

Talking Pictures

The Kentuckian (1955)

If you're in the mood for a 'western' but don't fancy wagon trains, cattle drives or 'injuns' - then why not give this movie a try. One of only two films star Burt Lancaster directed, and featuring the movie debut of Walter Matthau, 'The Kentuckian' is set in the 'precowboy' 1820s and follows Lancaster and his son as they trek from Kentucky to Texas to start a new life. Along the way they meet two women, one who would love to travel with them, and the other a schoolteacher would rather have 'Big Eli' and his son settle down.

What seems an overly simple plot at first glance belies its origins as a novel, and a multi-layered narrative which reveals Lancaster maybe really moving on due to an old family feud, which leads to a fine climactic scene in which Lancaster's athleticism is needed to outrun a marksman loading his musket (a scene cleverly pre-empted earlier to allow us to fully understand the jeopardy). Lancaster really proved his acting depth in later films such as the 'Birdman of Alcatraz' but here he's somewhere between that later classic and his halcyon 'Crimson Pirate' swashbuckling days - handling the drama, romance and action with equal aplomb. Eli's brother (who also wants him to settle down in his tobacco business) is played by the dependable John McIntire, a regular in so many classic westerns, and some fun is to be had seeing Lancaster in the business dress of the era as he undertakes an errand for his brother on a 'Mississippi steamboat'



and an encounter with some serious card sharks (Incidentally the same steamboat is seen in countless westerns, and initially in 'Gone with the wind') - at one point we even get to hear Lancaster sing (probably the only time ever!). Amidst the drama and romance, a standout scene is a particularly visceral fight scene with chief villain Walter Matthau who is presented as a vicious expert with the bull-whip and who almost gets the better of our hero in a protracted punch-up which in many ways forms the dramatic centre-piece of the plot. Add in a realistically portrayed young son, a cute dog, lots of spectacular scenery (courtesy of the Cumberland Falls park in Kentucky), colour, widescreen, and a thundering Bernard Herrman score and you have a minor classic well worth revisiting.

The priority now is to identify sites in the next few weeks, in preparation for fencing (if needed) and planting later in the year.

In addition to creating small wooded areas and wildlife corridors (that wouldn't qualify for Forestry Commission or Agri-Environment schemes). 'Together for Trees' aims to plant landscape trees (for example, to replace mature trees suffering from ash dieback) and create new hedgerow. The Yorkshire Dales Millennium Trust can also consider larger planting sites if they meet grant criteria.

These habitats will be well managed and resilient providing vital nature-based solutions that will reduce biodiversity loss, provide natural flood management, help stabilise soils, improve water quality, control erosion, combat climate change and add interest and variety to views

Message from the Swaledale Museum Reeth

Our digital archivist Stephen Eastmead has been very busy. You can see the fruits of his labours on our Image Archive, which now holds nearly 7,000 images. We have been particularly honoured to have been given two large photographic collections, one belonging to Eleanor Barker of Healaugh and the other to Marjorie Daniels of Reeth which have been added to the Museum Image Archive. You can access this free online via our website. We particularly like the early ice cream and aerated waters parlour, a large shed in Reeth (see no's 6423 & 6428). There are lots of mysteries too and we would appreciate any information, for example about the cottages in Healaugh c.1900 (5435 & 6347) and the cottages in Low Row (6455). Do have a look and get in touch if you can help.

We are also in the process of commissioning some fabulous bone china mugs which bear a photographic panorama of Old Gang, thanks to Roger Preston, whose work you might have seen in recent Museum exhibitions. These are part of an enticing range of new things that we hope will lure you into the Museum shop. So watch out for more information on these. We can't wait to reopen.

Thanks to all of you who responded to our February photograph. It was taken in Reeth outside what is now the Burgoyne Hotel, then Hill House. The gathering of course shows the famous 'Reeth Parliament', a gathering of usually male elders who discussed and debat-

ed the affairs of the world, and particularly of Swaledale. It dates to before 1930 when the shelter was built. The bench they are all sitting on was erected to celebrate Queen Victoria's Diamond Jubilee in 1897, and we make a guess that the photograph was taken c.1910. We think that the man seated to the far left is James Martin, as we have a dated photograph 1906/7 with sitters' names, and Mr. Martin appears on that. Do you have a photograph of a sitting of Reeth Parliament? If you do we would love to see it, and create a proper chronology of participants. Do you think the Reeth Parliament still sits? A bit chilly now, but watch out as the days get warmer.

Now for the March photograph (see the opposite page). We have a large framed version of this in the Museum. Can you name the people, and do you know where they are sitting? For once we have full details, so don't forget to read the April Gazette to find out more. If you have any family history information about any of the sitters we would love to hear from you.

Dales Police Report February 2021

The following incidents of interest have occurred in the Dales area this month:

Also, the local GP surgeries are facing a tirade of calls currently with people asking about when they will be in line for the vaccine which is clogging up their phone lines; they will contact you!

With the bad weather we are having. we are seeing an increase in what appear to be 'non-essential' journeys where people are simply driving around in off-road/4x4 vehicles in the snow. We are still very much in lock down and 'going for a drive in the snow' is not an essential journey - you are not only breaching Covid regulations but putting yourselves and others at risk when unnecessarily time at α emergency services/rescue teams are already stretched.





PLUS CA CHANGE. < PLUS C'EST LA MEME CHOSE!

We have become very used to believing that crime and a yobbish culture are characteristic of the modern world-But it seems to me that it is nothing new. Even in our peaceful dales a look back at some old reports and documents reveals a very different picture, quite a healthy disregard for the law. Today's misdemeanors may be different, what is acceptable now was not always so.

In 1607 two Brunskill brothers from Stonedale were charged with assaulting Will Bainbrigg at Bowes. They actually killed the poor man with a pitchfork. Poaching was a common offence in those days. John Dawson from Gunnerside shot a deer belonging to Emmanuel, Lord Scrope, and a Grinton man was sentenced to stand in the pillory in Richmond for an hour on market day for stealing Sir Marmaduke Wyvill's deer in 1693.

Sheep stealing was certainly as worrying in the 17th century as it is today. John Richardson from Bishopdale stole 'Four hoggs and two ewes' from George Wawne of Oxenhopfell in Swaledale. By 1846 an Askrigg man was transported for stealing sheep. Transportation was not uncommon for crimes committed by both men and women, right into the nineteenth century.

A woman from Oxenupe (Oxnop?) was taken to the Quarter Sessions for making false and scandalous accusations that a neighbor was milking and stealing from her cows, in 1674.

Not much later, two Muker men were in trouble for diverting a watercourse.

A group of men from Grinton in 1614

were accused of riotous assembly and assault on the wife and a servant of George Alderson of Cogdon, also for breaking windows etc. One visualises a rather ugly scene.

It seems that in the 17th century minding your words was important. A yeoman from Keld was in trouble in Grinton for uttering seditious and defamatory words to another yeoman, basically speaking against the King. James Arundel later also shouted at Simon Douglas of Fremington "Thou and thy father are rogues and traitors, and all are traitor that doth fight for the King". Tempers were high.

Anti social behavior such as affray, assault, throwing stones, gambling and quarrelling on a Sunday, or non-attendance of church, were all considered unacceptable crimes in the 17th and 18th centuries. Some folk were not above pilfering from their employers in the lead mines. In 1791 there was a "Hue and Cry" advertised for the capture of robbers who took goods from Moulds mine in Arkengarthdale.

Bastard children were a great concern, and people were fined if they allowed an unmarried woman to give birth in their home. The Wensleydale Advertiser also gives a picture of the kind of lawlessness, which seems quite familiar today, and no doubt was common in Swaledale and Arkengarthdale at that time.

In 1844 "mischievous parties have been throwing down the battlements of the bridge in Gayle". Bedale reported "widespread vandalism in the district" and there was an appeal for a policeman for Hawes where "The male position in society cannot move without insult in either Hawes or Gayle on a majority of nights of the week". (see next page)

Theft, pick pocketing and daylight robbery were not uncommon. Stealing from wagons at the markets occurred. A bowl of wheat was taken from Leyburn market for which there was a reward offered of one pound.

There was a highway robbery at three am in 1845, when twenty pounds was taken from a shoemaker. James Clapton, of Askrigg. That seems a lot of money to be taking around the countryside at that time of night.

As today one suspects that a good deal of the brawling and bad behavior was fueled by alcohol and it is not surprising to read of a riot in the Crown Inn in Hawes where two individuals were taken into custody, handcuffed and chained.



The Cost of Not Writing a Will

Thinking of a loved one passing away is • not pleasant to contemplate but it is kindest and sensible to ensure that your affairs are in order. Making a Will ensures that your assets pass to your loved ones or those who you would wish . to inherit. This was nearly not the case when one of our clients passed away earlier this year. For the purpose of this article, I will refer to him as Tom. Tom first asked me to write his Will in 2016 as he knew he had terminal cancer. Despite this, Tom kept putting it . off and eventually signed his Will one week before he passed away. Tom's Estate was bequeathed to a close friend.

Had Tom's Will not been signed, he would have died intestate and his whole estate would have gone to the Crown, as Tom had no surviving family.

Only with a valid Will can you be certain that your estate will go to the right people:

- you can specify how long funds must be held in trust for children, to any age you deem appropriate.
- You may wish friends or charities to benefit.
- You may also want to outline personal wishes, such as funeral arrangements or who should inherit particular property or items of worth.
- You may also exclude family members who you don't want to benefit from your estate in a will.

Even if you have made a will, it is sensible to keep it updated.

If you do not draw up a proper Will:

- the rules of intestacy award none of the estate to stepchildren and live-in partners, regardless of the longevity of the relationship.
- Unless you have a joint mortgage, the house that you share with your live-in partner could potentially be passed onto your children, parents, siblings or the state, leaving your partner homeless.
- In the event that both you and your spouse die, you would have no say in who becomes your children's guardian. If your child or children are under the age of 18 it is important you have a Will for this reason.
- You may not want parents or siblings to benefit to the detriment of your spouse.
- There may be personal wishes that cannot be fulfilled without a will.
- Friends or charities would not benefit.
- Failure to have a Will can cause acrimony and complications. Look no further than famous stars such as Barry White, Bob Marley and Jimi Hendrix whose families squabbled for years because they all died intestate.

Talking Pictures AIRPORT

The 'law of diminishing returns' has often been applied to movie sequels, and it is indeed true in part in the final three 'Airport' films. Whereas the original 'Airport' was a classic of its kind - all-star cast, superb production values and a plot which belies its novel roots - the first sequel, made as the 1970's vogue for 'disaster' movies grew, proved a great disappointment.

Although it was high grossing, and led to two further sequels, Airport '75, despite a cast of 'high-rankers' such as the ageing Charlton Heston (who also saved the day in 'Earthquake' a year earlier) Efrem Zimbalist (who starred in the similarly plotted Crowded Sky back in the 1950s) Dana Andrews and Sid Caesar, with requisite Hollywood veterans Myrna Loy and Gloria Swanson brought out of retirement, the film looks cheap and dated today.

Shot in TV style, with only widescreen shots giving it any sense of real cinema, the much vaunted collision which is central to the plot and shown in glaring detail on the poster actually appears in the film by way of shoddy back projection, and the obviously studio bound attempt to drop a new pilot into the stricken cockpit from a helicopter borrows the same idea from the opening episode of TVs **Thunderbirds**.

The audience is relieved to see familiar face George Kennedy later in the movie, reprising his role of Joe Patroni,



helping to bring down the stricken airliner.

Airport '75 has all the plot elements that have been mercilessly spoofed since, including singing Nuns (Helen Reddy) and an extremely ill child (Linda Blair)

Whereas Airport '77 charted whole new territory, in which a 747 privately owned by wealthy philanthropist James Stewart and transporting priceless art plus VIP guests, is hijacked by thieves. All goes 'well' for them until the low flying jet hits an oil rig, crashes into the sea and sinks.

Unlike in the previous '75, British matte painter Albert Whitlock provides some stunning effects shots which give these sequences realism. Of course the pressurized jet (with the requisite slow leak) must be lifted to the surface to save the passengers – all which again (Cont. on next page)






Have a thought for Shackleton

In August 1914 the British Imperial Trans-Antarctic Expedition (1914-16) left England under Shackleton's leadership. He planned to cross Antarctica from a base on the Weddell Sea to McMurdo Sound, via the South Pole, but the expedition ship *Endurance* was trapped in ice off the Caird coast and drifted for 10 months before being crushed in the pack ice. The members of the expedition then drifted on ice floes for another five months and finally escaped in boats to Elephant Island in the South Shetland Islands, where they subsisted on seal meat, penguins, and their dogs. Shackleton and five others sailed 800 miles (1,300 km) to South Georgia in a whale boat, a 16-day journey across a stretch of dangerous ocean, before landing on the southern side of South Georgia. Shackleton and his small crew then made the first crossing of the island to seek aid. Four months later, after leading four separate relief expeditions, Shackleton succeeded in rescuing his crew from Elephant Island. Throughout the ordeal, not one of Shackleton's crew of the Endurance died. Extract from 'https://www.britannica.com/biography/Ernest-Henry-Shackleton.


