First Thoughts

Aesculus Hippocastanum Conkers to you and me!

22nd September my favourite time of year arrives. Autumn. Hence Conkers. Right, who has not played Conkers? Here is your guide.

Any kids should first talk to your parents and obtain permission to follow anything in this article. The fun part is collecting your conkers. The scientific name of the trees to look for are 'Conker Trees'.

Best time to collect conkers is after a windy day. Collecting them is a lovely task. I used to climb trees but today's kids are not allowed to or that is what it seems like? Again ask your parents? Do not go making a mess of trees as you collect your conkers. I am sad to say when I was collecting mine, I probably left quite a few branches around on the floor as I threw sticks up into the tree trying to knock those conkers clusters down.

When you do find your conkers, we can all agree that the swirly patterns of conkers are beautiful. They look like some form of polished wood.

Going back to safety. The Government advises you should wear a safety hat, gloves, boots and suit. Seriously the only protection you should wear is probably eye protection but ask your parents. All kitted up, here are the Woodland Trust rules for you:

 Wrap the loose end of the string around your hand. One player should dangle their conker on about 25cm of string, keeping it absolutely still.

- 2. The other player then swings their conker at it to try to break it.
- 3. If the attacking player misses, they can have two more chances before it's their opponent's turn.
- 4. Take turns until one of the conkers breaks and you have a winner.
- 5. A new conker is called a 'none-er' as it hasn't beaten anyone yet. When it beats another conker, it's a 'one-er'. If it beats another, it becomes a 'two-er' and so on.



Your parents may have tricks handed down through the years such as soaking in vinegar and baking. Even more of a cheat is painting the conkers in nail varnish. Any injury to adult or child is at the readers own risk BUT go enjoy an ancient playground sport (or at least it goes back to the

Message from the Museum in Reeth

Thanks to all of you who have visited the Museum since we have re-opened, who have patronised our shop, booked in as an archive user or commissioned renewed or research. joined our Friends group, or who came to see us at Reeth Market on 31st July. The latter was a wonderful opportunity to see lots of people in a safe atmosphere and catch up with news. Thank you Prue and Nick for helping, and for the refreshments! Weather permitting we will be back on Reeth Green on 28th August, and 4th, 18th & 25th September. Do come and see and support us. The Museum continues to be open by appointment - so give us a ring if you want to come in!

This month we have been preparing a proposal for a travelling May Sinclair exhibition in collaboration with the May Sinclair Society, which will be submitted to the AHRC (Arts and Humanities Research Council) for funding. The format of 'May Sinclair and the Importance of Place. Postcards from Swaledale and Arkengarthdale' is inspired by a postcard sent by May Sinclair bearing a landscape photograph of Arkengarthdale. Sinclair has annotated Langthwaite with an arrow, and on the back of the postcard she has written 'This picture is the scene of 'The Three Sisters'. The marked house is the Vicarage. The hills are much bigger & higher than the photograph shows'.

In both her novels based in Swaledale and Arkengarthdale, <u>Mary Olivier</u> (1919) and <u>The Three Sisters</u> (1914), Sinclair reveals the crucial importance

of place in her unfolding of the emotional state of her heroines. Her literature is deeply embedded in the landscape and its meaning. Sinclair lived in Reeth, the gateway to Swaledale, while writing these books, and her intimate knowledge of the place is evident. She was a keen walker and like her heroine Mary Olivier relished long perambulations through the dale. Her descriptions of place and people are detailed, accurate and integral to her literary intent. This will be the first time specific real buildings, places and people in Swaledale are matched with her texts. enriching our understanding of the power and importance of place in Sinclair's work. By the way we have a May Sinclair walk posted on our website. This is especially important as we learn from Dr Rebecca Bowler from Keele University that when Sinclair was asked 'what is Britain's loveliest walk?'. she described one starting in Reeth.

The beady-eyed amongst you will have noted the typing error in our last message relating to the photograph of the Old Gang Barytes Recovery Plant, c.1977. It was of course a Davison not a Dyson cast-iron jig. Thanks to Alan Thorogood we were prompted to interview William Houston, who gave the photograph and others, at length, and we will post his reminiscences on our website. He provides technical details of the process and equipment as well as lively recollections of the characters involved.

Now for last month's photograph, which was given to us by Rhoda Fraser, part of a wonderful archive of material relating to Arkengarthdale Chapel. The picture was taken outside the Chapel,



Christian Aid

Thank you so much to all of you who contributed to our e-envelope request during Christian Aid Week in May. The total raised is not yet available, but we did send a cheque for £415 from other donations.

Christian Aid is working with some of the poorest and most vulnerable communities to help them stay safe during the coronavirus pandemic. This includes the Rohingya in refugee camps in Bangladesh.

Living in a refugee camp is already challenging at the best of times. Camps are overcrowded and lack proper hygiene which increases the potential for the rapid spread of the coronavirus. To prevent the spread of the virus Christian Aid are:

- Raising awareness of the virus and sharing hygiene messages to people in the camps in their local Rohingya languages. CA are doing the same with the host communities through community volunteers and religious leaders.
- Helping doctors in the camps receive training so they can treat infected people and train other doctors in health facilities. Ensuring healthcare staff are equipped with personal protective equipment (PPE) and that handwashing stations are available at the entrances to health facilities.

Christian Aid has an office in Cox's Bazaar and in Camp 15 with a large warehouse. They have a team of 25 experienced and skilled national staff working together with local NGO partners (Dustha Shasthya Kendra and Dhaka Ahsania Mission) to ensure they respond effectively, particularly in the areas of health and water and sanitation.

In addition, Christian Aid will build additional handwashing stations throughout the camps, and distribute hygiene kits (containing antiseptic liquid and soap) to 50,000 people.

FLU CLINIC

This year the flu clinics will be slightly different. As well as vaccinating those who are usually eligible for the vaccine, the government have an ambition to offer it to 50-64 years old who do not have a long-term health condition. We are dividing the process into two phases:

The first phase is to vaccinate all those patients who would normally receive the flu vaccination. This will be covered in the clinics in September as detailed below.

Details of the second phase will be released once the NHS has confirmed their plans. We have been informed that phase 2 will be carried out around November/December time. If you are a phase 2 patient, please do not come to the September clinics.

The priority is to get phase 1 done first in September. We need your help to make sure that as many of you as possible in phase 1 come to either of the clinics in September. The drop-in flu clinics will be held in Reeth Memorial Hall on Wednesday 16th September and Wednesday 30th September on appointment needed just turn up between 11am and 1pm both days.

There will be enough vaccine for you so either date will be fine. In the past we have put on catch up clinics, but this will be difficult because we will need to be getting on with phase 2 as soon as we can, so please help us by coming to one of the clinic dates.

In order to comply with COVID guidelines, we have arranged to hold both of the clinics at **Reeth Memorial Hall**. Please be assured that we have put plans in place for you to be able to attend for your vaccine safely whilst following all government guidelines including providing hand sanitising facilities and temperature checks on arrival, social distancing queues around the hall and all staff wearing personal protective equipment.

On the day please remember the following:

- Do not attend if you are feeling unwell or have been asked to self-isolate
- Attend ready to receive your vaccination - wear a shortsleeve, loose-fitting top
- Bring a bag for any coats or jumpers as there will be nowhere to put items down
- Wear a face covering before entering the hall and sanitise your hands
- Please leave immediately after your vaccination

Just to clarify, eligibility for stage 1 is defined as those people over the age of 65; those who are registered as a carer, pregnant ladies or those who suffer from the following conditions:

- Chronic Respiratory Disease (COPD. asthma. etc)
- Chronic Heart Disease (e.g. heart failure, angina)
- Chronic Kidney Disease
- Chronic Liver Disease
- Chronic Neurological Disease Parkinson's Disease. (e.g. strokes)
- Diabetes
- Immunosuppression (suppressed immune system due to disease or drugs)



Incidents - July 9th to Aug 9th

On average we respond to between 50 to 60 calls each year.

5 Incidents this edition

The teams focus during the Covid-19 outbreak has been to maintain an operational Mountain & Cave Rescue Service, we've held meetings on-line & limited equipment checks to reduced members of the team. Fortunately we are well stocked with the essential PPE to protect the team when deployed.

08/08/2020: Incident 26: An early call from the Police this morning following reports of a dog stranded on a ledge near Leyburn Shawl. Fortunately the dog made its own way to safety as we were on route.

08/08/2020: Incident 25: Called by the Ambulance Service to rescue an injured mountain biker, treated on scene by team medics and ambulance service. Then evacuated to the road.

06/08/2020: Incident 24: Both Team Search Dogs & handlers deployed to an out of area search.

30/07/2020: Incident 23: Called by the Police to rescue a 9 month old puppy that had fallen down a steep banking near Askrigg, North Yorkshire Fire Service attended & asked us to

assist. Stood down on route as the puppy was rescued by passing members of the public.

20/07/2020: Incident 22: Team Search Dog & handler called to assist in an out of area search.





Annual Governance & Accountability Return for 2019/20

This was discussed and approved. Councillors thanked David Williams for undertaking the internal audit and would make a donation to the 2 Dales Junior Football Club and Reeth and District Community Sports Club Ltd in lieu of an audit fee.

Playground

Dates were being arranged for meetings with two different equipment suppliers to get quotes for replacing some, or all, of the play equipment. Two recent inspections had flagged up safety issues with the condition of the zip wire and part of this equipment has been removed as a safety precaution to put it out of use as children had been seen playing on it in spite of the playground being locked. Possibilities for getting the most urgently needed repairs done as an interim measure were considered and Coun Good would contact RDC about this. He would also check what measures they were taking with council owned playgrounds with regard to Covid-19 precautions.

Village green and parish land

Work to the flagstones in front of the Black Bull was almost complete apart from a small amount of pointing. A request for permission to block off part of the cobbles to allow members of a car rally to park together was turned down as the area in question was registered common land and the council did not have the right to authorise it.

One quote for repainting the white line had been received and the clerk would also approach the contractor used by NYCC.

The situation regarding garden waste tipped on the Beckside would be monitored before further decisions were made. A case of ash dieback affecting some of the trees growing out of the beck would be reported to the YDNPA ranger.

Flood works

Coun Terry would look into any further works required which could be carried out with remaining grant money.

Market

Coun Bearpark reported that all of the local charities who had been scheduled to have cake stalls had cancelled although some of the slots have been reallocated to the Swaledale Museum. It was agreed to accept the Market Manager's revised plan of which stall should go where and that customers and stall holders would be responsible for having their own hand sanitiser.

Grass cutting

Following a request from a resident the contractor would be asked to clear cuttings from the path and steps near the War Memorial if possible as it was making them slippery.

A reply would be sent to a letter about cutting and spraying of areas of grass containing wild flowers explaining the reasons behind the cutting and referring the correspondent to the Highways department who were responsible for spraying verges.

Roads and footpaths

An email from a resident proposing a speeding sign for the lane from the Arkleside Hotel down to the beck was (continued on next page)

noted and it was agreed that this was a matter which should be referred to the Police

The council had been made aware of a hedge in Fremington which was overhanging the footpath. The clerk would contact the property owners if no action was taken in the near future.

Future meetings

As there were likely to be decisions regarding the playground coming up an extra meeting was arranged for Monday, August 24, by Zoom.

It will consist of 1,000+ pictures of school life in the Dales that will come together to create a whole new image. Hundreds of photos for the mosaic have already been submitted, but it's hoped that the community will bring forward many more.

The artwork has been commissioned by The NASH and Dales Countryside Museum in Hawes as part of 'The Story

of Schools in the Upper Dales' - an oral history and research project funded by The National Lottery Heritage Fund and the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority's Sustainable Development Fund. The project is delving into the development of schools over time in Upper Wensleydale, Swaledale and Arkengarthdale. It will culminate in an exhibition at Dales Countryside Museum openina January 2021, including the big reveal of the mosaic, a short film, display boards, audio recordings and artefacts. Project Manager Emily Rowe Rawlence says: 'We want to create a community artwork that celebrates our schools but also the dynamic youth of the Dales from the dawn of photography to now. Do you live in the Upper Dales? Did you go to school here? We'd love to see your pictures about what youth in the Dales means to you. We'd like to amass as many images as possible. Photos can be vintage or modern and feature landscape and buildings as well as people, and artwork and drawings are great too - the more the merrier'.

Education Officer Heather Hodgson says: 'We're really looking forward to working with three local primary schools on this project - Reeth & Gunnerside, Hawes and BAWB. With pupils and the wider school community we'll be collecting as many photos, pictures and drawings as we can. Dig out your old photos, take a new snap, draw a picture, get creative! With digital technology it's super easy to participate by taking photos on phones and uploading them online. Members of the public can participate by uploading their images... Artist Helen Marshall says: 'I am proud to be creating artwork for such a special location and community. It is fantastic that our work is exploring and engaging with rural communities and I

am looking forward to discovering some of the unique stories and photos that shall unfold as part of the project. I am also especially excited to be visiting and working with The NASH and Dales Countryside Museum in Hawes, and cannot wait to see all the wonderful creative imagery that is generated from the community and schools.'

'The Story of Schools' artwork will be on display at Dales Countryside' Museum from 30 January to 21 April 2021, after which it will tour as part of Swaledale Festival.

Pales Police Report August 2020

The following incidents of note have occurred in this area this month -

Three incidents were reported

On the afternoon of 11th July, near Tan Hill, a pointer type dog escaped its lead and chased a flock of sheep causing considerable distress and some minor injuries to a number of ewes and lambs. The owner has been reported for summons for the offence of 'Dog worrying livestock'. It is just another example of how quickly uncontrolled dogs can revert to their primal instincts if given the chance.

On the afternoon of 29th July an off duty police officer near East Witton noticed a suspicious quad bike being ridden in convoy with a silver Mercedes car. Both vehicles made off at speed.

The quad was quickly located apparently abandoned nearby. The suspect vehicle was then tracked by the Force Control Room using the national network of 'Automatic Number Plate Recognition' cameras, and traffic officers soon intercepted it on the outskirts of Darlington.

Two male occupants were arrested on suspicion of theft of the quad, and are currently under investigation. The Mercedes was seized on suspicion of being used in crime. The quad turned out to have been stolen that day from a farm at West Scrafton.

A great result, and a good reminder

to ring the police when you think something or someone is suspicious, out of place or unusual in your community.

It is also worth noting that this happened in broad daylight in the middle of the afternoon, so please watch out at all times of the day and night.

Overnight on 7th August the Leyburn Recycling Centre on Moor Road was broken into again and about 20 car batteries stolen. Please call in at the time if you see any suspicious activity down there.

The police continue to take reports of telephone and e-mail scams. Please don't share personal information or give strangers access to your computer, however convincing they might sound.

If you believe you have been a victim of fraud, call North Yorkshire Police on 101 or report it to Action Fraud by visiting actionfraud.police.uk or by calling 0300 1232040. In an emergency or if a crime is in action dial 999.

Coronavirus continues to have a huge impact on our lives. This looks set to continue until an effective vaccine is developed. In the meantime keep applying common sense with face masks, hand washing, social distancing and avoiding crowds.

For this year, just plant things wherever there is space (ideally keep all the herbs together). Please label the things you plant if they are something unobvious!

We encourage people to pick the fruit and mature leaves, making sure you leave plenty for others too. If you're a good weed-spotter, pull the tiny weed seedlings out before they get started!

Our plans also include signage and fruit trees.

Recently (August), a blog on our website shared tips for the garden, including making free plant food from comfrey (which bees love!)

Wildflower meadows are one of the reasons people love coming to Swaledale. The UK has lost 97% of its wildflower meadows since the 1930s. Dr Cliff Henry from the National Trust explains that "wildflower patches are wonderful habitats that support a rich variety of insect life. In turn, other animals like hedgehogs, birds and bats need the insects to feed on. If one group of species is in decline, that can lead to the loss of many more."

We can help wildflowers to thrive on verges, unused patches of land, in your garden and elsewhere. We can avoid strimming and weedkilling (both of which harm wildlife too!) and help Swaledale's native wildflowers thrive.

Share your favourite recipes

We are collecting and sharing recipes recommended by local people. If your recipe uses local ingredients, that's even better.

The latest comes from the family of Emma Longstaff, who grew up at White House farm, Arkengarthdale. ARKENGARTHDALE PARISH COUNCIL JULY 2020

Annual Governance and Accountability Return 2019/2020: David Williams was thanked for undertaking the internal audit. The Parish Council was not exempt from external audit for 2019/20 on account of the flood-related contributions. The accounts would be sent to the external auditors this month and made available online. The commencement date for the exercise of public rights to view the accounts was set for a 30 working-day period between 20 July and 28 August 2020

Budget 2020/21: The draft budget for the current year was considered. It was becoming increasingly difficult to operate within the current precept amount. An extraordinary meeting would be held on Monday 3 August to finalise the budget.

Coronavirus community support: A grant application to the Yorkshire Dales Millennium Trust for fuel costs to reimburse the Arkengarthdale volunteer drivers had been successful. A grant application to RDC for Personal Protective Equipment for the volunteer delivery drivers had also been successful.

Affordable housing: It was noted that the Upper Dales Community Land Trust (UDCLT) (with support from RDC and Broadacres Housing Association) had submitted a bid to Charlton's Estate Agency for the school building on 9 June with an explanation of the

planned development and the rationale behind the bid. As yet no response had been received from the Parochial Church Council.

Flooding matters: The completion of the repairs to the flood-damaged road surface next to St Mary's Church was noted and thanks were expressed to organisina Cllr Stones for contractors; A plan of action received from YDNPA on the forthcoming works to the foot bridges and rights of way in Arkengarthdale had been received. on Arkletown bridge currently underway; The Two Ridings Community Foundation would soon be re -opening a call for applications for individuals and organisations for flood resilience work.

Correspondence received: Αn expression of thanks from the Royal British Legion's local representative had been received for the Parish Council's continued support difficult time for fundraising; complaint from a resident about dog fouling on the footpath in Scar House Woods was considered but, as the woods were private property. Parish Council did not have the authority to act. A request for a representative of the Parish Council at future meetings of the Hambleton and Richmondshire Rural Transport Access Partnership (RTAP) had been received. The likelihood of public transport for Arkengarthdale was discussed and Cllr Peacock noted that NYCC were currently looking at demand in isolated areas.

NYCC Highways: A site meeting with Highways had been held on 2 June 2020 in Arkengarthdale. The list of issues previously identified by the Council had been viewed and discussed.

It was noted that pot holes on the Eskeleth road were particularly urgent.

application Planning Consultation R/01/166 at Low. Seal House. Arkenaarthdale, for works to rear of existing dwelling, to include raising the roof of the rear lean-to, provision of new rear entrance door and glazing. internal alterations drainage and works. Application unanimously supported.

Planning Consultation - application R/01/120A at Home Farm, Arkengarthdale, for erection of agricultural building for sheep housing. Application unanimously supported.

Mobile phone network: A local pilot scheme for 5G was noted but it was not clear if Arkengarthdale was included in the scheme. This would be investigated.
