Thank you all, and we wish you peace and contentment over the festive period. We show below a suitably seasonal photograph - tell us where and tell us when!

Don't forget the Museum is now closed for the Season. However we are delighted to be taking group bookings for next year, including school parties. Some folks use us as an unusual and fascinating meeting place for family and friends before going out to lunch. dinner or a walk, others who organise group tours of the Dales find us a useful place to get a flavour of the area. Perhaps you would like to book us for a birthday treat? We can do special hands-on sessions to suit the interests of your group, and/or a walking tour of Reeth Green taking the story of the area from its geological foundations to the present.

One of our new research projects focuses on the Bloomsbury Group and Swaledale. It is something we have been interested in for a long time but have not had a chance to draw the

evidence and ideas together. Thanks to very special Friend of the Museum Jocelyn Campbell we had the pleasure of having dinner at Duke Mary's many years ago. Many of you will know this isolated cottage, named after Mary, daughter of Marmaduke Metcalfe, who lived in the cottage in the late early nineteenth and twentieth century. As Ned Garnett relayed to us Mary was 'unmarried, raised two children in the cottage, one of whom was said to have been born while she was cutting the peat on the moor'. After Mary's death in 1912, the Garth sisters advertised it for let in 'The Lady' in 1936. Ned's grandfather, David Garnett (1892-1981) who had come to the Dales in 1927 to see the eclipse (along with Virginia Woolf) saw the advertisement and sped uр Swaledale, securing the house. prominent member of the Bloomsbury Group. David Garnett received literary recognition when his novel Lady into Fox, was published in 1922. In 1942 he married Angelica Bell, the daughter of Duncan Grant (with whom he had had an affair) and Vanessa Bell. In his The White/Garnett Letters published in 1968 he reveals his relationship with the difficult T. H. White (1906-1964). better known to most of us as the author of The Goshawk (1951) and his sequence of Arthurian novels, The Once and Future King, first published together in 1958. One of his most memorable stories is the first of that series, The Sword in the Stone, published as a stand-alone book in 1938. T.H. White lived at Duke Mary's (next page)



The same source reveals that Timothy B. Bagenal (1925-2011) visited Duke Mary's and shared a love of Swaledale with the Garnetts. Timothy's mother Barbara Hiles Bagenal (1891-1984) was an artist associated with members of the Bloomsbury Group. Timothy was a pioneer of Swaledale vernacular building research and rescue, as well as the author of books and articles on our local history, although perhaps more widely known as the author of The Observer's Book of Freshwater Fishes. Ned Garnett's father Richard (1923-2013) who bought Duke Mary's in 1964, joined the publishing firm of Rupert Hart-Davis in 1949. We are looking forward to finding out more about the connection between the Garnetts and Bagenals, via Friend of the Museum, Caroline Bagenal. There is an intricate web of connections to investigate, with the attraction of Swaledale at its heart. If any of you know of anything relevant to this project we would very much like to have a chat. Meanwhile we

hope you will be celebrating Christmas with a traditional Swaledale feast of frumenty, hulled wheat boiled in milk and seasoned with sugar, or perhaps start your Christmas Day with a bowl of porridge!

The Right To Have A View

I'd like to thank the editor for his 'First Thoughts' in the November edition of the Gazette.

This is a story I have been following closely with increasing concern and dismay.



What has COP 26 done for us?

A key aim of the 26th United Nations Some net-zero pledges missed the Climate Change Conference (COP 26) projected global temperature rise down to 1.5°C, partly by encouraging countries to achieve net-zero carbon emissions by 2050. Without controls on global warming, it is likely that even in Arkengarthdale and Swaledale, we will see the impact of climate change with warmer wetter winters and drier hotter summers and a greater chance of floods and moorland fires. We could also see higher food prices and food shortages as food production is impacted.

There have been some major agreements

More than 40 countries agreed to coal-fired power 2030/2040 with leading financial institutions agreeing to stop financing coal developments. Unfortunately some of the world's largest coal users such as Australia, China, India and the USA didn't sign.

Over 100 countries, collectively home to over 85% of the planet's forests, pledged to halt and reverse forest loss and land degradation by 2030. Funds have been pledged to help devel- Editor Note: We will have to have reoping nations restore land, tackle wildfires and support indigenous communities' rights. Big financial companies have promised to end investment linked to deforestation.

More than 100 countries have signed the Global Methane Pledge aiming . to limit methane emissions by 30% by 2030, mostly by plugging leaky pipes.

Scientists believe this alone could help avoid 0.3C warming.

UN's 2050 targets. Big polluters was to introduce measures to keep the such as China and Russia, and Saudi Arabia will only work towards 2060 targets with India opting for 2070. Many scientists think that even 2050 is too late and action in the next 10 years will be most impactful.

> Money to support developing nations pledged earlier didn't materialise and many observers remain sceptical that funds pledged at COP26 will be any more forthcoming.

So has enough been done?

The general scientific consensus, so far, is that maintaining the Paris target of 1.5°C global warming will not be achieved. Many organisations predict that the world is currently heading for 2 - 2.4C of warming. Proposals called for by scientists such as national limits on emissions or a global carbon tax were not even discussed.

The local not-for-profit community company known as Hudson House Ltd would like to thank everyone who signed the recent petition about the reopening of the petrol pumps on Reeth Garage forecourt. Taking the physical petition and the online equivalent together, we estimate that in little over a week around half the population of Swaledale and Arkengarthdale had expressed their support for this project. This in turn helped secure substantial funding from Richmondshire District Council to pay for the specialised investigation and advice needed to establish whether the project would be viable.

These surveys are now being arranged and we hope that before too long we will know whether a modernised, sustainable forecourt operation is possible in Reeth. What the Board of Hudson House has in mind is a combination of 24 hour automated pumps, electric vehicle charging points and a shop which, like its predecessor, would complement rather than compete with our existing village businesses.

As well as establishing the physical condition of the site and working out the cost of modernising the facilities, we also need to decide how it might best be funded and managed once it is open. We'll keep the community posted on developments and consult as widely as possible as we go along.

Monthly Crime Bulletin – October 2021

Incidents of note over the last month;

They had been considering adding weekly collections of food waste into the programme as well as co-mingling general recycling rather than continuing to collect it separately.

But this week (Tuesday November 9) members of the Corporate Board were told that continuing with the review was not recommended with several factors preventing longer term decisions being made. The national waste strategy has not yet been concluded and local government reorganisation for North Yorkshire will mean a countywide review of waste and recycling services will be undertaken. Officers from Richmondshire will be part of that review process.

Members agreed to halt the review, continue with the current Richmondshire service, and extend the life of the existing vehicle contracts or enter into temporary hire arrangements where needed.










Local Furniture Business

A FORMER fell running champion has been inspired by the hills surrounding his Yorkshire Dales National Park home to start his new bespoke furniture making business. 

News from Bellerby Study Group for January 2022.

Bellerby Study Group restarts after the Christmas break with a talk by Gary Bankhead, Hon Research associate in the Department of Archaeology at Durham University. It is about the Durham River Wear Assemblage of finds revealed by the archaeological investigations of a submerged river bed, positioned just downstream of the 12th century Elvet Bridge in Durham City, that have revealed an important multi-period underwater archaeological site. This is on Wednesday 19th January.

This is followed on the 26th of January by a talk by David Metcalf, telling us about setting up a farm in Russia. Metcalfe Farms were shareholders in a newly formed Russian Farming Company from 2005 - 2011.

The company started with 2,800 ha of abandoned land, by the time the company was sold in 2011 we had 50,000 ha and 300 employees.

Meetings are on Wednesday at 7.30pm in the Memorial Hall, Church Street, Bellerby DL8 5QL.

Talks are followed by refreshments and a chance to chat.

Post Office News

Firstly, to those customers who are continuing to wear a mask and sanitise their hands before entering the shop: Thank you for considering the welfare of both our staff and other customers.

Although the wearing of masks is no longer mandatory (at the time of writing this) it is strongly advised that we continue to wear them in enclosed or crowded spaces, which is why we would still like our customers to wear one. It's a small measure to take for the good of our community.

Post early for Christmas. No doubt you will have heard this mantra a number of times and it is no less important this year. We could give you the recommended last dates for posting, but who knows - by the time you read this they could have changed. (Within a few days of receiving the official leaflets, we were told that some of the dates had been brought forward.) The best thing to do is look for the latest information for us all so thank you for continuing to on the Royal Mail website:

www.royalmail.com/christmas/ last-posting-dates

or ask at the post office counter.

If posting abroad, including EU countries, it is more important than ever to correctly fill out a customs declaration form to avoid your items being delayed or even sent back to you. These must be filled out in block capitals as initially they are read by machines. If you are intending to send any parcels overseas, it would save you time and pick up some of the forms.

If you are ordering presents online this year, or indeed ordering anything them) point for me at home. online, please remember that with some

companies you can request for your items to be delivered to our post office - so you don't have to stay at home waiting for them to arrive. Amazon in particular allow you to choose Local Collect for delivery of a large number of items, depending on the size.

DPD have recently made an agreement with Post Office Ltd for a Click and Collect service. We think DPD drivers can be automatically directed to deliver your item to the post office if you are not in and they need to have sight of someone before leaving the parcel. With DPD though, please note that we have to scan the customer's Pick Up Pass which is sent to you electronically - and not the code on the red postcard which may have been put through your door. As such, we can only process these parcels during post office hours and when you bring the pass with you - either on a phone or printed

Finally, it has been a difficult year support us through trying times. All that remains is, on behalf of all our staff, to wish you all a safe Christmas and a healthy New Year.
