

Afoot in Two Dales Challenge Walk

The Irregulars is a local group within Walkers the Lona Distance Association (LDWA) for people with the common interest of walking long distances in rural, mountainous or moorland areas. The group currently organising a 50 mile/5,500ft circuit of the Yorkshire Dales for experienced walkers and entitled Afoot In Two Dales (AKA The Yorkshire 50), to be held over the weekend of 15th/16th July 2023. This is a circular walk on footpaths, bridleways and quiet roads through Swaledale and Wensleydale and offers some of the best walking that the Yorkshire countryside has to offer. After starting at Harmby Village Hall, participants make their way checkpoints Castle at Bolton. Haverdale. Muker. Hardraw. Bainbridge, Thoralby and The Gallops, where they are given refreshments, eventually returning to Harmby for a cooked meal. They will be setting off from Harmby at 8:30am on Saturday and have 22 hours to complete the route.

We charge an entry fee to cover the cost of e.g. hiring several village halls. provision of food and drink transportation for anyone dropping out through injury or fatigue and first aid at the finish. After the event our intention is to use any surplus funds to make a donation to the Swaledale Mountain Rescue as we did last year. We anticipate around 150 people entering the event and over 100 have already signed up.

The event is held with kind permission of the walk's originator Jill King, & the Cleveland LDWA Group, and is available as an 'Anytime Challenge' walk that could be completed over two to three days.

Skeeby Beck Pollution

By now many of the Gazette's readers will be aware of the appalling wildlife devastation at Skeeby Beck. This



follows the catastrophic release of slurry into the beck from a farming site further upstream. The Environment Agency rate this a 'fish kill' and in consequence thousands of fish have died. It may be some months or years before this stretch of the river returns to full life.

Following such an event there will be much hand wringing and finger pointing which is understandable but we must also offer our support in more tangible ways. Consequently the Reeth fishing club (RADAC) is planning to offer a pair of concessionary tickets for this season to the Gilling Fly Fishers thus ensuring that local water is available to our neighbours.

If Trees Could Talk... 5 - Wood Pasture (1,000 to 250 years ago)

You can get a good view of Rowleth Wood from almost any vantage point along the back road between Crackpot and Gunnerside. It's quite a dense woodland now, but within memory it was more open and was livestock unfenced with arazina between its trees. This practice, of the dales' sides managed as pasture liberally dotted with trees ('wood pasture') has a longer tradition in Swaledale and Arkengarthdale than today's more familiar, if relatively modern, dry stone walled landscape.

For much of the last thousand years, Rowleth Wood was less dense than it is now but far more extensive, the current wood being the last remnant of what was recorded in 1383 as being called 'Mosdalhegge', a wood pasture stretching all along the dale side of what is now Melbecks, from Gunnerside Gill to Barney Beck west of Healaugh.

Wood pasture embodies the practice of a patch of land being managed for more than one purpose: grazing, fuel and building material. For local people wood pasture provided self-sufficiency and the flexibility to deal with changing circumstances. For the landscape, it harks back to the biodiversity of the wild wood, where a wooded outlook was kept open by large herbivores.

Each of the villages that grew out of the vaccaries (farmsteads)

established in the free chase had its own wood pasture: common land which was an essential adjunct to their meadows which were neither large enough nor productive enough to meet the year-long requirement to feed livestock

In 1570, we have reference to the 'queen's woods' of Harkerside and Whitaside. Although largely lost now, we can still find remnants of these once more extensive woodlands and, by looking at eighteenth and nineteenth century maps, we can trace the slow disappearance of wood pasture from the Swaledale landscape between Grinton and Haverdale Beck.

It's a cold January day around 1600. Snow sits on frozen ground in another dismal winter. We're on Whitaside, above Lawn House, amidst several acres of wood pasture where the dominant tree is holly. The trees are pollarded, a practice that maintains a dense head of young branches just above browsing height. A shepherd is lopping selected branches off these pollarded hollies and sheep are enthusiastically stripping them of leaves and bark, there being little else available to eat.

The following aerial photograph shows a section of Whitaside with two current properties circled in red: Lawn House to the left and Hollins Farm to the right (Hollin is an old word for holly). The fields shaded in light green are named in maps of 1774 after the trees that once grew in them: hazel and ash in the lower fields, holly in the higher fields to the south. By the time of the 1844 tithe maps, all these fields were listed



as meadow or pasture, but even today (as the photo suggests) this is the part of Whitaside that has the most trees.

Elsewhere in Swaledale evidence of wood pastures that once the needs of farming communities. Field and names of documents are both sources evidence, as are tracks (now often footpaths) that lead from villages for a mile or so and then peter out in what was once their wood pasture. And there still remain some ancient pollarded trees (holly, elm, ash and alder), some centuries old, which often survived felling by being incorporated into field boundaries.

Pollarding is strongly associated with

wood pasture as it maintains trees in a juvenile state, sprouting branches

above the browse line and so allowing new growth to coexist with livestock. These ancient trees are living signposts to how our dales' sides were traditionally managed for several hundred years.

By combining multiple sources of evidence, it is possible to identify areas of historic wood pasture from Keld to Fremington. Evolving from the free chase, wood pasture probably reached its maximum extent in the fourteenth and fifteenth centuries both documents and pollen analysis support this conclusion. After this time, changing pressures on land use led to wood pasture's decline, although it continued up dale for longer.

Although in many cases, as our old maps show, wood pasture was repurposed for meadow, this wasn't always the case. A number of deer parks were created in Swaledale by landowners seeking to recall memories of the free chase. Wood pasture would be ideal for this purpose and there is evidence that Feetham's wood pasture was appropriated to this end in order to create Healaugh Park. Today's Feetham Wood is a small remnant of this former woodland.

Later, there was a trend towards a more intensive type of woodland management in the form of coppicing, as industry and a growing population increased the demand for wood for both fuel and timber.

8 Incidents this edition. On average we respond to between 40 to 50 calls each year.

2023:

Incident 12: 09/05/2023: Called to rescue an injured walker in Swinnergill, above Muker. The casualty had fallen

The team and air ambulance responded. We evacuated the casualty up the gill to the waiting air ambulance.

Incident 11: Called to rescue an injured walker near the waterfalls at Keld. Treated on scene by the Ambulance and team, then evacuated by team vehicle to Keld.

Incident 10: Called to search for a missing D of E group. After an initial search while the team were traveling to the scene, the missing group turned up safe having taken a wrong turn!

Incident 09: 02/04/2023: Called to assist Cave Rescue Organisation at Clapham with a report of Six cavers overdue on a trip from Lancaster Hole to County Pot having gone underground at 11,30 and expected out by 19,30. As another party had seen them, well on their way, earlier in the day, the search was concentrated towards County Pot. With no-one found, the Lancaster Hole entrance was checked, in case they had been unable to find their way forward and had returned over their now-familiar route. With this initial check drawing no results, a new party was preparing to go into the cave system from Lancaster Hole when a phone call was received. Two of the missing cavers had emerged from Lancaster Hole, shortly followed by another one, with the remaining three in need of hauling up the 33m entrance pitch. This done, cavers and rescuers returned to Bull Pot Farm by 05.15.

Incident 08: 23/03/2023: Called by Cleveland Mountain Rescue Team to assist with an ongoing search for a missing person. Team tasked with searching underground caves & mines in the search area. Toxic gas levels in the mines prevented further searching, Mines Rescue took over the search with breathing apparatus & located a body.



Incident 07: 17/03/2023: Called to rescue an injured walker in Arkengarthdale, the casualty and group had managed to self-evacuate someway, then treated by the team and evacuated to the road Ambulance.

Incident 06: 12/03/2023: Team called by the Police to rescue an injured walker on the hills above Richmond. A very well organised group with the casualty had provided immediate first aid and kept the casualty warm. The team treated and then evacuated to the road ambulance.

Incident 05: 11/03/2023: Called by the ambulance service to rescue an injured person in Wensleydale. First team members assisted the ambulance with evacuating the casualty.

Artists across North Yorkshire are taking part in the Open Studios event in June 2023 on 2nd-3rd and 10th-11th between 10am-5pm.

Visiting studios is a way of seeing and understanding an artist's practice. You get to experience work first hand, see techniques and materials and you can ask all the questions you want to about art, art practice and creativity.

You don't have to be looking to buy work, although you can; most studios have small cards, prints and gifts that are low cost for sale, which are handmade and completely unique to the artists. Some studios have activities running for you to take part in.

The open studios event is organised by the artists-run collective, North Yorkshire

Open Studios (NYOS), a not-for-profit community that works to support the hundreds of painters, sculptors, printmakers, jewellers, ceramicists, photographers and creatives who live and work in North Yorkshire.

You can design a fantastic day out around the studios and artists you would like to visit or you can drop in to a studio which happens to be nearby on the advertised weekends.

Even though Rachel, Jane and Michael are a part of this collective they are still out on a limb compared to many artist clusters, for example around Harrogate or Skipton. In recent months they have been working to raise their profile in Swaledale Arkengarthdale to let people know that as part of the community they welcome locals and visitors popping into their studios just to show support and get to know what they do.

They all also work within the community, for instance Jane ran workshops last year to raise money for charity and Rachel is running a project





for Risedale School in conjunction with the Swaledale festival this year.

Rachel Antill is forming the Northern arts collective which is aimed at supporting

artists that are concerned with sustainable art practice, and art work that highlights our use, understanding and relationship to landscape and sustainability.

Talking Pictures

MISSION IMPOSSIBLE II The Movies Review by John Hunter

...You may recall last time we looked at the original TV series and the many tropes which were transferred to the movies. This time, with the threat of being disavowed if unsuccessful, we'll have a quick trip

through the Tom Cruise series, beginning back in 1996 with the original 'Mission Impossible', directed by the great Brian de Palma ('Untouchables' etc) and utilising special effects from the 'Star Wars' guys at Lucasfilm. Though some criticised the complex plot, it was really a simple double cross

story with young Ethan Hunt's IMF team wiped out in a failed mission in Europe - causing him to be outlawed and hunted by the CIA. Putting his 'new' team together, he pieces together how they were framed (in order that the bad guys acquire a sensitive computer file). The film is actually quite 'talky' but with two stand-out sequences - breaking in to CIA headquarters at Langley (the famous and much imitated scene of Cruise dangling by wires to access secret info) and the exhilarating (if actually ludicrous) finale which has an express train thundering into the channel tunnel towing a helicopter! Terrific stunt work and visuals save the day - all set to Lalo Schiffrin's original score given a modern makeover by the great Danny Elman.

Film 2 left me rather cold I'm afraid. Then fashionable director John Woo fills the action with lingering slow motion and loving close ups of the daring Mr Cruise. Forgettable, except for some excellent motorbike stunt work. The third in the series is back on track with a more 'down to earth' story involving Tom and his team bringing down arms dealer Philip Seymour Hoffman, who threatens to do very nasty things to Tom's new fiancée.

'Ghost Protocol' came along in 2011 and is the first of three superb MI films capturing the spirit of the TV series but with modern (and expensive) action scenes. Beginning with Tom accused of blowing up the Kremlin (top that!) the plot involves a 'new' team, with Jeremy Renner and 'techie'

Simon Pegg (good value comic relief) trying to stop a rogue nuclear missile destroying San Francisco. Stand out sequence (and filmed in IMAX for posterity!) has Tom scaling the worlds' tallest building in Dubai (largely done for real), and concluding with a triple whammy climax which has Pegg tapping the PC keys, Renner going hand to hand and Tom trying to stop the attack - breathless stuff which concludes with Tom driving his car off a car park!

'Rogue Nation' begins with Tom's most outrageous stunt to date - actually hanging off an Atlas transport as it takes off 'You said you were on the plane!' exclaims Pegg, not realising how literal this was! Renner returns as does original team member Ving Rhames. A plot involving 'the syndicate'

involves bumper intrigue and a superb use of the latex mask once again! The last film to date 'Fallout' introduces Henry Cavill to the franchise and concludes with the most vertiginous helicopter chase ever seen. All we can say is...roll on 'Dead Reckoning' this year!! (...and look out for all those scenes shot in and around Yorkshire!)



Heritage Day at St Andrew's Church Grinton

1st July 2023 10am to 4pm

A day planned to focus on the heritage of this beautiful local church, and to celebrate its oldest bell which is 400 years old this year, as well as the central importance of sheep to the economic life of Swaledale. We want to encourage people to look round the church, climb up into the bell tower to view the bells (2-4pm only), view stalls with wool-related crafts, take part in crafting, and enjoy cake and



refreshments.

The church is a Grade 1 listed building built in the 12th century and was the only church in Upper Swaledale for 400 years, earning the name of the Cathedral of the Dales. It was built in Grinton as this was the first place above Richmond where the river could be crossed via a ford. In Anglo-Saxon Grinton means 'the green pasture'. At this time Grinton was larger than Reeth due to it being one of the centres of the lead mining industry. It was originally staffed by Augustinian monks but in 1272 the first vicar was appointed - Symon de Swaldal.

It has had many alterations to the

original Norman architecture, with additions enlarging the building from the 13th to 16th centuries and many other modifications since. There are many special items of historical interest worth seeing - the old graveyard, stained glass and mediaeval windows, a Jacobean pulpit with sounding board above it fitted in 1718 to increase audibility, a chained bible, and the 'leper's squint'.

A colony of bats live in the church and a monthly bat count takes place on the first Wednesday of the month from April to October. Monthly conservation group meetings take place too every month to help look after the churchyard.

There are eight bells hung in the tower, with the oldest dating from 1623. The others range in date from 1763 (still the original bell) with others from 1750 to 1825 having been recast in 1896 and 1926. A new eight bell frame was put in place in 1926 and the final two bells were added in 2016 [see photo]. The church was used in 'All Creatures Great and Small' where Tristan goes bell-ringing.

We look forward to welcoming you on the 1st July.


