
As part of the change we have simplified the running of the centre and have installed a new till that requires only card payments and no other administration.

"The Dales Detective Series by Julia Chapman, starting with "Date with Death", eight books so far and another in the pipeline, I don't normally read "cosy" crime novels but these are fast paced and engrossing with many twists and turns, murders and mysteries involving Samson, Delilah and Tolpuddle the dog and as a bonus, set in the Dales."

If you like detective stories set in a familiar landscape, check out Peter prize-winning Robinson's series featuring DCI Banks, as he works his way through gruesome (and some less but not very) deaths, gruesome, disasters and human despatches. With twenty eight books in the series there's plenty to get your teeth into for years to come. Best to read them in order, as you get very engrossed in the story of Banks' life that develops through the novels.

Peter Robinson was born in Leeds and latterly divided his time between Canada and Richmond, where he had a holiday home. The books are set in the fictional town of Eastvale in the Dales and you can amuse yourself by trying to work out which bits you think you recognise from where!

Readings show stargazing at its best

Dozens of 'sky quality' metre readings have underlined the Yorkshire Dales National Park's status as an International Dark Sky Reserve.

During 2023 the National Park Authority trialled permanent light metres at locations in Aysgarth, Garsdale, Grassington, Long Preston, Malham, Oughtershaw and Sedbusk.

They consistently produced sky quality metre readings of above 21, indicating that the National Park offered stargazing at its best, with the stars of the Milky Way clearly visible.

One-off readings were taken at a further 46 locations during 2023, including at Pendragon Castle in Mallerstang, Howgill Lane above Sedbergh, Cotter Force in Upper Wensleydale and Malham Tarn. They also produced readings of above 21.

The Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority has included the data in its second annual report to the USbased certification body, Dark Sky International.

The Yorkshire Dales National Park became an International Dark Sky Reserve in December 2020, at the same time as the North York Moors National Park.

Since then the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority has increased engagement with local tourism businesses to promote the dark sky, particularly during the dark skies

season running from October to March.

The annual Dark Skies Festival took place this year from 9-24 February. It had more than 50 sell out events.

Member Champion for Promoting Understanding at the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority, Derek Twine, said: "It's fantastic that the National Park has International Dark Sky Reserve status. My thanks go to the volunteers who collected the sky quality metre readings. It's great to see so many people working locally to protect the dark sky. In 2023 we saw several businesses, such as Stone House Hotel near Hawes, lead the way by installing dark sky friendly lighting at their sites.

"Since submitting our annual report to the international association, we've held the 9th Dark Skies Festival, in February. Businesses such as accommodation providers, pubs and outdoor activity providers have told us benefited they from increased tourism and revenue during the festival period.

"It's exciting to look ahead too. We've struck up a partnership with Melbecks Parish Council to look at how we can help create a dark sky friendly village. And we will continue to support communities and organisations, not least through our planning service, to ensure external lighting is well designed - with light cast down to where it is needed, not angled up into the sky."

Wensleydale Concert Series 2024

As we begin our 9th year of concerts at St. Andrew's Church in Aysgarth, we are proud to bring an ambitious programme of EIGHT concerts between May and September to Wensleydale. Our concerts feature musicians with international reputations and a wonderfully diverse programme of music.

The series starts on Saturday 11th May with the Jervaulx Singers. The Jervaulx Singers are a Yorkshire based professional soloist choir including singers from across the UK from choral and operatic traditions. They will be performing the beautiful and dramatic "A German Requiem" by Brahams accompanied by the composer's own 4-hand piano version of the score. The two solo parts are performed by members of the choir.

We have two concerts in June, both featuring the wonderful pianist Daniel Grimwood who is a regular and audience. On favourite with our Saturday 15th he is joined by the Australian pianist Yasmin Rowe and their programme features romantic works and Stravinsky's wild and dramatic Rite of Spring, which caused a riot at its Paris premiere!. On Friday 21st Daniel is joined by the amazina Azerbaijani-born violinist Nazrin Rashidova to give a beautiful and varied violin and piano recital including works by Arvo Part, Grieg, and Szymanowski and more.

On Saturday 6th July married couple Benjamin Frith & Heidi Rolfe join us for another 4-hand piano recital including music by Field, Satie, Schubert and Brahms and featuring

Rimsky-Korsakov's Scheherazade.

The Herschel Trio (right) joins us on Saturday 27th July. Named after the famous astronomer. and North-East composer. the Herschel Trio (flutes, harpsichord and viol) bringing is นร a



barogue performance entitled "Barogue Britannia!" including works by Handel, Arne, Purcell and Finger with traditional airs by Oswald, O'Carolan, together with Welsh airs and a North/ North-East connection with music by Avison. Garth. and Herschel. Internationally recognised pianist, Ashely Fripp is performing on Saturday 17th August with a programme of Schubert/Liszt transcriptions from Schwanengesang, a selection JS Bach Prelude and Fugues from the Well-Tempered Clavier (Book 1) and two late Beethoven sonatas.

Get your dancing shoes on for Saturday 7th September when we welcome Tango Siempre.

Tango Siempre have toured the UK and Europe since 1998 with projects ranging from traditional tango dance collaborations shows to with orchestras. contemporary dance companies and jazz musicians. They are unique in having three composers/ arrangers within the band. Their repertoire consists exclusively of original compositions and of music that they have transcribed and arranged from historical recordings of the great Argentinian orchestras and of Astor Piazzolla's Nuevo Tango ensembles. They have also appeared on BBC

Strictly Come Dancing and were the driving force behind the massive hit touring show Midnight Tango featuring Vincent Simone and Flavia Cacace.

Our final concert is on Saturday 21st September. Russian pianist Vitaly Piasarenko is in great demand, and has performed in over 30 countries in solo recitals and as concerto soloist with major orchestras around the world. He was the winner of the 8th International Franz Liszt Piano Competition in Utrecht and took 3rd prize in the Leeds Piano competition in 2015. THE WENSLEYDALE SCHOOL & SIXTH FORM LEYBURN

The Wensleydale School and Sixth Form is currently oversubscribed for September and is working hard to arrange additional transport for new students out of the catchment area.

The school has also taken in 20 new students since the start of the academic year which is a reflection of its impact within the community.

The journey to this point has been gradual, steady and under Headteacher Julia Polley, who has been at the school for eight years. Changes have been made to foster a culture of good behaviour and safety. Plus some adaptations made during covid have become a permanent feature to facilitate a calm and safe environment. These include a ban of phones and split breaks and lunches so students can have more space with their peers during these times. The uniform has also been relaxed, yet maintains a clean and professional finish to reflect the down-to-earth ethos of the school.

With no supply teachers having taught at the school in the past four years, the teaching is strong and the dedicated staff provide a stable and familiar environment for students. The school is fully inclusive and takes children of all abilities and social and emotional needs, with all staff highly trained meet SEND needs. to Headteacher Julia Polley, who is a teaching head and therefore knows students well, is a big believer that whatever is good for children with SEND needs, is good for all.

As a result of such changes, poor behaviour in the school is low and academic achievements are on the incline.

The most recent Ofsted report states: "Leaders have constructed a carefully planned and appropriately sequenced curriculum. Where this curriculum is strongest, lessons are exciting and engaging for all pupils". Plus: "Leaders have strong ambitions for pupils at the school. There are high expectations for behaviour and conduct. Staff share this vision and ensure that every pupil has the opportunity to flourish. Pupils speak with pride about the inclusive nature of the school, telling inspectors 'We are a tight-knit community'."

Alongside five academic lessons each day, students can choose from a vast range of extra-curricular activities through the school's enrichment programme which is a fundamental part of the school day. Activities include climbing, chess, Mandarin, cooking, darts, various sports, the school newspaper, drama club, calligraphy and much more. Additionally the school has a fully staffed Combined Cadets Force (CCF) with 40 students who parade twice a week. The school is immensely proud to be the only state school in North Yorkshire to have a CCF.

Mental health support is also embedded into the heart of the school culture, with onsite counsellors and support from NHS' Wellbeing in Mind team. The school uses restorative practice and restorative justice and parents and students are encouraged to talk openly with school staff.

Headteacher, Julia Polley, says: "We believe that by investing in our staff, creating consistency and setting clear

children expectations, have the security and support they need to truly engage with the curriculum and reach their potential. A famous quote says, 'a little progress every day adds up to big results'. This perfectly sums up the last eight years of my time at the school. I am extremely proud of all we have achieved at the school and we welcome children from all backgrounds and of all abilities to join us."

Ambitious New Work **Programme for National** Park

Members of the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority met in February and agreed an ambitious £13.1m work programme for 2024/25 which represents a significant increase in expenditure to support delivery of its key objectives and ambitions.

While the Authority's core government grant remains flat for an 8th year, Defra have provided additional Capital £500k. Funding of On top of significant external income secured by the National Park Authority through a variety of externally backed projects, this means the Authority can:

•Provide £2m of grants to the National Park's farmers and landowners through the Farming in Protected Landscapes programme.

 Continue the Tees-Swale project. peatland, meadows, restoring hay woodland and other priority habitats across Swaledale and Arkengarthdale.

•Provide new, Education and Outreach projects: Championing National Parks for everyone, and the National Citizen Service project.

•Facilitate an extensive volunteers programme, young ranger, 'Upskill Down Dale' youth engagement programme, and apprenticeships, developing skills that lead to employment in the environmental sector.

 Implement the Coast to Coast National Trail through the National Park, and a variety of other ambitions.

Derek Twine, Deputy Chair of the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority and Chair of the Finance and Resources Committee said:

"The ambition in this year's work programme is clear to see. Thanks to important income streams and the additional government capital funding, we have been able to commit to supporting farmers and landowners in accessing critical new grant funding, opportunities provide for underrepresented groups to experience the joy of visiting a National Park, and much more.

"However, the very real pressure on our core government grant funding remains and the outlook beyond 2024/25 looks much less positive. The 'Farming in Protected Landscapes' programme and 'Grow Back Greener' project are both scheduled to end in March 2025 and continuing uncertainty over the Country's public finances in general means it's difficult to anticipate how our core grant, currently only £5.2m, will be impacted beyond next year. As a result, all of the Authority's plans and ambitions for the future face a degree of uncertainty".



Local author and printmaker become partners in crime

Swaledale writer, Susan Parry, is known for her crime novels about forensic archaeologist, Dr Mills Sanderson but recently she has completed the first book in a new series featuring DI Miriam Abbott, Head of the Regional Unsolved Crime Unit, who has three investigations to solve in a few months. But Susan also had a problem to crack: she needed an eye-catching illustration for the cover for this first book

because it would define the style of the entire series

She found the solution at a special exhibition of Hester Cox's work in the Dales Countryside Hawes Museum. T† reflected the life of traditionally-managed upland hay meadows, including a series of Marie Hartley-inspired linocuts depicting the flowers insects and birds of three meadows

near Hester's home in Horton-in-Ribblesdale. Simple lino prints of dalesinspired scenery was exactly what Susan was looking for, so she was delighted when Hester agreed to design a cover illustration for her.

"Our collaboration has worked perfectly," Susan said. "Hester was able to interpret and distil my halfformed ideas into a striking image inspired by the Dales landscape. The bare trees and footprints in the moonlight, reflect the narrative of my book, which takes place over the

winter. In fact, I had been struggling with a suitable title until I saw the final illustration, when the decision was made to call the book "Tracks in the Dark".

Hester says, "Having a degree in Illustration has meant that I've always been really interested in the connection between images and the written word. Designing a book cover has been a bit of a dream of mine so I was delighted when Susan approached me and excited that it was for the launch of a brand new series of novels. My linocut image is the result of a

> lovely to-and-fro process with Susan, a visual conversation, which resulted in a graphic image that I hope will entice her readers."

Susan and Hester will be discussing their collaboration at events arranged by independent bookshops in the Yorkshire Dales: The Wonky Tree Bookshop, Leyburn, on April 4th; Limestone

Books, Settle, on April 30th; and The Stripey Badger Bookshop, Grassington, on May 13th.

Hester's artwork is currently on display at the Dales Countryside Museum, Hawes, where it is part of the 'Cry of the Curlew' exhibition.

Specialist Search Dog Training

On the last weekend in February, Swaledale hosted the winter Specialist Search Dogs training course. Over three days, ten search dogs and their handlers, supported by search technicians and a drone pilot, undertook a range of training scenarios to hone their skills and experience.

Whilst Specialist Search Dogs provide search and rescue/recovery in a range of disciplines, this course focused on our human remains detection dogs. On the Friday we travelled over to Semerwater where the handlers and technicians practised water and bankside safety and then the dogs were deployed into various search scenarios with dogs working both on the boat and along the water's edge.

On the Saturday we were based at Hazel Brow Farm, with a whole team exercise focusing on a single, large scale scenario which involved deploying the


drone to identify very small articles that had been located by the dogs. In the afternoon, everyone played a role in a first aid exercise and stretcher carry back to the farm. Thanks to Cath Calvert for letting us use the visitor centre and its facilities for the day.

On Sunday we moved to Fremington where another exercise further developed the skills that we had worked on the previous day, using the dogs to find larger articles above the surface and also buried remains. Many thanks to Ray, Sue & Martin Calvert for generously letting us use their land over the course of the weekend to train our fabulous dogs, dedicated handlers and search team.





The team is made up of highly trained volunteers available, 24/7 in any weather, any time of the day or night.

MOUNTAIN & CAVE RESCUE TEAM

On average we respond to between 40 and 50 calls each year. In 2023 we attended 46 incidents. Incidents Feb 6th to 8th March 2024 3 Incidents this edition

Incident 08: Called by the Ambulance Service to rescue an injured walker near the upper waterfall at Aysgarth. Treated on scene by the team and later the Ambulance crews. Evacuated by the team to the road Ambulance.

Incident 07, 08, 09. Which eventually became 07: Called by the Police to rescue an injured walker on the fells above Askrigg, very soon after we got a call from the Yorkshire Ambulance Service to rescue an injured walker in Gunnerside Gill, followed by another call for a second rescue in another part of Gunnerside Gill. With 3 jobs running we asked Upper Wharfedale Fell

Rescue Association (UWFRA) to give us a hand. Once the second casualty was located, it turned out that they were also the first and third casualty Treated on scene and evacuated by the air ambulance.

Incident 06: 21/.02/2024: Called by Upper Wharfedale Team to assist with the rescue of an injured walker on our joint Southern border. Treated on scene & evacuated to the valley.


Incident 05: 21/02/2024: Called by The Cave Rescue Organisation, in Clapham, to help search for an overdue party of nine cavers in County Pot, a popular entrance into the Ease Gill system. Initially, snow drifts made accessing Bull Pot Farm difficult. Two underground teams were deployed to carry out a hasty search of the route that had been given whilst surface personnel set up a control room and communication relay. Search teams located the overdue group who were cold and tired.

Due to the large number in the group, and potential for a long drawn out search of the wider system, additional support was requested from colleagues in Swaledale Mountain Rescue Team and Upper Wharfedale Fell Rescue teams. Cumbria Highways also responded, clearing the snow drifts and enabling easier access to Bull Pot Farm.
