A New Vision . . . and Name!

From January 2026 Keld Resource Centre became known as **Keld Heritage Centre**.

This was to better reflect our charitable and project aims of preserving and promoting the heritage, legacy and traditions of Keld and Upper Swaledale. The decision follows a period of major growth and expansion, most notably the successful launch of the **Old School Museum** and the recent acquisition of the extensive collection from the **Swaledale Museum** in Reeth. These developments have helped to establish the organisation's role as a central hub for local history and culture in the Upper Dale and has encouraged the Board of Directors/Trustees to ensure our name fully supports our future purpose and vision. Our growing local history Archive Library also suggests this name change is appropriate to fully reinforce our core aim of safeguarding and sharing the heritage of the Upper Dale.

We also launched our new website early January 2026 to reflect our new re-brand, so make sure to visit www.keldheritage.co.uk; our new site will enable us to share more of our archive photographs and documents online and make our Local History archives accessible to anyone, regardless of their location.

Otherwise, it is business as usual in Keld - **The Visitor Centre** and **Old School Museum** will remain open daily. Admission is free, but donations are

welcomed. **The Manse** continues to be available for bookings for relaxing breaks and retreats. All income supports Keld Heritage Centre's community project work. We have also launched our 2026 Events Programme, with new workshops, talks and walks for all to enjoy.

Helen Guy, Curator/Project Manager and Trustee/Director summed it up: We're thrilled to give our Centre a name that truly reflects the scope of our work. Keld Heritage Centre is not just a group of buildings; it is now the home for Upper Dale's history, ensuring the traditions, family history and stories are safeguarded and shared for future generations.

Finally, a huge thank you to our growing team of Volunteers who support the Project in so many ways - be it leading walks, providing refreshments at our events, cleaning, decorating and maintenance work; and to everyone who supports us by attending our events and donating items to the museum - it is all greatly appreciated.

Her story is written with great knowledge, passion and feeling for one so young, describing in detail the sheep rearing and husbandry cycles, the challenges, successes and the detailed planning to ensure continuation and improvement of blood lines in their flock.

I would encourage Decision Makers at both Regional and National level to read the story to gain an understanding of the dales farmers' lives and challenges to help influence policies.

The story brought back many memories of my life in Swaledale, 'up in Low Row'. I visited the Keld area with my Mum, Phyllis who had lived at Skeugh Head when attending Keld School, to visit her cousins at Angram, Thorns, Hoggarths and West Stonesdale. We travelled by Percivals bus and when Billy Burrell was driving, he would take the bus to Park Bridge to turn around and provide us a lift halfway to two of our destinations. My Dad, Kenneth, William Sunter along with other Calvert's workers, spent many weeks in the 1950s repairing, renovating and building property in the Keld area. Jessica's story helped me remember many of my childhood 'days out'.

However having lived away since 1965, heughed in East Yorkshire overlooking the Humber estuary and Bridge for some 55 years, I still retain a close interest via many media channels, and telephone conversations of the

'happenings' in the Dale. In essence 'You can take the man out of the Dale but not the Dale out of the man'.

I welcome receiving the 'Gazette' monthly on line. I understand the amount of work which goes behind the scenes to produce each edition: well done the 'Gazette Team'. In return, I will make a donation to help secure and sustain future publications.

The Guns of Navarone – a personal retrospective

Released when I was but a toddler, 'Navarone' has a special place in my heart for several reasons. It was one of the first films I saw at the cinema (in one of many 'pre-TV' re-releases) - with school mates rather than parents, and being shown at the notorious Scunthorpe Essoldo, the film broke down five minutes from the end, so we only heard the climax in sound! (We asked the manager for a refund but his reply is unprintable here!). As well as featuring some of my favourite stars (from movies seen on TV as a growing boy) such as Gregory Peck and David Niven, the thunderous score was by my favourite 'golden age' composer, the great Dmitri Tiomkin. I was able to catch up on the film's finale in the mid '70s on its first TV showing (such an 'event' that the film poster was emblazoned across the whole cover of the TV Times) - but only on a small black and white TV! It wasn't until the release of 'Force 10 from Navarone' in 1978 that I would see my 'lost' footage on the giant anamorphic screen of the Birmingham

Gaumont (alas now demolished - it had once boasted the largest curved screen outside London) - as 'Force 10' began with the climax of its forerunner, albeit with a new soundtrack - and of course I was now studying music at the local University.

Years later, Jane and I were holidaying in Rhodes - and whilst I knew some of the film was shot there, assumed that little evidence would be left (nearly 40 years later) - but to the contrary, I recognised Rhodes harbour immediately from the acquisition of the small motor launch scene, and a trip down the coast to Lindos revealed not only the

acropolis at which our heroes rendezvous, but the actual cliff face looking out over the Aegean (minus the two huge guns of course!).

The film itself was part of a cycle of big-budget war movies with an all-star cast, like *The Great Escape* and *The Longest Day*, directed by J Lee Thompson, and based on Alistair MacLean's novel, which I'd read as a boy. The only Oscar awarded to the movie was to the special effects team, and in those pre-CGI times they certainly do a good job of demolishing the entire mountain containing the guns in the climactic scenes - *I just wish I'd been able to see that at the Essoldo back in '71!*

Answer to last article - 'The Great Race' was that vintage car race movie, featuring the song 'The Sweetheart Tree'

Minutes of the Melbecks Parish Council meeting held on Thursday 2nd October 2025 at Gunnerside Village Hall

Present were Councillors Silver, Calvert, Bowe and Strafford with Cllr R. Alderson chairing. Also present was NYC Councillor Yvonne Peacock and PC Heather Campbell. There was one member of the public present. The Clerk was Miss N. Adams.

1. Apologies for absence: None
2. Declaration of Interests: Councillor Silver declared an interest in item 8(e).
3. Minutes of the last meeting: The minutes of the last meeting, held on 17th July 2025 were approved.

4. Matters arising: A concern was raised about lack of communication between Parish Councillors, and it was agreed to set up a WhatsApp group for parish councillors, and any councillors who are not able to join this group will be informed of any important issues by the Clerk. The Clerk will also send a report for the Reeth Gazette following Parish Council meetings.

Following the decision made at the last meeting to send a letter regarding the tarmac which has been laid near the Institute, it was noted that this letter has not yet been sent but the Clerk will arrange for this to done.

The notice board in Low Row has been repaired at a cost of £40.00 and the contractor was asked to send an invoice for their work and they will be asked to do the same at Gunnerside. Locality funding of £300 for the notice boards has been received, however if the decision is not to replace these at the moment, it was confirmed that this can be allocated to a new website instead.

5. Finance

- a) Bank Account: Councillors noted that communication from Barclays Bank has been received. The clerk will investigate this.
- b) Parish Precept arrangements for the financial year 2026/27. It was noted that this needs to be confirmed by December 2025 and this will be discussed at the next meeting.
- c) New Assertion 10 in the Annual Governance and Accountability. Return for the year ended 31 March 2026 - Digital and Data Compliance. This new requirement around email addresses and website etc will be discussed at the next meeting.

PC Heather Campbell joined the meeting at 20:30

6. Highways

a) The clerk was asked to report the following highway concerns, and Councillor Peacock to be copied in:
At Rowleth Bottom, Low Row, the road is falling away on the south side of the road.

At Gunnerside, opposite the electric gate, the wall is damaged with a steep drop behind.

At Robin Gate, Low Row, the bollards are damaged on the south side of the road.

7. North Yorkshire Council

a) Consultation on proposals relating to Reeth and Gunnerside Federation: The Parish Council noted this consultation, and the date of the public meeting, which is taking place around how Reeth and Gunnerside Federation is currently working. The proposal is for Reeth to become an Infant School and Gunnerside a Junior School.

8. YDNPA

a) Protected tree applications: Land next to Brockma Gill, Kearton, Low Row

b) Protected tree applications: Thistlebouth Farm, Gunnerside fell 1 x pine and crown lift 1 x elm -there were no comments or objections.

c) Householder planning permission for erection of a stone boundary wall with pedestrian gates at Jingle Pot Lodge, Gunnerside, DL11 6JG - R/05/67G - there were no comments or objections.

d) Listed building consent for erection of a stone boundary wall with pedestrian gates at Jingle Pot Lodge, Gunnerside, DL11 6JG -R/05/67H/LB - there were no comments or objections.

e) Section 73 application to vary conditions 2 (approved plans) and 17 (roofing slates) of R/05/252 (Full planning permission for re- occupation of a former dwelling and installation of sewage package treatment plant) in respect of the amended location of the fuel tank, generator and heat pump and for the use of weathered Indian stone slates for any additional slates required at Mount Pleasant, Low Row, Gunnerside, DL11 6PU - R/05/252B - there were no comments or objections.

f) Autumn Parish Forum online Tuesday 4 November 2025 at 7pm - the council noted receipt of this.

g) Yorkshire Dales National Park Local Plan 2025-2040 - the council noted receipt of this.

h) Yorkshire Dales National Park Management Plan Annual Forum - the council noted receipt of this.

9. Any Other Business

a) Housing Needs Survey Report for Affordable Housing - the council noted receipt of this.

b) North Yorkshire Citizens Advice & Law Centre- the council agreed not to make a donation at this time.

c) Dales Police Report 8th August to 6th September 2025 - the council noted receipt of this.

d) Dales Police Report 7th July to 7th August 2025 - the council noted receipt of this.

Both these reports had been circulated to councillors prior to the meeting. PC Heather Campbell advised that there had been an incident of fly-tipping which was reported to the police, but it was noted that this is not a police matter, unless there is an obstruction on the highway.

e) The North Yorkshire Police, Fire and Crime Panel - the council noted receipt of this request for co-opted members of the panel.

f) Complaints Procedure. The councillors reviewed and adopted the Complaints Procedure.

g) Brown Hill Top 'Parking for residents of Brown Hill Top' It was noted that this sign had originally been put up by a previous owner of the house. The Parish Council suggest that this sign is taken down as no permission had been obtained to put this up, although cars can still park at this location. The owner of the property has agreed to take this sign down.

h) Scott Trial permission slip: This was signed and will be returned.



Astronomy in Swaledale

If you live in the Dales or visit regularly, you probably know that the Yorkshire Dales are a Dark Skies Reserve. This means that our skies are dark enough to qualify for dark skies reserve status, and that the National Park is committed to protect the night sky and encourage visitors to come and enjoy the experience.

The map below shows the light readings used to support the application. The dark blue dots are where the readings were very low indeed - some of the darkest skies in the UK. The area inside the red line, where all the readings are dark blue is known as the "core" area. The light blue dots show where the readings were still good - dark enough to see the milky way on a clear night - but not quite as dark. In and around Reeth and the main road up through Swaledale neck.



the readings were mixed. This is because sky darkness depends a lot on the transparency of the air. On nights when there is a lot of moisture or dust to reflect light, the sky is brighter. But on very clear nights the skies over our villages can be almost as dark as out on the moors.

So how can you get the best out of the dark skies? Well, the most important thing is to get away from artificial light. This is because it doesn't matter how dark the sky is if your eyes can't become dark adapted enough to enjoy them. An outside light shining on you, or a glance at a phone screen sends your eyes into daylight mode. But just 5 to 10 minutes in darkness will allow your eyes to become sensitive enough to see the full glory of a clear night sky. Wrap up warm and, if you can, find a chair or sun-lounger which will help you look up without falling over or craning your neck.

If you are more of an armchair astronomer, or if you would like to find out more about what is up there you might also like to know that there is a small, friendly group of people interested in astronomy who meet locally. It's called the Reeth Informal Astronomy Group. We are open to all, and our meetings are free to attend - you can contact us via our website (reethastro.org.uk).

We also run special observing events, the next of which is **on Friday 20th February**, from 7.00pm at the Reeth Evangelical Congregational Church, which has a nice dark garden and a warm meeting room. If it's clear we will have several telescopes set up for

you to look though and, of course, we'd be happy to answer any questions you might have. We will also have some of the pictures we have taken on display and if it is cloudy, an introduction to the affordable robotic telescopes which are revolutionising our hobby. The event is free - though we will have a bucket for donations which will be shared between Swaledale Mountain Rescue and the Church, who are letting us use their premises.

In the meantime, please do what you can to keep our skies dark - not just for the astronomers, but also for our nocturnal wildlife. Good outside lighting is shielded so it only shines where it is needed, is only on when it is needed, and uses warm yellow-white or red colours rather than high intensity blue-white light which blinds everything it touches.



Incident 02: Called by the Police to rescue a family whose vehicle was stuck on sheet ice.

Incident 48: 20/11/2025: Called by the Police to rescue a couple and their dog from another precarious position on ice. Due to the conditions both occupants were evacuated by

Incident 47: 19/11/2025: Called by the Police to rescue a motorist stuck on ice and snow. The vehicle was in an exposed position, and the driver was unable to get out of the vehicle. The team recovered the driver.

Natural solutions continue on local farms

Ousewem's delivery team, led by the Yorkshire Dales Rivers Trust, has been working with farms across Swaledale and the wider SUNO catchments to put practical natural flood management in place. The focus is simple measures that fit normal farm work, avoid disruption and still make a difference in wet and dry spells.

Scrapes in awkward corners, small wetland pocks, better hedge condition and leaky features built from local materials have proved the most workable. Their success comes down to careful placement rather than size, which means each site needs a tailored design. Conversations at events and on farm walkovers have also reinforced how much hedge shape and density matter for soil and water, so we are supporting farmers who want to thicken or replant where needed.

Some sites near Arkengarthdale have needed extra checks, and a small trial using Wensleydale wool behind leaky features is now underway to see how it performs over winter.

Work with estates and local farmer groups continues to shape the next phase of design. Walkovers remain the starting point for every site.

All of this also give Ousewem clearer evidence about how NFM behaves in different conditions across North Yorkshire.

Richmond Pool Update

In October 2025, NYC committed to a £1.2 million repair programme to protect the future of the pools in Richmond and ensure the safety of users.

Both public pools at Active North Yorkshire Richmond have been closed since April last year following a partial collapse of the building's ceiling.

The commitment to carry out the repairs followed a public survey where more than 2,200 members of the local community expressed how important the pool was to the town and the surrounding area, and how it plays a crucial role for local swimming clubs. However, the repairs are now having to take longer after asbestos was detected in the roof of the building during the delivery of the agreed programme of works.

These works have already started - but the repair programme needs to be extended to allow its safe removal. The asbestos was encapsulated so has not posed any health risk to pool users or anybody else who has previously accessed the building.

Executive member for leisure, Cllr

Simon Myers, said: "We all want the swimming pools in Richmond to reopen as soon as possible, so they can continue to benefit communities and support our county-wide vision to promote health and wellbeing.

"What became abundantly clear from the public survey was that Richmond Swimming Pool is an incredibly valued and vital part of the town's fabric. I am delighted that this will remain the case as a result of our commitment.

"I would like to thank everyone for their ongoing patience and cooperation, and I look forward to seeing the facilities used and enjoyed again by the public as soon as possible."

A consultation into the future of the pool held last year saw residents express widespread support for reopening the facility after essential repairs.

More than half of those surveyed said they used the facility at least once a week, with 91 per cent feeling it was either "very important" or "moderately important" that the site was saved.

The work in Richmond forms part of the authority's plans for a wider leisure investment strategy, which has been drawn up after NYC launched the new Active North Yorkshire service in 2024.

The service is aimed at improving the opportunities for people to become and stay active at every stage of their life - with the next phase looking at how investment in the council's facilities can help to deliver this aim and to create financially sustainable services.

The archaeology and local history group's next talk is on Tuesday 10th February, 7.30pm, when Alex Walsh, of the Towton Battlefield Society will talk about the Battle of Towton, North Yorkshire, one of the bloodiest and most significant battles in the Wars of the Roses. This will be the last in in our winter series of member only talks on Zoom; you may join us using the form on the website at <https://new-swaag.org/join-us/>. The fee is now half-price, £10, for the half-year to July. Membership will include four talks and the opportunity to participate in a local archaeological dig in the summer. Most of our talks are recorded and available to members a week or so after the talk.

Continuing our look at historic features in the local landscape, there are many what are known as 'burnt mounds' in Swaledale. These are frequently ignored, just one of the many lumps and bumps in fields and on the moors. As the name suggests they are piles of fire-cracked stone, now overgrown. They are always located near a stream or spring. In the middle there is a depression, the size of a bath, lined with clay to enable it to hold water. There is a good example near Swale Hall farm just to the south of the Swale Trail. What were they used for? The Annual Governance and Audit review (AGAR): the clerk said that from 2026 a gov.uk website and Cllr emails will have to be in place to ensure

compliance with AGAR. The Council has a gov.uk website. If gov.uk emails are not in place the Council would fail the review and would have to explain why and how it is going to rectify the failure. It is unclear what penalty or fine may be placed on the Council in the event of non-compliance. To comply all Cllrs and the Clerk must have gov.uk email addresses. This will cost around £60.00 each year. The Cllrs agreed that the Parish Council have no option other than agree to this. Clerk to progress.

b. NYC School Proposals. Cllr Rukin reported that no appeals in the Upper Dales had been successful and that North Yorkshire Council seem to be

determined to follow this ridiculous policy whatever. On a positive note, NYC have accepted the proposal to retain Gunnerside and Reeth Schools in

ertain circumstances and RECENT Schools in their present form. Cllrs noted that the potential use of the 'Little White Bus' was still unresolved. Clerk to correspond with board/management to establish if this is possible.

c. Pennine Way path, Thwaite. It had been noted that the width of the stile was reducing, making it more difficult to use. The Clerk had reported this matter to YDNP, Cllr Reynoldson said that the owner of the property adjacent to the stile had agreed to widen it and install a gate to be provided by YDNPA. The stones have been removed making it a wider opening; we await installation of the gate.

d. Housing Needs Survey. The report has been provided to the Council which shows that there is a need for affordable housing in the dale. There is no requirement for any affordable housing within the Parish.

e. **Election Costs.** North Yorkshire Council have decided that Election Costs should be borne by each Parish Council, which they say is a fairer system, rather than the whole County paying for election costs. This will incur a cost of £50.00 per Councillor. The next Election is in 2027, which will cost the Council £250.00. This cost is something that the Council should consider when setting the Precept for 2026/27. The Councillors noted this is yet another way of moving costs from NYC to Parish Councils. The Parish

Council believes that more and more costs will fall onto the Parish Council, leading to further increases in the Precept.


