 19:** Called to assist the Ambulance service with the evaluation of a casualty at Aysgarth Falls again (again, the 2nd time in May)

Each month we highlight an item of our rescue equipment; this is how we spend your generous donations. Last month we looked at our waterproofs, this

month we thought you might like to see some of our medical equipment. We carry a vast range of equipment to treat & preserve life in some very difficult locations, we don't have the luxury of getting the casualty into hospital very quickly so we have to be able to stabilise & treat in the field prior to transport off the hill or from out of a cave.



We carry Oxygen & spares, each cylinder lasts about 30min so we need to move plenty of these during a rescue, especially if it's going to take a few hours to evacuate the casualty.

When I first joined Mountain rescue some 30 years ago the cylinders were really really heavy, now with lightweight technology they are only really heavy!

Thanks to all our team members, supporters & YOU for the ongoing support.





#### **Dark Sky bid endorsed**

#### Bainbridge, 1 July 2020

An application for International Dark Sky Reserve status for the Yorkshire Dales National Park has been endorsed by the National Park Authority's board, after research showed the quality of the dark sky in the Dales to be 'exceptional'.

Yesterday's annual general meeting of the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority (YDNPA) heard that more than 400 light measurements had been taken at night across 290 locations in the National Park from late 2018 through to early spring this year. More than 100 locations had readings of 21.2mpas (magnitudes per square arcsecond) or more, which is the minimum requirement for a Dark Sky Reserve. Members of the board agreed that the core area of the Dark Sky Reserve could comprise a large arc of land around but not including Hawes, taking in the upper ends of Swaledale, Rawthey Valley, Garsdale, Littondale and Wharfedale. The core area would cover 30% of the entire National Park.

Members also adopted a Light Management Plan. It contains principles on external lighting which will be given effect in the next Local Plan.

Nick Cotton, the YDNPA's Member Champion for Recreation Management, said: "I would like to thank the National Park Authority volunteers who worked alongside members of local astronomy groups to gather the light readings necessary to support our Dark Sky Reserve application. The dark sky in the National Park has been recognised as one of it's special qualities for many years. Now we've got the data to back it up. Dark Sky Reserve status will help us gain international recognition and preserve the dark sky of the National Park. It has the potential to boost the tourism economy too. On a clear winter's night in the National Park you can see the Milky Way, planets, shooting stars and sometimes even the northern lights. I would encourage those councils who haven't yet got involved to send in a letter of support, as we need to demonstrate that the reserve bid has strong community support."


The full Authority meeting heard that the aim was to submit the application to the International Dark Sky Association by the end of July. The bid document is currently being finalised with the help of YDMT Consultants Limited and Fiona Southern of Carrock Landscapes Ltd. In February, local businesses led an appeal for people to sign a pledge of support for the bid. So far, 424 of pledges have been signed. The Yorkshire Dales National Park would become the fourth National Park in England to become a Dark Sky Reserve, after Northumberland, Exmoor and The South Downs.

#### British Summer Time Begins By Ysenda Maxtone-Graham

This book is about summer holidays of the mid 20th century and how they were spent. Vividly remembered in detail by the people who were there. It paints a portrait of 20th century Britain in summertime: how we were, how families functioned, what houses and gardens and streets were like, what journeys were like, and what people did all day in their free time. From pre-war summers to the late 1970s. It takes us back to the long stretch of time from the last days of June till the early days of September.

Those months when at the end of Summer Term you were set free for the school holidays, you could become the person you really were. You had enough hours in the endless succession of days to become good at the things that would later define you. The 'showpiece' part of the summer holidays was 'the Summer Holiday', when families took off to the seaside, or to the grandparents' houses. Siblings wedged into the back of small cars, roof-racks clattering, mothers preparing picnics. The holiday weeks when nothing much officially happened, boredom often lurked nearby, and you vanished for hours on end, nobody much knowing or even caring where you were. Could it be that those unscheduled days were actually the most important and formative of your life?

Editor Note: I have not read this yet but intend to. I can remember preparing to go on holiday crammed into the back of a car with my three sisters.

Yes four in the back of a very small car with no seat belts. I would have packed a Summer Beano comic, I-SPY books, a bucket and spade etc. No doubt one of my sisters would suffer travel sickness and my dad would say we cannot stop or we will never get there. We often had to drive from Nottingham down through the very centre of London (no M25 then) directly down to Hove or Seaford in Sussex. To get through London quickly we would get up really early and be told to keep silent as we got into the car. Not something I think anybody does these days. On the way we would play boring 'eye spy with my little eye' or sing terrible

songs like 'she will be coming round the mountain'. Often our holidays were to those large static caravan parks (Holimarine—see photo), with a centre of evening entertainment (or so named?) and a swimming pool.

No television in the caravan. No TV is brilliant when you come to think about it. I did enjoy them and its not just nostalgia.



## Message From Mike Brookes

#### Dear Patient

I hope this message finds you well. I know that some of you have spent time away from work and family; some of you have been shielding to protect yourself, loved ones and greater society; some of you have been required to work harder than ever; everyone has made some form of sacrifice during the pandemic.

I would like to take the opportunity to give you an update on what is happening at Reeth Medical Centre since the pandemic began in March.

At the onset of the pandemic, we completely reorganised the way the practice functioned within a matter of days in order to protect our patients and staff and enable us to continue to provide care to all those who needed it. We remained flexible to adapt to the guidance provided by the NHS, Public Health England and the government, which changed frequently understanding of the coronavirus developed.

The government mandated that we clinically triage all patients before offering any appointments at the surgery. This was a stark contrast to the open access, walk in clinic we offered previously. Staff and patients adapted well to the change and we are now able to offer more email, video and telephone consultations than before.

Our clinical staff now wear full Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), protecting patients from respiratory exposure.

At the moment we continue to work hard to give you the care you need but life is not back to normal for healthcare.

In my opinion, the coronavirus is unlikely to go away. It is more likely that we will face a scenario where we have to learn to live alongside the virus. If our immune response to COVID-19 is similar to that of other coronavirus infections, any immunity we generate is likely to be short-lived, meaning we are at risk from repeat infections. This also means that vaccination is likely to be challenging and may mean regular, repeat vaccination assuming a vaccine can be developed.

#### For us, this means that we will:

Continue to clinically triage patients by telephone first; we will still see patients face to face where needed but appointments and home visits are limited due to the extra time required to change PPE and decontaminate rooms and vehicles between patients.

Ask that patients use their online accounts with the practice for routine questions to the doctor, nurse or reception and for ordering their medicines as this helps us to keep the telephone lines free for triaging patients.

Ask patients to wear a face covering when they come into the practice.

Request that you attend just in time for your appointment so that you are .....(continued on next page)

not waiting for any length of time inside the building, and when waiting, used the zoned areas in the waiting room.

Ask visitors to the area to contact their own GP practice for advice first, as prescriptions can be arranged with local pharmacies and consultations can be done via video, reducing the pressure on local services.

I would like to thank you for your continued support and encouragement at this difficult time. Your patience, kind words and understanding have made all the difference to me and the staff at the medical centre.

# Pales Police Report July 2020

We continue to navigate our way strange through these times. dominated by the many worrying effects of coronavirus. elements of 'normal' life begin to reopen, including pubs, shops and holiday accommodation, it is apparent have. that we. all increased responsibility for looking after the welfare of each other by applying some common sense to our everyday routines. Whether this be wearing face masks in enclosed public places, regular hand washing, applying social distancing, or avoiding crowds. For the latest advice information regarding the pandemic please qo to Gov.uk/ coronavirus

The following incidents of note have occurred in this area this month -

Two incidents were reported in June regarding free grazing cattle on the common land above Gunnerside chasing people, one of which resulted in an injury to a local man. The Access Ranger for the Yorkshire Dales National Park has investigated the appropriate and taken enforcement action by formally warning the farmer responsible for the cattle. Please report any such incidents to the Yorkshire Dales National Park.

Overnight on 25<sup>th</sup> June the front doors of the Penny Garth Café and the Fish and Chip Shop on Hawes Market Place were both damaged by silicon being injected into the locks. Obscenities were also scrawled on the pavement outside them. CCTV images

have been obtained of the offender, a hooded male figure in wellingtons. Enquiries are continuing to identify him. Anyone with any information should contact North Yorkshire Police on 101 quoting reference 12200108060.

We have been informed by Trading Standards of a worrying rise in courier fraud; basically where a victim is contacted by a person claiming to be from the police, informing them their account is under threat and persuades them to attend the bank, withdraw their money and a 'police officer' will attend their home address and take the money for safe keeping. Please be sure that you or a vulnerable relative don't fall for this kind of theft.

Likewise we have been taking reports of other telephone scams. These have included calls from persons pretending to be from Amazon Prime, attempting to convince you to give them remote access to your personal computer, and then removing money from your bank account. Also fake callers claiming to be from 'Track and Trace' informing you that you require a coronavirus test and asking for a £50 payment. Please be on your guard and don't be a victim. Such incidents can be reported directly to Action Fraud.

The Dales are seeing increased visitor numbers, presumably due in part to restrictions on foreign travel, which is causing some community tensions. Please continue to show patience and tolerance towards each other, and remember 'behaviour breeds behaviour


#### **Easy Starter Pet**


As we slowly emerge from lockdown, we'd like to thank all our customers for supporting us during these challenging times. We were so pleased to continue baking for you.







Incredible Edible Swaledale aims to grow free local vegetables for all, on un -used bits of ground. You may remember we built the first raised beds at Reeth Medical Centre and part-filled those with compost - then the lock-down happened.

## Press Release June 2020 Age UK praises young volunteers for their dedication

Four kind-hearted, young volunteers are helping the elderly and vulnerable in Richmondshire by supporting Age UK with home deliveries of essential provisions. George Smith, a Year 13 student at Richmond Sixth Form College, and his sisters, Connie and Hannah, and friend Arte Dawson, all former-students, are devoting time each week to offer their valuable support.

The lockdown in March resulted in elderly and vulnerable people needing assistance to get their food shopping and prescriptions. In addition, as family, friends and some carers could no longer visit, cooking a daily hot meal became a major issue for many people. Hannah, Connie, George and Arte wanted to do something to help. By volunteering for UK North Age Yorkshire and Darlington (NYD), they have offered support by delivering shopping, food parcels and a daily hot meal

Two-course hot meals and shopping are provided, seven days a week, by Thorpe Farm on the A66 and the White Swan, Gilling West. George, Hannah, Connie and Arte collect the shopping, already boxed-up from Thorpe farm, and deliver it for free to customers who live in the Richmond and Leyburn area. They have also delivered free food parcels supplied by Vicky Pattison and her Help the Elderly project.

The four volunteers have been helping two to three times each week, since the lockdown started in March, working two-hour shifts over lunch time and then different times when delivering shopping. Providing a vital lifeline to those in need, they join a team of four who deliver around 30 meals each day, and up to 50 roast dinners on a Sunday, across the Richmond and Barnard Castle area.

Hannah said: ""A lot of the people we are delivering to are self-isolating and currently have no contact with the outside world, so it's nice to have been a friendly face for them as we deliver." Connie added: "It's been lovely to be able to help people and see how much they appreciate it."

They all agreed that they have really enjoyed getting to know some of the people we have delivered to and hope to stay in touch.

George, Hannah, Connie and Arte are among the youngest volunteering for Age UK NYD, and are part a great team of volunteers, from all walks of life and different ages who support the lonely, isolated and elderly across Richmondshire. Age UK NYD are really grateful for all of their time and effort.

Marriott. Kate Richmondshire Coordinator for Age UK, said: "I am very proud of George, Hannah, Connie and Arte for wanting to get involved and for continuing to deliver the hot meals and shopping for all of this time. especially as they are still studying and have returned to work. 

## Message from the Museum

The photograph in our July message has certainly stirred up some wonderful responses. It was given to us by Mr William Houston who has labelled it 'Ernest Shevel's barytes plant, Old Gang, June 1977'. Mr Houston knew Ernest Shevels and Charles Woodward with whom he worked very well, as he was, and still is, in the mineral and quarry business. He notes that the photograph shows an 'Ex-British Road Services parcel van, originally BRS green, here painted brown to 'blend' in. Ex-witherite mine Dyson cast-iron jig inside vehicle, see-through fibreglass roof, very light inside. 4 Denver flotation cells on right, bought at a sale in late 1950s from Greenside Lead Mine, Glenridding Cumbria and subsequently swapped for a pair of crushing rolls from Carrock Fell Mine, Cumbria.

Charles and Ernest originally drove the machinery off the 4 cylinder Albion engine in the truck but this proved unsatisfactory due to sudden and violent speed variation. They eventually used the small diesel engine in the leanto on the left. The van served as a lock -up shed'.

The photograph is part of a small group given at the same time reported in the 'Friends of Swaledale Museum Newsletter' no.16, Autumn 2013. You can see all the photographs (nos 5500-5505) on our Online Image Archive on our website under 'Explore and Research'.

The barytes and fluorspar recovery plant operated in the later 1950s, 1960s and 1970s. All that remains today is a 'barytes/fluorspar jig' up at Old Gang, and it is illustrated in Ste-

phen Eastmead's Hungry Chert Quarries Mouldside Arkengarthdale, SWAAG 2014, p.34.

Charles's son Gary contacted us on seeing the picture in the Gazette and of course identified exactly what was going on and when, and was able to add a great deal more detail - in fact a gold mine of information, which we will put on file.

After the lead mines closed in the 1890s enterprising individuals realised that there was potential to be made from all the heaps of gangue mineral that had piled up as waste from the galena extraction. The barytes was used for barium meals, and the fluorspar for North Seal oil drilling rigs, to lubricate the drill heads.

We were also delighted to receive a message from Friend of the Museum Alan Thorogood. See opposite page.

Ernest Shevels and Charles Woodward were not alone in their enterprise. William Taylor and Edwin Drake had a similar plant at Askrigg at the same time, and Mr Houston has donated photographs of their operation too, also on our Online Image Archive.
