As numbers increased, the choir was formed and, under the guidance of musical directors, has given hundreds of concerts over the years. Shelagh believed that

singing with a choir brings friendship, a sense of achievement, deep pleasure and enrichment. For this, choir members past and present, will be forever grateful. Lockdown stopped our activities, but it didn't stop Shelagh's positivism. With her talented gardener Isabel, she created a Life Affirming Lockdown Garden.

A grand opening party was planned for 20 July but sadly Shelagh died two weeks before. In honour of her determination, her love of a good party and a celebratory drink or two, the party went ahead as planned. The sun shone, the bees buzzed, the flowers bloomed, the glasses clinked, a band played, there was laughter and merriment. Shelagh would have loved it. (see photo).



Reeth Rural Radio Network

Many readers will already be familiar with Reeth Rural Radio Network (RRRN). Setup in 2004, this is a volunteer-run service providing wireless broadband connections to properties in lower Swaledale (from Marske and Marrick to Gunnerside) Arkengarthdale. Our aim is to ensure that even the most remote houses can aet access to decent broadband. We are just one such community service - a similar scheme covers Muker, Keld and the rest of upper Swaledale.

The principles of the network are simple: some of the local population centres already have high-speed fibreoptic broadband connections available. We tap into these, and then bounce these connections wirelessly up the valleys to reach the most remote properties. If you look carefully, you'll see our small white antennas perched on top of buildings such as The Buck Inn, Reeth, and the Kings Head in Gunnerside. Our belief that decent broadband is an essential service, no matter where you live, does not always seem to have been shared by commercial providers. While BT are continuing to roll out fast fibre to some Dales villages, the progress has been glacial, and many houses remain too far from the 'green boxes' (which are usually in village centres) to sustain a decent connection. However, this is slowly improving - it is well worth checking latest status with BT as you may find that your village is one of the lucky ones. Similarly, mobile phone 46 connections are also available up Swaledale (though not Arkengarthdale), primarily with EE and O2. If you have got line of sight to a mobile phone mast, then these connections are well worth investigating - a 4G dongle that plugs into your computer gives more

than enough bandwidth to have a Zoom call, or watch Netflix, and the monthly charges have come down substantially in recent years. We also have all of our fingers (and toes, and everything) crossed, as the NYCC-funded 'MANY' project (Mobile Access for North Yorkshire) is installing a 5G mast in Arkengarthdale. While details are still uncertain, we expect this to provide high-speed wireless broadband connections houses in to lower Arkengarthdale, that have line-of-sight to the mast at Bouldershaw. These connections are likely to require a small box on the outside of your house, as the 5G signal won't penetrate our thick stone cottage walls. They may also be comparatively expensive, given the new technologies being used. While it is very exciting to see another broadband option become available, it will still only cover a limited area - wireless connections are bound by the laws of physics, and the signals can't bend around the twists and turns of the valleys. It seems very likely that there will continue to be many remote properties that won't be able to benefit from commercial broadband for years to come, if ever. Therefore, despite these exciting new developments, it is our intention to continue to maintain and develop the RRRN. We are currently putting substantial investment into the network, building new infrastructure in Low Row & Marske to improve the speed and resilience of the network, and with future upgrades planned elsewhere. Our volunteers continue to add new connections, including free Wi-Fi connections in local churches and other community centres.

Have Your Say – Local Occupancy and Barn Conversions

The National Park is updating the Local Plan that defines the rules used when making planning decisions in the Dales. Feedback from residents has shown that there is a lot of interest in how rules are applied with respect to local occupancy and to barn conversions.

The Park has launched a consultation specifically on these topics. It is particularly keen to hear from people or groups directly affected, but we are all invited to comment.

It is worth remembering that the National Park neither builds nor sells homes - all it can do is set the rules used to grant planning permission. The consultation is therefore about these rules - there's no point commenting about anything else!

Local Occupancy

The purpose of the current 'local occupancy' strategy is to build up a growing stock of dwellings specifically for households that have a need to live in the Park, typically because of work or family. It works through the planning system by applying conditions as to who can occupy a property. Local occupancy homes tend to be 15-20% cheaper to buy than properties on the open market because there are fewer potential buyers, which also means it can be harder to get a mortgage.

An alternative to 'local occupancy' is a system based on 'principal residence', meaning that the occupiers must live in the house most of the time. This system discourages second home use but is open to more people moving permanently into the Dales. It can mean more

homes are built (because they are easier to sell) but they would be more expensive for local buyers.

The consultation is asking if we prefer to keep 'local occupancy', replace it with 'principal residence' or just let the market prevail.

Barn Conversions

The planning rules for barn conversions have changed recently and as a result more permissions have been granted, and more conversions carried out. The Park is reviewing its rules with regard to location, occupancy and design of barn conversions.

As more barns get converted to residences, focus will shift to barns in more remote locations, where the impact on the landscape and demand on local services may be felt more strongly. The consultation is asking if conversion of more remote barns is desirable, and whether applications should be considered on a case-by-case basis or be auota based.

Further questions relate to the permitted use of a barn conversion. Should they be reserved for local occupancy? Should holiday-let use be preferred? Or should they be sold on the open market and some of the sale price reclaimed and used to conserve barns that would otherwise fall into ruin? A final set of auestions relate to the design of barn conversions. The current approach leans heavily towards the preservation of the heritage value and features of a barn, which can be at odds with building regulations and modern living demands for natural light and living space. Which is more important: retaining barns' original features

and appearance or creating liveable housing? Is it better to allow the external appearance of a barn to be modernised than to allow it to fall down?

If you'd like your views to be heard, tell the National Park. There is more information in the consultation document and a link to an online survey where you can answer any or all of 19 questions.

A Richmondshire student's art skills, and love for the green agenda, have seen her design chosen as the new brand for a climate change group.

Violet Livingstone-Owen's design depicting a world in two halves (one showing what it will be like if we save the planet' and the other if we don't) is to be the new livery for the Richmondshire Climate Action Partnership.

The 11 year old pupil of Reeth and Gunnerside Primary Schools said she was inspired by her interest in green issues. She said: "I did half good and half bad in my logo design. The one with factories shows how much pollution is going into the air. I gave that piece of land a darker shade for the smoke and soot on the ground.

"The fallen trees represent deforestation. The people are sad around that half because the animals have nowhere to live and it's getting too hot.

"In the other half people are replanting trees and not cutting them all down. The animals have a place to live. There is no pollution in the water on the good side if people do beach clean ups.

"I think we need to drive less and be more active. We need to work as a community by giving time to help. We need to make a difference."

The Partnership brings together representatives from the district council, community organisations, individuals and businesses to take local action on climate change. An action plan for a net-zero carbon council has just been adopted by the District Council, and the partnership is working on a complementary one for the district. It is hoping that students and others will also come forward with ideas for projects to include in it.

"Violet's logo illustrates the wonderfully insightful clarity of a young mind," said Mike Sparrow, Deputy Chair of Richmondshire Climate Action Partnership.

"The stark contrast of a world that is nurtured with care and respect, juxtaposed to the spectre of what we all face if we ignore our responsibility to safeguard clean air and healthy ecosystems; a happy world versus a sad world. It reminds us that we all have a part to play, no matter how small, no matter your age, in protecting the legacy that we leave for future generations, and we are delighted to be able to use Violet's work as our motif."



On average we respond to between 50 to 60 calls each year.

06/06/08 Aug 2021: Incidents: 27,28, 29: Great to be back supporting the Ardrock mountain bike event again, a well organised event with the usual bumps & scrapes dealt with. We even had a visit from the Coastguard helicopter who came to collect some equipment from incident 25.

05/08/2021: Incident 26: Team called this evening to rescue an injured walker in the West Tanfield area, fortunately the ambulance crews could access and treat on scene, so the team stood down en route.

27/07/2021: Incident 25: Team called to rescue a walker who had taken a long tumbling fall and then a shorter fall over a cliff into the river at Kisdon Force, Keld. Team quickly on scene found the casualty been assessed by passing military medics, then assisted by Yorkshire ambulance

crews and the Great north air ambulance team. After assessment it was decided to call the coastguard helicopter from Prestwick to winch out of the waterfall. A tricky winch from a tight spot. While the aircraft was en route the team hauled the stretcher out of the waterfall to a more stable winching point. Thanks to everyone who assisted and to the local farmers who help move kit.

25/07/2021: Incident 24: Called by the Ambulance service to rescue an injured walker above Hawes, following a slip-on steep ground. Call went initially to Cave Rescue Organisation who passed it to us. A very rapid response due to us having just finished training. Helmed and road ambulance also attended and treated the casualty alongside our 2 team Drs.

18/07/2021: Incident 23: Team called out this afternoon to rescue an injured walker near the river at Muker. Thanks to all the people who stopped to help & call the team. Treated on scene and evacuated by team vehicle.

Dialect and Heritage Project

A Dialect and Heritage project launching in the Yorkshire Dales!

Yorkshire has one of England's most well-known and distinctive dialects. As the largest county, Yorkshire covers a sizeable area and is home to a diverse and varied range of words, phrases, pronunciation and forms of grammar. In the 1950s and 60s, researchers from the University of Leeds carried out the Survey of English Dialects, visiting people in more than 300 places in order to record their many different ways of speaking.


The surveys field workers largely focused on gathering data from rural areas, including from communities across the Yorkshire Dales. Just as its networks of pasture and drystone walls tells the story of a changing rural landscape, the language of the Dales reflects the history of its people and their way of life.


The project makes Leeds Archive of Vernacular Culture (LAVC) available to the public for the first time and the multi-media archives, which include photographs and sound recordings will be put back into the communities they were originally collected. **Dales Countryside Museum** based in Hawes, North Yorkshire will host a series of activities, events, exhibitions and opportunities for everyone to get involved

'FLU CLINIC

Rates of flu infection were much lower than expected last year. This may be because of lockdown restrictions and social distancing measures. As the country moves to a different phase of the pandemic, some of the mathematic models suggest that we

may see a rise in flu cases this winter. This year we will be running our annual flu clinics in two phases again. We will be vaccinating those who are usually eligible for the vaccine in phase one and then vaccinating 50-64 year olds who do not have a long-term health condition in phase two.

Phase one will be covered in the clinics in September as detailed below.

Phase two will be vaccinated in October; please see October's gazette for confirmation of dates and times.

The drop-in flu clinics for phase one (list of eligibility below) will be held in Reeth Memorial Hall on Thursday 23rd September and Thursday 30th September - no appointment needed just turn up between 10.30am and 12.30pm both days.

There will be enough vaccine, so either date will be fine. In the past we have put on catch-up clinics, but it will be difficult this year, because we will need to be getting on with phase 2, so please help us as much as possible by coming to one of the clinic dates. The clinics will run very similar to last year. We ask you to continue wearing a face covering when visiting the surgery and this is the same for our clinics in the Memorial Hall and we will ask you to use hand sanitiser and maintain social distancing around the hall to help us to protect our community.

On the day please remember the following:

- Do not attend if you are feeling unwell or have been asked to self-isolate
- Attend ready to receive your vaccination wear a short-sleeve, loosefitting top.
- Bring a bag for any coats or jumpers as there will be nowhere to put items down
- Wear a face covering before entering the hall and sanitise your hands.
- Please leave immediately after your vaccination.

Just to clarify, eligibility for Phase 1 is defined as those people over the age of 65, those who are registered as a carer, pregnant ladies or those over 16 who suffer from the following conditions:

- Chronic Respiratory Disease (COPD, asthma, etc).
- Chronic Heart Disease (e.g. heart failure, angina).
- Chronic Kidney Disease.
- Chronic Liver Disease.
- Chronic Neurological Disease (e.g. Parkinson's Disease, strokes).
- Diabetes.
- Immunosuppression (suppressed immune system due to disease or drugs) We look forward to seeing you for your vaccination!

'The Courier' Movie Review

The real-life story of Greville Maynard Wynne is an electrifying tale of espionage, secrecy, danger and with international ramifications. This recent film version may take some extensive liberty in parts for a more screenentertaining version, but having the heavyweight that is Academy Award nominee Benedict Cumberbatch in the central role pays dividends. I don't think there's been a Cumberbatch role in recent years I've not enjoyed, from early beginnings in Parades End, Brexit: The Civil War (well worth a watch), Tinker Tailor Solider Spy, The Imitation Game & even as Dr Strange in the Marvel blockbusters...And that's why its so fitting to see him return away from the Hollywood blockbuster into a film with strong British roots centered around the 'Cold War' and MI6. His performance will simply dazzle. Without giving too much away the film gives us the true to life story of Greville Wynne, a British Businessman whom extensively helped the secret services in Britain infiltrate Soviet Russia and made a connection with a source. Olea Penkovsky aka Ironbark. What follows is a film that doesn't really beat around the bush, Soviets are bad, the film is conventional at best and yet the performances by the cast, not just Cumberbatch make it an enjoyable evening film. Playing 'Ironbark' is Georgian actor Merab Ninidaze and what a joy it is to find an actor who can delve into the Russian language naturally, as opposed to having some American/British actor play the role instead with a terrible accent. His performance bounces off Cumberbatch perfectly, and adding to a



Brosnahan to rising star Jessie Buckley it really delivers a great experience from the acting alone. (It is perhaps unwarranted to call Buckley a rising star, after making tremendous performances not only on stage but on TV, in the HBO series Chernobyl and Netflix film I'm Thinking Of Ending Things.). The final third act of the film is perhaps the most poignant and effective & perhaps not something we see explored fully enough in other similar films in the same year. (But we can't spoil this for you...). The film is exactly what it says on the tin (well the poster). A soviet spy romp, East vs West, with a tremendous cast, a plot that maybe doesn't quite deliver as best as it could but it's enjoyable anyway. 
We are pleased to announce this return to Leyburn, March 2022.




