# NEW EQUIPMENT FOR REETH PLAYGROUND

Reeth Playground is due to receive some new equipment this month. Four pieces of children's gym equipment have been ordered to replace the zip wire which was decommissioned last year. The specific items are an arm and pedal bicycle, a rower, a double slalom skier and a double strength challenger, all of which are designed for primary school aged children.

The new equipment has been funded by a Community Investment Fund grant from Richmondshire District Council and a Locality Budget grant from North Yorkshire County Council, and the Parish Council are extremely grateful for this support.

Installation of these items is scheduled for Friday 4th June so the playground will be closed that day. Repair work to extend the life of the existing playground equipment has also been organised

It is hoped that the local and visiting children who use the playground will enjoy trying out the gym equipment this summer.


John Barry happened to write such warm and 'misty' themes. For me they seem to wrap around you as you listen.





Air pollution controls on home fires

Restrictions came into force on the 4th May banning the sale of bagged house coal and small amounts of "wet wood" green unseasoned wood. This is aimed at reducing the amount of particulates released into the air when coal and wet wood are burnt

The average Briton loses 8 months of life as a direct result of airborne particulates.

Householders with multifuel stoves and open fires are encouraged to use less polluting alternatives such as smokeless fuel and kiln dried wood. Purchase of loose coal direct from coal merchants will be phased out by 2023 and the sale of green wood in amounts greater than 2m3 can only continue if advice is given on how to dry the wood.

Swifts, swallows, and martins project Currently, a few great ideas are up for grabs. Since we all know they need help, we are finding easy ways for people to make boxes and cups on a budget. One way for house martins is to make papier - mache cups from balloons and attaching them to a board. For swifts, a bit of carpentry is required, making these out of wood and for swallows the easiest way to make a cup would be making them out of clay or plaster. The project is seeking funding but our other focus will be on spreading awareness




English nurse and joins the British Airship Program - a morass of infighting and political intrigue - where two teams are set against each other, one to fly to Canada, the other to Egypt and India.

This bridleway gives access to the residents at Storthwaite Hall. I decided to liaise with YDNP staff and a plan was put into action to help the local community. This is a brief account of following.

On Saturday 10th Aug 2019 a large gang of people turned up on a wet day ,and with the assistance of a JCB and its driver (name not known) we managed to remove the stone and de-



bris off the track onto the adjacent fields.



As a member of the Yorkshire Dry Stone Walling Guild I again approached the YDNP and a planned 3 day wallathon was put into place from Friday 13th Sept. This was advertised widely and on Friday 13th I had wallers and helpers turn up. The area was split up into sections and various wallers got down to the task of re building the walls. At this point I would like to express my thanks to the CB Inn for providing the very welcome butties over the 3 days. We managed to repair some 75 metres over the 3 days. As I coordinate a walling team of volunteers we decided to continue the work when we could. The team meet on Tuesday fortnightly and so the work went on. # Broadsword calling Danny Boy

Editor Note: Following on from John's excellent Alistair McClean article in our May edition Gazette, here is related content:

Mike B

To any school boy of the late 60's and early 70s.. (my hand is up, Sir!)... this call sign will immediately bring back memories of a trip to the 'Gaumont' to see one of the greatest 'boy's own' adventure films of all time - 'Where Eagles Dare'. Last time we looked at the plethora of material that has been filmed by author Alistair MacLean - and this is amongst the best - though we'll reveal a few little known facts about the movie. For starters, MacLean wrote the screenplay first, and only turned it into a novel to tie in with the film's release.

'Eagles' was apparently originally intended as a tongue in cheek war com-

edy - indeed the same production team, along with star Clint Eastwood, made the cheeky 'Kelly's Heroes' a couple of years later. It is said that Richard Burton wanted to finally make the sort of film his own children could watch and enjoy - and arrived on set taking the whole thing extremely seriously. Such was his star power back then that the whole company veered to the fast paced boy's own yarn we now know and love.

Eastwood referred to the movie as 'Where Doubles Dare' as it seems to contain an inordinate amount of physical derring-do such as the scene in which top British stunt man Alf Joint performs a superb leap between two cable cars. Although filmed in the studio (and not several hundred feet up in the Bavarian alps) he accomplished this without the aid of the digital trickery or wire work which would be used today. He planned the distance to be leapt as only just within his reach, and for his troubles lost three front teeth as he hadn't quite factored in the

momentum of his own weight as he grabbed for the second cable car. (He also 'played' Richard Burton in several longshots on a day that Burton was too drunk to perform.) Cinematographer Arthur Ibbotson creates a crisp steely palette - the whole film seems shot in half light, and composer Ron Goodwin provides his second most famous score (after '633 Squadron').

Eastwood's character at the close of the film says to Burton 'Next time make this a wholly British affair will you?' - and the production pretty much was, with some excellent special effects by Tom Howard (whose team created a 40 foot 'model' of the castle atop a mountain complete with a miniature cable car. The actual castle (in Werfen, Austria) is not as high, and has no cable car - these scenes being shot in Ebensee).

Back at MGM Borehamwood in London. a huge set was built housing the fullsized cable car station (the cars actually travelled in and out for about 20 feet) - complete with massive painted 'cyclorama' (backcloth) depicting the distant mountains - which all looks totally convincing in the film. Rounding off the excellent cast is a roster of British thesps - the perennial Nazi, Anton Diffring, erstwhile 'comic' Derren Nesbitt, Michael (voice of Paddington Bear) Hordern, theatre heavyweight Mary Ure, 'Hammer Horror' girl Ingrid Pitt and TV regulars Donald Houston, Peter Barkworth and William Squire.



### Yorkshire Dales National Park Dave 'with Carol' as he Fixes path

Bainbridge, 27 April 2021

A Dales Volunteer took time out from constructing cross drains on a new path on Ingleborough on Sunday to speak about honouring his late wife.

Dave Cherry from Otley said he shed tears for Carol every day. She died a year ago on 13th May. He is taking part in an event in July to raise money for

Macmillan Cancer Support.

He is also one of the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority's newest Dales Volunteer recruits, having being urged to sign up by his wife after she had fallen ill.

"About half way through treatment she said, 'Why don't you consider volunteering here? You know why I'm saying this, don't you?' I realised that yes, one day she would die and I would be alone. And it's a lovely thing to do. I'm always with Carol, here. I feel good doing it. We have spent so much of our lives enjoying the Dales, either walking, cycling or windsurfing," he said.

"The place that has got the biggest meaning for me is Pen-y-ghent. It's funny I'm looking at it right now. I knew that Carol wasn't well when we went up there once. She was super fit but was struggling. I was saying, either I'm getting fitter, or there must be something not quite right with you. That's what made us investigate further. It still took another six months to realise it was ovarian cancer."

Carol had a full hysterectomy and six cycles of chemotherapy. As soon as she was fit again, Dave said they headed straight for Pen-y-ghent to walk and celebrate, although the recovery period did not last long. Dave retired early from his job as an officer at Leeds City Council to help during further treatments and later her end of life care.

"I have started to do a bit of bereavement counselling myself and I'm hoping to be trained as a volunteer counsellor in the summer. I can talk about death now, and end of life. I'm hoping to work with Wheatfields Hospice in North Leeds and walk with people in the Dales or near Otley. I'd love to give something back that way. Not many blokes talk about their feelings and it's still thought that if you cry you are weak, but it's the complete opposite. I shed tears for Carol everyday, but not for long."

He added that as well as raising funds for Macmillan Cancer Support, he wanted to raise awareness about cancer screening: "I'd love women to have regular screening for ovarian cancer. When Carol was diagnosed she would have had cancer for around two years."

Chairman of the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority, Neil Heseltine, said: "I'd like to wish David all the best in his fundraising efforts in honour of his late wife, Carol. He and all our Dales

Volunteers do great work for access and conservation and their love for the Dales is an inspiration."

Dave Cherry is fundraising for Macmillan Cancer Support via Justgiving.

Volunteering brings many benefits both to the National Park Authority and to individuals who take part. The number of volunteer days on offer is an objective of the Yorkshire Dales National Park Management Plan.

#### Keeping the momentum going...

April and another month for planning, rescheduling for a positive Autumn return to live events. It is also the time for our management board to report and reflect on what has been achieved in the last twelve months. Who would have thought our weekly Zoom sessions would be noting such milestone moments as; our one-year anniversary of making-music all together in the same room, one-year of being together in a virtual community, celebrating Jake and Fred turning 13 and 14 years old, Dan successfully auditioning for University and our volunteers becoming eligible for their vaccine appointments?

We launched our Play>Record>Perform project in the Autumn as planned and opted for 100% digital delivery due to COVID-19 restrictions. The group worked on The Sounds of the Dales heritage project and A Magical Christmas Concert DVD presentation presenting a selection of solo and collaborative performances – over 20 creatives of all ages took part.

We have provided mentoring and technical support throughout the pandemic supporting 20 young people so far. Support has included equipment loans such as computers, interfaces, microphones, headphones to musical instruments, sound systems and video cameras. We have given guidance on setting up spaces to record music at home, getting online to be able to take

part in other learning activities, preparing and recording submissions for graded exams, advice on Arts Award, university applications and writing personal statements. Of these, 8 have chosen to engage in our regular weekly sessions on Zoom.

Since October, we have been delivering 3 one-hour sessions (Monday, Wednesday and Friday) where young people have put forward the songs they would like to play, record and perform together. They have chosen all the material covered from several genres including Indie, Folk, Rock, Jazz, Pop and Musical Theatre which has created some interesting discussions around musical tastes and adapting music to suit different genres. We have piloted the use of JamKazam - a music making platform which reduces latency and allows real time music-making and recording. It has been a great way to continue working together and make the most of the current restrictions.

Our BlueAngels continue to be our lifeline of support. In addition to the many hours of in-kind support given by our volunteers, it is the monthly pledges and one-off donations which have enabled us to cover our essential costs and keep the organisation moving forward. #### Reeth and District Angling Club

#### The Club

Reeth and District Angling Club (RADAC) was formed 35 years ago. The club has access to over 10 miles of stunning game fishing on the upper reaches of the River Swale. We have access to five separate beats stretching from Muker in the west to Ellerton in the east. Fishing is exclusively for brown trout with fly-fishing being the predominant method, although other methods (spinner and worm) are allowed in certain locations as directed by the club rules.

Full membership of the club is available to ratepayers who live in the parish boundaries of Reeth, Fremington and Healaugh, Grinton, Ellerton Abbey, Marrick, Arkengarthdale and Melbecks (£30 per year, £20 OAP, Free for under 16 year olds). Guest day tickets are available (£10 per day) and can be purchased from: Black Bull, Reeth; Post Office, Reeth; The Bridge Inn, Grinton and the Kings Head, Gunnerside.


#### The Fish

The Upper Swale holds a reasonable population of natural wild trout. However, after careful consideration the club decided to supplement this with some stocked fish. There are strict rules regarding the stocking of fish particularly in relation to preventing the spread of disease but also very importantly to prevent damage that might be caused by inter-breeding and competition with the 'wild' trout. Our decision to re-stock is re-assessed each year based on catch returns and our overall view of the health of our fish population.

In line with Environment Agency rules our stocked fish are sourced from a licensed fish farm and all the fish are triploid (infertile fish). Triploid trout have been treated with heat or pressure at the egg stage to induce infertility. This ensures that there can be no interbreeding between 'wild' stocked fish which would reduce the genetic variation of the wild trout populations. Reduced genetic variation has been demonstrated to reduce their local adaptation and fitness and may also dilute characteristics that have particular interest to anglers (e.g. sea and ferox trout). The total number of fish stocked is calculated to ensure that there is no undue competition for food and habitat with the 'wild' popula-Our re-stocking usually takes place in April and we place approximately 350 trout into the river. The majority of the fish are 11-13 inches long however ... (continued on next page)

we do add a small number of much larger fish (up to 17 inches). They are introduced at a variety of locations across our 10 miles of fishing. After stocking we ask members to refrain from fishing for several days to allow the fish to disperse and recover. In order to monitor fish stocks we ask all members to record details of every trout they catch and these catch returns help inform our decision to restock each year.

The Sunday DalesBus service, is running through Swaledale again this summer, and will be operational until 17<sup>th</sup> October 2021.

The service connects Swaledale with population centres to the east and west, and is perfect for car-free visits to Swaledale, connections with the Settle-Carlisle railway at Ribblehead, and for those wanting to walk the Dale from end to end.

The two buses (830 and 831) are operated commercially, and the service is organised and funded by the Dales & Bowland Community Interest Company, a not-for-profit organisation set up to provide access to the Yorkshire Dales.
